


The Can Am Spyder has always looked like something fun to ride from the commercials. That is why going to Bike Week was perfect. All the manufacturers bring the new models to get you, the rider, on their product in hopes you will buy. After we went through the sign in process, video on operating it and taking a closed course test, it was time to take it out.

The first thing I noticed was the shifting being different than other motorcycles. You simply twist the throttle and click through the gears on the left side with your thumb. No clutch, no letting off the throttle. They want you to keep those RPMs up and don't let up as you shift. As you slow down, it downshifts automatically. Braking is just one pedal as and it slows all 3 wheels at the same time. They made this vehicle so smooth so that anyone can get on it and enjoy riding it. You're out there to enjoy the ride plain and simple.

The touring model I was on had a very smooth ride, plus, it had all the bells and whistles. You can raise and lower the windshield as you ride, listen to music, adjust heated grips and more options we weren't informed of when we went. As we started out of the parking lot you notice how quick it responds to how hard you twist the throttle as you click through the gears. Turning is easy as there is no leaning required. You just turn the handle bars the direction you want to go. It handled the highway speeds as easy as it did lower speeds on the streets downtown. Overall a very positive experience and something to consider if you've never ridden one. For this rider it was a lot of fun to ride.

Across the United States, "retreats" have opened up to help wounded warriors and their families adjust to life back in the U.S. and "wind down" from the war. There are probably more in Michigan, but I am going to tell you about two that I know of.

A very generous individual donated Wilwin Lodge to the American Legion, department of Michigan. Wilwin Lodge is located in the Upper Peninsula northwest of Trout Lake. From their web site: http://www.wilwin.org, Wilwin is on property that once hosted a large lumbering operation, complete with a mill, railroad spurs and it's own village. It is now a peaceful retreat deep in the north woods of Michigan's Upper Peninsula.

The lodge sleeps up to 15 people in a total of 6 bedrooms. With a 2 story atrium and dual stone fireplaces, it's a stunning building. The property consists of nearly 600 wooded acres, a total of 5 buildings, including the lodge and Soldier's retreat, and nearly 10 miles of well-maintained trails.

Wilwin has three missions:

Mission #1: Provide free rest and recuperation vacations for returning service members and their families.

Mission #2: Add other uses and be self-sustaining in 5 years.

Mission #3: Improve and increase facilities and capacity for more uses and be established as a permanent function of The American Legion in 10 years.

Individuals who are interested in staying at Wilwin can fill out the application located at http://www.michiganlegion.org/pdfs/ wilwin application.pdf

A recent retreat in progress is Camp Santo. Camp Santo is run by Jim Santo and is located near Shepherd, near the Isabella county line. Jim recently obtained 501c3 status for Camp Santo. The camp consists of 20 acres that are wooded with a river running through it. The "bunkhouse" is a work in progress.

Jim is a combat Vietnam vet, and the camp's focus is for combat vets to be able to relax and talk with someone who has "been there, done that", communicate with someone who has shared similar experiences. Another use Jim has for the camp is for a veteran who needs a place to stay for a couple of days.



## The Motorcycle Lawyer on THE LAW Location of the Wire Highway Barriers

In the last issue of this magazine, my column was titled, "Wire Highway Barriers: Cheese Graters for Motorcyclists". As you may recall from the article, wire highway barriers are also called median cable guard rails. They are comprised of cable rope made of steel wire that is mounted on posts that are driven into the ground.

The idea is that the wire barriers prevent a vehicle that has left the roadway from striking another vehicle and creating a more dangerous situation. The barrier stops or reduces the speed of the impacting vehicle. It is usually installed in the grass between opposite traveling express ways.

Michigan increased its use of wire highway barriers in 2008 in large as part of federal monies that were given for certain projects. A major reason this type of barrier is used is because it is the most cost-effective safety barrier available at almost a third of the price of the regular steel guardrail we are used to seeing.

