




# READERS RIDES Woody





I have been riding motorcycles for 59 years. I got my first Harley when I was 17, and still in High school. It was a 1946 EL 61 C.I. knucklehead that I rode to school until I graduated and went into the navy in 1959. I sold the bike for \$250.00 before going into the navy. I had only paid \$200.00 for it from Jack King's Triumph dealership in Bay City in 1957. It was only 11 years old when I sold it. Having made a \$50.00 profit. I was quite happy to have made \$50.00 back then. How times have changed. That same bike today would be worth over \$25,000.00. I have always regretted selling it. Over the years I have been able acquire a small collection of antique Harleys. One of my favorites is my 1933 VLD special sport solo Harley Davidson. I restored this bike back to what it looked like in 1933. I restored it around 20 years ago. It took me four years to find all the parts I needed to start the restoration. I have been showing it at bike shows ever sense. I have taken a first place in its class every time I have shown it. It also has taken a few best of show trophies. It took a third place over all in the Chicago Bike show; one of the largest shows in America. What makes this bike so unique is that it was the bike that helped changed the way Harley made bikes. After the great depression Harley needed to get people back to riding for fun. This is the first sport solo bike Harley ever made. All the bikes up to this time had side car mounting mounts. The VLD has none. They only made 780 VLD's in 1933. Harley was in serious trouble because of the depression. Harley only produced 3,703 motorcycles in 1933, this was one of the worst years Harley had ever had. The 1933 VLD was the first to have two tone paint; first year for magnesium alloy pistons (Dow metal) with 5 to 1 compression, first for Art Deco tank emblem, one year only design, first year for "Y" shaped intake manifold, first year for the Linkert carburetor. All these changes allowed this bike to have a top speed of 105 MPH. In 1934 Harley sold over 10,000 motor cycles due to the changes they made to the 1933 VLD. This was a real labor of love restoring this bike.



#### Ischemic Heart Disease: What Veterans Need to Know, Both Before and After They've Been **Awarded Service Connection**

In 2010 VA added ischemic heart disease (IHD) to the list of conditions that are presumed to be caused by exposure to Agent Orange. The addition was a great victory for veterans; however, it is important for veterans to know that "ischemic heart disease" does not mean any and all conditions that are related to the heart. The VA has listed the following cardiac conditions, as falling within the definition of IHD: acute, subacute, and old myocardial infarction; atherosclerotic cardiovascular disease including coronary artery disease (including coronary spasm) and coronary bypass surgery; and stable, unstable and Prinzmetal's angina. 38 C.F.R

Notably, the regulation specifically states that IHD includes, but is not limited to, the specific conditions that are listed. Therefore, if a veteran has cardiac complaints and has been exposed to Agent Orange, it is important for the veteran to ask their doctor whether their particular diagnosis or condition is in fact a form of ischemic heart disease and/or if their condition falls within the parameters of one of the conditions the VA has already conceded qualifies as a form of IHD.

Once it is verified that (1) the veteran has been exposed to Agent Orange and (2) the veteran has a valid diagnosis of IHD, the next step is to determine what the rating for the IHD will be. The proper rating for IHD is determined by looking at several factors, per the VA's Schedule of Ratings for the Cardiovascular System. 38 C.F.R. § 4.104.

The cardiovascular rating schedule considers the following factors when assign-

- Ejection Fraction percentage
- Symptoms such as: dyspnea, fatigue, angina, dizziness, or syncope
- Presence or absence of congestive heart failure
- Evidence of cardiac hypertrophy or dilatation
- The need for continuous medication
- The veteran's workload capacity, expressed in cardiac METs (metabolic equivalent). For example, the VA's Disability Benefits Questionnaire for IHD states that the 1-3 METs level is consistent with activities such as eating. dressing, taking a shower, slow walking for 1-2 blocks. A 1-3 METs level would entitle the veteran to a 100% rating for IHD.

#### As compared to

The > 7 to 10 METs level, which is consistent with activities such as climbing stairs quickly, moderate bicycling, sawing wood, and jogging. A > 7 to 10 METs level would entitle the veteran to only a 10% rating, which is a drastic difference from a 100% rating.

