





A few years back, I restored a 1946 WLA 45 flathead Harley with really no intensions of showing, but when the bike was complete, I felt it worthy, it was received extremely well. My wife and I had so much fun meeting all the other builders and people and participating in the events that we wanted to do it again, but how?

Well since the 46 is such a classy bike, why not build its Evil Twin, a bobber!

So off I went in search of another 45, I came across a very crude yet somewhat together 1940 WLD 45 Flathead!

Now begins the Evil to the Good, but how? First of all, they have to talk to one another so I put original tanks, and handle bars, and would paint it the same colors and scheme including the fresh motor, but that's where the similarities ended.





Next came the Evil part, make the side shifter using a 1940 Mouser bayonet that actually pulls out of its sleeve making it a dual purpose devise, if you know what I mean! Then take a WW2 hand held air raid siren and modify it with a pulley and linkage so it can be used off the left hand throttle when twisted it would lay down on the front tire and crank out the alarm. Other unique features are the fabricated footboard hand leather tooled to the shape of my boot; leather tooled custom seat with the Evil Twins flaming skull, like the footboards, custom springer front end and brakes, exhaust, fabricated




















rear fender, and what else but a removable whisky flask with the skull and cross bones. There are too many small details to list. I do all the work and design myself including paint and leather work.

Obama to sign Fairness for Veterans Act

Legislation proposed by U.S. Sen. Gary Peters is on its way to President Barack Obama's desk to be signed into law. The Fairness for Veterans Act helps veterans who may have been given an administrative discharge from the military, rather than an honorable discharge, due to behavior resulting from mental traumas — like Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder.

An administrative discharge is often given for minor misconduct, including being late to formation and missing appointments, behavior often seen in those experiencing PTSD.

"They have been released from the military services with less than honorable that means they don't have access to the VA and the medical help that they certainly deserve and need," Peters told 24 Hour News 8. "Now with this law, soon to be signed by the president, these individuals will have the opportunity to go back in front of a board and as long as they have creditable medical status they could very well see that status change."

Veteran's family surprised with home makeover after bout with

A Waterford family that transitioned out of homelessness last year was surprised with new furniture throughout their home. Iraq War Veteran Joel Trombley, 29, his girlfriend Morgan Pettinaro, 20, and his three children were chosen by Pontiac nonprofit Humble Design to receive a full home makeover. "It's a dream come true," Trombley said.

He said the upgrade was badly needed, with the home all but empty since August 2015 when he moved the family into the house.

Humble Design works with shelters to assist families with making new homes.

"Everything here has been donated," said founder Treger Strasberg, who operates the program out of a 12,000 square-foot warehouse in Pontiac. "We sometimes paint stuff and wipe stuff down and cover it with a cloth, but it all ends up looking beautiful. It does not look like recycled furniture."

Trombley said his case worker with the Department of Veterans Affairs told him about Humble Design's initiative. Organizers later visited him to learn how he envisions his home. "I'm not the type of person who wants to tell a bunch of people what I want," he said. The family was sent away for a few hours while Humble Design and volunteers from Bank of America furnished and decorated the home. When they returned, Trombley's children Tristen, 6, Emma, 4, and Noah, 3, excitedly ran in with shocked and joyful expressions, elated over their new bedroom and toys. "I don't think I've seen them that happy since Christmas," Trombley said.

Veteran's widow's claim for survivor's benefits granted after battle with VA

A Mid-Michigan woman said a deadly cancer took her husband. She said he was exposed while fighting in Vietnam, but the govern-

ment didn't seem to agree. His loved ones were left flat without the help they thought they would receive. That was until now.

JoAnn Leuenberger, Freeland resident, lost her husband in April 2012 after a battle with bile duct cancer. She said the cancer was caused by liver flukes, a parasite often contracted by eating uncooked fish. She said her husband, Roy Leuenberger, did that while serving in Vietnam. "They are little parasites and they got into the food or the water ingested by the veteran and they manifest themselves 30 to 40 years later. The guys don't know they have

In her husband's case, they found out too late. It wasn't until fall of 2011 that subtle symptoms showed their face. The then 67-yearold noticed his urine was dark and his skin was turning yellow. "He went to the doctor and they did lab work and then we got a call, 'go to the hospital," JoAnn Leuenberger said.

Her husband passed away five months later. His wife is fighting for survivor's benefits, but was having trouble getting her claim - that her husband died as a result of his service in Vietnam - approved by Veteran Affairs. Unlike the effects of Agent Orange, bacterial filled fish resulting in bile duct cancer is not a presumptive disease recognized by the VA. However, the VA is restoring those benefits. JoAnn Leuenberger received a call from the VA on Nov. 15. "A lady by the name of Tammy told me that she had approved my claim," she said. With her claim approved and a yearlong battle, she can now receive survivor's benefits and continue to support her family. "She stunned me. I had no idea it was going to be approved that fast and I know it was your help from TV5 that did it," JoAnn Leuenberger said.



