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
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


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


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
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
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#### Fall colors, time to ride north!



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
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#### VA Focuses National Attention on Suicide Prevention Month 2013 Collaborates with Communities to Help Veterans Access Mental Health Support

WASHINGTON — In recognition of September as Suicide Prevention Month, the Department of Veterans Affairs is mobilizing people and organizations nationwide to support Veterans in crisis and spread the word about VA mental health services.

Throughout the month, VA suicide prevention coordinators at all 151 VA medical centers will organize community events, host health fairs, lead training sessions and work with VA Voluntary Service to improve Veterans' lives. VA is also launching a new Suicide Prevention Month public service announcement, "Talking About It Matters" nationwide in September.

"VA's highest priority is the mental health and well-being of the brave men and women who have served our Nation. Even one suicide is one too many," said Secretary of Veterans Affairs Eric K. Shinseki, "va is a leader in providing highquality mental health care that improves and saves Veterans' lives. We know that treatment works, and there is hope for Veterans who seek mental health care."

This year's theme, "It Matters," emphasizes the people, relationships and experiences that matter to Veterans and their loved ones, reinforcing their personal connections and giving their lives hope and meaning. To spark conversation about the difficult topics of suicide risk and prevention, VA will unveil a photo-sharing campaign, "Show Us What Matters," and will invite Veterans and their loved ones to upload photos of the special people in their lives to VeteransCrisisLine.net/

"When a Veteran is in crisis, even one small act can make a lifesaving difference," said Dr. Robert A. Petzel, VA's Under Secretary for Health. "It's up to all of us to understand the signs of crisis and look out for the Veterans in our lives. And when we are concerned, we need to reach out and tell someone."

Throughout the summer and through September, VA is holding Mental Health Summits at all 151 VA medical centers to further engage community partners, Veteran Service Organizations, health care providers and local governments, and to address the broad mental health needs of Veterans and their families and show them they matter. VA is calling on supporters to educate their networks to recognize suicide warning signs and encourage Veterans in crisis to call the Veterans Crisis Line (1-800-273-8255 and Press 1), chat online at VeteransCrisisLine.net/ Chat or text to 838255 – even if they are not registered with VA or enrolled in VA health care. All Veterans Crisis Line resources are optimized for mobile devices.

"We urge Veterans' loved ones—and everyone—to show support for Veterans during Suicide Prevention Month and throughout the year." said Dr. Janet Kemp. director of VA's Suicide Prevention Program, "Learn to recognize the risk of suicide and let Veterans know that caring, confidential support is only a call, click or text away. Families, friends and co-workers need to work together to provide a network of support for Veterans in our communities. We're all in this together."

Anyone can support Veterans by:

Encouraging a Veteran who needs help to call the Veterans Crisis Line. Remind them that it takes courage to seek help.



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## The Motorcycle Lawyer on THE LAW

# What is Michigan's Motorcycle Endorsement?

If you mention Michigan's motorcycle endorsement to somebody who lives outside the State of Michigan, you're likely to get a blank stare in response. Often, they will reply "Oh, you mean a motorcycle license?" In fact, Michigan's motorcycle endorsement is not a separate driver's license, but a special qualification on your regular driver's license that allows you to legally ride a motorcycle in Michigan. The designation for a driver with a motorcycle endorsement is CY.

#### What is a motorcycle?

Before we go into what you need to do to get your endorsement, let's define what constitutes a motorcycle. According to Michigan Compiled Law (MCL) 257.31, a motorcycle is "every motor vehicle having a saddle or seat for the use of the rider and designed to travel on not more than three wheels in contact with the ground but excluding a tractor." It is important to understand that this definition is different than the definition of "motorcycle" used in Michigan's No-Fault law, and may also differ from the definition provided in your vehicle insurance policies.

#### How do you get a motorcycle endorsement?

In order to get a motorcycle endorsement, you first need a regular driver's license. Once you have that, you need to:

Pass both a vision test and written test at a Secretary of State office.

Pass a rider skills test from a certified testing organization, or complete a certified safety course.

Bring proof that you passed the test or completed the course to a Secretary of State office, along with enough money to cover the cost of the endorsement. The initial endorsement costs \$13.50, and renewals are only \$5.