Impact to motorcycles: Certainly motorcyclists benefit from other vehicles being stopped from crossing the median and hitting them—the motorcyclist. But obviously the concern is that these wires present a more serious risk of severe injury and even death to a motorcyclist. Some motorcyclists refer to these wire rope barriers as "widow makers." I have heard talk that if a motorcyclist hits one of these barriers there would be a 'cheese-grater' effect.

This writer's research found that the State of Michigan has outweighed the cost of non-motorcycle vehicle benefit against potential motorcyclists harm. It decided against the motorcyclists — more wire barriers are being installed. They are on the rise.

The most requested information from the calls and e-mails I received after my last article circulated was the location of the wire rope barriers here in Michigan. Therefore, I've compiled a list below. Some stretches of state roadways in MDOTs Southwest Region that have had cable barriers installed include:

- I-94 from Michigan/Indiana state line to Maudlin Road, north of New Buffalo (2009-10).

- I-94 from US-12 to the I-94 Business Loop in Stevensville (Lakeshore Drive) (2009-10).

- I-94 from Park Road in Benton Township to the Kalamazoo/ Van Buren County line (2009).

- I-94 from Kalamazoo/Van Buren county line to 12th Street (2009-10).

- US-131 from West B. Avenue south of Plainwell to 146th Avenue north of Moline (2009-10).

- I-94 from 40th Street east of Galesburg to Old US-27 in Marshall (2010).

- I-196 from 71st Street north to 118th Avenue (2009-10).

- I-196 from 118th Street north to 130th Avenue (2010-11).

Should a motorcyclist wish to complain about the use of these wire barriers in Michigan you may call the Michigan Department Transportation (MDOT) at 517-373-2090.

## **NO-FAULT CHANGES TO VIOLATE BIKERS RIGHT OF WAY**

The Michigan Catastrophic Claims Association is an insurance fund that provides for drivers who are catastrophically injured in an auto accident.

Notice that's "drivers" not riders. As it stands at the moment the only way a biker can collect from the MCCA is if there is an automobile involved. Yeah, you are required by law to pay into the fund for each auto AND motorcycle your insure, but don't expect to collect if you hit a deer on your bike, or crash your bike solo.

The MCCA is made up of representatives from the insurance companies. They supposedly have about \$13.7 billion in the MCCA reserves. Nobody knows for sure because the MCCA is not required to comply with the Open Meetings Act and the Freedom of Information Act. Did I mention the fund is run by a bunch of private company insurance members? Kind of cool to have gotten legislation passed to make your product mandatory for everyone to purchase and allows you to set the price as you see fit, huh? Then top it off with legislation allowing your books to be kept private. What a gig!

Maybe I'm being too rough on them, that board of insurance company members may not even have profit margins on their list of priorities. Maybe we can trust them to only have our best interests in mind, only charging us in accordance with the most fiscally efficient standards possible. Yeah, right.

These guys hate motorcyclists. Why, you may wonder, when the only time they have to cover our costs is when an automobile is involved? Well, that's about half of all motorcycle crashes. And when car meets motorcycle bad things happen to riders, and expensive long term catastrophic medical care is often involved.

These Insurance Czars are making big money off the MCCA grift on our insurance policies. I think we pay around \$175 as a portion of our auto insurance policy for every auto and motorcycle we travel the roads with right now. That portion was \$5.60 in 2000. WTF? They claim the increases are because of increasing payout costs they have each year. Is that the truth? Once again no one knows, and they ain't telling or opening the books. Each year, legislation is introduced in Lansing to make them validate their claims. Each year the top dogs in Lansing make sure those bills never see daylight. Hmmmmm. WTF, but I repeat myself.

So, lets get to the point here as concerns us bikers.

Right now your motorcycle insurance policy covers you until a trigger amount of around \$500,000 dollars is reached. Then MCCA picks up the costs for the rest of your life. Yeah, it's only if a car is involved, but that's a 50% possibility if not higher.

