### House votes to give vets access to private care

The House unanimously approved legislation to make it easier for patients enduring lengthy delays for initial visits to get VA-paid treatment from local doctors instead. The Senate was poised to vote on a similar bill, said Democratic leader Harry Reid.

The legislation comes close on the heels of a Veterans Affairs Department audit showing that more than 57,000 new applicants for care have had to wait at least three months for initial appointments and an additional 64,000 newly enrolled vets who requested appointments never got them.

The House bill and a similar version in the Senate would spend hundreds of millions of dollars to hire more doctors and nurses, but that may be easier said than done given a nationwide shortage of primary care physicians.

"This is not a problem that is just isolated to the VA," said Rep. Dina Titus, D-Nev.

Primary care physicians are expected to become increasingly in demand as millions of people newly insured under the federal health care law start looking for regular doctors. The Association of American Medical Colleges has projected that by 2020, there will be 45,000 too few primary care physicians, as well as a shortage of 46,000 surgeons and specialists.

### Veterans turn to American Legion for medical help

A counselor at the local Veterans Affairs office looked at Rebecca King, a victim of domestic violence and abuse who was seeking help for depression, and told her she would not be able to see a psychologist. She looked too nice and put together for someone depressed, King was told.

Like others who've failed to receive help at troubled VA offices, the Army veteran then gave up. "I have a son, I'm his only support system, I have to keep it together" King recalled telling the VA office in El Paso, trying to explain why she didn't look disheveled.

She is now among nearly 1,800 people who have turned to the American Legion, which has held town-hall meetings and opened temporary crisis centers in Phoenix, Fayetteville, North Carolina, and El Paso. Patients can gain access to health benefits, schedule doctor's appointments, enroll in the VA and even get back pay.

The centers come in the wake of the VA scandal that brought to light long wait times and false record-keeping among other things, and are being established in towns where the VA audit showed wait times were longer. Between now and October, crisis centers will come to Fort Collins, Colorado; Saint Louis, Missouri and Baltimore, Maryland. They also plan to visit Clarksburg, West Virginia; White City, Oregon and Harlingen, Texas.

Jessica Jacobsen, deputy director of the VA's regional public affairs office in Dallas, said the VA will use community partners, such as the American Legion, to help "accelerate access and get veterans off wait lists and into clinics.

On the first day the Legion's crisis center team arrives in a town, they typically hold a town-hall meeting, where they take questions from veterans — sometimes, the head of the local VA is there to answer as well. In the days following, veterans come to the Legion post and talk to counselors, who assess the best way to tackle a given problem, be it benefits, retroactive payment, scheduling a doctor's appointment or enrolling a veteran in the VA's system for the first time.

### Volunteers build home for vet who lost arms in Afghani-

"Faith, family, friends and the community" are helping Eric Lund as he recovers from the wounds of war and seeks to come home.

That was among the messages shared at a groundbreaking for Lund's Helping a Hero home in Hamlin Township.

Lund, a sergeant in the Army National Guard, lost both arms in Afghanistan in May 2012. He was honored with a gathering of people committed to help create an adaptive home for him.

As shovels dug into the dirt at the home site, the crowd shouted, "Welcome home. Eric" and waved American flags.

Lund will celebrate when a second Helping a Hero home is built in Michigan and he is able to help with that cause.

Meredith Iler, chair of Helping a Hero, said applications are being taken for that second home for a wounded warrior and are available at the organization's website, www.helpingahero.org.

### Last of original group of Navajo Code Talkers dies

The last of the 29 Navaios who developed a code that stumped the Japanese during World War II has died. Chester Nez, of Albuquerque, New Mexico, died June 4 of kidney failure, said Judy Avila, who helped Nez write his memoirs. He was 93.





# The Motorcycle Lawyer on THE LAW

### **Changes to Michigan's Laws that Could Benefit Motorcyclists**

So far this year, we've seen a number of Bills proposing changes to Michigan's motorcycling laws. I believe some of these changes could benefit motorcyclists and potentially increase rider safety, which is a step in the right direction. Here are a few changes proposed this year to Michigan's motorcycling laws.