#### Is a trike a bike?

In fact, three-wheeled bikes (trikes) are not covered by a regular motorcycle endorsement. There is a separate driving test and endorsement for trike riders in order for them to be legal on the roads. Michigan's Law, MCL 257.312b(3) covers that: "A motorcycle endorsement issued to a person who operates a 3-wheeled motorcycle or an autocycle shall be restricted to operation of that type of motorcycle and does not permit operation of a 2-wheeled motorcycle. The Secretary of State shall develop a driving test specifically pertaining to an autocycle or a 3-wheeled motorcycle."

#### Why do you need a motorcycle endorsement?

If you are pulled over and do not have a valid motorcycle endorsement, it could cost you two points on your driver's license and cause you to pay a fine. That's not the worst of it though; I have worked with several clients who were in crashes without having a valid motorcycle endorsement. In those cases, the defense attorney tried to paint my client as inexperienced and flouting the law.

Obviously, not having an endorsement does not necessarily mean you are inexperienced. To combat the defense's argument, I show how long my client has been riding, all the training and experience they have, and how it was actually the car or truck driver's conduct that caused the crash.

If you are in a crash, not having a motorcycle endorsement doesn't limit your eligibility to receive no-fault benefits if they are otherwise payable; as long as a "motor vehicle" such as a car, truck, tractor trailer, and so on was "involved" in the crash, and you own and insure the bike you are riding when the crash occurs, you can still be eligible for no-fault benefits, even without a motorcycle endorsement.

If you ride, I recommend obtaining a motorcycle endorsement; It's The Law. Why subject yourself to two points on your license and a fine? Further, in a crash scenario, why even give the negligent driver's lawyer the chance to claim that you were acting illegal and are inexperienced? For fifteen bucks and a little bit of your time, they won't have the chance.

## Tribute to the Beirut Barracks Bombing

Donnie Gene Phipps, Jr., of Taylor, served in the United States Marine Corps from 1981 to 1985, in the 1st Battalion, 8th Marines Bravo Company, 2nd Platoon. In 1982, U.S. Marines were deployed to Beirut, Lebanon as a peace keeping force, along with units from Italy, France and the United Kingdom.

In the early morning hours of October 23rd, 1983, a truck carrying 2000 pounds of explosives was driven into the barracks at the airport where they were stationed. The blast leveled the four story building and killed 241 U.S. service personnel, the true beginning

> Donnie Gene is here today to tell the story because on Friday, October 21st, he was called away to the American Embassy, about five miles from the barracks, to serve Embassy Guard duty. The attack took place two days later, and sadly, two of his close friends lost their lives that day

In 2008, for the 25th anniversary of the attack, Dion Miller of Dr. Dion's Painting in Wyandotte painted Donnie Gene's 2002 Harley Davidson Standard FLHP, a retired police bike. Both saddlebags and fairing display the image of the memorial in Camp Lejeune, Jacksonville, North Carolina, along with the names of friends that survived, and those that

October 23rd will mark the 30th anniversary of the Beirut Barracks Bombing, and on a happier note, Donnie Gene is still in contact with several friends from the Marine Corps that survived the attack. This

month, he and his wife, Nicole will ride with them to Camp Lejeune in Jacksonville, North Carolina, to visit the memorial and remember those who were lost. He sends out a special thanks to his Marine brothers and their families for being a huge part of his life over the past 32 years.

Those who know him recognize him a mile away from the gigantic American flag that flaps from the flappole attached to his bike. If you've seen him on the road, now you know his story.

#### "2 MILLION BIKERS TO DC" TRUMPS "MILLION MUSLIM MARCH"

A few dozen demonstrators attending a rally on the National Mall, once billed as the "Million Muslim March", were vastly outnumbered by hundreds of thousands of motorcycle riders from across America participating in the "2 Million Bikers to DC" ride to honor September 11 victims and to counter the pro-Muslim rally that many said was inappropriate for such a solemn day in

The American Muslim Political Action Committee scheduled the rally to draw attention to what it said is an unfair and ongoing fear of Muslims after the Sept 11 terrorist attacks. Among the bikers, however, the provocatively scheduled rally was considered an insult to the nearly 3,000 people who died on Sept. 11, 2001, when Islamic terrorists hijacked three commercial jets and crashed them into the World Trade Center buildings in New York and the Pentagon in Arlington. Another hijacked plane headed for Washington, D.C. crashed near Shanksville, Pennsylvania.

Though the biker gathering fell short of 2 million strong, some estimates ran as high as 880,000 riders, and "What began as an idea on Facebook quickly turned into a national movement thanks to social media and dedicated bikers from around the nation," wrote the Examiner.com; and as bikers from as far away as the west coast began their journey to D.C., Twitter lit up with photos and videos showing thousands of bikes overflowing out of rest stops and parking lots as the hastily organized ride gained momentum.

