# TWO WHEELS FOR WARRIORS

Retired Sergeant Bradley Vandenberg just isn't complete without going above and beyond for others. Over the past 3 years, he has kept the electricity on, fed the hungry and kept a roof over other families heads. Bradley spends most of his time planning and sponsoring poker runs

and fundraisers to help the less fortunate. He isn't looking for recognition or even acknowledgement on the help he's offered. It seems the smiles he puts on a face is more than enough to keep his efforts in full swing. That desire alone started him thinking...

Bradley's former Staff Sergeant Justin Madore has struggled after more than 9 combat related surgeries. Doctors informed him that he should no longer ride! Can you imagine hearing those words? This led Bradley to a decision: Madore would be the recipient of a bike custom built for him and his companion Cody. Cody is a canine trained to help their owner deal with P.T.S.D (Post Traumatic Stress Disorder). These canines are trained by K9s for Warriors in Ponte Vedra, Florida. Madore's case is severe and he has also been diagnosed with Thyroid Cancer. Bradley then began his ventures recruiting builders, sponsors and hosting fundraisers to support his dream.

Another recipient is Petty Officer 1st Class Matthew Pepper, also injured during deployment. His dedicated years of service left him with a back injury causing a loss of feeling in both legs. He has been diagnosed with P.T.S.D. and MS. He has lost feeling in six fingers and his 25 year career as a Master Electrician came to an end. Pepper now volunteers his time coaching 4th - 6th grade football and assisting other vets as well as escorting for deploying or returning troops.





# VETERANS CORNER











#### 8 November 2012

Michigan's nearly 700,000 veterans may soon benefit from the partnering of the Michigan Dental Association Foundation, the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs, and the Michigan Veterans Trust Fund. This partnering will help bring about awareness of possible dental assistance for Michigan Veterans.

Dentists who are members of the Michigan Dental Association distribute informational cards to Veterans in their offices advising where to go to seek further information regarding VA health care and the Michigan Veterans' Trust Fund. Wartime Veterans and their families may be the recipients of approved grants to help get them back on their feet after temporary financial hardships, awarded by the Michigan Veterans' Trust Fund.

This act of providing the informational cards by the member dentists of the MDA is a way to help make sure the Veterans receive the information pertaining to health and possible assistance programs the Veterans need and deserve

Having two of the nations top Veterans Administration Medical Facilities right here in the state of Michigan, and the 11th largest population of Veterans in the country, but for some reason Michigan Veterans' are less likely to seek out health care at a VA facility than fellow Veterans. This may be due to the fact many Veterans are not aware how to access their VA health care or not aware the Michigan Veterans Trust Fund is available to assist them financially.

Dental benefits are not an automatic part of VA health for most Veterans. Be sure to check with your dentist to see if they are a participant in this program and attempt to learn as much as you can to benefit you and your family.

Oral care and dental treatment are closely related to physical health, in particular diabetes. So Vets you need to be getting those dental check ups (and the informational cards) and seeking the treatment and care You have earned through your years of service to this great country.

#### VA Releases New PSA Targeting Women Veterans

#### 26 November 2012 Washington, DC

A new Public Service Announcement (PSA) directed towards women Veterans has been developed and released by the Department of Veterans Affairs to advise them that they have come to the "The Right Place" when seeking care or treatment from a VA Health Facility. VA administrators want to send a clear message to women Veterans that they have earned the right to high quality health care benefits and that they have come to the right place to receive those benefits.

The number of women Veterans seeking VA health care is increasing, doubling in the last decade and will be doubling again in the near future.

Many women who serve(d) our great country do not identify as Veterans and many women Veterans are unaware of the high quality of women's health

care that is available through the VA health care program. The VA wants to make sure that all Veteran women are aware that this service is available to them and that they are making use of it. Currently women comprise 18 percent of National Guard and Reserve forces and today's active military consist of 15 percent women.

#### VA Registers "GI Bill" as a Trademark

#### 3 December 2012 Washington, DC

The "GI Bill" is now officially registered and owned by the Veterans Administration, after having been registered with the U.S. patent and Trademark office, the VA is the sole owner of the title.

The VA will continue to support Veterans in the pursuit their education, a right which they earned by serving.



# MICHIGAN RIDERS MEMORIAL WALL














Members of the Knights of the Road M/C – In the city of Fowlerville, neighbors and local business owners donated time, resources, and their expertise in making this wall a reality.







# The Motorcycle Lawyer on THE LAW "It Depends" Is Usually the Answer

A while back I wrote an article for this magazine entitled "Motorcyclists Often Get Shafted." In it, I explained how motorcyclists are treated differently under Michigan law than operators of cars. For example, after a crash, a motorcyclist cannot get his deductible reimbursed from the at-fault car driver. Actually that's generally speaking; the more accurate answer is, "It depends."

There are usually exceptions to the laws that apply to motorcyclists. Nuances exist because Michigan's No-Fault law is very fact specific, often not logical, and works differently if a motorcycle is not the vehicle involved.

All of the following statements are true and are printed here in an attempt to educate you on the law and expose these nuances. Reading all of my statements on the topic together may give you an insight as to the specific difference.