House Bill No. 4781: This Bill amends the section of Michigan's vehicle code (MCL 257.306) that deals with the Temporary Instruction Permits (TIPs) for motorcyclists. Previously, motorcyclists who did not have a CY endorsement on their driver's license could get TIP, allowing them to ride legally for six months under certain restrictions, including only riding during daylight hours, always wearing a helmet, always riding with a fully-endorsed adult, and others. The purpose of the TIP was to give new motorcyclists the opportunity to practice their skills before taking their rider skills test as part of the CY endorsement process.

However, rather than using the TIP to practice for their Skills Test and to get their CY endorsement, some riders were using a TIP for the entire riding season, letting it expire over the winter, and then applying for a new one the start next motorcycling season.

House Bill No. 4781, which was unanimously approved in May of this year and takes effect on January 1, 2015, limits riders to just two TIPs in a ten-year period. That gives motorcyclists more than enough time to practice before their Skills Test, if they don't want to take a certified Rider Safety Course. This change is a step in the right direction, at least as far as encouraging riders to ride legally with a CY endorsement. Hopefully, having fewer untrained, un-endorsed riders on the roads will lead to more safety for all.

Taking a certified Rider Safety Course is a good idea, and I always recommend motorcyclists get their CY endorsement. Getting endorsed is not expensive, especially compared to the fines you might pay if you are caught riding without an endorsement. Plus, insurance rates tend to go down once you get your CY, so getting endorsed can save you money.

House Bill No. 5438: This Bill would amend section 37 of the Driver Education Provider and Instructor Act (MCL 257.657), specifically to include motorcycle (and bicycle) awareness and safety training for all new motor-vehicle drivers.

The Bill proposes that "classroom instruction shall include information concerning the laws pertaining to bicycles and motorcycles and shall emphasize awareness of their operation on the streets, roads, and highways." House Bill No. 5438 has not yet been made law yet, but it's on its way.

If the Bill passes, motorcycle awareness and safety training will be a legal part of the driver education curriculum. Promoting motorcycle

awareness among new drivers will help spread the word to Watch for Motorcycles, and could help save lives.

House Bill No. 4265: This Bill would amend section 611 of the Michigan Vehicle Code (MCL 257.611). The proposed change would allow motorcyclists, as well as moped and 3-wheeled motorcycle riders, and bicyclists, to proceed through a red light if their motorcycle or vehicle does not trigger the light's sensors, within certain restrictions. The rider would have to wait at the red light for a complete light cycle or a minimum of sixty seconds if the light is not cycling. They would also be required to yield to oncoming traffic "in the manner required by the stop signal."

Other states have enacted similar laws, often called "safe-on-red" laws. Every state's law is different, but the general idea is the same: to allow motorcyclists and others on small vehicles to proceed when sensors don't pick up their vehicles, as long as it is safe to do so.

Safe-on-red laws will increase convenience, but it's not clear what impact they may have on rider safety, if any. I think any safe-on-red laws enacted must be accompanied by a strong awareness campaign. If motor vehicle drivers are educated about the new law and reminded to watch for motorcycles in intersections, it could go a long way to making laws like this one safer for motorcyclists.

Stay tuned for updates on these and other new laws here in Michigan, and stay safe this summer!

Make it for next year's Freedom Cruise the last week of June 2015!










































# Round up at the Ray C's Rodeo





### ALGAE-FUELED MOTORCYCLE SETS SPEED RECORD

Below the Surface's "Driving Innovation" Team established the first official algae-fueled motorcycle speed records during The Texas Mile land speed event on March 24th, 2012. Team leader Kristian Gustavson reached 94.6 mph using a 50/50 blend of biodiesel derived from algae and cooking oil waste from the University of California at San Diego (UCSD). Fellow team member, Devin Chatterjie, reached 96.2 MPH on 100% algae-derived Green Crude diesel fuel supplied by Sapphire Energy Inc., one of the world's leaders in algaebased oil crude production. Together, they established the fastest and only known records to date for an algae-fueled motorcycle.

