





VA Medical Treatment of Veterans

It seems lately there are some concerns about how some of the VA locations are providing medical care for veterans.

KKCO in Grand Junction, Colorado ran a story detailing the plight of two veterans. One bluntly said the VA's lack of urgency cost him his leg.

Larry Wilkinson said a VA doctor never called him with the test results of a foot infection and after two months of no news, he had to have his leg amputated.

"I feel the VA owes me a leg," Wilkinson said.

Another VA patient, Richard Worsley, said when he was showing symptoms of a heart attack, he was taken to St. Mary's even though he wanted to go to the VA Medical Center. He then received a bill for more than \$8,000.

68 Years to Get VA Benefits

89-year-old Milton Rackham, of Belding, Mich., lived for decades without any benefits because the VA told him his records were lost in a fire in Missouri, the World War II veteran and Purple Heart recipient told FoxNews.com.

"They always said, "we can't help you," recalled Rackham, a former engine mechanic with the U.S. Navy who suffered injuries during the war and later struggled to find work.

"It made me feel like I was worthless," he said.

In 2011, Rackham's friend, Myrl Thompson, began writing about Rackham's war stories, and arranged meetings between the veteran and VA officials over the benefits he allegedly never received. Roughly two months ago, Rackham claims he started receiving \$822 a month from the VA as well as \$7,000 in back-pay.

Perhaps more alarming is the allegation by Rackham that the VA had no new information on his record to prompt the payments some 68 years after he left the Navy.

"What drove me crazy was that they had the same information in 2008 and they denied me," he told FoxNews.com. "That's what blows me out of the water. Ever since 1974, when I first asked for benefits, they've had the same information."

Rackham also indicated that he was advised by friends to appeal the \$822 and the \$7,000, which amounts to 10 months in back pay, but he opted not to, saying, "I won't live long enough to go through the VA process one more time."

Kids' penny drive helps Marine vet get service dog

Penny by penny, children at a suburban Detroit Musson Elementary School have raised \$4,500 to help a Marine Corps combat veteran get a new service dog.

Eric Calley of Lansing has Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder and lost his service dog Liberty to cancer in January.

Calley spoke at a school assembly Thursday, thanking the children for their help. Calley says he's "humbled that the elementary school raised that much money" to help him with his issues. He says that "service dogs ... do something that's so great for ... veterans and servicemen and women."

Tool can plug gunshot wounds in seconds

You can find many things in Williams-Sonoma, the kitchenware retailer, cookie sheets, and spatulas. And, oh yeah, an idea for treating gunshot wounds. At least, that's what RevMedx found.

The U.S. military had asked the medical technology company to come up with a solution for stopping gunshot and shrapnel wounds from bleeding out. The working idea was a medical version of Fix-a-Flat, the foam you squirt in punctured tires to plug up a hole. (Perhaps the military had been browsing at Pep Boys.)

Instead, it was a sponge that solved the problem, says Andrew Barofsky, RevMedx's CEO.

"One of the co-founders of the company was shopping at a Williams-Sonoma and discovered this kitchen sponge that was dried and compressed. You'd bring it home, splash water under it, and it would pop up into a normal-sized kitchen sponge," he recalls. "That was kind of a light bulb moment."

The concept was turned into XStat, a dose of tiny sponge-like discs that are injected into an open wound with a syringe. The sponges, which have been treated with an anti-hemorrhagic substance, expand to 10 times their size in seconds, both plugging the wound and providing needed compression to stanch the bleeding.

It could be a revolutionary battlefield tool, says John Steinbaugh, a former Special Forces medic and the company's director of strategic development.

Packing wounds with gauze or tampons and then applying direct pressure for several minutes can take several minutes too long, he says. Bleeding out is a major cause of fatalities. "Three to five minutes can mean the difference between life and death," he says.

Medics are looking for something that "you fire and forget," he says. "You put it in and the bleeding instantly stops." XStat received FDA approval in April, and RevMedx is now ready to get it into the hands of medics.

