



I hope you had a great labor day, and what labor you did was over a grill. There isn't much in the way of veteran's related news because the lawmakers in D.C. and Lansing are on recess back home, probably working on their reelection. Which could be a good thing, because it limits what havoc they could cause by creating new laws.

Flint Apartment Complex For Homeless Veterans

A 78-unit apartment complex aimed at giving homeless veterans a place to live could be coming to Flint's south side. The project has been OK'd by the Flint Planning Commission but must still secure funding. The \$15 million project will use 80 percent federal funds. The three-story building would be at the corner of West Hemphill Road and South Grand Traverse Street. It will feature one-bedroom apartments for homeless or at-risk to be homeless veterans.

The project was brought to the city by Alternative Veterans Solutions, said the group's founder and Chief Executive Officer, Tredale Kennedy. Kennedy's nonprofit group received donated office space inside the Insight Institute of Neurosurgery and Neuroscience building. The 12,000-square-foot office is planned to be a one-stop shop for veterans and their families. The institute donated five acres, which is currently unused parking lot, for the apartment project.

Flint's project will mimic a similar one in Battle Creek that featured 75 apartments that were built three years ago. That phase filled up with residents in three months and now Battle Creek is near completion of a second phase of 100 additional apartments.

VA Funding

Congress is considering 'The Putting Veterans Funding First Act of 2013' (HR 813). This bill would fulfill our nation's promise to help veterans readiust back into civilian life. The bill would do so by ensuring that VA services aren't affected by Washington's partisan budget wrangling, and that the care and benefits veterans have earned are delivered them with timeliness and predictability.

The Putting Veterans Funding First Act would require Congress to fully fund the Department of Veterans Affairs' discretionary budget a year ahead of schedule. ensuring that all VA services will have timely, predictable funding in an era where continuing resolutions and threats of government shutdowns are all too frequent. If passed, the bill will make it easier for the VA to plan for key investments in information technology, claims processing and construction projects and it would grant Congress greater oversight on multi-year funding proposals, with one year building off of the next.

Grant for Homeless Veteran Housing

Blue Water Center for Independent Living has received more than \$500,000 in grant money for homeless veterans. The one-year \$573,084 grant from U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs will go toward low-income or at-risk veterans who are homeless or seeking housing.

Blue Water Center for Independent Living will be the lead agency for the grant, but the funds will be shared among the center's five counties - Huron, Sanilac, Tuscola, Lapeer and St. Clair — as well as disability networks in the Wayne County and Detroit area, and the Oakland County and Macomb County area. The grant money will not be available until October and must be used within a year.

In the coming months, Blue Water Center for Independent Living and the two disability networks plan to reach out to other community and veterans' agencies for referrals. This is the second time the BWCIL has applied for the grant. This year, however, the group included counties outside the Thumb in its proposal.

This grant is only for a year and then they'll have to apply for renewal. The renewal will most likely be based on their performance. For more information, call the Veterans Community Resource and Referral Center at 313-576-1580 and ask to speak with a social worker.

Polish Army Vet Home Closes

The last two residents of the Polish Army Veterans Home in Sterling Heights were moved out. The home closed because there were not enough residents and not enough money coming in to keep the home going.

The home for elderly and disabled veterans began more than 80 years ago in an old farmhouse. The present nursing-style residence was built in the 1960s. But it has no air-conditioning, bathrooms are outdated, and the roof needs to be replaced.

There are no plans to sell the property that has a section known as Wanda Park and a soccer field, which are open to the public. Posts of the American Legion and Veterans of Foreign Wars and others have long supported the facility by donating household items and clothing.



The Motorcycle Lawyer on THE LAW Michigan Court of Appeals case shafted motorcyclist

Insurance does not have to pay \$100K in medical bills

It really bothers me to see a motorcyclist get shafted by the law, so this month I wanted to talk about a recent case decided by the Michigan Court of Appeals that involved a motorcyclist. The motorcyclist, whom I did not represent, lost the case, which is unpublished, and I think there are some important lessons to be learned from his situation.