The Driving Innovation Team rode a unique turbocharged, 800cc diesel powered Track Motorcycle manufactured in Holland. The bike was shipped from Holland to the US last fall courtesy of FedEx Express in a show of support for the project. They rode five times, registering 94.6, 95.1, 95.2, 95.6, and 96.2 MPH. Their next official speed trial will be in El Mirage, Calif., on May 19th.



"The Texas Mile organizers, racers, and spectators were extremely supportive of our team during the speed trials and I would really like to thank them for the warm welcome and opportunity to put algae fuel to the test. I am excited to work with them more in the future," said Gustavson.

In a project entitled One Barrel for Baja, Gustavson led a team of UCSD students to make a portion of the biofuel themselves under the supervision of Dr. B. Greg Mitchell's Scripps Photobiology Group, with assistance from the San Diego Center for Algal Biotechnology. The students grew and harvested algae using a sponsored Dissolved Air Flotation (DAF) unit supplied by World Water Works from ponds at the Carbon Capture Corporation's facility near the Salton Sea and at a greenhouse facility on the university's campus.

After the algae harvest, its biomass was isolated and sent to Dr. Skip Pomeroy's Laboratory at UCSD. In the laboratory, the lipids and fats were then extracted and further converted into usable diesel fuel by the Biofuels Action and Awareness Network.

Gustavson, a recent graduate of the Center for Marine Biodiversity and Conservation's MAS Program at the Scripps Institution of Oceanography, is a co-founder of Below the Surface, a nonprofit organization dedicated to

exploring waterways and educating the public about issues pertaining to water. He started the One Barrel for Baja Project in order to synthesize enough algal biodiesel to compete in various speed trials and the gruel-



ing Baja 1000 race this fall (http://algae.ucsd.edu/Blog1/Blog-1-Baja.html). Below the Surface is committed to finding solutions to pollution and believes that biofuels from algae can help reduce run-off going into America's waterways.







# World War II Combat on a Harley-Davidson: Africa 1943

First American Soldiers meet the British Army, 70 years ago, April 7, 1943




my duty to carry messages, by motorcycle, between Battalion command and my Company Commander. After landing at Casablanca January 25th 1943 we trained in desert warfare and broke in the new equipment we were issued. Where we were bivouacked I could see. from my pup tent, the white building where on January 14, 70 years ago, Franklin Roosevelt. Winston Churchill and Charles De-Gaulle met in Casablanca.

On one training exercise

we had to get into a fox hole and have one of our tanks run over us. They had about 12 fox holes all in a row. I was in the last hole. I could hear that tank coming and the ground shaking. I had a feeling that something just wasn't right. When he got over my fox hole he turned the tank right on top of me and the side of my fox hole caved in on me. They blew the whistle to get up; I couldn't move. They yelled "Peepers get up!" I yelled back "I can't". So they had to dig me out. I was ok, but a little shook up. This is what they call " friendly fire". I had plenty of that in France, Belgium and Germany.

When I got my new Harley Davidson about three weeks after we arrived at Casablanca. Africa, I had to put 500 miles on it to break it in. That fun ended on March



1st, 1943 when we started the long trip to the front. It took us 7 ½ days and 1,400 miles. I got a good view of Africa riding my motorcycle. Some mornings when I got up I had frost all over me and my motorcycle. One day I got so cold riding I had to stop and jump up and down on the road to warm up. A French farmer saw me and had one of his workers bring a big arm full of straw and set it on fire so I could get warm. It sure helped a lot. We arrived at our new bivouac area on March 14, 1943. It was just east of Bouchebka which is just across the Algerian border in Tunisia. East of Tunisia is Libya. This is the area where the British and Germans had been fighting for about 3 or 4 years. Last year with the war in Libya, television reports showed Libya and all of North Africa: the whole area where I spent 10 months and put about 3 thousand miles on my motorcycle.

