



The Heritage Softail is clearly a favorite here for the Thunder Roads Team - with our own editor riding one for more than 11 years. So it was with some pleasure that we turned our focus on this classic mainstay in the Harley-Davidson lineup.

Few bikes capture the spirit of the original dressers more authentically than this beautiful motorcycle. 1940s-style leather saddlebags with quick-detach buckles, full FL front fender, chrome laced wheels and hub cover all pay homage to the past, while the counter-balanced Twin Cam 96™ engine, hidden rear suspension and new optional HYPERLINK "http://www.totalmotorcycle.com/motorcycles/2013models/2013-Harley-Davidson-FLSTC-HeritageSoftailClassic. htm" Anti-lock Braking System all reside at the forefront of modern technology.



No, we ain't talking about | For a list of those high demand occupations see http://benno urban kind of music (classic rock and blues is the best music by the way, don't you know). VRAP is Veteran's Retraining Assistance Program. Part of the VOW to Hire Heroes Act of 2011, it offers up to 12 months of training assistance to unemployed veterans.

As with any government program, it has some conditions:

- 1. You must be between 35 and 60.
- 2. You must be unemployed at the time you submit the application.
- 3. Your discharge must not have been dishonorable.
- 4. You are not eligible for any of the other VA education benefit programs (GI bill, vocational rehab, etc.)
- 5. You are not getting VA compensation for disability
- 6. You are not enrolled in any federal or state job training
- 7. You want to give Possum \$1,000. Just screwing with you on this one, that ain't true.

Here's the scoop copied from their web page: http://benefits. va.gov/vow/education.htm

The program is limited to 45,000 participants from July 1, 2012, through September 30, 2012, and 54,000 participants from October 1, 2012, through March 31, 2014. Participants must attend full-time in order to receive up to 12 months of assistance equal to the monthly full-time payment rate under the Montgomery GI Bill-Active Duty program (\$1,564 effective October 1, 2012). DOL will offer employment assistance to every Veteran who participates upon completion of the program.

As of May 13, there were 47,066 people enrolled in training, so you can still get approved for it.

Participants must be enrolled in a VA approved program of education offered by a community college or technical school. The program must lead to an Associate Degree. Non-College Degree, or a Certificate, and train the Veteran for a high demand occupation.

To apply go to http://vabenefits.vba.va.gov/vonapp/main.asp

To complete the application, they will need to know your direct deposit information (bank routing number and account number), the name and location of your school, the program you wish to pursue, and the applicable high demand occupation you wish to train in.





Proposed No-Fault Law Shafts Motorcyclist

On April 23rd a new bill (HB 4612) was introduced by the Michigan House of Representatives. This bill could be disastrous for motorcyclists and our passengers. It would cap medical and other no-fault benefits, making it difficult or impossible for some accident victims to afford their medical costs. All vehicle accident victims would be hurt by the significant benefit reductions proposed in this legislation, but motorcyclist would be disproportionately worse off... significantly shafted!

Our current no-fault system requires auto insurance companies to pay "all reasonable charges incurred for the reasonable and necessary products, services and accommodations for the injured person's care, recovery and rehabilitation." Stated more simply, insurers must pay all medical bills related to your medical treatment and care for life, as well as pay for wage loss, household chores, and medical mileage.

Under this proposal, drivers of cars ('motor vehicles' not motorcycles) would have coverage of their medical bills capped at \$1 million. There are many other limitations pertaining to the products, services and accommodations covered in the current system.

Motorcyclists would be subject to even further caps and cutbacks. Bikers would only be entitled to \$250,000 of total Personal Injury Protection (PIP) coverage, including wage loss and replacement services, regardless of how or why the crash occurred. See section 3107 (3)(C) of the proposed bill.

Consider this example: Under the proposed changes, if a motorcyclist with a good job is permanently disabled after an accident, and qualifies for the maximum wage replacement and household chores reimbursement, he would only have \$78,400 left to pay medical bills. More realistically, the medical bills incurred close to the date of the incident would eat up the full \$250,000 of coverage, leaving little to nothing for wage loss or household chore reimbursement. More likely, the motorcyclist would be left with additional medical costs. A car driver in the same situation would start out with four times more coverage. The current law has the same limitations on how long an accident victim is paid wage loss and replacement services, but provides unlimited coverage for medical costs for life.