So many turned out that plans to have them ride through the streets of the Capital had to be changed, particularly in light of the fact that local authorities denied a permit that would have provided the riders a police escort through traffic -- a sore spot with organizers who believe the denial was for political purposes.

"We didn't need a permit in the first place," National Event Organizer Belinda Bee told a local Fox News station, citing D.C. law; "it shall not be an offense to assemble or parade on a District street, sidewalk, or other public way, or in a District park, without having provided notice or obtained an approved assembly plan." So the event went on -- legally -- without the permit, although the group apologized to the public that "What could have been a one or two hour ride through" tied up Beltway traffic from early morning into the afternoon.

Co-founders Belinda Bee and "Top Fuel" Bill Williamson credited everyone who helped with the unprecedented success of this year's ride, and promised another ride next year, "and every year for September 11."

"Sending out a BIG Thank You to all who supported and cheered on the 2 Million Bikers to DC ride," e-mailed Angel Richardson, a member of the NCOM Board of Directors who attended the hugely successful event: "We have a kick ass bunch of patriots!"

#### CHRISTIAN AND VETERAN BIKERS SUE OVER BEING THROWN OUT OF

Motorcyclists who were thrown out of the Florida State Fair for displaying their love of America and Christianity on their vests must amend their lawsuit, a federal judge has ruled.

According to Courthouse News, Mark Denico, Thomas Griswold Jr., Timothy Newberry and Dennis Walsted had arrived at the Florida State Fair on Feb. 7, 2010. Denico and Griswold are members of the U.S. Military Vets Motorcycle Club, while Newberry and Walsted belong to the Spirit Riders Motorcycle Ministry. Walsted said he was planning to "lead all the motorcyclists in prayer once inside the fair," but he and the others were escorted out once they paid for admission. Fair rules ban gang colors or signs, and members of the Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office told the guartet that they could not enter the fair while wearing vests with the patches indicating motorcycle club

Tampa Bay Times reported that approximately 50 bikers from numerous clubs were turned away that day. In their subsequent lawsuit, the four accused law enforcement and fair officials of violating their First Amendment rights to freedom of association and religion.

U.S. District Judge Virginia Hernandez Covington nevertheless dismissed the complaint without prejudice because it failed to specifically indicate claims under the federal civil right law Section 1983, which creates a private right of action for civil damages. The fair demonstrated that the "plaintiffs' naked reference to § 1983 is insufficient for defendants or this court to assume that they intended to bring [counts one through nine] under its rubric," according to the ruling. "Plaintiffs may have identified constitutional rights alleged to have been violated, but have failed to allege causes of action associated with those violations," Covington added.

The judge also declined to give the plaintiffs an injunction restraining the defendants from "ordering, compelling, bullying, requesting, coercing, or threatening a member of a motorcycle club or motorcycle ministry to remove their vests with 'patches' on them signifying membership within a particular organization." Injunctions are appropriate only if plaintiffs can show they will continue to be harmed during the course of litigation, according to the ruling. "Conspicuously absent from the operative complaint is any allegation that the plaintiffs intend to return to the Florida Stair Fair wearing their prohibited patches or that the plaintiffs face specific future harm at the hands of the defendants," Covington wrote. Vaguely alleging that "the Florida State Fair Authority will continue to selectively exclude certain motorcyclists from the fair" is not sufficient to reach the standard for an injunction, the court ruled, and so the club members must amend their complaint before moving forward with the

#### MOTORCYCLIST FINED FOR TIRE TREADS

A New York rider who set out for a Friday the 13th motorcycle trip to Port Dover, Ontario told local CTV News that he was unfairly ticketed and pulled off the roads by Waterloo Regional Police in Canada. Jeff Selby of Elmira. NY claims the officers were excessive in their punishment after a routine roadside check found the tread on his motorcycle tires was point five millimeters under

Selby says he offered to drive his bike straight to a repair shop to have the tire replaced but the officers said no. "He goes it doesn't matter. Your bike will be off the road as of today. We're gonna take your plate, we're gonna charge you and you're gonna have to get a tow truck.