It was during this time that I stole little Moe, our "C" Company mascot, on orders from my First Sergeant. When the Sergeant wanted a jeep driver, he always picked me. I had to drive him and another first Sergeant into town and the first stop was a bar. The Bartender and owner had a little black puppy that belonged to his little daughter. He put it up on the bar so we could pet it. The Sergeant put a little brandy in a saucer and the puppy got drunk. The first Sergeant said to me, "Peepers, when we get ready to leave, you put the puppy in your jacket". I said, "Sergeant the puppy belongs to the bartender's little daughter, I can't do that". He said, "It's an order!" So that is how we got our company mascot. Little Moe went to Italy, England, France, Belgium and Germany with us. In England Moe liked to ride on my motorcycle. I was in the hospital when Little Moe got left in a Ger-

man house being used as the Company command post. They pulled out during the night and forgot about Moe. The last time I saw Moe, she was setting on a soldiers lap in a big army truck that went by me as I was standing on a street corner in a small town in Germany. That was the first and the last time I saw Moe since a week before "D" day, June 1st 1944. Moe landed at Utah beach on "D" Day and I landed on Omaha Beach June 10th.

On the morning of April 7th at about 7:00am I was given a message originating from Patton's headquarters to de-

liver to the Company "C" Commander of the 899th. The message contained orders to move his tanks up toward Tunis. They spread a map of the area over the hood of a jeep and showed me the "C" Company location and said they were getting ready to pull out and might be gone by the time I got there. I was directed to find them and make sure the Captain got the message.

On this assignment I met the British in Africa. We were about one mile into no-man's-land. The Germans were retreating and the British were attacking and I and George Keyges were in between. That is no-man's-land. George A. Kegyes Jr., a tank driver from my company was looking for a ride back to "C" Company. He had just gotten out of the hospital and had one of his hands still bandaged. I told him to get

on the back of my motorcycle since we were going to the same place. For the next half hour we didn't see another soldier or hear any shooting. It was quiet except for my loud motorcycle. At one point we took a spill and damaged the muffler at the end of the exhaust pipe so I took it off. We got to where "C" Company was supposed to be but they had already pulled out. We stopped on a small hill and. looking around, did not see any soldiers or vehicles. We did see about five or six wild camels and they were moving fast right toward us. I told George we needed to get out of there. Something had spooked the camels. We continued down the road looking for "C" Company. George saw a scout car on a hill off to our right so I stopped the motorcycle to get a better look. I think they were watching us closely and were probably scouting for Germans. I knew it wasn't an American scout car and I hadn't heard anything about the British being that close. I knew the German Army was close because we had been fighting them for the last five months. I told George we should go down the road a little further and then we will turn back if we didn't see Company "C". We went over a small hill and right in front of us was the British 8th Army convoy. They were stopped and standing by their trucks and tanks. When they saw we were Americans, they let out a yell, "Yanks, Yanks!" and their cheers ran down the convoy. They shook our hands and took our picture. We were as much a boost to their morale as they were to ours. We spent about five minutes with them and left to find "C" Company. We caught up with them in about a half hour. I gave the message to the Captain and I didn't even tell him that we met the British 8th Army. I had completely forgotten about the incident until I was reading the Chronicle-Telegram on April 7th 1993 about what had happened in history 50 years ago. It described the meeting of the Americans and the British 8th Army on that date. I exclaimed to my wife that the Americans were me and

up in the hospital for 24 days. It had happened after "C" Company pulled out. We had just had lunch and I had lingered to finish my coffee. (Since I had my own transportation, I was pretty much free to do what I wanted unless I had a specific messenger assignment.) After coffee I left and rode to catch up with Company "C". When I caught up with the convoy, the first vehicle I passed was the maintenance truck that always brings up the rear, then the kitchen truck and then the ambulance. I just got by the ambulance and ran into a shell hole on the shoulder of the rough road and took a bad spill. The soldiers in the ambulance thought I had run over a mine or a shell had landed on me. They said I made a big cloud of dust and when it cleared up I was standing up and they could see that my collar bone was broken, and that I was dazed. I think that I completely flipped and came down on my head and right shoulder. When the medics pushed on my collar bone I passed out. They put big pieces of adhesive tape to hold my collar bone in place and started the 70 mile ambulance ride to an evacuation hospital.