This proposal slashes medical benefits

The new bill proposes to eliminate life-long coverage, limiting Personal Injury Protection (PIP) coverage to \$1 million for drivers of 'motor vehicles', and only \$250,000 for motorcyclists. Attendant care would be significantly limited: If the attendant care was provided by family or household members in-home, coverage would be limited to 56 hours per week. If in-home care is provided by a nursing service, it would be limited to 16 hours per day, regardless of whether or not round-the-clock coverage is required. For the first time ever, the bill would require a \$200 per month co-pay at the expense of the patient if attendant care is needed on a full-time basis, effective 30 days after attendant care is initiated.

This bill eliminates the victim's right to a jury trial

The right to a jury trial would be taken away by this new bill. According to the proposed bill; "Whether a charge is reasonable or whether a product, service, or accommodation is medically appropriate and medically necessary is a question of law to be decided by the court," not a jury.

The proposal will not lower premiums

While promises of lower premiums have been made, they can't be fulfilled. The bill does require the reduction of rates by \$150; however, insurers can increase the rates one year later without limitation. The cuts to coverage will force drivers to obtain additional PIP coverage from other sources, so any cost reductions they might have seen from insurance rates will be offset by the new cost for PIP coverage.

The bill will retroactively cut coverage to current benefit recipients.

Virtually all of the reductions in benefits and charges will be retroactive. The bill states "payments to providers for... products, services and accommodations are subject to the limits in this section..." A motorcyclist who was previously in an accident and whose doctor's appointments, therapy, and other medical costs are currently being covered could be immediately and totally cut off.

Make your voice heard


Thunder Across the Thumb Ride & Bike Show for the Troops The Ti














Biker Preacher's Corner

NCOM CONVENTION HITS JACKPOT IN RENO

Freedom is an ongoing gamble, with bikers' rights activists wagering to win against an often stacked deck, always in favor of the House, but everyone came away a winner at this year's 28th annual NCOM Convention over Mother's Day weekend, May 9-12, 2013 at the posh Silver Legacy Resort-Casino in Reno

But it was work, not play, on the agenda for hundreds of attendees from across the country there to discuss topics of concern to all riders; such as biker profiling and discrimination, motorcycle-only roadblocks, knowing your rights, and mobilizing motorcyclists to advocate motorcycle-friendly legislation and defeat anti-biking bills.

The traditional "Ringing of the Bell" ceremony paid homage to those freedom fighters who have gone before us, while for the first time a Veterans' Rights seminar was conducted by NCOM's newly-formed Veteran Affairs Special Committee in an effort to reach out to true defenders of Freedom

"STOP MOTORCYCLE CHECKPOINT FUNDING ACT" INTRODUCED IN CONGRESS

Congressman Jim Sensenbrenner (R-WI) has introduced "a bill to prohibit the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) from providing funds to state and local authorities for the purpose of creating motorcycle only checkpoints."

Filed on May 7, the Stop Motorcycle Checkpoint Funding Act, H.R. 1861, "also contains language to force the DOT to focus motorcycle safety efforts on crash prevention programs, not national helmet mandates," according to Rep. Sensenbrenner, "This will stop the DOT from manipulating State policies with

NTSB RECOMMENDS LOWERING DRUNK-DRIVING LIMIT TO .05

The National Transportation Safety Board has issued a recommendation that states lower their drunk-driving thresholds from a 0.08 blood-alcohol content to 0.05 BAC. The recommendation is one of several the NTSB made to curtail drunk driving, which the federal investigative agency claims is involved in a third of America's 34,000 traffic deaths each year. The agency acknowledged in its report there is no one "silver bullet." but estimated that 500 to 800 lives per year could be saved with the proposed lower limit.

Chairman Deborah Hersman admitted the NTSB is aiming even higher: "Reaching zero deaths from alcohol-impaired driving."

Not everyone agrees. "This recommendation is ludicrous," said Sarah Longwell, managing director of the American Beverage Institute. "Moving from 0.08 to 0.05 would criminalize perfectly responsible behavior.

