





SO SIMPLE SPAGHETTI CARBONARA

- 1 Pound of Quality Spaghetti (don't ever cheap out on primary ingredients)
- 1 Stick of Real Butter OR Quality Margarine such as "I Can't Believe It's Not Butter"
- 1 Pound of Applewood/Thick Sliced Bacon, Cooked Crisp & Rough Chopped in Medium Size Pieces. If you're not an authentic bacon lover, you can get away with just half a pound. Not me though. Iol
- 2 Tbs. of Minced Garlic (you can buy a jarful already minced in Deli/Produce area)
- 4 Large Eggs put out till reaches room temperature
- 1 Cup of Freshly Grated Parmesan Cheese, plus more for garnish topping (I'd tell you that you could use the shaker kind but you really can't. Just buy a block of it and use your cheese grater or, ask them to grate an entire pound for you at the Deli counter. They'll gladly do it for you.

Salt & Pepper to taste, however..... Salt the water for the Spaghetti heavily as it's the only time you get to flavor the spaghetti internally.

Bring a large pot of heavily salted water to a full boil.

After you've cooked up your bacon nice and crisp, (pour off most of the bacon grease into a container if you're cooking a pound of bacon) saute' up the minced garlic after cooking up 2nd round of bacon. Use a very large and high skillet as you're going to be adding the cooked pasta to it. Some people just use their spaghetti pot and add all the ingredients to it as it's already so high. I do this, but others prefer the all-in-1 skillet method. You'll find your own groove.

In a separate bowl, whisk up the 4 eggs and 1 cup of grated Parmesan cheese. Add a good amount of fresh cracked black pepper. If mix is too tight, loosen it with some of the pasta water. When the minced garlic is just golden (never overcook) add the bacon back in and stir with a wooden spoon to incorporate well together. Remove from heat and stir in the egg & cheese mixture until creamy. Quickly add the drained spaghetti. Add 2 Tbls. of butter or margarine. If need be, add more pasta water to loosen if seems dry. It must be wet, loose & creamy. Fold out onto a large serving pasta platter and garnish with parsley and more Parmesan cheese. Serve with hot, crusty, lemon-butter bread. Delicioso!

OLD SKOOL VINEGAR PIE

- 2 Cups of Cool Water
- 1/2 Cup All-Purpose Flour
- 2 Cups Sugar
- Cups Sugar
- 2 Eggs; beaten & frothy
- 6 Tablespoons Apple Cider Vinegar
- 2 tsps. Limoncello (lemon flavored liqueur OR lemon extract (It's better w/ Limoncello, although in "the day", lemon extract was always used.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Use a store bought pie shell. Bake as per directions & cool completely.

In heavy 2-qt. saucepan, bring water to a full boil. In small bowl, combine flour and sugar, tossing with a fork to blend. Add the flour mix to boiling water and cook, whisking often, until thickened, about 7 minutes. Remove from heat and slowly add the eggs, whisking vigorously. Return to medium-low heat and cook, whisking until velvety smooth; about 3 minutes. Add the vinegar and Limoncello and whisk just to blend. Pour into the cooled pastry shell and refrigerate until set; 3 hours and never sooner. I think alot of people don't try this pie because of the name but damn....it is so good with lemon ice-cream.

Great...now I'm toally jonsing for it.


EASTER LOVIN' PISTACHIO WHOOPI PIES


1 Box of Cocoa Chocolate Cake Mix (If can't find, just get regular Milk Chocolate mix and add 1 Cup of Real Cocoa Mix mixed with 1/2 cup sugar).

Blend all ingredients as per pkg. directions. Lay out 2 large cookie sheets with baking parchment paper or non-stick mats. Take a small ice-cream or sherbet ball scoop that is approximate to the size of 2 Tablespoons and scoop into balls. Place balls all over both cookie pans. Leave 2-1/2 inches for balls to spread out. Take a rubber spatula and just press slightly so that all balls will bake down 1/2 inch thick. Bake 12 mins. so they're cracked on the surface. Cool 1 min. then transfer to a rack to cool thoroughly.

Put Pistachio ice-cream in refrigerator to soften up for about 20 minutes. Scoop 1/2 cup of ice-cream on each Whoopi and cover with another & squish slightly to form a sandwich. Freeze for no less than 2 hours before serving. These Rock!

Greetings Fellow Polar Bears!