George Kegyes. When George and I met the British on April 7 1943 and they let

out that cheer "Yanks" and it went all the way down their convoy, I wonder how

many times that word was said that day. We sure made lots of British soldiers

About 5 hours after we met the British I took a spill on my motorcycle and ended

happy and me and George also. It's been 70 years and I still can hear "yanks".

After we arrived they took me to a tent and laid me on the ground.

I was on a stretcher and remember how dark it was in there.

It was full of dead, wounded and injured soldiers.

About midnight they came in and announced that we were to evacuate. All walking patients would ride in British ambulances and other patients would go by plane. I had never been in an airplane and I didn't want to start then. I said that I could walk and that I wanted to go in the ambulance. The ambulance had benches on both sides that held patients on each side, stacked up. I had a small burlap bag with my personal things in it. I put it on my lap and rested my arm on top of the bag

to relieve the pain on my broken

collar bone. We hadn't gone very far when I got sick and vomited. They laid me on the floor and that's where I stayed for the rest of the trip to the General Hospital in Constantine, Africa. The hospital was an arrangement of tents set up in a wheat field. The next morning I walked over to the operating tent and got my

collar bone fixed and they put a jacket cast down to my waist. My arms were free to move. I had that on for 20 days. Our "barracks" were long tents and our "cots" were five or six inches of wheat. Our "air conditioning" was when we rolled up the sides of the tents. That is where I spent Easter Sunday, 1943.

By May 1st I was back with my company and got right back on my motorcycle. The operations against the Axis powers had ended in Africa while I was in the hospital. It had been a good rest for me. We didn't have to do anything but lie around and play cards all day. The incident with the British 8th Army and my injury showed me a lot about how luck and coincidence help you survive a war. I think that is why I completely forgot about meeting the British 8th Army for 50 years. I was also lucky that I fell on my motorcycle near an ambulance rather than near the maintenance truck or alone somewhere in the desert. When I saw that article in the Elyria Chronicle, it all came back to me. Before April 7th, 1943 at the Battalion command post, I didn't even know George Kegyes. He was from Company "C" but in a different Platoon. We were both from Ohio and lived about 13 miles from each other, I was from North Olmsted and George was from Elyria. Now I live just two streets from where George lived on

6th Street. George Kegyes is buried just miles from where I now live in Elyria.

### HARLEY-DAVIDSON MESSENGER AS A TARGET

Command Posts were a good target for German planes and artillery especially it's officers, vehicles and, in the following case, my motorcycle. It was in March 1943 that I was at the command post and assembled there were 2 motorcycles, two half-track radio vehicles in addition to my motorcycle. A captain stopped for information and told his driver to put the camouflage net over his command car. Two German planes spotted that green net and attacked. The first bomb covered my fox hole and I had to use all my strength to push myself out of the hole through the dirt to get air or I would have suffocated like four other soldiers did right near me. When I stood up shaking the dirt off me and getting air, I saw the other German plane coming right at me as he released his bomb. That plane was so low that I felt like I was looking at the German pilot right in his eyes. I jumped back into my fox hole and took cover as best I could since it was full of dirt. I don't know if I said it out loud or to myself, but I prayed "Please, God, I don't want to die yet".

As soon as the planes left we started to dig in fox holes for the soldiers that got buried. We dug with our hands. I got hold of a soldier's arm and another soldier helped

me pull him out. He was dead. I got the order to pull out immediately because soon as those German Planes got back at their base they would give their artillery our location and they would shell us. We moved forward about two hundred yards and about one hundred yards off to the left of the black top road at the foot of some small hills. It was getting dark and I was getting in my sleeping bag because I was dead tired. An officer came up to me and said, "Peepers, you have to go back and get the Company Commander at the old command post." And I said, "Sir, can you get someone else to go, I am too tired. He said "It's an order" and I said "Yes, sir". So I got on my motorcycle and counted two small hills I had to get over to get out on the black top road. By that time it was getting pretty dark and I had to drag my feet to keep on the road. The only light I had on my motorcycle was my black out light. No head lights were allowed on the front lines.