In late July, the Michigan Court of Appeals decided the case of Detroit Medical Center (DMC) versus Progressive Michigan Insurance Company ("Progressive"). The case stated that the motorcyclist was traveling upward of 100 mph on a desolate and very dark side street that crossed Jefferson Road. The motorcyclist saw motor vehicle headlights Jefferson Road and hit the brakes hard to avoid colliding with the vehicle. The aggressive braking caused the motorcycle to fishtail, and the rider lost control and dumped the bike. The motorcycle never came in contact with the motor vehicle. The motorcyclist was treated for extensive injuries at DMC, and incurred over \$100,000 worth of medical bills. As they can do in these situations, the DMC brought a case directly against the appropriate auto insurance provider, in this case Progressive, claiming that the motorcyclist was entitled to no-fault benefits.

It's important to understand how no-fault benefits work for motorcyclists. A motorcycle is not included in the definition of a "motor vehicle" under Michigan's no-fault law. If you own a bike, you must have insurance on it, otherwise you cannot make a claim for no-fault benefits. These benefits can include lifetime coverage of medical bills, wage loss, money for household help, medical mileage, and attendant care. In order for a motorcyclist to qualify for no-fault benefits under the law, a "motor vehicle" (car, truck, van, tractor trailer, etc.) must be involved in the crash. If the motorcyclist hits a pothole, loose gravel, a dog, or another motorcycle, no-fault benefits will not be paid.

In this particular case, the Court of Appeals decided that the motorcyclist was not entitled to the medical bills paid because the motor vehicle wasn't "involved enough". In its ruling, the Court stated that there has to be a connection between the motorcycle and the other vehicle that is more than just incidental. In other words, there must be a causal nexus established between the accident and the motor vehicle. It went on to state that the motor vehicle to be involved in the accident, must be actively, as opposed to passively, contribute to the accident and have more than a random association with the accident scene. For a motor vehicle to be causally connected to the motorcyclist's injuries, their injuries must originate from the use of the vehicle.

This Court of Appeals panel believed that the motorcyclist was startled, and overreacted when he saw the headlights on Jefferson Road. I was not directly involved with this case and don't have any inside information on the proceedings; my comments reflect my personal opinion, which is that this aspect of the decision is difficult for me to accept. The panel wanted evidence that the evasive action taken by the motorcyclist was necessary to avoid the motor vehicle, yet they did not accept the rider's opinion that a crash couldn't be avoided unless he hit the brakes. Often in these cases, there are no other witnesses to the crash besides the two drivers, and really the only person who can say for sure that the motorcyclist felt that a crash was imminent is the rider himself. The bottom line is, the Court of Appeals panel found that there was no objective need for the motorcyclist to take evasive

action, and therefore the motor vehicle was not sufficiently involved in the crash to entitle the motorcyclist to no-fault benefits. The DMC did not get its medical bills paid by the auto insurance company, leaving the motorcyclists on the hook for the entire cost of his treatment.

This, and other decisions by appellate courts (Court of Appeals, Michigan Supreme Court, etc.) is relevant because of how laws are made. When legislature passes a bill, it becomes a law "on the books", and we must follow it. A judge deciding a case filed in a lower court, like a District Court that hears traffic tickets and small criminal matters, or a Circuit Court that hears divorces or civil cases over \$25,000, looks to the written law to decide the legal issues in the case before them. However, published laws as written do not cover every single situation that might occur. So, if the written law does not plainly state what to do given the factual situation the judge has before them, the judge looks at the appellate courts decisions for similar factual cases with the same legal issues.

With the Michigan Court of Appeals, a case can be published or unpublished. A published case is authoritative; it's what we call "good law", and we must follow it as written, and it is used to decide future cases. If it is unpublished, then it is not authoritative; the decision was unique to the case, and is not the law that other judges must follow given similar facts. That said, even if a ruling is not authoritative, among the legal community we would say that it is instructional, and could give other judges an idea of how to rule on similar cases if there is not a published case on point. At the end of the day, whether this ruling is published or unpublished, the motorcyclist in this case is still stuck with a massive medical bill.