#### Military veterans 'decompress' with special duck hunting program

Veterans and Sportsmen United is a nonprofit organization aimed at bringing military veterans together in fellowship through the great outdoors. Activities for the group come in all sizes; from a weekend-long hunting trip with 13 to 15 attendees, to day hikes with smaller groups. Veterans get to take part in outdoor actives such as hunting, fishing, hiking, camping, bush-craft survival and

pretty much everything else outdoors. The most important role of the group is to bring veterans together, and to give those recently returning from tours of duty a chance to decompress in nature.

During a trip to Lake Hamlin, just east of Ludington, a group of nine shot and recovered 16 ducks, with each of the veterans getting at least one duck during

## The Motorcycle Lawyer on THE LAW Freedom of Choice and Insurance 101

If you read last month's column, you know that I promised a longer discussion about insurance for my November article. That is still the plan, but first I need to get the word out on a Senate Bill that could affect Michigan bikers' right to choose whether or not to wear a crash helmet, and what the Bill could mean for motorcyclists.

Senate Bill 527 (SB 527) was introduced on September 29, by Senator Rebekah Warren (D-Ann Arbor). It would amend part of the Michigan Vehicle Code (MCL 257.658) by requiring that all motorcyclists wear a crash helmet while on or riding their bikes. That's right: this Bill would reverse the 2012 helmet repeal law and force all riders (including passengers) to wear a crash helmet. There would be no provisions or exceptions for riding helmetless. The bill would also require anybody aged 19 or younger riding a moped on a public thoroughfare to wear a helmet. It has been referred to the Committee on Transportation.

This isn't the first time a Bill to reinstate mandatory helmet laws has been introduced. A similar Bill was proposed in 2014, and didn't make it past committee. So for now, this is a "wait and see" situation, but I wanted to get the word out to readers and invite you to join the discussion on Facebook (Facebook.com/TheMotorcycle-Lawyer).

For the time being, Michigan motorcyclists are not required to wear a helmet to ride, but they are required to carry certain insurance. The next few paragraphs will give the basics of what insurance coverage motorcyclists must have, and what I recommend you should have based on my experience as a rider. I strongly encourage all of you to see an insurance expert to go over your current coverage and see if you have everything you need (and want) to protect you in case of an accident.

Michigan motorcyclists are required to carry Bodily Injury (BI) coverage in order to ride legally. Bodily Injury coverage protects you if your negligence causes a physical injury; this coverage also applies if your passenger is injured due to your negligence. The bare minimum you must carry is \$20,000 / \$40,000, but I recommend carrying \$100,000 / \$300,000; it's worth it.

While not required by law, Uninsured Motorist Coverage can pay for your injuries if the at-fault driver in the crash is not insured; hit-and-run crashes can also be covered, even if you don't know the at-fault driver's identity. Uninsured Motorist Coverage is inexpensive and could save you a lot of grief. I recommend carrying at least \$100,000 worth of coverage.

Next, there's Underinsured Motorist Coverage. Note the name: under-insured is not the same as un-insured. Underinsured Motorist Coverage kicks in if the negligent driver in a crash has a small insurance policy that won't provide enough compensation for your injuries. Having this type of coverage is not required by law, but I always recommend it, and the more the better. I suggest carrying \$100,000 or more... the more coverage you have, the more you could collect for your injuries in the case of a crash.

I get so many calls from bikers who want to know how to get their motorcycles fixed after a crash. For that, you need Collision Coverage, which can cover the cost of repairs or pay out a "fair market value" if the bike is totaled. Note: Collision Coverage typically only covers damage to the "stock" bike. If you have custom work or any accessories, you may need an Accessories Coverage rider as well. Be very specific with your insurance agent about what you want coverage for. Collision and Accessories Coverage are not required, but I'd recommend them if you're worried about costly repairs, or if you have a lot of custom work done to your ride.