When I got to the old command post, the captain velled out "Is that you Peepers?" And I said "Yes, Sir." He said, "Follow me!" One the way back an infantry soldier yelled "Watch out there is a hole here". It was too late; I was already in the hole. I just gave the motorcycle more gas and climbed right back out. When we got back to the new command post, the officer that was with the captain came up to me and said. "How could you see?" I said, "Sir, I couldn't see a damn thing, I felt my way back by dragging my feet on the road". The officer said they had a hard time following my black out light on my tail light. The Germans didn't drop any bombs on us that night, so I got a good night's sleep next to my motorcycle. I was surprised those bombs didn't damage my motorcycle. Of all the bombs and artillery that we were in, we never got hit.

months of training before I was sent to Italy. We only stayed in Italy about ten days and they took all our equipment away from us and sent us to England for

the invasion of France. There I got another new Harley Davidson. Eventually they took that one away from me and assigned me as driver of an armored car for the second in command. He never rode with me and I had it all for myself. This is the armored car I drove onto Omaha Beach June 10th, 1944. On July 20th, I was made a tank commander for the next 5 months when I was made Platoon (Staff)

George Kegyes died 34 years ago and I put flowers on his grave last Memorial Day. I will continue to do so as I do for my close buddy who died during the war. He is buried in Ravenna, Ohio, about 60 miles from where I live. I have put flowers on his grave for 66 years. He got killed by artillery fire.

### THE WAR AFTER 'D' DAY

Recalling operations in Africa brings back a lot of memories. It became a different kind of war after "D" Day. I lived through battles in France, Belgium, and Germany. As I met the British in Africa, I met the Russians at the Elbe River in Germany. Between those events we liberated thousands of French and Belgians and many prisoner of war camps. Even the Germans were glad to see us, but not the Russians. Four times I got into no-man's land. Although there are many stories to tell about "noman's land", one I remember clearly. In Germany in 1945 my platoon officer said we have to move up to the German lines and knock out a German machine gun that has our infantry pinned down behind trees in the woods. I guess the look that I gave him caused him to say, "It is an order from the infantry Colonel, and we have to do it". He said "come on I'll show you where it is". At the edge of the woods there was high grass and we got down on our bellies and crawled like a couple of snakes. A couple of times he looked back at me and whispered "keep your head down". He pointed out to me the German machine gun. We crawled back the same way. I got in my tank and we moved up toward the machine gun. I could see our infantry lying behind the trees. I was giving the driver instructions and the gunner and we were right up in the German line. I could see the German soldiers as clearly as I could the American soldiers. I pulled out my pistol and shot at the closest Germans and hit one of them. We knocked out the machine gun and our soldiers attacked. Another time I was in a jeep and got about a mile into the German lines. There were five of us in the jeep when we saw three German soldiers coming out of a building. They ran for cover and our jeep driver slammed on the brakes and he backed down the road as fast as we could and turned the jeep around and we escaped with the three German soldiers shooting at us. No one got hit. When we got down the road about a mile we met our soldiers riding on our tanks. Our officer gave the Colonel the information and they spread the infantry out in the woods and the tanks down the road. The Germans pulled out real guick and not a shot was fired. The next day the Germans gave us a hard time before they retreated.

I have many more stories to tell and now's the time to do it. I had many close calls and spent 24 days in the hospital in Africa and about two weeks in Germany. I'm 93 years old and still in the color guard of the VFW Post 9871 in North Ridgeville, the American Legion in Elyria and the DAV in Elyria, and the Senior Fellowship of Elyria. I'm a life member of all of them.





After the war ended in Africa, it was six more

After paying respect to those honored on the Wall the 10 riders, joined by an estimated 100,000 motorcycles will turn towards New Orleans and lead this caravan on a salute to all Veterans as they travel to their destination. Their arrival in New Orleans will signal the kickoff of the Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Celebration. This all-star celebrity concert will be the Thank You these Veterans deserve. This is their welcome home so the Vietnam Vets will not be charged to attend. With over 700,000 Vietnam Veterans living in the United States, this monumental event will bring together many who served their country under unbelievable circumstances and creating a brotherhood that can never be broken.

The Return will be funded by corporate and individual sponsorships and donations.