Selby told the news station that he understands the safety concerns but says he has a clean driving record and deserves a warning first, and that the five hundred or more dollars he's now facing in fines, relicensing fees and towing cost is exorbitant. Police there say the law is the law and you can't put a price on safety, adding that when it comes to safety there's no room for warnings or second chances and it's their responsibility that's on the line

The legal regulation for tires on any motorized vehicle is that they have to have at least 1.5 millimeters of tread on the majority of the tires circumference.

#### SIHK-ING HELMET EXEMPTIONS DOWN UNDER

On April 23, 2013, Queensland became the fourth Australian province to exempt bicyclists from the Sikh community from wearing a helmet. Calling it a "common-sense approach," Queensland transport minister Scott Emerson said, "By amending the Queensland Road Rules, we will join Victoria, South Australia and Western Australia which also have this exemption.

Now, Sikh motorcycle riders are seeking exemption from helmet laws as well. Harpreed Singh, who is originally from New Delhi, told ABC News that he has not ridden a motorbike since moving to Tasmania in 2008 because of the legal requirement to wear a helmet. Members of the Sikh faith wear turbans for religious reasons and do not want to remove them. "I have ridden motorbikes all my life and in India it is allowed and even in the UK, Canada and the US, Sikhs can ride a bike with a turban on."

Anti-discrimination commissioner Robin Banks says it would be better to exempt the entire Sikh religion, in order to avoid the situation where every Sikh has to apply for an exemption and then prove they have one if they are stopped by the police. She too points to other parts of the world where similar changes have been made: "In Canada there's been human rights cases that have decided that instead of having to wear a motorbike helmet, or even a safety helmet on building sites, [they] are permitted to wear their turbans."

The Tasmanian Government says the transport commissioner has the power to exempt individuals from wearing a helmet.

In Tasmania, the fine for not wearing a helmet is \$140 and three demerit

#### ACCIDENTS POSSIBLY LINKED TO BRAIN MISCALCULATIONS

Incidences of cars pulling out in front of motorcyclists run regularly in headlines -- locally, statewide and throughout the nation -- and there could be a scientific reason. Recent research by a Texas Tech University psychologist suggests that the regularity of this problem isn't necessarily a case of poor driving or carelessness, but may be related to a basic human judgment error.

Pat DeLucia, the coordinator of the Human Factors Psychology Program, said her results show that small, near objects can appear farther away than larger, farther objects. The study is published in the peer-reviewed scientific psychology journal "Current Directions in Psychological Science."

An interest in softball prompted DeLucia to study how the human brain perceives objects, their size and motion and an object's time to impact. Her finding -- that an object's size affects distance perception -- may be the basis explaining why car drivers miscalculate motorcyclists' distance and speed

Many times, the brain interprets objects with a larger retinal image as closer. Since motorcycles are smaller than cars, DeLucia said the brain may use this shortcut to judge a smaller motorcycle farther away than it actually is.

This size-arrival effect can lead drivers to misjudge when a vehicle would arrive at an intersection and could be considered a contributing factor in motorcycle/vehicle accidents.

DeLucia hopes to find funding from the Texas Department of Transportation to create an educational program to inform drivers of her findings and reduce the incidents of these types of accidents.

#### HONDA TOUTS TECHNOLOGY TO CUT MOTORCYCLIST FATALITIES

Honda North America executives announced that the Japanese automaker hopes two experimental safety technologies it is testing could help reduce pedestrian and motorcycle deaths by the end of the decade. By equipping a car and smartphone with wireless dedicated short range communications technology, Honda said it can alert both a driver and pedestrian, or motorcycle rider, of an impending collision.

Vehicle-to-Pedestrian and Vehicle-to-Motorcycle technologies are still in the early development and testing stages, but Honda intends to integrate the advanced collision sensing and predictive technologies into their vehicles through a special licensed radio band that allows cars to send and receive messages from surrounding vehicles. The system that might be an app one day on a smartphone is capable of alerting drivers that a pedestrian or motorcycle is near, even if the driver can't see them, in time to avoid a

Jim Keller, chief engineer for Honda R&D Americas, Inc. said connected vehicle technology could be on the road by 2020, and the technology would be much cheaper than implementing cameras and other safety systems equipped on vehicles today.

Honda is one of eight automakers involved in a federal vehicle-to-vehicle communication study which began a year ago in Ann Arbor with the help of the University of Michigan Transportation Research Institute and has been extended six months.

#### WEIRD NEWS: BLIND DISABLED MOTORCYCLIST SETS SPEED **RECORD**

The dangers of riding a motorcycle are obvious even to able-bodied operators, yet blind, disabled Scottish biker Stuart Gunn threw caution to the wind by setting a new world record by clocking 167.1 mph.