The Motorcycle Lawyer on THE LAW NEW YEAR, NEW BILLS TO WATCH

Happy New Year! The holiday season has come and gone, for the most part, and now it's time to get back to business. My team and I are busy putting the finishing touches on our plans for this year's motorcycling season, and we are always keeping an eye on Bills that come before the Michigan legislature so we can keep our readers up to date on laws that could affect them. Here are a few motorcycle-related laws we will be watching in the next few months:

House Bill 5867: Introduced in September 2016 by Rep Martin Howrylak, HB 5867 aims to crack down on distracted driving, specifically the use of handheld portable electronic devices, including cell phones, computers, GPS devices, . According to the Bill, "a person shall not hold or use a portable electronic device while operating a motor vehicle that is moving on a highway or street in this state or temporarily stationary due to traffic, a traffic control device, or other momentary delay." In other words, no phones while driving, sitting at a red light, stuck in heavy traffic, or at any other time when the vehicle is on the road.

The Bill would allow drivers to use their phone if it is mounted in such a way that it does not hinder the driver's view, and they can activate it with a single tap or swipe of the finger. The Bill would not apply to devices that are synced to the vehicle or operated by voice only. Additionally, drivers could use their phones if they were pulled over on the side of the road and out of the way of traffic, or to report an accident, crime, or dangerous situation. The fine for a first violation would be \$250: that doubles for subsequent violations.

I think we all know how dangerous distracted driving can be; certainly, we know how dangerous a distracted driver can be to a motorcyclist. I could see some people feeling "inconvenienced" by not being allowed to use their phones while driving, but I do not see how this Bill could be anything but beneficial to everyone on the road. And, it could potentially make riding a motorcycle safer in the State of Michigan by reducing the number of distracted drivers. Oh, and in case you were worried, this Bill specifically states that "this section does not authorize the seizure or forfeiture of a portable electronic device..." unless otherwise required by law.

Senate Bill 404: Introduced in June of 2015 by Senators Joe Hune, Wayne Schmidt, and Mike Kowall, SB 404 protects owners of property used in motorcycle safety training from liability and lawsuits. The bill explains that the owner of property used in a motorcycle safety course is not liable for personal injury or damage to personal property caused by participants in the course; however, this protection does not apply if the owner of the property did not warn participants about a dangerous use, condition, activity, or structure and injury or damage occurred as a direct result of this lack of warning. The liability protection would not apply if, "the injury or damage was caused by the failure of the owner or property to warn against a dangerous condition, use structure, or activity of or on the property that amounted to willful or wanton misconduct."

This Bill has been referred to the committee on transportation. On the whole, I think this bill is neutral; it is unlikely to affect many motorcyclists. That's because, to my knowledge, most motorcycle safety courses already ask participants to sign a waiver, which specifically warns about dangerous use, conditions, activity, or structure.

Senate Bill 496: Introduced by Senators Rick Jones, Darwin Booher, Jim Marleau, and Wayne Schmidt in September 2016, SB 496 would amend the Michigan Vehicle Code to increase the fines associated with riding a motorcycle or moped without proper credentials.

Motorcycle riders, before operating on any public street or highway, are required to have a valid license with a motorcycle endorsement (CY). Moped riders are required to have a special restricted license, unless the rider already has a valid driver's or chauffeur's license. Restricted licenses to operate a moped can be issued to anyone over the age of 15, provided they meet certain conditions.

SB 496 proposes to fine riders who are caught without a proper license or endorsement up to \$500 or up to three months in prison for a first offense. Subsequent offenses could put operators on the hook for up to 1 year in prison, or a fine of up to \$1,000.

These are steep fines, but I can't say I'm surprised to see a Bill like this coming forward. There has been a lot of media coverage and scrutiny about unendorsed motorcyclists over the last few years, coinciding with coverage of the number of uninsured drivers (including motorcyclists) in Michigan, and particularly in the Metro Detroit area. As most readers know, I always recommend that motorcyclists get their CY endorsement; it's inexpensive, and it's the law. So I can't say I have a problem with this Bill, or even with the fines it would impose on violators.

Finally, SB 496 brings up an important question: what is the difference between a motorcycle and a moped, legally speaking? The definition has changed... learn more in our February article!





IN THE SHOP WITH RON

The holidays are finally over and it looks like winter is here for a while, but on the bright side by the time you read this the days will already be getting longer which means spring is on the way! I for one can't wait it's been a long crazy year here and I am hoping 2017 will be much the same. This month we're going to be replacing the starter pinion gear on a 1984 Harley FLHT. First, with the bike securely on the lift we need to drain the primary fluid. While the fluid is draining, we can remove the left floorboard.



Then remove the derby cover and the outer primary cover. Now we can see the starter jackshaft, pinion gear, and shifting arm.