Currently, all 50 states have set a BAC level of .08, though most countries in Europe including Russia, most of South America and Australia, have set BAC levels at .05 to constitute drunken driving.

The NTSB only makes recommendations on transportation safety issues, and has little actual regulatory power. It will be up to federal agencies. Congress and state lawmakers to take action. The last move from .10 to .08 BAC levels took 21 years for each state to implement.

WEATHER & ECONOMY DRIVE UP TRAFFIC FATALITIES

For the first time in nearly a decade, the number of traffic deaths went up last year according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), which cited warmer weather and an improving economy for the 5.3% increase in fatalities to 34,080, the highest since 2008.

The rise follows a steady decline in fatal accidents since 2005 when 43,510 people died, culminating in a 60-year-low of 32,367 in 2011, but NHTSA Administrator David Strickland said, "With a rebounding economy there's increased discretionary driving, which is clearly always the leader in terms of dangerous driving scenarios."

U.S. motorcyclist deaths outpaced the overall national numbers with a projected 9% more fatalities in 2012, up to more than 5,000, and in addition to climatic and economic factors the agency also blames a long-term decline in helmet laws with only 19 states requiring usage, down from 26 states in 1997.

"The most notable thing was the warm weather," said Dr. James Hedlund, a former NHTSA official and the author of the report by the Governors Highway

Safety Association, as thirty-four states east of the Rocky Mountains notched record average temperatures from March to May 2012, and forty-eight states recorded their warmest average temperatures on record

The report also cited two economic factors that may have contributed to an increase in the number of miles traveled via motorcycle in 2012 and thus a higher probability of accidents: a better economy and high gas prices. "An improving economy produces more discretionary income with which to buy and ride motorcycles," said the study. Several states reported an increase in the number of registrations in 2012, and Hedlund has found that over the past three decades. the number of registrations tracks closely with the number of deaths.

GHSA's recommendations for cutting motorcyclist deaths include reducing alcohol impairment, reducing speeding, increasing driver awareness, and ensuring that motorcyclists are licensed. According to GHSA, NHTSA data shows that in 2010, nearly a guarter of riders involved in fatal accidents did not have valid licenses.

CONNECTICUT RIDERS DECRY PROPOSAL TO REGULATE EXHAUST

An unexpected effort in the General Assembly to crack down on noisy motorcycles is being met by opposition from the motorcycle industry. Under language added last week to a bill involving off-road ATVs, the sale, registration or operation of a street motorcycle having non-stock pipes would become a fineable offense. Most after-market exhaust systems are not EPA-certified.

The new provisions, if approved, would require federal Environmental Protection Agency noise emission control labels to be displayed on all motorcycles. and would institute fines of up to \$250 per offense for non-compliance.

OHIO LAWMAKERS CALL FOR BAN ON TRAFFIC CAMERAS

Following a biting ruling by a judge who called traffic cameras a scam, legislation was introduced on February 20th in Columbus, Ohio by Representative Ron Maag (R-Lebanon) to eliminate the use of photo monitoring devices to detect speed and traffic signal violations. He and Rep. Dale Mallory (D-Cincinnati), one of many bipartisan co-sponsors, believe the removal of "speed-trap" cameras is necessary and must be addressed immediately since there is no existing state law regulating traffic enforcement cameras, so communities operate their programs under local ordinances.

Their hard-line stance against the cameras comes on the heels of Hamilton County Common Pleas Court Judge Robert Ruehlman's permanent injunction, which prohibits the further use of speed cameras in Elmwood Place, a Cincinnati suburb. Ruehlman granted the injunction citing there was a lack of due process for alleged violators.

Judge Ruehlman's decision was unequivocal. He made national news headlines when he called the speed camera system in Elmwood Place "a high-tech game of Three-card Monty.... It is a scam the motorist cannot win." Between the camera enforcement, the lack of proper signage, and the fees for administrative hearings, Ruehlman declared that the town of Elmwood Place had violated drivers' due-process rights, and may be the first case in the U.S. that specifically addresses the constitutionality of traffic cams.

In Ohio, there are at least 16 municipalities that use some kind of red light or speed camera, according to the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety. In the United States, there are more than 650 municipalities operating either red-light or speed cameras.