Gunn is a real world Daredevil, and with a little help from his father, Geoff, the pair ride together and dad cheerfully informs his son if he's drifting or should brake, assisting his blind and paralyzed-from-the-waste-down son to beat world speed records.

"I hope this proves to people that just because you are blind or have a disability, doesn't mean it should change or limit your life," says Gunn, the World's Fastest Blind Motorcycle Rider.

a few of them. Seems like I have been going, going, going and I am getting exahausterpated ... but hey, this article is not about 'lil ole me getting tuckered out, it's all about tech tips and wrenching on bikes, and today we are going to install a S&S Power Dual exhaust head pipe onto a Harley Davidson Road King. There are all kinds of exhaust systems out there from slip on mufflers to complete systems, chrome or black, super loud to quiet and everything in between.

It's usually less expensive to put an entire system on right off the bat rather than installing slip on mufflers, then later putting on a head pipe. However, sometimes it's not affordable or, possibly you bought a used bike with slip on mufflers and you want to upgrade the head pipe later. That is the case with this bike, it was bought used with Vance and Hines slip-on mufflers - the owner really liked the muffler looks and sound but did not like the performance or look of the stock head pipe. He gazed at a number of head pipes and most all of them routed the pipes similarly, but S&S took the rear pipe heat away from the rider by routing the rear pipe under the bike. That's the one he chose and the one we will now install. (fig 1)

First, we take the seat off, and on this bike we have to take the saddle bags off and just for safety sake, take the side covers off too (most owners do not like it when you scratch their paint). The right side floorboard was removed, then we started stripping the bike of the old exhaust by removing the heat shields, then the O2 sensors need to be unplugged next. After that, the mufflers come off and, by the way, the stock mufflers can be a real treat to remove, take your time and be patient wiggling them back and forth, up and down, twisting ... they will soon slip off without damaging anything (using a little PB Blaster can help too). Next, take off all the supporting brackets like the one on the starter (fig2) and the support near the transmission (fig3) then the left side false pipe can be removed.




FIG 4 Taking the exhaust to head nuts off

After that, remove the four exhaust to head nuts and slide the mounting rings down (fig4) Now it's time to take the right side exhaust tube assembly off, this one is a bit tricky, again easy going and you won't scratch or break anything. Now the old exhaust is off, set the head pipe on the bench and take the two O2

Now it's time to organize the new head pipe system, inventory parts and read the instructions, (Okay, now that I have read the pictures.. he he) it's time to install the system. Take off the old exhaust flanges by removing the retaining rings off the old pipes and put them on the new head pipe (fig 6) Put a little anti-seize on the threads of the O2 sensors and screw them into the new head pipe. (fig7).

Take out four of the rear transmission oil pan bolts leaving the center one. The new S&S head pipe is installed now with new conical exhaust gaskets, but do not completely tighten the exhaust to head nuts, plug in the O2 sensors wiring, then the crossover under pipe is slid on next (make sure to position the clamp on correctly on the tube or you will be taking it all apart again). Then, this fine system has some fancy brackets with new longer bolts that needed to be installed for the under cross over pipe to attach to the transmission pan. (fig 8)

Install the heat shields and tighten worm clamps, then slide your mufflers on and bolt in place. Once everything is aligned, tighten the system down evenly and do not over tighten exhaust to head nuts, it's no fun to replace the exhaust studs, no fun at all!! Now Loctite and install the right footboard back on using the two spacers to create needed clearance between it and the new head pipe.




FIG 11 New exhaust left side

Okay, we are ALMOST finished; the next step is to thoroughly clean the system BEFORE starting! Oil and grease will burn into the new chrome if it is not cleaned off it first. Take a look at the old system in fig 9 and 10 then the finished bike in fig 11 and 12, what a vast improvement, cleaner lines and it takes a lot the heat away from the rider... it also made quite a difference in throttle response even before we re-tuned it. Please read and use the supplied instructions with your system, this is only a quick overview of the process to get you familiar with the project.



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

"What a wild ride! Seven days of fun, excitement, work, play and amazement" is how I described this year's Sturgis Rally to the Travel Channel camera crew. While only my third Sturgis Rally trip, I set out to get on the ground floor of what the rally is all about, who makes it happen and how it comes to fruition. I have to say, I succeeded on most levels.