By the time this hits the bike shops it will be spring. But as I write this, it is 8 degrees outside and a large drift near the window blocks my view of the driveway. What I want to know is which one of you pissed off the Gods? Lots of Thunder Roads readers want to know also so we can come to your house and give you a "blanket party" as we called it in the military. I'm catching a plane this week to Florida to get out of this cold for a week. I surrender!

Congress Blinked

As you are probably aware by now, in the ongoing soap opera in D.C. the politicians blinked on the Cost Of Living Allowance decrease issue for military retirees Military retirees will not see a lesser COLA increase than other federal retirees They took a lot of flak for that in D.C. and retreated to stand a better chance of getting reelected.

Domestic Energy Execs Lobbying Congress About G.I. Bill. Military **Exit Training**

Executives told a House subcommittee that the number of jobs in the country's oil, natural gas and solar industries has increased by as much as 40 percent since the recent recession -- creating scores of high-paying jobs for which veterans are

Veterans face several hurdles toward landing those jobs, including resumes mired in complicated military jargon and a GI Bill that seems more crafted to help finance a college education than pay for high-skilled technical training.

The government does a great job of preparing civilians for military service but less so in readying them to enter the job market. An eight-week course could cost as much as \$10,000 and quickly deplete some of the bill's housing benefits. One suggestion was job training for military personnel before they are discharged. "We need a reverse boot camp."

"Can You Hear Me Now?" VA Wait For Hearing Aids

VA is taking weeks to provide or repair hearing aids for its patients, leaving hearing-impaired veterans at risk. The VA has promised to provide hearing aids within five days, but the agency's inspector general found that the average wait time was between 17 and 24 days. About 30 percent of veterans are waiting 30 days or more, and of those, 10 percent are waiting to have their hearing aids fixed for two months or more, a report released last week found.

VA officials blamed staffing issues for the delays, but inspectors visited the Denver Acquisition and Logistics Center (DALC), which serves as a central processing facility for the VA, and said they, observed 19,500 hearing aids backlogged, unopened, sitting on carts and waiting for repairs or replacements. Part of the reason the agency kept veterans waiting was because staff never recorded when they received the hearing aids or requests for the devices.

Housing for Female Homeless Veterans

A plan to provide temporary housing for homeless female veterans in Genesee County is back on track. The organization known as Our Home Transitional hopes to buy a house in Flint to help women who have served their country. A house in Flint could hold up to 25 women who have served in the military but are homeless or soon to be homeless. It's estimated there are 100 women in Genesee County alone who fit that profile.

Genesee County veterans' records damaged by mold

Specialists in Livonia will try to restore thousands of pages of Genesee County

veterans' military papers that sustained water, mildew and mold damage. Some date as far back as World War II. Most are discharge papers damaged by moisture at an offsite storage facility, where they had been stored until recent years, Genesee County Clerk John Gleason told The Flint Journal.

The county isn't sure whether any records have been damaged beyond repair. The county keeps the records at the request of veterans if they choose, Gleason said. It especially is important for elderly veterans who need access to the documents when they become eligible for certain benefits.

Funds raiser to support Greenville soldier critically injured in training accident

Cory Muzzy was critically injured in a live-fire training accident on Feb. 21, and is undergoing a series of surgeries at Duke Medical Center. One of his legs has been partially amputated so far and he is battling blindness in both eyes. But family and friends are rooting for him.

Muzzy's parents and wife are staying in North Carolina to assist with his care and transition once he is released from the hospital. If financing allows, they hope to bring his 3-year-old son to stay with the family.

Getting Ready for the Motorcycle Season: Jason's Top 5 Tips

In spite of the cold and snow, I know a lot of motorcyclists are getting ready for this year's riding season. I know I'm dying to get back out on the open road, and hoping we won't have much longer to wait. There's so much you can do to get ready for the season, I thought I would share my "Top 5" tips to help get you started.

#1: Insurance. I know insurance isn't sexy, but it is so important to make sure your bike is properly insured before you even think of going out for a ride. I know some people cancel their insurance policies, or just keep their comprehensive coverage during the winter. As I've said before, this is not recommended. If you cancel your insurance outright and something happens to your bike while it's on your property (think flood, fire, or theft), your homeowner's insurance does not cover your motorcycle. If you get in a wreck with just comprehensive coverage on the bike, you might be in big trouble: Comprehensive coverage won't pay for repairs to your bike if you get in a wreck, and you're not legal to ride on the street without bodily injury coverage. Don't risk it! Even a quick trip to the party store could ruin your whole season if your insurance isn't fully up to date. #2: Tires. Michigan has had some of the coldest temperatures ever this winter, so it's a good idea to inspect your tires thoroughly before going out to ride. Look for cracks, flat spots, or any other damage. Get yourself an accurate tire gauge, and check tire pressure when your tires are cold, before you've ridden more than a few miles. If you need a tire gauge, visit my website at www.motorcyclelawyermichigan.com/20.html and request one, along with our new Biker Card* and other freebies we have available. Remember, tire pressure is linked to the temperature outside; if it's really cold or really warm compared to your last ride, check your tires again. NHTSA recommends checking tire pressure at least once per week. Most tires have an ideal PSI range stamped right on them, and your owner's manual can tell you more about adjusting your tire pressure according to the load and the temperature.