The Motorcycle Lawyer on THE LAW Women's Motorcycle Month

As most readers know by now, July is Women's Motorcycle Month. Across the United States, motorcycling is growing in popularity among men and women of all ages. According to a recent Motorcycle Industry Council (MIC) survey, women now account for about twelve percent of motorcycle owners in the United States. Most riders have noticed a definite shift as women have moved from the back to the front of the bike, especially over the last ten years.

Here in Michigan, the number of women with a CY endorsement on their driver's license jumped from 54,084 in 2008 to over 67,539 in 2013, an increase of 13,455 riders. Secretary of State Ruth Johnson, who is actively involved in promoting motorcycle awareness and safety, was one of the first women in Oakland County to get her Michigan CY endorsement.

Women who ride seem to take safety seriously. More women are taking and completing motorcycle safety training courses, and in response to the increase in demand, many certified Rider Training Programs are offering "women only" classes. The Insurance Institute for Highway Safety (IIHS) reported that of the 4,667 motorcyclists who died in crashes in 2012, 419 were women, or about nine percent. Of this group, 285 of these were riding as passengers. In total, women riders (non-passengers) represented less than three percent of the motorcyclist fatalities in 2012. Obviously, the ideal would be zero motorcyclist fatalities, and both men and women who ride need to keep fighting to promote motorcycle awareness and safety on our roads.

In the past, customization was often the best option for women motorcyclists shopping in a "man's world", but that is no longer the case. Manufacturers are sitting up and taking notice of the sharp increase in women riders: protective gear, clothing, helmets, and even bikes are now being specifically designed to meet the needs of the female market. Harley Davidson® is a great example of a company that is working to attract the increasing number of female riders. Harley recently released two new motorcycles designed to appeal to women riders. A large portion of its website is dedicated to women, providing a wealth of information for female riders including tips for choosing a motorcycle and links to motorcycle safety courses. Women motorcyclists are encouraged to share their stories, and there are a number of inspiring testimonials from real women who ride. Harley has also created Garage Party, a hands-on event hosted by local dealerships, where women can come together to learn about motorcycling and view some of Harley's products and services.

While the availability of gear and even bikes designed with female riders in mind is a bonus, motorcycling isn't just about the "stuff". For most bikers, riding a motorcycle is about freedom and stress relief. Grabbing the handlebars is a way of taking control, and it appears most women riders feel the same way. Last year, Harley Davidson commissioned a study that found overall, women who ride feel happier, sexier, and more confident than women who don't. The study also showed that female motorcyclists had better communication with their significant others, as well as more physical intimacy. In terms of stress relief, women riders who participated in Harley's study reported feeling less stressed after they started riding.

From where I sit, I think the increase in ridership among women is a good thing for all motorcyclists. More bikers can only help motorcycling technology evolve, which has the potential to help increase road safety for all of us. Also, the more motorcycles car and truck drivers encounter, the more likely they are to really "see" us in intersections and in their blind spots. With high-profile role models like Secretary of State Johnson, and manufacturers catering specifically to women who ride, I hope to see this trend continue over the next decade and beyond.


Going forward, one of our main goals is to increase the number of





Another nice ride takes us on a coast to coast ride from Lake Michigan to Lake Huron, riding through East Jordan, Boyne Falls, Wolverine, Indian River, Onaway, then on to Rogers City.

Leaving from Central Lake, just north of town you will pick up Ellsworth Rd heading north. Once in the town of Ellsworth, you will find signs directing you to "The Breezeway", aka C-48. Follow this scenic road into East Jordan. and on to Boyne Falls. A few miles past East Jordan, you will be taking a right on Deer Lake Rd, it is marked with a Breezeway sign. You will turn right at the stop sign at M-75, this will take you to US-131 at Bovne Falls.

Head north for about a half mile and turn right (east) on Thumb Lake Rd. This is a favorite ride for local riders; it will lead you into Old US-27, dropping you just south of Wolverine, a nice rest stop. Continue north on 27 to

Indian River, where you will take C-68 to the east. You will go through the small town of Tower, then through Onaway, and on to Rogers City. While in Rogers City, be sure to check out the big quarry at the north end of town. This is a nice town with a great marina area, and plenty of places to stop for refreshments, but the quarry is the highlight, believe it or not. It is impressive! There is an overlook on the north side of the pit on Bus.23.