Nine states have passed laws prohibiting the use of red-light cameras, and 12 outlaw speed cameras, according to the Governors Highway Safety Association, while 29 states have no law on the books. Some Ohio legislators hope to make the Buckeye State the Lucky 13th state, and House Bill 69 has been assigned to the House's Transportation. Public Safety and Homeland Security Committee for further discussion and vote.

POKER RUN LEGALIZATION BILL IN ILLINOIS

Companion bills SB 1960 and HB 2520; the "Poker Run Act," have been introduced in Illinois to legalize poker runs for the charities that bikers do and for Not For Profit organizations.

"No segment in our society raises more money for charities and local citizens that are down and out on their luck than bikers." said Bob Myers. State Legislative Coordinator for ABATE of Illinois, who went on to explain; "Since 'Land Based Gaming' has become law, the Illinois liquor and Gaming agents have been tearing down our fliers in restaurants and bars claiming they are illegal as they use poker cards, spinners, dice, and marble spinners to complete the run." ABATE intends to use the legislation to correct problems with "poker" runs and other events that the Gaming commission and Liquor Control Board are treating as gambling. Poker runs shall include "dice runs", "marble runs" or other events where the object is to build or obtain some matter of a score with which the participants use in a competition. Poker runs shall not constitute a game of chance under the Illinois Gaming Act or Liquor controls Act and shall not be regulated under those Acts.

THREE-WHEELERS MAY BE EXEMPTED FROM LOUISIANA HELMET

Louisiana was the most recent state to (re)impose a mandatory helmet law for all motorcyclists back in 2004, but the House Transportation committee recently advanced legislation that would exempt a new concept vehicle from the legal category that requires drivers to wear helmets.

HB 218's exemption would apply to the three-wheeled Elio Motors vehicle, which is preparing for production at the Shreveport plant that once made pickups for General Motors. Because the Elio has three wheels, it's considered a motorcycle under federal and state safety regulations.

"It definitely affects our sales because a lot of people don't want to order the car if it requires wearing helmets," said Joel Sheltrown, vice president for governmental affairs at Elio Motors, adding that "We're not bound by automotive standards, but that is our goal."

Am I my brother's keeper?

We have worked long and hard to win some of our liberty back over government mandated helmet wearing when we ride in Michigan.

(I would still see those 18 - 21 who are old enough to die in our wars avail themselves of the liberty they fight for.)

For most of us, the helmet is not the issue, it's the freedom to choose, as well as the knowledge that there are better ways to advance our safety on the roads.

The trick is going to be in keeping our liberty if we don't step up to the plate by taking responsibility for ourselves and demonstrating what we have known all along is true. A.B.A.T.E. - A Brotherhood Against Totalitarian Enactments, is how we got here. A.B.A.T.E. – American Bikers Aiming Towards Education is how we stay here.

We have two groups that need to be addressed. Us, and Them. Each year it's about equal in terms of which group was responsible for the crashes that have occurred. We need to improve on the ways we already address the problems. Let's start with THEM.

THEM - The careless, reckless automobile drivers who through no fault of our own kill and maim US every year.

We all know about "Motorcycle Awareness" and we push it hard. We have bumper stickers, signs, t-shirts, drivers training volunteers, and public service announcements. We have motorcycle awareness month.

But, what works, and what is a waste of time? I'd argue none of it is a "waste" of time because any effort is a useful effort, but we need to get the best bang for our buck. And I mean OUR buck, because we bikers primarily are the ones who finance these programs. The federal and state government seems more interested in mandatory safety gear, than they are in taking an aggressive approach to crash prevention.

We need to encourage the Secretary of State and Office of Highway Safety Planning to assist us in educating people on how to drive around motorcyclists, and LOOK for motorcyclists. ABATE of Michigan recently lobbied for and had legislation passed that increased the fines and penalties for right of way violations. That should be an incentive to those cagers who know and care, but we really want to focus on drivers seeing us, respecting our right to be on the road, and learning how to drive around us for the BEST results.

US - Are we a Brother-Sisterhood? Is that low wave thing just a farce or does it actually mean something?