On this model the shifting arm pivots on a shaft called the pivot shaft and the other end of the shifting arm is connected to the solenoid shaft with a compressed spring, shouldered washer, and rolled pin. By slightly compressing the spring and washer, the rolled pin can be easily removed. Then slide the spring and washer off the solenoid shaft. Right above the pivot shaft on the inner primary housing is a hex headed plug screw, remove this screw and with a little finesse you can slide the pivot shaft up and wiggle the shifting arm free from solenoid shaft and pinion gear. Now we can remove pinion gear and jackshaft assembly. This can take a little creative wiggling and twisting to get it by the clutch hub /ring gear.





With the jackshaft on the bench, we can remove the nut on the outer end (note on this model the nut has left hand threads) and slide the pinion gear off the jackshaft.

That's basically it for disassembly, reassemble in opposite just a couple of things here; I like to use a small amount of a good quality light grease on jackshaft where pinion gear slides back and forth, also use a little Loctite on nut on end of jackshaft. Make sure the thrust washer is installed on end of jackshaft and lube bushing in outer primary cover that supports the jackshaft. Before finale assembly, check the pinion gear assembly by turning the pinion gear; it should turn freely in one direction and not at all in other direction.

I would like to wish everyone a healthy and prosperous New Year. Hope to see you on the road or in the shop.



A few months back I wrote about the need for those who are going to carry a firearm to practice at every opportunity. Knowing the price of ammunition I suggested that shooters consider buying a quality .22 pistol to use as their primary practice firearm because it can be shot it for about 9 cents per round verses 24 cents per round for the ultra-cheap 9mm. and 30 cents per round for 40 cal. The primary focus of practice should be reinforcing marksmanship fundamentals; grip, sight picture, breath control, trigger control, and follow through. By controlling the cost of practice maybe you can get to the range more often, and by keeping the cost of shooting in check range time can become family time and a great excuse for the kids to put down the video games!

But use of a quality .22 doesn't have to be limited to the range; it can also be a blast for hunting. At one of those times when my life was stuck on stupid I found myself visiting friends in the U.P. Out of alcohol fueled boredom somebody came up with the bright idea of going rabbit hunting in the backwaters of the St. Mary's River, which at the time was overrun with show shoe rabbits. It was February and there was about 3 feet of snow on the ground, I had a brand new Ruger Single Six revolver with me and my good Yooper buddies rounded up snow shoes to help us get around so it sounded like a perfect plan to me. The first is the new Smith and Wesson Victory. which is the newest of the three in the market. The jury is still out on how well it will stand up over the years but it seems to be well balanced, all metal construction, and of the three it has the best 'out of the box' trigger pull. A strong selling point with this firearm is price, around \$400.00, which is making them hard to find on the shelf.





The next choice is the Browning Buckmark, a long proven platform with a well-deserved reputation. The sturdy rubber grip is very comfortable for most shooters, aluminum construction keeps the weight down, and the stock trigger isn't too shabby for the price. My biggest dislike is the way the slide/bolt are assembled makes them a crud trap and it doesn't take much neglect or cheap ammo before performance is affected. Something both the Victory and Buckmark have in common is the need to remove small screws to facilitate dis assembly for proper cleaning. If you choose either of these firearms a nonskid cleaning mat and a stick of Loctite 248 (find it, try it, you will love it!) will be invaluable.

The third recommendation I would make would be any of the Ruger Mark Series. Whether you pick the 22/45 (grip to barrel angle identical to the Colt 1911), the Mark III, Mark III, or the new Mark IV you will own a workhorse of a pistol. Quite frankly I don't care for the budget models because of the polymer frame that does not allow the owner to change the grips to better fit the hand. It may be just a 'touchy feely' thing but the budget grip is completely devoid of ergonomic design and just plain not comfortable. All of the Rugers suffer from the heaviest off the shelf trigger pull (7.5+ lbs.) of the guns I have mentioned, but they also have the greatest availability of aftermarket parts including trigger kits that will drop the pull to smooth crisp 2.5 pounds turning an out of the box shooter into a virtual

Now about the Ruger's reputation for being a nightmare to tear down and clean, don't be a sissy! I know grown men who can overhaul an internal combustion engine practically blindfolded yet squeal like Ned Beatty in "Deliverance" at the idea of stripping and cleaning their Ruger Mark II or III. Well cowboy up because there are no little screws to play with, no need for Loctite, and there is a very good step by step video on the Ruger web site that will walk you through the process. If that is still to intimidating look at the new Ruger MK IV which features push button dis assembly that will only require you to take your thumb out of your mouth for a couple of seconds to take it completely apart or put it back together, and on the bright side I think the MK IV's will put a lot of good used MK III's in the market.

Take any one of these guns, have a little tune up work done and maybe add a reflex style red dot optic and you will be taking squirrels out of the tops of trees, or getting Elmer Fudd's revenge on them "waskely wabbits" even when they are on the run. Granted, these are not Hammerlis' or Pardinis', but they won't set you back 2-3K either; but at the same time if you decide to try bullseve league competition they are capable of helping you hold your own. And frankly I love shooting my .22 pistols just for the fun of it!