If you are heading back to the west side of the state, there are a couple options; both are good rides, one to the south, and one to the north.

To do the south route, head south out of town to M-65 to M-32 at Lachine. If you have enough time, or just like to follow the lake, you can stay on US-23 out of Rogers City all the way to Alpena to M-32, but it will add some time to the ride. Once on 32 west, you will go through Atlanta, Johannesburg, Gaylord, and Elmira before coming to US-131. Go north to pick up 32 again in about 1/2 mile. Follow 32 west back to East Jordan.

The north route out of Rogers City takes you back west on 68, but instead of turning back south on 27, continue on 68 to US-31 at Alanson, where you can head south back to Petoskey. From here you can take the lakeshore on US-31, or back to 131 south to M-75 at Lake Walloon, then on to Boyne City. Either route is beautiful riding. If taking the M-75, get on Front St Downtown, and hug the lakeshore until you see Advance Rd. Turn left, this will take you into East Jordan.

Whichever route you take on this tour you will be seeing some awesome scenery, and some really cool towns along the way.





No Guarantees in the Helmet Debate

"We never even said a word. We just walked out and got on that bike. And we rolled. And we rolled clean out of sight."

~ Bob Seger

Riding a motorcycle is like any other highly pleasurable activity. It's hard to describe the thrill to people who don't ride or will never ride. They just can't understand.

It's just like non-golfers who can't understand why anyone would live to chase a little ball all over the place. Or like people who ice fish – how they can go out in the freezing cold just to sit on a frozen lake and fish.



So it boggles the mind of some non-riders why anyone would risk driving a motorcycle without a helmet on. Heck, even little kids on bicycles with training wheels wear helmets.

But, no matter what side of the motorcycle helmet debate you come out on, we can all probably appreciate the literally unbridled freedom helmetless riding provides. Wind in the hair unencumbered by thick cushioned plastic and leather. It's you, a leather jacket and jeans streaming through the biosphere, taking Mother Nature in along with a few insects, to be sure.



Words fail. But the bottom line is that there are no guarantees either way. Wearing a helmet can hamper a rider's ability to see and react to other drivers. Not wearing a helmet can sometimes turn your two-wheeler into what some ER personnel call a "donor-cycle." Here, we argue that it's the inexperienced rider combined with distracted auto drivers who create all the issues.

And just like you don't know someone until you walk a mile in his or her shoes, you don't know riding until you've put on a full-face helmet and taken a bike for a spin. Helmets are clunky. It takes longer to turn your head in a helmet. And you're senses are somewhat muted from all the nuances of riding



Maybe you'll find it hard to understand how someone like me could see both sides of the helmet laws since I often treat wound care patients who have suffered traumatic and sometimes-paralyzing injuries from motorcycle accidents. But I do see both sides. And I do not judge.

You see, I live to chase that little golf ball. I also live to fish, although I restrict my winter fishing to the supermarket seafood counter. And you live to ride. It's that simple.

We're both at the mercy of the unknown, the distracted driver, the rookie rider. In my car, even though I'm surrounded by shiny metal and tempered glass, I'm just as vulnerable as you. A couple of years back, I got T-boned in a Taurus by a teen-



age driver and had to be extracted from the vehicle. And yes, I was wearing a seat belt. The point is there's no guarantee.

We treat all kinds of wounds here at Encompass HealthCare and Wound Medicine. A lot of diabetic foot ulcers. A lot of paralyzed patients with non-healing bedsores. And some of them also suffer broken hearts because they can't return to their beloved riding.


So the debate over helmets goes on. Frankly, I'm smack dab in the middle with my estimation of the issue. The more bikers I talk with and the more I hear their attempts to describe

the joys of riding, the more I just can't take a position on one side or the other. So I take the only position I can: compassion.