The Insurance Czars have introduced a plan for legislation that would put a Cap on your motorcycle no-fault insurance coverage of \$250,000 dollars. That means you could never hit the trigger number, and never receive MCCA benefits, EVEN IF A DISTRACTED. DRUNK DRIVING. CAR DRIVER **INTENTIONALLY HITS YOU!** 

Get this clear in your head. You will be required to pay into the MCCA fund for every motorcycle you insure, but you will never get a dime out of it. Period. Your insurance policy will not cover you beyond \$250,000 dollars. That's it. Crash, your fault or not, you are capped at a \$250,000 no-fault recovery.

If you're an automobile operator there is no cap, and regardless of whether you're a drunk driver, a crack head, or having sex while driving and talking on your cell phone, you will receive un-capped coverage and unlimited lifetime care and benefits from the MCCA.


If you're not involved in your government, don't think they are not involved in you. Support Abate of Michigan. If you ride, you need representation in Lansing. Do not leave this kind of legislation to the lobbying of Rich Corporate Insurance Lobbies. We have rights. We have a right to travel in or on the vehicle of our choice. We have a right to the same benefits we pay for as any other vehicle operator.



Back in 2010, I started out with a bone stock 2010 Harley-Davidson Road Glide, black in color, and I did not care for it much but I knew I wanted a Road Glide.

I got in touch with a good friend of mine, Matt Shay from Audiowerks Custom Cycles. He had done some work before for me on other bikes that I had and did a great job but this one was going to be a little more detailed. I told Matt my ideas, he loved them and added a few of his own. I wanted it to be white because at the time I would never see a white Road Glide, but plain white would not work for me so I wanted to add something besides skulls and flames so he added the crosses and chains which I think came out great.

Since Matt is an audio expert, I said to him "Let's go nuts on the stereo!" and he knew just what to do! He put 4 6 x 9s in the bags and another set in the lowers then put in a set of 6 1/2 in the dash, all Hertz high energy with a Kenwood Double deck in the dash with 2 Ark audio Amps.

When he first turned it on we could not believe this was coming out of a bike! I was blown away, it's louder than most cars. It's by far the loudest bike to come out of his shop. Matt cut and raked the frame for the front 26 inch wheel that I have to say looks amazing. He then stretched the tank, the bags and the rear fender, covered the seat to match then had Todd Cycles make a set a bars that look great on the bike.

After it was all said and done I was very happy with the outcome! As I was telling Matt so, he told me he had a little surprise for me - I was blown away again to see he had installed a remote start with flame thrower he thought it would be a nice touch.... I thought so too!!





## How to Prevent (and if that doesn't work... Repair) Cross Threaded Fasteners!

# **SHOP 101**

### Cross-threading is more than just

an annoyance - cross-threading a fastener can cause serious, expensive damage to your motorcycle! Cross thread something like a spark plug into the soft aluminum head (very easy to do!) and you will be in for a world of hurt trying to fix it. Even cross-threading everyday fasteners like ordinary nuts and bolts can do damage.


What is cross-threading? It means the threads on the male part of a rotating fastener aren't correctly lined up with the female part of the fastener. It's usually caused when one of the parts of the fastener is slightly tilted when it is tightened. Instead of the lands and grooves of the threads lining up and sliding along one another, the threads cut across one another, causing damage. The more it's forced, the more damage occurs, to the point where the fastener becomes "stripped" - the threads are so damaged, that the fastener will no longer tighten correctly.

(Stripping a fastener can also occur when it is tightened beyond design limits, causing the threads to break - this is why you should use a torque wrench!)

Spark plugs are infamous for cross-threading. The fork tube covers (wide, thin threads) are also easily cross-threaded. The larger in diameter the fastener, and the finer the threads, the more susceptible the fastener is to cross-threading. Not to say that coarse (wide, more distant) threaded fasteners can't be crossthreaded! You can even cross-thread the lid on a peanut butter jar if you try hard enough!