Finally, there is a specific insurance requirement if you want to ride your motorcycle without wearing a helmet. Each rider on the bike needs to have at least \$20,000 in first-party medical benefits coverage in order to ride without a helmet. That means you need \$20,000, and if you're carrying a passenger, they also need an additional \$20,000 in first-party medical benefits coverage to be legal.

Obviously, I can't cover all aspects of insurance in a single article; moreover, I look at insurance from a personal injury law perspective. Talk to an insurance expert to learn more about what you need and want to cover; it's not a bad idea to go over your policy on a fairly regular basis to make sure you're still getting what you want and covered for what you need.

One final note: I recommend you do not cancel your motorcycle insurance during the off-season. If you store your bike on your property during the winter, your homeowner's policy will not cover damages to your bike if something goes wrong. As a bonus, keeping your insurance active year-round means you can ride the minute the weather gets nice enough, if you want to. Seems worth it to me.







Harry lafrate is the plant director and a proud new owner of a 2005 Harley Davidson Heritage Softail. He said the employees in the plant take special pride in printing a Michigan motorcycle magazine: "We are extremely pleased to be working with Thunder Roads MI magazine," he says. "We have many employees who are avid motorcycle enthusiasts. Several ride together in support of area charity rides and all of our riders are excited about producing this magazine. We have an extremely passionate and talented employee base and it is nice to see their passion displayed in the production of this magazine each month."



Ryan Graham is the Customer Service Representative on the TRMI account and rides a Harley Davidson 95th Anniversary 1200 Custom: "When I go out riding, it doesn't matter how far away from home I get, I always see riders with their

Thunder Roads MI Ride Cards. It gives me a great sense of accomplishment knowing I play a part in such a successful magazine."

No matter where you go in the plant (or the parking lot), you are apt to run into a biker. Misty Wright works in Sales Service and rides a Yamaha Virago. Janel Scharich works in the scheduling department and rides a Suzuki Boulevard. Tony Maziarz is a press room supervisor in the plant and rides a Heritage Soft Deluxe. Jason Obermiller works in the finishing department and rides an Ultra Classic. Bruce Ouderkirk also works in the finishing department and rides a Honda Shadow. Jeff Sharp works in the plateroom and rides a Street Glide. They and other bikers in the plant keep a careful eye on Thunder Roads MI and other magazines produced in the plant to make sure they meet the highest

Printing a quality motorcycle magazine requires the same precision engineering and process control and quality controls that go into making the motorcycles in







the first place. A tour of the Midland printing plant shows off a combination of high-horsepower printing technology run by skilled craft professionals every step of the way.


Ryan Graham, as the customer service representative, helps Thunder Roads MI orchestrate the complex workflow from the time initial magazine files are received into the plant until the very end when finished magazines are boxed and shipped out the door. The magazine page files are initially uploaded into Quad's system online. where they are quality checked and reviewed by the publishing and print production teams. Once pages are approved and ready to go, Ryan will ok the magazine to be moved into the plate room and the start of the printing process. Jeff Sharp and the group in

the plate room use the magazine page files and the paperwork Ryan created to lay out the pages for printing. The Thunder Roads MI pages are then chemically etched into metal plates for the pressroom. From there, the pressroom employees take over. They hang the printing plates on the web offset presses and load the giant paper rolls, start up the press and set the color using sophisticated ink controls. All of the colors in the magazine are produced from a combination of just four ink colors - cyan (light blue), magenta (light red), yellow and black. The press operators take great pride in making the color images in the magazine reproduce perfectly, matched to the specifications and preferences of the magazine's editorial, creative and advertising teams.









I have chosen this name for our monthly recipe page, as that was what my mother, rest her soul, always used to say when I would assist her in the kitchen.

Mom was an avid supporter of the K.I.S.S. (KEEP IT SIMPLE SWEETIE) method of cooking. I now, more than ever, truly appreciate her philosophy of always taking shortcuts where you can, as long as your ultimate outcome is that of down home, labor of love cooking.