Modern motorcycles can achieve unbelievable speeds and most riders spend far more time focusing on how to reach high speeds - then they do considering how they are going to come back down. Just as engines and transmissions have evolved over the years, allowing motorcycles to push the limit in terms of acceleration and top speed - so have the modern braking systems. Performance braking systems have amazing stopping power, but require periodic maintenance and upkeep in order to function. It's essential that riders understand how their braking system work and what's required to keep them up to speed (or take them down...)

Tip: Brake fluid absorbs moisture over time and becomes less effective. Replace brake fluid every one to two years and your brakes will perform the best they can.

Motorcycles have up to two brake fluid reservoirs, one for the front, usually found on the handlebars and one for the back. Both should be checked regularly. Topping up should only be done from a new, sealed bottle as brake fluid tends to absorb moisture over time. If your brake pads are thin and due for replacement. Beware - brake fluid, if spilt on paintwork eats right through to the bare metal.

Also check the thickness of the brake pads. If you allow them to go right down to the metal your brake disc will be damaged resulting in an unnecessary and expensive replacement. Fitting braided steel brake lines will increase the performance of your brakes by roughly 50%

Replacing front and rear brake pads

Replacing stock or worn brake pads is the guickest way to get increased braking power out of a tired system. Various manufacturers make all kinds of different types of replacement brake pads for today's motorcycles. Some claim to last lon-

ger, while others claim to give more feel and braking power. However, be forewarned that the manufacturer of your motorcycle put a lot of time and effort into developing your braking system, and there is no telling what a different type of pad material might do to your rotors or how well different pads will work with the overall design and setup of your bike. If you have any doubts, then stick with genuine factory parts.

Removing the calipers from the rotors is the first step in checking your brake pads. In dealing with your front disc brakes, first remove the Front Caliper two main bolts that attach the calipers to the forks. Once the calipers are free you can slide them off of the brake discs and inspect the amount of pad material and look for anything out of the ordinary. If there is less than 1/8 inches of pad thickness left then they should be replaced.

Internals of Front Caliper

Once the calipers are free from their mounting locations, it is time to disassemble them and remove the brake pads. On this particular setup there is one threaded metal pin that holds one side of the pads in place. The other side of the pad rests in the casting of the brake caliper. Removing this pin will free the pads and they should just fall right out. Notice the metal clips inside the caliper just beneath where the pads sit. These metal clips provide pressure on the pads to keep them from moving around inside the caliper. It is a good idea when you are working on your brakes to replace these clips. It would be foolish if you spent all this time and effort to have something so simple and cheap screw things up.

Internals of Rear Caliper

Once the two mounting bolts have been removed, the caliper should easily slide off the rotor. Inspection of the pads is the same as the fronts. The rear pads are smaller because less braking power is required. The rear pads are held in place



Tip: If you are unsure how to replace brake pads then have a mechanic do it for you. It is worth the cost as it is in the best interests of your safety. Feel free to bleed your own brakes as that is a easy operation to do.



by one bolt on one side of the caliper and are held at the other end inside the casting of the mounting bracket that the caliper is bolted to. Be very careful to make sure the new pads are firmly mounted in the caliper and are held securely at both mounting locations. If there is any doubt, check them again! Otherwise, they could fall out while you are cruising down the side of your favorite canyon road and ruin a perfect day, causing you to crash into the guard rail and go flying off the side of a cliff. Not a pretty site.

Once the new pads have been assembled into the calipers and everything is torqued to spec, it is time to bleed the lines

How to Bleed Motorcycle Brakes

It is actually not very hard to bleed (renew) your own motorcycle brake fluid. This should be done at least every 2 years. Or when the brake fluid turns from clear to a brown to black colour (darker it is, the worse it is).

Brake fluid will eat away at plastic and paint, be sure to cover any paint or plastic that may get splashed with brake fluid. Wipe any spilled fluid with the rag and lots of water.



STEP 1: Make sure you have the tools to bleed your brake fluid. The tools you require will vary, but generally this is what you will need:

- A. Wrench/Spanner (average 10mm)
- **B.** Brake bleeding kit (rubber fitting, clear hose, small container)

C. Brake fluid overflow container (to put the brake bleeding kit small container in)

D. Rags

E. Brake Fluid (check what type of brake fluid you need for your bike. e.g. DOT 3). Make sure to buy enough brake fluid in the DOT type you require. (500ml should be more than enough).