You can detect a cross-threaded fastener usually because it "binds" as you turn it. Normally fasteners should rotate freely until they are fully tight. If the fastener starts to bind, or give resistance when it is only partway in, gently back it out, adjust the angle, and try again.

If the bolt is torqued in even though you feel resistance, meaning it is cross-threaded, it will shave away metal on both the male and female parts of the fastener, weakening the threads:





#### How to prevent cross-threading

So...how do you prevent this? Diligence and attention is always a good way. However, there is a very simple technique which I have used for many, many years. I don't know that anyone taught it to me, I suspect I just figured it out on my own. However, it works on every threaded fastener, and I use it every single time I screw any fastener into place, even bottle caps and jar lids! It works every time.

The secret: Screw the fastener in place BACKWARD. That's right, turn the fastener backwards instead of forward. If you normally twist the bolt clockwise to tighten it, instead twist it counter-clockwise. Do this until you hear/feel it click. This is the end of the male thread going past the end of the female thread. Once you feel this, you know the threads are perfectly aligned, and you can tighten the fastener normally





Taps (the long thin pieces) are used to cut threads in holes, and dies (the roundish pieces) are used to cut threads on rods. They are made of very hard, high-strength carbon steel.

Normally taps and dies are used to cut threads in things that aren't already threaded - (i.e. you can drill a hole in some metal, then use a tap to create threads in the hole.) Or you can take a metal rod, and use a die to make it into a threaded rod. However, they are also good for repairing damaged threads.

#### You will need

- Tap and die of the correct size and thread pitch (this is important! Using the wrong size or pitch will destroy your fastener even more!)
- Tapping lubricant

Use the lubricant to lubricate the tap, die, bolt, hole, everything. Not using lubricant is a good way to destroy your tap/die and guickly destroy the threads in the piece you are trying to repair

Gently insert the tap into the hole or the nut, and make sure the threads are lined up correctly. This is not the time to cross-thread again, because the tap will very easily cut across the existing threads! Gently twist the tap in and let the threads guide it. As it encounters damaged threads, you will feel a very gentle resistance. It's ok to keep pushing through.



For the other end, you want to thread the die onto the end of the bolt, again being very careful not to cross-thread it as you twist it on. The same procedure goes as for the tap - let the threads guide it into place, and push it through gentle resistance to repair the threads.






When you've moved past the damage, gently turn it backwards until it comes free.

A quick warning: It's entirely possible that you will cut damaged metal threads away from the fastener with the tap or die as you twist it. Particularly on spark plug holes, you don't want this metal falling into the engine! Use plenty of tapping lubricant, and every time you push through any resistance, back the tap out and clean any metal off before reapplying lubricant and starting again.

this endeavor was, never lost his edge-or his sailor roots. A strongly opinionated libertarian and genius level prankster, Jerry was the definition of a social chameleon. Whether reciting poetry on his radio program "Old Ironsides" or tattooing, Jerry lived life to the fullest-with a bigger than life persona more akin to the sailors of yesteryear.

#### "Good work ain't cheap. Cheap work ain't good." ~ Norman "Sailor Jerry" Collins

A Sailor Jerry tattoo was characterized by bold unwavering lines with a refined use of color and amazing detail (the riggings in his clipper ship tattoos were nautically accurate). His one-of-a-kind work combined America design and traditions with Asiatic color and sensibilities. His visionary style is revered to this day.

Collins entrusted his artwork to his two protégés, Ed Hardy and Mike Malone, both of whom have become prominent figures in their own right. Hardy, who turned down an MFT scholarship to Yale in order to pursue tattooing, is known for his artistic sophistication and large-scale tattoos. In fact, many fans of Ed Hardy and his work, don't realize that the real inspiration for his work came from his mentor - Sailor Jerry. Malone, who designed under the name "Rollo Banks", and was known for his conceptual boldness and distinctive designs, died in 2007.



#### Key Classic Tattoo Components for Sailor Jerry:

#### Nautical Star ~

These generally represented the North Star, which historically had been used to navigate. The symbolism alludes to keeping a sailor on course, heading home.