I have motorcycle accidents in Michigan news articles auto sent to my email every day. Today there were two stories, both involved bikers who died and were at fault, and for both, alcohol was a factor. Neither wore a helmet which may or may not have made a difference. If someone had intervened,

stepped in and took action for these guys before they got on their bikes it would definitely have made a difference. As it stands, it makes us look bad in more ways than one.

We all know our friends we ride with, and we all know their abilities and limitations. It should be a matter of course to stop a risky situation from becoming a terrible one. Hiding keys, pulling coil wires, finding rides for friends, or providing a cot..... you all know what I am talking about, it's responsibility not just for ourselves but our biker family that comes with liberty.

Another one of the biggest problems we have is un-endorsed riders. Seriously, half of the non-cager related crashes in Michigan each year involve a rider without a cycle endorsement. Now that does not mean that a cycle endorsement makes you a better rider necessarily but it does mean that a lot of inexperienced, untrained, people are buying a motorcycle and going out and getting in crashes that impact all of us. If you know one, deal with them.

Insurance. Part of liberty is personal responsibility. Make sure you have as much medical coverage as you can afford, and Uninsured and Underinsured coverage. This has nothing to do with helmets. Wear one or not, if you crash it's going to likely result in some injuries, often severe, and always expensive to heal and treat. Nuff said.

The last and maybe most important aspect of personal responsibility in my opinion is to join, and support, a motorcyclists rights organization. I recommend ABATE of Michigan, but decide for yourself. Tar snakes, Cheese cutters, Intelligent Transportation road engineering, Traffic lights, Parking, Rules of the Road, Insurance issues, Motorcycle construction, are all government regulated aspects to our safety and well-being when we ride. Government is not going out of business in the near future, and we need to be there and be relevant when the stuff that pertains to us is up for consideration or needs to be.



She started riding when she was only 12 years old, on a cousin's Honda 250. Later, while on active duty in the Air Force, she rode a 350 Honda daily to & from work on the cold swing shift in England. She learned motorcycle mechanics when her timing chain went out & she tore down the engine & rebuilt it herself.

Because more than 20 years had passed since she last rode, Chelle took a motorcycle riding course & got her endorsement. She immediately bought a 1994 Harley Davidson Electra Glide with a Voyager trike kit installed. Two weeks later, she trailered it to Sturgis, S.D. for the Black Hills rally. She put 1500 miles on the trike during that trip. Four months and 4,000 miles later, she decided she liked riding enough to justify a new motorcycle.

Through her commitment to the Hogs and Heroes Foundation, she performs community service at Walter Reed hospital, where she's met many wounded warriors. She joined the Patriot Guard Riders (PGR) (http://www.patriotguard.org/), whose mission is to "1) Show our sincere respect for our fallen heroes, their families, and their communities. 2) Shield the mourning family and their friends from interruptions created by any protestor or group of protestors". As a PGR member, she performs duty as escort to burials at Arlington National Cemetery of active duty military personnel killed in the

line of duty, stands flag lines at funeral homes receiving remains of recently recovered Vietnam veterans, and occasionally participates in welcoming home troops from wars in Afghanistan and Iraq. "I try to participate in at least one PGR mission each month", she said. "Sometimes I can schedule a day off, but other times I have to take vacation to participate because ANC burials are always during the weekday. Riding to or from, and standing, sometimes for hours, in the heat, the cold, the rain & snow are small inconveniences compared to the sacrifices these troops and their families made. It is one small act I can do to show my appreciation.", she says.

While serving brunch to veterans at Annapolis Harley Davidson as a Hogs and Heroes volunteer, Free Spirit negotiated her new trike purchase. There she met Tracy Hoover from Truckin 4 Troops (http://www.truckin4troops.com/) who introduced her to Brian Brashears. She discussed her design with Brian - something special - a patriotic theme. The second of three generations of female veterans, she wanted a trike that sent a message—one that captured her passion. Thanks to the work of Brian's Premier Collision Center in Edgewater, the 56-year-old Air Force veteran and her ride are getting attention everywhere they go.