STEP 2: Attach the brake bleeding kit to the brake fluid nipple located on the brake caliper.

STEP 3: Loosen the nipple so the fluid is free to flow down the brake bleeding kit tube and into the small container

STEP 4: Remove the master cylinder cap (top) so you can monitor and refill more brake fluid into the master cylinder as you bleed the brakes.

STEP 5. Pump the brake lever so the old/new brake fluid is forced through the tube into the brake bleeding kit fluid container

STEP 6: Keep the volume of the master cylinder constant (near full) as to not have it empty. Keep pumping on the brake lever until the fluid coming out is clear (rather than the old brown/black colour).

STEP 7: Once all the tiny air bubbles are gone hold pressure on the brake level and re-tighten the brake fluid nipple to close it off.

STEP 8: Replace the master cylinder top cover.

STEP 9: Remove the brake bleeding kit from the cliper and use the rag with water to clean up any spillage.

Tip: Any brake bleeding kit will do just fine but make sure you have a small bucket to put the tiny brake bleeder fluid container in as it is very likely to overflow.

Drum Brakes

For a long time motorcycles were stopped by drum brakes which work by pushing shoes up against the inside of a drum and cause friction slowing the motorcycle down. Drum brakes are easy to recognize with the 'drum' mounted on the wheel.

Brake Shoes

Drum brakes worked well and are still being used for smaller bikes however drums are prone to overheating and wear-outs. Even the high performance ones, these motorcycle brakes need regular adjustment for optimal use. Disc brakes started to appear in the seventies with Honda leading the pack (the CB750). A disc brake works on a simple principle that a steel disc is gripped by two pads by a hydraulic calliper.



BRAKE SHOES

Disk Brakes

Disk brakes are much friendlier for a motorcycle rider, less prone to overheating and require little (or no) adjustment. The downside was/is (especial during the early days) that wet weather didn't let these motorcycle brakes function as well. Modern day bikes use twin front disc's and only one at the rear. Using more brake power at the back would lead to wheel block ups due to the dynamics of braking.

Brake Disk or Rotor

Each disk is gripped by calipees, where every calipees is pushed by four or six pistons. This highly improves the brake power and the riders feel when braking. Many tour bikes use a combination of different motorcycle brake hydraulics to divide the front and back breaking power in the most optimal way. Additionally some bikes now also have ABS (anti block system).

The steel disk floats in the wheel so it can accommodate the temperature influences which a cure while braking. The pads are also fitted loosely in the clamp around the steel disk. Over time the disk pads need replacing which is just standard maintenance. However keep an eye on disk damage due to incorrect placement of brake pads or anything else. Damaging the steel disk can result in a costly replacement

Signs that your motorcycle brake pads need replacement:

- Brake fluid level has gone down markedly in the master cylinder reservoir.
- Brake lever or pedal travels farther before engaging the brakes. Different noise from brake pads than previ-
- ous when applying brakes.
- Increased brake noise when applying the brakes, including a metallic squealing noise.

PLEASE NOTE:



- Most, but not all brake pads have wear groove indicators (see image) that help us identify when we're getting close to the end of the brake pad's life. In the case of the bottom image, the pads are ready for replacement as the wear groove indicator is now absent (almost absent) from both of the brake pads. If the brake pad manufacturer doesn't use a
- wear indicator, a micrometer may be necessary to measure the amount of friction material remaining to ensure the level is within manufacturer specification.
- We would rather replace brake pads a little early versus run the risk of damaging a brake rotor or worse, finding ourselves with out brakes when we need them most.
- Locating the wear indicator may be possible without taking a brake caliper off the motorcycle for inspection. However, if necessary, we may have to remove a caliper for closer inspection.

or 2014, Harley-Davidson focused on style and technological updates to their bikes – to make them better suited to the demands facing today's riders. The Iron 883 was no exception and for 2014 comes with improved ergonomics and a new close loop exhaust system.

The bike was also fitted with an improved braking system which includes bigger brake rotors and modified calipers. (There is also an optional ABS system offered.)