#3: Engine, brakes, and battery. What you have to do to get your bike ready now depends a lot on what you did to get it ready for winter storage. If you did some prep before putting it to bed for the winter, you should still do a full circle check to make sure everything is working properly. Check your lights and turn signals. If you didn't change the oil and filter before winter, you should do so now. Check your brakes, too, to make sure they're working properly and not worn. Before and after you start the engine, look for fluid leaks. Make sure your battery is topped up (where applicable), fully charged, and undamaged.

#4: Gear. This time of year is full of motorcycle events and swap meets, a great way to get out and see what's new for this season,

or pick up the gear you've been missing. A biker's gear is as personal as their ride, and there are a lot of products available to help make your riding season more fun and more comfortable. I always carry my phone, a waterproof shell, and our Biker Card* which has instructions for what to do in the event of a crash and also gets me discounts at a bunch of different stores and restaurants. If you want a Biker Card, visit www.motorcyclelawyermichigan.com/20.html to request one.

#5: Routes. Have you seen the roads out there? After a winter like this, it's no surprise they're pretty torn up, and potholes can be a real problem for motorcycles. Before the riding season really gets underway, start paying attention to the condition of the road when you go out in your car. Keep an eye out for smoother routes and areas that haven't been so badly damaged by the snow and ice, and stick to those for your first few rides. Once the season gets into full swing, more and more roads will be repaired, giving us more and more pothole-free routes to take. If you're looking for new rides to try, I've posted a list of Michigan's best rides on my website, www. motorcyclelawyermichigan.com/MIBestRides.html.

Take it easy out there! Ease into full riding by practicing your braking and maneuvers in a safe location like a parking lot before taking it to the streets. These tips should help you get off to a great start and may even extend your season and the life of your bike, too.



The Way it Works

Each month *Thunder Roads Michigan* will announce a list of Thunder Run Stops each month. These stops are selected based upon the recommendations of our readers and confirmed by our editors. Riders can then hit these locations and present their Rider Cards in order to register at each stop.

Once a Rider has registered at the stop - their Card number is then entered into the drawing for that stop. *Thunder Roads Michigan* will then select rider checks-ins randomly each month from across the state for special prizes and incentives.

Prizes are developed by both *Thunder Roads Michigan* and our sponsors - allowing for some exciting options. They may include stays at exciting stops, riding gear or accessories, gift certificates, cash, and even the opportunity to win a motorcycle!



The beauty and simplicity of this program is that anyone can win with any check-in, but your chances of winning are increased by the amount you ride! The dedicated rider trekking across the state has a greater chance of accumulating prizes but the couple that can only get out a few days a month to ride can also win! Every check-in counts as an entry in the "drawing" - so if you hit 40 stops in a month, you have twice as many chances of winning as someone that only hits 20. State and Stop Prizes

That would be a prize specific to that stop and only riders checking in at that location would be eligible for that prize. The Winners

If your check-in is drawn, *Thunder Roads Michigan* will post your card number both online and in the magazine. Riders will then have at least 45 days to "claim" their prizes. For state-wide prizes, winners will often have the opportunity to select from a number of prize options. For instance, a rider might have the option of winning a *Rally Package* that includes accommodations and extras for attending the particular Rally. If that rider isn't able to take advantage of that prize - they might opt for a *Premium Leather Jacket* instead.

One special highlight of the custom build is the billet aluminum girder front end that recalls the early Indian models. Designed, machined and built in-house, the girder fork







If you've just prayed this simple prayer with me, please contact me. I would like to pray with you, encourage you and walk with you in your new relationship with the God of All creation.



Tech Tips By Steve

Getting the Dirty Out ... A Proper Engine Oil Change

One of the easiest things you can do to protect your engine and extend its life is an oil change, easy enough right? I would say correct ... with a little information on the proper way to get rid of the dirty nasty crappy vucky oil.