Free Spirit's new motorcycle features an all-encompassing American flag design that flows throughout the machine. To reflect her history as an avionics technician and aircraft mechanic in the Air Force, the tank is painted with two of the many aircraft she once performed maintenance on, a C-141 dropping paratroopers and an A-10 Warthog. The front fairing sports an eagle holding the POW-MIA flag in one claw, and a KIA-WIA flag in the other. Chelle says the Prisoners of War – Missing in Action flag is common, but the Killed in Action – Wounded in Action flag is rarely seen. Her funeral escorts and wounded warrior projects prompted the KIA-WIA tribute.

Above that, the windshield is coated with a decorative sunscreen featuring the Vietnam Women's Memorial. The crowning glory is the design at the back of the trike. Taking up almost the entire cargo panel stands an air-brushed portrait of Chelle with her mother and daughter, all military veterans.

The composite portrait is made from 4 different pictures she provided the airbrush artist, Tim Lewis. He sketched these by free hand so realistically it looks like a snapshot. Behind them is the restored gate of ArlingtonNationalCemetery, which houses the memorial to Women in Military Service to America (WIMSA) (http://www.womensmemorial.org/). Chelle, her mother, and daughter are charter members of WIMSA. The trike is topped off with a Virginia special Armed Forces Veteran tag numbered "WIMSA".



"This trike is a tribute to women in the military," Chelle said. "Often, women are not recognized when people think of veterans. I am one of few women who have three generations of women in the military, something I'm extremely proud of!"

The day she picked up the rike from the paint shop, she rode directly from Edgewater, MD to Arlington National Cemetery (ANC) o join a PGR escort. In an eerie coincidence, the service was for the first emale veteran Chelle had participated in. "It was just meant to be!" she said. No other activity would have been a fitting first ride for ner tribute trike. She went directly from ANC to the WIMSA business office, where she met Brigadier

General (retired) Wilma Vaught, WIMSA president. General Vaught gladly stood with Free Spirit for pictures next to the trike. The General invited her to participate in the 15th anniversary of the WIMSA Memorial, scheduled for October 19-20, 2012.

Chelle's road name "Free Spirit" is painted on the tour pack. "I pretty much do what I want to do when I want to do it, and I travel far and wide", she says as an explanation to the road name. As evidence, just 3 days after getting it back from the paint shop, her christening ride (solo) was a 2,600 mile trip to Key West, FL by way of Clearwater, and return to her home in Alexandria, VA.

She doesn't trailer the trike anywhere now. Chelle frequently enters the trike in motorcycle shows. Her first, at Daytona Bike Week in Daytona Beach, FL brought second place in the trike/sidecar class at the Harley Davidson ride in custom motorcycle show. Her trophy was presented by the infamous Willie G. Davidson, grandson of the founder, just before he announced his retirement. She usually places, occasionally taking first place in her category. She's running out of room on the corner shelf reserved for the awards

But, this trike is not just for show. Chelle rides it every opportunity she gets, often for business trips. She rode it to Clearwater, FL, Montreal, Canada, Atlanta, GA, and Louisville, KY for meetings with an international aviation committee.

Free Spirit recently returned from her second Black Hills Motorcycle Rally in Sturgis, SD – this time she rode there and back - 14 days, 13 states, and 4500 miles! She has accumulated 23,000 miles on the trike in the seven months since it came out of the custom paint shop. Along with the mileage on her first trike, she earned her 25,000 mile patch about a year after she started riding again.

Tech Tips By Steve

would like to apologize for not writing you great people an article last month. I was in Europe visiting my son Adam, and just could not get the article done. I hope you enjoyed the article that was written by the Goldwingdocs, they did a great job!

This month I have a few special thoughts!

Germany, Czech Republic, Italy and France. As I was touring the countryside I got to see the road differences from the States and Europe, I was focused mostly on the type and size of two-wheeled fun going on out there. We saw mostly BMW and Ducati and very few Harley-Davidson motorcycles. They seem to favor the on off ride looking motorcycles there, like the BMW GS in the picture below, however there were a lot of others like the Yamaha, Honda, and Ducati.



There are many more mopeds over in Italy ... Tons of mopeds everywhere and few motorcycles. Then we traveled over to France (where we only visited Paris) and I saw motorcycles start to outpace mopeds, but still a plethora of mopeds! The one thing I did enjoy seeing is how they use their two-wheeled devices for their every day transportation. They use their two wheels for doing everything from just going back and forth to work, to getting the groceries, to delivering pizza and other yummy food treats. I had an excellent time over in Europe and enjoyed looking at what kind of motorcycles and mopeds they ride and how they use their motorcycles with the limited time I was there. Inner city cobblestone roads are horrible, and WOW could I make a ton on brake replacements... crazy, crazy, crazy driving in the city!