#### Damage to Motorcycle

- A motorcyclist cannot get his collision deductible reimbursed by an insured car driver (or his insurance company) that rear ends him on the road.
- A motorcyclist can get his collision deductible reimbursed by an uninsured car driver that rear ends him on the road.
- A motorcyclist can get his collision deductible reimbursed by the insurance company of the car that ran over his motorcycle when it was parked between the lines at a shopping center.
- A motorcyclist with no collision coverage can force the insurance company of the car that ran over the motorcycle to pay for all the damage when it was parked between the lines at a shopping center.
- An uninsured car driver who causes a wreck is responsible for the collision damage to the motorcycle.
- A car driver can get his deductible reimbursed by a negligent car driver. A motorcyclist cannot get his deductible reimbursed from a negligent car driver.
- The insurance company for the driver of a motorcycle that hits another motorcycle is responsible for the collision damage to the bike that was struck.
- If a drunk driver of a car, who has insurance, losses control and hits a motorcycle on the road, the insurance company on the car does not have to pay for any damage to the motorcycle.
- No-Fault Benefits
- The owner and operator of an uninsured motorcycle is NOT entitled to Michigan No-Fault benefits when rear ended by an insured, drunk truck driver.

- A passenger of a motorcycle is always entitled to No-Fault benefits so long as a car, truck, van, SUV, or similar motor vehicle is involved in the crash.
- Contact with a motor vehicle is NOT required for a motorcyclist to qualify for, or obtain, Michigan No-Fault benefits.
- An operator of a motorcycle that is owned by his friend but is uninsured is entitled to No-Fault benefits when a car hits him.
- An insured motorcyclist that rear ends a car is entitled to No-Fault benefits from that car's insurance company.
- An insured motorcyclist who wrecks from going wide and hitting a tree is NOT entitled to No-Fault benefits.
- A motorcyclist that gets hit by another motorcyclist is NOT entitled to No-Fault benefits.
- The insurance company on the policy of the motorcycle never pays the No-Fault Benefits of the biker (it may pay some medical bills if certain coverage was purchased).
- The owner and operator of an uninsured motorcycle is hit by a semi-truck and incurs \$95,000 in medical bills—the motorcyclist is NOT entitled to No-Fault benefits and is stuck with the bills.
   The bills do not have to be paid by the semi truck's driver, owner or insurance company.

Confused? It is because the facts significantly affect the outcome when applying Michigan law in a motorcycle related crash. For further explanations, read the FAQs or watch the short videos on www.motorcyclelawyermichigan.com










# Tech Tips By Steve

CK. time for a little metric action, no, Sailor boy, you're not in the Philippines on shore leave. One of the simplest things to do to your bike to gain horsepower and torque is to install a good exhaust and air intake system. Today I'll cover an air cleaner upgrade which gets more air flowing into the engine by installing a less restrictive high flow air cleaner system. More air in means we can put more fuel in and that means more power! Now, there are all kinds of easy air cleaner kits out there for you Harley riders, but few for the metric riders and I will assure you that some of these are not as easy to install as the Harley ones either. However, with some patience, persistence and reading skills you can get your metric breathing like it should in about a half a day or less. NOTE: Once you install a great breathing air cleaner and a less restrictive exhaust you will have to put more fuel to the bike via re-jetting the carb(s) or upgrading your fuel injection so you don't lean it out making that bike run hotter and possibly burn a hole in your pistons.

This article will be covering the air intake system on a Yamaha Raider, specifically a 2009. How in the heck did I get here? Well, Joe Jones came into the shop with a challenge for me, he wanted to upgrade his air intake system to complement his new exhaust. He handed me a kit and said, "Here, you figure this kit out." and of course I said "No problem, it should be an easy day, Joe!" Joe left and I opened the kit and instantly got a headache as I read through the directions, my first thought was to pawn this off to my main master mechanic, Marty, but he would have killed me, so I just took it on the chin and proceeded to tackle it that night.. Easy day... remember Steve? The air cleaner is a Baron Big Air Kit Stealth for the Yamaha 06-13 Roadliner, 06-13 Stratoliner and 08-13 Raider and has a Parts Unlimited part number of 1010-0759 and lists for around \$250.00. (Fig 1)

I won't bore you with a play by play, I'll just show you a few pictures and highlights so you can make a decision whether you want to take this on yourself or let the shop you bought the kit from install it for you. I always start something like this by taking the negative cable off the battery, yes I said the negative side, please. Then I proceed to the directions, oh my ... remember that headache? Once I got my bearings on what

to do when I took the fuel tank off and got a good look at the fun that was in store for me that night. Fig 2

Ok, not too bad, I just started disconnecting the wiring harness on top of the airbox, setting everything aside (the harness and connectors were all neatly color coded so you could not mess it up, well, unless you are color blind), then I removed airbox, air cleaner and some other misc. parts, after it is all removed you have what you see in Fig 3. So far, so good, now for more interpretation of those blasted directions, luckily for me the directions have many pictures and if you take a look online you can download a color PDF version with much clearer text and pictures on Barons website.





Fig 4 New air cleaners installed

Now, just pop on the cool new high flow washable air cleaners (Fig 4), install the kits new crankcase breathers, install the supplied bracket so all the wiring and air sensors are securely fitted, slide the fuel tank on and you are done with stage one. Completed kit in Fig 5 looks very clean and at first glance looks similar to the original bike, one big difference however ... take a look at Barons supplied dyno results.




Fig 7 Baron Custom Raider cover letting some sunshine through

This kit has two stages. Joe decided to stay with stage one, which leaves his coils and fuel pressure return valve in the stock location. Stage two of this kit puts the coils and a few other do-dads under the fuel tank so you can remove the plastic covers that hides the coils and other things including some of that fancy engine. If you decide to do stage two you will have a little ugly leftover unless you replace some OEM bolts with chrome bolts and make or buy covers hiding the engine mounts and some other things that cannot be moved. Baron makes a set cover plates that are clean that will cover the remaining ugly for about \$140.00. Parts Unlimited part number of 0520-0931. See Fig 6 Stock cover and Fig 7 Baron cover.