The 2014 Harley Davidson Iron 883 is powered by Harley's iconic air-cooled, Evolution engine which comes with electronic fuel injection and aluminum heads and cylinders. To offer a smooth riding experience the engine was rubber mounted and its power is kept in leash by a six speed transmission.

As far as performances are concerned, the Evolution engine puts out a maximum torque of 53.8 lb ft at 3750 rpm and delivers an average fuel consumption of 51 mpg.





Peanut Sauce: 1/4 Cup of Rice Vinegar 2 Tbls. Creamy Peanut Butter (Premium Brand) 1 Garlic Clove: minced 1 tsp. Brown Sugar 1 tsp. Olive Oil (Premium Brand) 1/4 tsp. Ground Mustard Dash of Cayenne Pepper (or more; up to you) Crab Cakes: 1 cup plain Greek yogurt 2/3 cup Crushed Saltines (Premium Brand); apprx. 15 crackers) 1/4 cup finely chopped Celery 1/4 cup finely chopped Roasted Sweet Red Pepper 1/4 cup minced fresh Parsley or Dry will do, just rub between hands to release oils 2 Tbls. finely chopped Sweet Vidalia Onion 1 Egg White; lightly beaten 1 Tbls. Holsters 101 PARTIOF

There are many different brands, materials, and styles of holsters on the market, and they're not "one size fits all." Here are some of the basics to get you started, and be sure to check out the Bullet Points next month, when I'll get into the more varied and specialized options!

Cowhide (Leather)

Most leather holsters found on the market today will be made of cowhide. It has been used to make holsters for many years because it is reliable, soft against the skin, and the higher quality leathers will stand up to years of wear before they become unusable. There are other leather products on the market, including horsehide, and some exotic skins, such as crocodile and stingray, and those are generally more decorative (and expensive) than basic cowhide. The downside to leather is that it will absorb some moisture.

Plastic

Various grades of plastics are also used in the manufacturing of holsters and range wildly in guality and durability. A brand of thermoplastic used frequently for holsters is Kvdex. Molded plastics may not be comfortable up against the skin for some people, and they lack the aesthetics of leather goods. That being said, they are extremely durable, and are unaffected by sweat and moisture. Hybrid plastic/leather is often used to increase comfort, combining the best of both worlds.

Belt Holsters

These holsters are worn on a belt, outside the pants. There are many options for location around the belt, from cross-draw to hip and small of the back. These holsters generally keep the gun off of the skin, and there are many styles designed specifically for concealment. Some belt holsters are designed : of your firearm. for open and police carry and are often made of plastic, some sporting a locking device, such as a thumb break, an angled release, or a finger release.



The Galco Tac Slide holster is a hybrid leather/ Kydex holster, and an inexpensive favorite of many. I often wear this holster on my hip when I am working at the shop.



The Galco Concealable is a molded hard leather holster designed for concealed carry. It is favored by many of the employees at the shop because it offers comfort, durability, and excellent concealment.

Paddle Holsters

These holsters are easy to put on and remove, because their attachment point is a curved piece, usually of plastic, designed to catch under the belt. These are popular hip holsters, because the gun is worn outside of the clothing, while the paddle is against the body. Many also have locking devices. and some of the most popular duty holsters, such as the Blackhawk! Serpa holster, has the option of a belt attachment in addition to the paddle.



Inside the Waistband

These holsters are designed for concealed carry. They have clips or hooks designed to attach to a belt, while the gun remains concealed under clothing. This style may require some adjustments to your wardrobe, as wearing a gun inside your waistband may increase your pant size. This style offers deeper concealment, fitting the gun into the natural planes of your body. The gun is more challenging to draw from deep concealment, but the perk of this holster is that, when fitted properly, you need not fear printing nor accidental visibility





The Galco King Tuk holster seems large, but the combination of Kydex and cowhide makes for an extremely comfortable and durable concealment holster.

The Galco Tuck-n-Go is a soft cowhide leather holster. It is an inexpensive option, though the soft leather will degrade more guickly over time than the harder leathers offered by Galco.