Okay, so now onto the tech tips for this month.

I know I keep harping on this, but please take the time to check your bike out before riding it. One of the most important things that gets neglected is tire pressure and the front tire is usually the low air culprit. This leads to some very sluggish turning and can be very sloppy handling so please take a look at your tire pressure!

Also, remember to get good gasoline, if you can find pure gasoline that is. If not, run fuel additives like Amsoil or Rocket Fuel through once in a while and that will keep things burning well and clean.

The use of more and more ethanol in our fuel is making our bikes a target for a lot of maintenance ... remember that ethanol is corrosive and it can make a mess of your metal fuel tanks unless you have a stainless steel or plastic gas tank, which most of us do not. If you think you are going to leave typical pump gas ethanol mix in your motorcycle for more than a week make sure you use a little bit of fuel conditioner to counteract this problem. Ethanol can also wreak havoc on rubber gas lines, peel tank sealer off and can destroy the aluminum in EFI induction systems and carburetor bodies.

Another item you twin cam people need to be aware of ... at least the 2007 models and older (2006 for you Dyna people)... is the cam chain tensioner pads. I am still getting a few bikes in my shop that have not been either converted to the new hydraulic style tensioners, or have a gear drive system. Not doing this upgrade soon may jeopardize your engine, and again I am not trying to scare you I'm trying to save you money in the long run. I keep seeing these shoes disintegrated every time we take these bikes apart. I just had a good customer of mine come in to upgrade his cams and decided to go with the S&S cam gear drive system for his Dyna and sure enough we took it apart and at 30,000 miles his timing chain tensioning shoes were almost totally disintegrated and all over the inside of the engine.




Spark Plugs ... what to look for and what is new?

The spark plug really has not changed too much for the most part in years, however a few years ago a company called Enerpulse brought us a new pulse powered product to the marketplace. PCI technology can be used to better the products you use day to day by making them more efficient and useful.

Here's how it works: Electrical energy is stored in a capacitor. At the exact moment needed, that energy is released in an amazingly powerful and quick (two nanosecond) high-energy pulse.

The result: When integrated into a spark plug, for example, the improved combustion efficiency burns fuel sooner and more effectively, which equals improved mileage (MPG), less CO2 based emissions, and better overall drivability. This new technology is based on plasma research supported by Sandia National Laboratories.




As seen here, PCI technology can be used to turn a simple spark plug into a high-energy, high-efficiency ignition product. With a built-in PCI circuit, Enerpulse can build a plug that has a conversion efficiency of 50% as opposed to the industry standard of less than 1%. I can tell you I have installed over a hundred of these little wonders in customers bikes and everyone loves them, I get all kinds of positive feedback: from my bike has never rode so good to better fuel economy, simply put ... they work well.

The mighty oil change!

A very simple task, but there are a few little tricks to the mighty oil change that I would like to share with you. To make sure you get all the oil and impurities out you have to begin with a well warmed up engine, yes this means your hands might get a little warm from the hot oil so be careful. After you get your motorcycle all warmed up make sure your pan will take a little over 4 quarts of liquid, this will give you a little wiggle room when you dump the oil. Most bikes have anywhere between 3.25 and 3.75 quarts of used oil that will drain out. Second, make sure you have the correct drain plug, for instance a FLH has three separate oil plugs underneath it, one for the engine, one for the transmission

and one for the primary. The picture below shows the transmission and engine oil which are close to each other. If you are changing the engine oil and it comes out clean, oops you have opened the wrong cavity.



Before you reinstall the drain plug make sure you clean it well, replace the old ring or the crush washer and put a little bit of Teflon tape or liquid onto the threads, doing this has a bonus... you won't be bored while the engine oil is draining from your bike and you want to make sure that it's completely drained as much as possible.... so don't rush it.