#### HISTORY OF STURGIS RALLY

First, a brief history lesson on Sturgis. The fella that the Sturgis community still give credit to in beginning the rally is Clarence "Pappy" Hoel. At all events and press conferences. I continuously heard his name. He purchased an Indian Motorcycle Dealership in Sturgis in 1936 and the Jackpine Gypsies Motorcycle Club was formed. In 1938, an event named "Black Hills Classic" was held in which nine participants raced. This was the unofficial/official first Sturgis Rally. My calculator was whipped out as I saw this was the 73rd Annual Rally. It didn't compute. I asked the Museum Director why this was and she told me it was because there was no rally held in 1942 due to the gas shortage and World War II. This year, it was estimated that the event brought over 500,000 riders to the Black Hills area.

#### ON THE ROAD

Many of you haven't attended this pilgrimage to the Black Hills and Badlands of South Dakota



You've heard about all the crazy things that go on in Sturgis. Yes, there's some wild stuff to be found up there, but there is also miles of beautiful riding in the area. From riding the desert-like Badlands with its' sharp buttes towering overhead to the gorgeous twists and turns in the Black Forest National Park to the Monuments of Mt. Rushmore and Crazy Horse, there's plenty to do for a full week.

In the town of Sturgis, vendors take over the buildings where local grocery and hardware stores stood one week prior. Main Street is closed down to only bike traffic. East of town a few miles, rallygoers find the comforts of home away from home at camping "mini" rallies such as Full Throttle Saloon, Buffalo Chip, Glencoe and Broken Spoke. Each of these locations feature camping, bars, bands, stages, contests, bike shows and entertainment of its' own every day during the rally. On a grander scale, these are all much like the self contained local rallies we experience in our own states.





#### THE RIDES

In order to capture much of the Sturgis experience this year, I joined a couple rides offered by the Buffalo Chip. The first being the Legends Ride. This is a fundraiser ride which drew a record number of riders to raise over \$84.000 which was split between the Sturgis Motorcycle Museum and Black Hills Special Olympics. The ride was led by many a celebrity. I met Dee Snider of Twisted Sister: Arlen and Zach Ness who led the ride alongside Buffalo Chip owner, "Woody"; Paul Tuttle, Sr.; Robbie Knievel; Kristy Swanson: Bean're and more. A large portion of the contributions earned were generated from the sell of the 2013 Sturgis Buffalo Chip Student Build Challenge. Students, under the direction of builder, Keith Terry, turned a 2013 Road King into a beautiful Street Glide. I was able to chat a bit with the female member of the student team. Hannah, who took

great pride in telling me about making the first cut to the frame when she cut the neck off of the bike. She and instructor, Keith, said that the students do not get a school credit for this. They are only working on it after school and for the experience. I also took the opportunity to speak briefly with Black Hills Special OlympicsBoard of Director President, Jack Lynass. His smile showed the results of being teamed with the Legends Ride as their program has grown in the past 4 years from 17 athletes to 142 due to the profits and resources donated from the ride. Being a Special Olympics Games Committee member myself, I can relate to a growing Special Olympics program.

#### **BIKER BELLES**

I also took advantage of the Biker Belles Ride which is a ride created to raise awareness of the passion, diversity and spirit of women in motorcycling, celebrating the woman's role in shaping the culture, art and history of motorcycling. Secondly, the ride raises funds for worthy local charities. This year, the funds went to the Sturgis Motorcycle Museum to build a new museum facility to house all their memorabilia. It also contributed to Helping With Horsepower a foundation directed by Laura Klock of Klock Werks Custom Cycles. This program helps young women who are at risk or victims of abuse. Laura took a few moments to explain to me that she. "used riding and racing as a parenting tool for her own daughters". She went on to explain that part of this program is dedicated to working directly with the young women in building a motorcycle and raising funds with ticket sales to a drawing for the bike. She says, "by repairing a motorcycle we hope they can repair what's damaged in their own lives." More on this charity and to enter to win the bike go to www. helpingwithhorsepower.com. Over 100 women rode on this ride through the Black Hills and finished with an auction in which a motorcycle donated by Shelly Rossmeyer and re-built by Jessi Combs, who lead our ride, was purchased by Pat Simmons of the Doobie Brothers for his wife of 24 years as their anniversary present. His wife is Cris Simmons who is a motorcycle Hall of Famer herself. I greatly enjoyed meeting the like-minded free spirited women on this ride and riding alongside them.