There are several lessons to be learned here. First, if you have a bike, insure it. We all like to think that nothing bad will happen to us, but it's not worth the risk. Next, if you crash and a motor vehicle was involved, it is important to establish evidence that shows how involved the motor vehicle was. As we saw with this case, your opinion may not be enough to establish the motor vehicle's involvement in Court. Finally, I always recommend that motorcyclists have health insurance as well. That way your medical bills are covered even if you are not entitled to no-fault benefits after a crash.

Last week was my birthday and I didn't feel very well waking up on that morning...kinda' depressed actually. Feeling no excitement or surprises were left in my life. I missed surprises.

I went downstairs for breakfast hoping my husband would be pleasant and say, 'Happy Birthday!', and possibly have a small present for me. As it turned out, he barely said good morning, let alone ' Happy Birthday.' I thought well, that's marriage for you, but the kids they will remember. My kids came bounding downstairs to breakfasts and didn't say a word..

Father and Son Project

THE BUILD STORY

I was cruising some fine customs at a local shop in Waterford, MI – an area known for its original ground up customs when I was approached by an old grevbeard who said " You don't know what you got unless you build it yourself". Well that's all I needed to hear.



With my son a top level aviation mechanic and my ability to finish long range projects, that was just what I was going to do - build my own! Searching the web for frames and rollers I came across a nice tall frame for my long legs offered by LeGene Jenkins of Kingsley, MI. It was a dropseat which I loved and came with that wild looking springer front end , a one off rear wheel and a semi- finished coffin tank. That was a great start but building a bike takes more than just kewl parts and now the real work would begin. I then picked up an Evo, an Ultima RSD Trans with a hydraulic clutch and the primary. We changed the belt pulleys for a chain and sprocket set up and figured out what to with no space for an oil bag that typically would mount under the seat. Once everything was mounted and aligned we finished off the tank and began thinking about paint. Originally the parts were destined to painted in a Devils Hand motif, something that would have gone particularly well with the spades cut into the rear wheel but I wanted something of my own design. The various parts seemed to be screaming Gothic. so I began searching the web for Gothic influences and came across many litho's of the dark ages and shared them with the renowned art-

ist John Harrow of Classic and Exotic Airbrushing in Troy, MI who produced the original artwork - done over aprox 80 hours with a Sharpie Pen (black magic marker) and light airbrushing. The bone colored base coat and finish coats were laid down by Ron Harris of Chop Docs who has a wealth of talents, painting bikes and cars is a special talent he's perfected to excellence. This article wouldn't be complete without giving very special thanks to my son Josh who without his innate mechanical ability this build would not happen. But more so it gave him and I a lot of great irreplaceable quality time together. As I write this article, I am dying of cancer and I know when I'm gone he'll look at this build and remember the time we spent together building this fine bike -a tribute to a great father and son relationship!







TechTipsBySteve MonkeysandApes! Handle BarFun!

SO as I am sitting around...yeah right I do a lot of that... thinking ... again, yeah right, thinking ... me? Well, I was thinking because my head ached profusely and my small mind was compiling ideas of what to write about this month for you fine people. Then it came to me as I look over at a customer's bike that we were putting a set of Paul Yaffe Monkey Bars on ... handle bars, I will talk about these blasted handle bars!


CONSIDERATIONS WHEN PICKING HANDLEBARS

The first question to ask is, just how do you want to sit on your bike, would you like your hands low and wide, then consider beach bars. If you like your hands up higher about shoulder height, then pick Ape hangers. Or, are you like me and rode motocross for years and liked that style, then consider drag or MX style bars. Basically, what position is your back and shoulders most comfortable or is it a certain look you are going for? Next is, do you want to hide your wiring, if so you will need to find a bar with drilled holes and you will have to take apart your wiring connectors and have hours of some real fun! Will the bars be substantially wider or higher, then you will have to purchase longer cables, hoses and wiring. Do you want the finish to be chrome or a color? Would you like larger than stock diameter? And the last big question ... what is your budget?