When taking the oil filter off make sure the filter o-ring comes off too, although very rare, the o-ring can stay on the engine and when you put the new filter on it will double the o-ring and leak. After you make sure the coast is clear apply a thin film of oil to the new filters sealing ring and install tightening it one half to three quarters of a turn after the filter o-ring touches according to Harley

After all the oil is drained and you put the drain plug back in to torque specs, add the oil, but do this in steps. If the system takes about 3.25 or more add roughly 3 quarts, fire the engine for a minute stop it, check for leaks and recheck the oil level according to the owner's manual. Some bikes need to be level and some bikes need to be on the kickstand to determine if they are properly filled with oil. Add the appropriate amount to bring it to the full level, and then get the bike warm and check it again. Make sure you do not overfill the crankcase this can build up pressure inside your crankcase and start making things leak and that can make for a sad day over a simple oil change.

(Second in a series of World-Class, State Based, Motorcycle Builders we have in Michigan)

If you don't recognize him from one of the Discovery Channel show(s) he's been on. (Such as the Biker Build-Off episode against Cory Ness) I'd like to introduce you to Eric Gorges, from Voodoo Choppers. While talking with Eric at his new Auburn Hills, Michigan shop I found out a lot that I didn't know about him and Voodoo Choppers. First of all, he's a lot more laid-back than a lot of other builders. He's a quiet, unassuming sort of guy. Eric believes whole-heartily in letting his work speak for itself. "The quality of the build is the highest priority". (He also digs listening to jazz while working.) That sometimes whichever career we start with is not always the one you stay with. And today, Eric Gorges is exactly where he wants to be

Like Detroit itself, Eric's story is one of repurposing and rebuilding. After a devastating health crisis in the late 90s, Eric, a self-confessed IT nerd, walked away from a lucrative corporate career for good. At that period in his life, he knew three very simple things; he loved bikes, he loved working with his hands and he needed a job. He sought out Ron Fournier at Fournier Enterprises in Shelby Twp., one of the best metal shapers in the country and eventually signed on as his apprentice.

Starting in the business from the ground floor up, with Ron as his handcrafting guru, Eric started working on vintage cars and building "one of a kind" hot rods. In April of 1999, with years of building and design work under his belt, he decided to strike out on his own and Voodoo Choppers was born. For this fiercely independent entrepreneur, a custom bike shop was the only way to go. Says Gorges, "I didn't want to



assemble bikes, buying parts from suppliers and bolting everything together. I wanted to be able to build whatever I could dream and didn't want to be constrained by other people's ideas." Moreover, as the dad of an eight year old daughter, Gorges views this work as more than just a way to make a living. In a disposable world, he regards craftsmanship as a lasting and loving legacy to future generations. Having so far built over 100 motorcycles, it seems that Eric has already left quite a legacy.

If you ask Eric what kind of bike he likes to build, he'll say "a 70s style Digger". But he'll quickly follow that up with, "but I will build whatever the customer wants me to build". He builds Bobbers, high necks, even a "Big Mac" (that's a bike, not burger). If you can name it, Voodoo Choppers can do it. He counts early Arlen Ness and the late Chicka as some of his influences. He readily admits, regretting not taking the opportunity to work one time with Indian Larry. He also would like to thank Steve at Stevenson Cycles, FabKevin www.fabkevin.com) and Ron Finch http://finchscustoms.com/

Over the years, Eric's Voodoo Choppers has been featured in international magazines, books, television shows and even a movie. They are truly rolling works of art. He and his team have also built motorcycles, a hot rod tank and a wild wheelie machine for two Discovery Channel series. He built a bike against Cory Ness and he's also worked with Ron Finch on Biker



Build Off, helping to create Double Cross, (he also helped Ron with Finicky).

Nowadays, he stays very busy doing what he does best. It could be a 'ReBirth'. This is where you supply a donor bike, and Voodoo Choppers will re-engineer the frame and add all the other good things but still give you the factory title, the factory VIN pads, etc. All this plus the seamless workmanship Eric is famous for. Or step all the way up to a hand-crafted, one off, custom motorcycle. How about just a new gas/oil tank, fenders, a tail-light, starter button, set of bars or exhaust or maybe a set of forward controls? Even a front end or complete frame, Voodoo Choppers can do it all.