#### **BRASS BALLS & TOBY KEITH**

The rest of the trip included a lot of riding, highlighted by a toast with Brass Balls Cycles builder/owner, Dar Holdsworth, and singer / songwriter, Toby Keith, backstage prior to his concert. Toby has partnered with Dar to create an Award Winning American made motorcycle that will stand alone in the industry. Toby noted that Brass Balls Cycles and Dar, caught his attention with all of the bike rebuilds and giveaways Brass Balls Cycles do for the veterans. In Toby style, there's no better way to announce the partnership than giving away a bike to a veteran on stage at the Toby Keith concert at the Buffalo Chip in Sturgis. Just before the concert wrapped up, Dar and Toby announced the partnership and presented a bike to Dar's dad, a Vietnam Veteran himself, which is where Dar's veteran compassion began. The crowd went wild and even Toby had a hard time laughing through his singing from all the joy brought to Dar's dad. This bike went on to win the Beauty and The Beast Bike Build Off the following day.

# Likes Harleys

Pope Francis "likes the Harley stuff."

That's what official Harley-Davidson painter David Uhl said about the Pontiff after he presented "Chance Encounter," a piece that commemorated the motor company's 110th anniversary celebration in Rome.

Uhl, whose home base is in Golden, Colo., was selected to do the piece because of the classical nature of his work. The painting depicts a Vatican officia curiously inspecting a 1948 Harley-Davidson FL Panhead in front of St. Peter's Basilica. The piece was used for specialized Vatican postcards commemorating

Harley-Davidson's anniversary celebration. Uhl flew to Rome on June 10th to present the painting to the pope and to help open a Harley-Davidson gallery that featured about 20 pieces of his artwork. While there, he toured the Vatican's art collection, and took in the ancient sites of Rome.

Uhl said the experience was overwhelming, and that he "felt like the Little Drummer Boy," when he presented his piece.

"This is Sistine Chapel we're talking about!" Uhl said of the artwork he viewed on his private tour of the Vatican's art collection. "You can't believe the amount

of time and effort that was put into that building. You can't compare me to those artists. I felt like the Little Drummer Boy saying 'here is my little humble offering.'"

In fact, when Uhl presented his artwork to the Pope in front of Willie G. and Nancy Davidson, other members of the Harley-Davidson Corporate family, and several Cardinals, Uhl expressed his humility.

"I said, your Holiness ... as an artist you might imagine I am overwhelmed by the beauty represented here. I am humbled by the opportunity to present you with this gift. On behalf of the Harley-Davidson motor company and myself I present you with 'Chance Encounter,' a piece to commemorate this unique moment in history."

The Vatican loved the painting, Uhl said. The Pope smiled for the entire presentation, and greeted the legendary Harley-Davidson artist warmly.

"One thing I did get, I was hanging out with Willie G. and Nancy, and as (the Pope) walked away, he turned back around at the picture and then nodded at everyone," he said.

Uhl estimated that Harley's 110th anniversary celebration in Rome drew about 40,000 bikers, and also featured a bike blessing from the Pontiff himself.

"The event itself was like a European Sturgis," Uhl said. "It wasn't nearly as raucous, but there were tons of bikes and people. It looked more like a big HOG convention than anything."


While he was at the Vatican, Uhl said he was struck by how genuine the Catholic hierarchy was. Uhl, who grew up as a Catholic, but who has since spent a great

deal of time researching other religions, said he was struck by the European perception of the church.

"Those guys (at the Vatican) were really, really genuine. They had a warmth about them that was exceptionally real. They're still really looked at with respect in Europe. I'm not really a Bible thumpin' guy at all, but there is an aura there that is really valid and pervasive and you can't help but get swept away in it."



"The current Pope is really down to

earth and a warm human being." Uhl continued. "He is not pompous at all."

Overall, Uhl said he came away from his experience at the Vatican with reverence and respect for the organization.

In addition to participating in the Harley-Davidson celebration activities in Rome, Uhl and his family also decided to stay a little longer and take a European tour. He started in Rome, where he visited all of the ancient ruins. Then, Uhl said he hired a driver who spoke good English to take his family to Tuscany, where they visited a tiny town with families who had lived there since 1100. There, Uhl said his daughter Bella wowed the Italians as she sang an impromptu Italian opera.

"She is quite the opera singer," Uhl said. "That took the little town by surprise. That was so cool."

Afterward, Uhl said the family visited Florence and Sienna, before eventually taking a high speed train to Venice — where Uhl fell in love.