Set yourself up for success and get all your tools and supplies ready before starting to tear into things, you will need a drain pan that will hold 5 guarts or more. a wrench for the oil plug or a screwdriver to loosen up the clamp for the types that have a plug in the oil drain line, oil filter wrench or strap, rags, Teflon tape or paste, oil filter, oil, and new a oil plug o-ring and, if you have one, a flat jack or a

Ride your bike for a bit getting it to operating temperature, the oil should be warm so it will flow out well, this will also help mix the nasty contaminants in the oil that settle out after shutdown. After its warm get your drain pan ready, open the oil filler cap so it will drain well and pull the plug (see pictures for various plug locations on some Harley models)



Newer Sportster, tube on right side of bike, Look closely its hiding J



Touring models, don't remove the wrong plug! Oil is the one facing forward NOT down.



Older Softail on the right side, remove plug from oil line.



Newer Softail the plug is in the frame on the right side under the bike

Use a clean drain pan so you can inspect the oil after draining, please be patient and give it time to drain out.

NOTE: A little known fact ... Harley leaves about one guart of old oil in the bike after you drain it and the only way to get it out is to do a flush, yep we can do it

While you are waiting for the oil to drain clean your drain plug off, replace the old o-ring and lightly coat the threads with Teflon tape or paste.



Oil plug and bad o-ring

Spin the old filter off inspecting the oil filter housing making sure the old oil filter o-ring did not get left behind, you will have a leak at the filter if it gets double o-ringed. Clean your mess from taking the filter off, then lightly coat the new oil filters o-ring and tighten it another _ - _ turn after the filter o-ring touches the filter

Next put the oil drain plug back in and it's time to fill the bike with oil according to the quantity the manufacturer states. What kind? We use Amsoil or Schaeffer's 20-50 but there are many good oils out there, your choice, just chose wisely ... no cheapo oil my friends!

NOTE: If it states 4 quarts put about 3.5 or so in, start your bike until the oil pressure light goes out, shut it off and fill to capacity. Sometimes they don't quite take all they say it should then you have an overfill problem and that can be bad.

After you are confident it's full take it out for a short ride and when you get back check for leaks and make sure it's full one more time. DONE!

So you're going to buy your first handgun? Maybe you have been hunting your : entire life, or you've shot rifles and shotguns. Perhaps you're entirely new to firearms altogether. Regardless of your firearm experience, there are a few things you need to know before you make your first handgun purchase.

Many people come into the store looking to buy a specific firearm, because their brother, friend, uncle, or neighbor told them they "just have to buy X gun!" That gun may be a fantastic firearm, but it might not be the right gun for you! The most important factor in making your decision is finding the gun that fits your hand the

In order to do this, you must first be familiar with the different types of handguns available. Would you prefer a semi-auto or a revolver? Is the gun going to be mainly for range use and home protection, or are you going to be getting your CPL for concealed carry? The amount of recoil you will feel will vary depending on type of firearm, so I highly recommend that you try a couple different guns in varying calibers so that you will know what is comfortable for you to shoot regularly. If your gun is not comfortable and fun to shoot, it will end up being an expensive paperweight. I recommend going to a local gun shop with a range, and ask the staff questions. Most importantly, ask what they recommend for your hand size, and then hold the different guns. The various grips will fit your hand differently. Find the guns that feel good to you and try them on the range. Keep in mind that full framed guns will generally have less felt recoil and be more comfortable to : If you prefer revolvers, I'd recommend one of the Smith & Wesson revolvers with shoot. Here are just a few:



The Springfield Armory XD has a slim grip, with a short trigger reach, and is a great gun to try if you have small hands.



A standard Glock, by comparison, has a large, thick grip, which is ideal for shooters with larger hands.



Glock recently began producing the model 42, chambered in .380 acp, with a much smaller frame, which is ideal for shooters with very small hands.



This Remington 1911 R1 is a standard, single action 1911 type firearm, and its full sized metal frame makes shooting a .45 guite pleasant. This style gun requires long fingers, but can be held by smaller hands, such as mine, because the grip


steel frames, particularly with a longer barrel. This tiny Smith is part of their Air Weight line, and is designed for concealed carry. It's an excellent gun, but the recoil can be a little intimidating for a new shooter.



Smith & Wesson also makes semi-auto pistols, and their M&P line is great for home defense, as well as carry. Either the full size or the compact would be a good choice, as the compact isn't too unruly, though it does carry a bit more snap than the full size. Make sure you hold both, as the grips on the two frame sizes