### "MY" BACON, EGG, VIDALIA ONION, SWISS CHEESEBURGER WITH AN EASY-OVER EGG ON

\*I have been making these since I was 10 y.o. Thought I invented them, then saw it on some cooking show. Who Knew?

- 1 Ground Beef Burger however you like it; thick or thin, but shape it the size to fit your bun and then push down gently in the middle with your thumb so it will cook evenly.
- 4 Strips of Hickory-Smoked Bacon
- 1 X-Large Egg
- 2 Slices of Baby Swiss Cheese
- 5 Strips of Vidalia Onion, sautéed golden brown

Now, you can grill your burger or fry it in a skillet, and sauté' your onions up while frying burger and pick them out and drain on paper towel. Put your cheese on burger, add a little water to pan and cover with lid (keeps moist & melts cheese fast), remove & drain on paper plate; pile your onions on top, fry your egg in the grease, flip gently and remove to a paper plate. Butter your buns and toast in the oven. A toasted bun makes ANY burger better. Now just build your burger and put the easy-over egg on top and your favorite topping; mayo, ketchup, whatevva'. I break the yoke and let it run all down over the burger. Woooeeee! damn, this is slap-ass good!

- 1/2 Cup of Cornstarch
- 1/2 Cup of All-Purpose Flour
- 1/2 tsp. Baking Powder
- 2 Tbls. of Old Bay Seasoning (spice aisle or often by seafood display)
- 1 tsp. Cayenne
- Pinch of Salt
- 1/4 Cup of Pilsner Beer (will say on label)
- 1/4 Cup of Water
- 1/2 Cup of Vodka

\* Always use Peanut Oil for frying. It just holds temperature better and gives a good, clean taste. Don't re-use oil. Always use fresh so your food doesn't taste like what you last fried.

Banana Pudding: Mix in a cooled glass bowl

- 1 Box of Vanilla Pudding Mix
- 1/2 Cup of Whole Milk
- 1 Whole Can of Condensed Milk
- 1 Level tsp. of Nutmeg
- 1 Container of Frozen Whipped Topping

(If you want seriously better taste, make your own whip cream with 2 Cups of Confectioner's Sugar to 1 Cup of Heavy Whipping Cream and 1 Tbl. of pure Vanilla Extract. Just keep blending on High until stiff peaks form and then stop or it will all turn back to liquid.) Tastes SO much better though than the pre-made. And it's so easy!

- 1 Box of Nilla' Vanilla Wafer Cookies
- 4 Bananas: sliced into 1/4 inch rounds

Mix all ingredients together. Folding in the whipped cream gently towards the end on low. Mix should be creamy, not runny.

In a larger glass serving bowl, place a layer of the wafer cookies. Spread 1/4 of the pudding mix over the cookies. Lay 1/2 the banana slices over the pudding mix in a single layer. Spread another 1/4 of the pudding mix over the bananas. Repeat. Place any remaining cookies on top, but break them up into halves, but cover completely.

Refrigerate at least 3 hours or overnight.





I reached out to one of our European sources for a little information on the game -



# Holsters 101 PART II continued from last month

Last month, I covered the basics, what materials are : The Ankle Holster used for most holsters, and three basic styles of holster (Belt, Paddle, Inside the Waistband). This month we'll: dive a little deeper into concealment and cover some of the specialty holsters that exist and why they may be useful to you in some circumstances.

### The Shoulder Holster

Shoulder holsters have been used for many years and are often featured in various TV shows and movies. They can be a discreet option for carry under a suit or jacket, particularly in situations where a belt holster is simply not a viable option. The downside to shoulder holsters is that it is virtually impossible to draw your gun without sweeping most of the room. which is particularly dangerous in crowded locations. I highly: This is a specialized holster, designed for a small pistol. It recommend obtaining additional training before choosing to carry using this type of holster.

This is an extremely versatile holster that is worn under clothing around the waist. It is an elastic band, similar to holster is that it is more challenging to draw from deep conand practice than a standard belt holster due to the fact that the draw is a bit more complicated.

### The Waist Pack Holster




### The Purse Holster