"Venice totally knocked my socks off as far as the visual experience goes," he said. "Next time I go to Italy I am taking a month for Venice because it's just amazing. I am hugely inspired by that."

Following their Italian tour, Uhl said his family flew to Paris, where they met up with friends and were treated to a special tour of the Eiffel Tower. From there, Uhl said they traveled to the south of France, where they were able to just relax and wind down with friends. The end of the Uhl's tour saw them traveling to Barcelona, Spain, where they were treated to tours from a local point of view.

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
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# Biker Preacher's

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#### **ABATE OF MICHIGAN**

#### **DEATH AND TAXES**

"Our Constitution is an actual operation and everything appears to promise that it will last: but in this world nothing can be said to be certain but death and taxes." - Ben Franklin

It was taxes that got us into the war with England and a revolution. Taxation without representation, meaning un-agreed upon taxes used for un-agreed upon purposes imposed by un-agreed upon persons. Well I guess we still get to agree upon who imposes the taxes, kind of, maybe....

At any rate, death is still certain, and taxes from my purview ain't going away any time soon. The Constitution on the other hand often seems to linger on life support for the most part these days.

But to make the connection between death, taxes, and motorcycles, here it is. These are the fees derived in 2012 from the State of Michigan Secretary of State specifically for the purpose of "Motorcycle Safety", which I equate with "preventing death". About a million and a half dollars. Not a lot of money some may say, but this is just from Michigan motorcyclists and specifically for Michigan motorcyclists. ABATE of Michigan was instrumental in the creation of this fund, and has remained instrumental in maintaining this fund for its intended purposes. "The government has seen fit to steal it for other purposes in years past."

Motorcycle Safety Fees (from license plate sales)..... ..815.348.00 Motorcycle Safety Fees (from driver license fees).....

These funds are used annually to provide riders training courses throughout the state. ABATE played a major part in the establishment of these courses and has been constantly a monitor and advisor regarding these courses. ABATE does not benefit financially in any way from these courses either. All of ABATE's motorcyclist legislative work is paid for by the membership and conducted largely on a volunteer basis.

The state also receives grants for motorcycle safety from the federal government by way of gas taxes that we all pay into. These funds are granted to the Office of Highway Safety Planning, a department within the Michigan State Police. The funds are specifically designated to be used for Motorcycle Safety purposes. The OHSP decides how best to do that. Aside from the errant use of these funds for "Click it or Ticket" a number of years ago, which was guickly addressed by ABATE contacting Michigan federal legislators, OHSP has focused on using the grant money for several "motorcyclist safety" campaigns.

"Ride Safe To Ride Again" for example.

Safety gear, including all the helmets, leathers, and paraphernalia associated with surviving crashes as well as really pushing "conspicuity", the wearing of high visibility jackets, vests, and brightly colored outfits seems to be the primary focus of these tax based funds.

Probably not without some valid basis, but still overly focused on surviving a crash as opposed to addressing ways to prevent a crash in my opinion. Sure, dressing in neon colored clothes may assist in catching a few eyes

that otherwise may not have noticed you. I guess that's our choice, but not being noticed by cagers might better be addressed with the cagers themselves instead of advising us to try and make ourselves more visible in the hopes of getting their misdirected attention.

Half or more of motorcycle crashes are still the result of a right of way violation by a cager. What's being done with our tax dollars to stop this from happening? What training are automobile drivers receiving that make them more aware, and more motivated to look for motorcycles? Last year Pennsylvania purchased thousands of motorcycle awareness signs and distributed them free throughout the state.

Allstate Insurance has been purchasing and placing caution signs stating: "Look for motorcyclists" at problematic intersections.

At what point does "riding safe to ride again" meet with "inattentive driver at an intersection" and makes riding safe meaningless for the outcome?

By the way, it's looking like 2013 may go down in Michigan with the lowest motorcyclist fatality and incapacitating injury rate since 2008. And it also appears that there is essentially no difference in these rates for helmeted and un-helmeted riders. In fact as of today (September 12th) more fatalities and incapacitating injuries are on record for helmeted riders than un-helmeted. And, once again, un-endorsed riders lead the list of those involved in crashes. Maybe THAT should receive a little more of the attention ABATE has been pushing for the last year or two?

Join us. Support us. Let's demand those who control the purse strings of our tax dollars use them how we want them used.

P.S. Watch for deer, it's that time again. Not just mornings and evenings once the rut begins. Oct. 1 on through January, I'll be doing my part to eliminate the problem.