Handle bars are given all kinds of great names like ape hangers, boardtrack, MX bars, touring, T-bars, drag bars, monkey bars and the list goes on, but what we really need to know is two basic things, how our are bars mounted and where do we want our hands to be while riding.

MEASUREMENTS

Unfortunately, there is not a true industry standard on how handle bars are measured, they are however measured by height, width, center and pullback, but how the bars are specifically set when making these measurements is not standard. The height or end rise is the measurement from the mounting point of the handle bar (this is the part that is mounted onto the triple trees) to the highest point of the bar, usually this is the point where is turns toward the rider. The width is measured from outside grip area to outside grip area. The center is the flat part width before the start the rise turn. Lastly, the pullback is the distance from the triple tree mounting point to the end of the bar at the grip area. Confusing? Here is a picture that should help. (Fig1)



DIMPLED, DRILLED OR NEITHER

Another piece of the information pie is knowing if you need your bars to be drilled, dimpled or neither. If you want your wiring inside the bars for a cleaner look you must have the bars drilled, if you have a bike that needs a dimple near the grip for your wiring then make sure you order bars with dimples. In Fig 2, the top bar is dimpled (and drilled) and the lower bar is drilled

RISERS and CLAMPS


Your handle bars are attached to the triple trees via a set of risers and/or clamps. Sometimes, the riser is built right into the handle bars and they bolt directly into the top triple tree. Like the second set in Fig 3.

With a bike that uses risers, sometimes you can get the change you are looking for by simply going to a set of risers with more pull-back or more height. You can see in Pic 4 that this bike has a very short riser with no pullback, if your wiring and cables will allow it, you could gain a few inches of rise or pull back or a little of both with a simple riser change.





We have the basics down, now I would like to take you through a handle bar swap on a 2008 Harley Road King. Bryan wanted more pullback and his arms a bit higher, he picked out a set of Paul Yaffe 10" Monkey Bars with internally hidden wires. His bike has throttle by wire so we ordered the bars cut for the sensor (Fig 5).

Since the bars were a bit higher than stock, we ordered a longer brake line and clutch cable, and with the wiring going through the handlebars, the wiring for the switches had to be extended by 8" so we used Namz wire extenders (Fig 6).

Now we have all the parts we need, so it's time for disassembly. Out comes the headlight and here are the connectors (5 of them, 4 for the switches and one for the TBW) inside the nacelle you have to disassemble. (Fig 7)

Harley was nice enough to make one side of the handle bar connections with white Molex connectors and one side with black Molex connectors, so it is difficult to mess things up. Before you take these connectors apart, make a very detailed wire guide with correct orientation of the plug, heck, take a few pictures just for safe measure so you can rewire everything correctly. Once you have the wires out of the connectors, you can pull them out of the nacelle and remove the protective sleeve. (Fig 8) Then untangle and straighten out the wires best as possible and slide them in good quality shrink wrap, heat and shrink, this makes them a smaller protected package so you will be able to get them through the bars easier.

Slide a fish wire through the handlebars and attach it to the wires by wrapping it around them and use a light layer of electrical tape to cover the wire. Get a

helper for the next step, (You may have to put cable lube on the shrink wrap to get it slippery enough to slide through) One of you push while one of you pull the wire carefully through the bars. I will tell you these monkey bars were the hardest I have ever done, these bars have two 90 deg turns and that makes life a bit difficult!!!! The throttle side is the hardest due to more wiring but it will fit.

THE THROTTLE SENSOR

The stock throttle sensor has a green connector that will not fit through the bar holes, (Fig 9) you have two choices here, replace it with the \$99.95 Harley through bar sensor that does not have the connector or you cut the connector off and solder it back together. Both options will work, however if you have a set like these monkey bars that take a lot of pulling and tugging I suggest the new sensor. Why Harley didn't make them this way from factory and makes you buy these are beyond my comprehension.