#### ORANGE BASIL TURKEY BREAST

- 1 Large, Boneless, Skin-On Turkey Breast
- 1 Stick of Butter; softened to room temp.
- 1 Tbl. of Dry Basil
- 1 Tbl. of Dry Orange Peel Seasoning (in seasoning aisle)

Salt & Pepper to taste

- 1 Medium, Aluminum, Throw-Away Turkey Pan (in Home Goods section of any Wally World or Target')
- 1 Jar of Smucker's Orange Marmalade

Preheat oven to whatever temp. advised on package of Turkey Breast. Use spray butter to coat bottom of aluminum turkey pan w/ handles. Place bare turkey breast on a long sheet of Cling Wrap or anything? to lay down on counter and protect from poultry juices running all over your countertop. (E coli is a tricky entity). In a medium bowl, mix together the soft butter, basil and orange peel seasoning. Now, wet your hands w/ warm water and extremely gently lift the skin up and very slowly work your hand back towards the end and then ease it back towards the front until you've made a pouch of the entire skin on front of turkey. Now, get a generous helping of the butter/basil mixture and rub it all up under the skin of turkey. Slather some all over the outer skin also and generously salt & pepper your turkey. Create an aluminum tent and cook 3/4 of the time it says on pkg. w/ tent on, the last half hour, remove tent and pour Orange Marmalade into a small bowl and with a basting brush cover the bird up entirely with the marmalade. It should get a perfect deep golden brown. Keep basting it periodically for the final half hour. Remove from oven, place foil back over it and let it set for 15 minutes before slicing. This is such an amazing taste and succulent; you'll be coming up with your own variations like I did. Cook (2) if feeding a big crowd only use a large size aluminum pan, and double up the recipe.

Truly scrumptious and so easy you don't have to wait until holidays to enjoy.

#### BABY PEARL ONIONS IN CREAMED SPINACH

- 1 Pkg. of Baby Pearl Onions
- 1 Pkg, of Creamed Spinach

Microwave both according to directions. Combine both in a beautiful serving bowl, add a pinch of nutmeg and (2) Tbls. of butter and this is a super simple side dish. Very creamy and delicious.

#### SUPER SIMPLE PUMPKIN SOUP

2 Cans of Pumpkin Pie Filling

1 Cup of Half & Half

1/4 Stick of Butter

2 Thls. of Cinnamon

1/2 tsp. of Nutmeg

1/4 Cup of Quality Syrup

In a medium-large quality pot on top of stove, add all ingredients and mix by hand gently or use one of those battery operated liquid mixers. Let it get good and hot but do not burn. Pour into (4) soup style bowls or mugs w/ handles and top with thin slices of peeled apples sprinkled with cinnamon and baked in oven for several minutes. Simply Delicious!

#### APPLE PIE BITES

- 1 Store-Bought Pie Crust
- 1 Can of Apple Pie Filling
- 2 Tbls. of Butter Divided
- 1/4 Cup of Sugar or Cooking Splenda
- 1 Tbls. of Cinnamon
- 1/4 tsp. of Nutm

Put all of this into a small glass bowl and blend thoroughly. Preheat oven to 425 degrees. Line a baking sheet with cooking parchment paper or a Silt Pad. On a lightly floured surface, unwrap the pie crust and lay flat; work quickly as easier when colder. Using a pizza cutter or really good, sharp knife, cut the crust into 3-inch squares. Using a basting brush, brush the crust with half of melted butter. The other Tbls. went into mixture. Work w/ one square at a time and place a tsp. of the mixture into the center of each square. Bring the corners of each square together to form a pyramid shape. Press together with the edges of a fork all around to seal. Place in the oven to bake until golden brown; apprx. 8-10 mins. Remove, sprinkle with cinnamon and sugar. Serve piping hot with homemade whipped cream or quality Vanilla ice-cream.

#### SLOW GIN FIZZLE

- 1 Ounce of Gin
- 1/2 Ounce of Quality Grapefruit Juice
- 2 Dashes of Grapefruit Bitters
- 1 Ounce of Sparkling Orange Crush Soda

Seltzer water to top & orange cut up wheels for garnish.

To make for a party size, repeat recipe 10 times in an ice-cold glass pitcher and gently stir.