For a sailor, the anchor represents stability and security. Often times you will see an anchor emblazoned with "Mom" or the name of a loved one. The idea is that these are the people that keep them grounded. Over the years, anchors have become increasingly popular within the tattoo culture - and the symbolism remains the same.

#### Swallow ~

In addition to indicating that a sailor had sailed 5000 miles, swallows are also associated with the idea of return. This "return" symbolism is rooted in two ideas. The first was the swallow's famous migration pattern, always returning home to San Juan Capistrano. Second, it was believed that if a sailor dies at sea, birds carry his soul home to heaven.

#### Pig and Rooster ~

The superstition behind this has to do with the wooden cages where roosters and pigs were kept in on ships. When ships wrecked, the lightweight wooden frames became personal flotation devices, giving them a surprising survival rate. A sailor hoping for good luck would get a rooster on top of the right foot and a pig on top of the left.

#### The Golden Dragon ~

During Sailor Jerry's day, Asia was a distant exotic place - so sailors who served at an Asian station memorialized it on their skin with the symbol of a dragon. Dragons also marked the crossing of the International Date Line and other Asiatic crossings. Non-sailors like dragons for their Chinese meaning of strength and luck.

#### Hearts ~

A sailor staring down a long stint at seaincluding the possibility of not returning home-often wanted a heart to keep his loved ones close. Sometimes these hearts were just images. Other times, they read "Mom" or featured the name of a special girl. Hearts still remain one of the most popular tattoos for both sailors and civilians.


you don't know who Sailor Jerry is, you don't know tattoos. Norman "Sailor Jerry" Collins (1911-1973) is considered the foremost American tattoo artist of his time, and defined the craft in two eras: BSJ and ASJ (before and after Sailor Jerry). Arguably, he did more for the ancient art of tattoo than most any other single person.

You see, there aren't many men like Norman "Sailor Jerry" Collins around anymore. The father of old-school tattooing, Sailor Jerry was a true classic in every sense of the word. A tough old sea dog with a shrewd intellect, Jerry stood up for himself and stood by his work earning him a legacy that is still felt today.

It was clear from an early age that Norman was destined to leave his mark. Born on the west coast in 1911, Collins soon gained the moniker "Jerry" after his father noticed a similar disposition between the young troublemaker and the family's cantankerous mule. By his teens, "Jerry" was hand-poking Pelikan ink tattoos as he ventured around the country hopping freight trains. At 19, he arrived in Chicago, cutting his tattoo chops in the infamous arcades of State Street. Shortly afterwards, Sailor Jerry enlisted in the US Navy. It was during his travels at sea that he was exposed to the art and imagery of Southeast Asia. Artistically, his influence stems from his union of the roguish attitude of the American sailor with the mysticism and technical prowess of the Far East. He maintained a close correspondence with Japanese tattoo masters throughout his career.

Sailor Jerry regarded tattoos as the ultimate rebellion against "the Squares". His legendary sense of humor is oft reflected in his work-- but he was never one to compromise his professionalism or take his craft and responsibilities lightly.

Finishing his naval stint in the late 20s, Collins decided to settle in the then "remote" island of Oahu, Hawaii. In some ways, his timing could not have been better (or worse, depending on who you ask!). This "last outpost" would soon become the stomping ground for over a million soldiers and sailors, all of whom were ready to live life to the fullest-usually contained within a 48-hour Honolulu shore leave! And so, for the next 40 years, Sailor Jerry had a constant canvas of carousing military men to obsessively perfect his deftly crafted, boldly lined, style that incorporated both American designs and traditions with Asiatic coloring and sensibilities. His one-of-a-kind tattoos and flash would eventually find their way into the highly secretive world of Japanese tattoo masters known as "Horis." Thus, Jerry became one of the first American tattoo artists to correspond directly with these masters, trading colors, designs and techniques. Yet Jerry, as high-minded and noble as