Once you have all the wires through the bars set them on the bike, slide wires through the nacelle and snug up the bars in the clamps to hold things safely. Reinstall all wiring correctly into the Molex connectors, install the switches onto the handlebars then install the longer clutch cable, adjust properly, install the longer brake line, bleed brakes and it's time to test things. OK, all wiring is working properly so it is time to get the owner to sit on it and adjust the bars and controls to their liking. We re-checked everything for proper function then we stuffed the headlight back in. Done!

NOTE: Many bar manufacturers state that if you have a FLH style Harley with a two piece handle bar clamp (Fig 10 complements of Burly Bars) under the chrome clamp cover, it would be wise to replace it with a one piece style. You will get much better clamping force and fewer troubles down the road.

ABATE OF MICHIGAN

Intelligent Transportation Systems. If you're not familiar with the term, you might want to get informed. It's coming at us like a runaway train on an international track.

"Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) encompass a broad range of information and communications technologies that improve the safety, efficiency, and performance of the transportation system. When integrated into the nation's roadways, vehicles and public transportation network, ITS can help reduce congestion, improve mobility, save lives and optimize our existing infrastructure." http://www.itsa.org/aboutus/mission-bylaws

Sounds good, eh? Especially to those of us who would like to see a greater degree of safety while out traveling on two wheels. But this bug has a lot of legs and portends to be a very invasive species in my opinion.

I am by no means a techie or infrastructure specialist, but I have been following this trend as it's built up for about 10 years. You may already be familiar with a lot of components of ITS that have already been incorporated into our travel lives. Like:

Electronic Toll Collection Ramp Meters **Red Light Cameras** Traffic Signal Coordination **Transit Signal Priority Traveler Information Systems** www.its.dot.gov/factsheets/benefits_factsheet.htm

There is a push federally to continually upgrade and incorporate ITS electronics into our automobiles that will interact with the infrastructure and other vehicles. The roadway infrastructures are continually being upgraded to interact with our vehicles. The goal as I understand it is to at some point take the human equation out of the transportation process making it safer, more enjoyable, and personally productive by allowing us to do things besides.... Drive.

But, I got a problem or two with this stuff.

Aside from the fact I do not trust any government agency to do anything even close to 100% right, and the fact that the most frequent technological problems I have are electronic, there is the fact that I just plain like traveling under my own control. And particularly on motorcycles.

Which brings me to the main issue I have, and that is that I am not seeing any consideration for motorcycles in this transportation future. It's evident already that current systems were not designed with motorcycles in mind. The red light cameras that were created to detect vehicles at intersections and cut down on the length of time waiting for lights to turn green are notorious for leaving bikers sitting for long periods of time waiting because the cameras were not designed to recognize them. By the way, Abate of Michigan has been working on a bill to allow motorcycles to ignore the red light when it is not operating for them. In fact we are interacting with



legislators in Lansing on several possible upcoming ITS concerns that do not seem to be taking us into consideration.

Another concern I have is the invasion of my privacy and right to travel FREELY around the country. Black boxes and GPS built into our vehicles allow the government to know where we go, when we go, and where we are whenever they want to know. Not only do I not want my personal traveling information available for government purview, I also can foresee rumored use taxes based on vehicle miles traveled being leveled on us. And really, who thinks getting a ticket sent by automated mail for an infraction reported by an automated camera that was able to photograph our license plate, upload our speed and actions, identify who we are, and fine us without human interaction. acceptable?

We tend to take it for granted, but freedom to travel is a big issue and always has been. It's not a right I care to hand over to government computers, robots, and electronic gizmos. There is always a line in the sand that has to be drawn where past safety hawks, nanny crats, and well intended do-gooders' should never be allowed to tread. We motorcyclists need to start thinking real hard where that line should be for us. We need to ensure that our voice and our will is heard in Lansing and Washington D.C. We must demand that ITS includes consideration for motorcycling and respects the rights given us by our maker and guaranteed in our countries founding documents.

A good start is by joining, supporting, and working with a motorcycle rights organization or two or three.....


There is so much to see and do over the course of the four day event that its challenging to












