



Naked PTSD Therapy

Every year, millions of people in the United States are diagnosed with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder, but for some a doctor's office just isn't enough.

Surrounded by memories of the battlefield, Vietnam veteran Max Sanchez says his time in the Army — "Four years, six months, three days" — is something he'll never forget. "I can't change what happened. There were things that were good there and there were things that were bad."

And while Sanchez has been to a therapist to help to treat his PTSD, he says that doesn't always work, so he found a different way.

According to Sanchez, he's a part of a group of veterans who live at the Fountains at Paradise Lakes, a clothing-optional housing complex, where they find peace

"I forget about the whole world," said Sanchez. Dr. Kevin Kip, of the University of South Florida's College of Nursing, said people have different ways of dealing with stressful situations.

Information from a traumatic experience...the images get stored incorrectly in the brain and if you don't have a therapy to help essentially store it properly, it will be chronic, disabling ... you'll have nightmares, flashbacks," he said.

Kip said he has treated hundreds of veterans with PTSD, and says he supports out-of-the-box therapies.

"I'm always open to new therapies," he said. "Anything that is stress reducing is

But it's an out-of-the-clothes therapy, that's helping veterans like Sanchez and some of his veteran neighbors.

VA Scandals, Falsifying Records, Some Died Waiting

The head of the American Legion called for Veterans Affairs Secretary Eric Shinseki and other top VA officials to resign over a series of scandals that have rocked

The American Legion cited a litany of complaints against the VA, citing everything from the agency's infamous backlog to controversial bonuses. But a handful of recent scandals appeared to factor heavily.

Most recent was a report that a Colorado clinic allegedly falsified documents to make it seem like patients were being seen in a timely fashion.

The findings were contained in a report by the VA Office of Medical Inspector. USA Today first reported on the findings, and the VA confirmed the review.

The investigation reportedly found that clerks at the Fort Collins clinic were coached on manipulating records so it appeared patients were being seen within the desired timeframe of 14 days -- even though many were waiting months. The report found that staff who did not go along with this were placed on a "bad boy

The development follows accusations that VA officials at a Phoenix facility kept a secret list of patients waiting for appointments to hide treatment delays. In that case, up to 40 patients allegedly may have died because of delays.

In light of those accusations, three executives at the Veterans hospital in Phoenix were placed last week on administrative leave amid an investigation.

Phoenix VA officials have denied any knowledge of a secret list and said they had found no evidence of patient deaths due to delayed care.

The claims are the latest to come to light as VA hospitals around the country

struggle to handle the huge volume of patients who need medical attention, including aging vets from World War II. Korea and Vietnam and a newer influx from wars over the last decade. In the past year, VA facilities in South Carolina, Florida, Georgia and Washington State have been linked to delays in patient care or poor oversiaht

In the Colorado case, a VA spokesman said the medical center did not find "any intentional violation" of policy by managers or schedulers.

The VA said unclear guidelines led to "confusion" in the clinic. "Extensive training with supervisors and employees occurred immediately and continues. In addition, weekly audits are conducted to ensure scheduling is being done appropriately with the proper supervision," the spokesman said.

Shinseki has ordered a "face-to-face audit" at all Department of Veterans Affairs clinics, a spokeswoman told CNN. Early that day, the House Veterans Affairs Committee voted to subpoena Shinseki in the wake of accusations that his department is responsible for deadly delays in health care at some of its hospitals.

The Shinseki subpoena will cover e-mails that allegedly discussed the destruction of a secret list, first reported by CNN, of Veterans waiting for care at a Phoenix

The House panel agreed to issue the subpoena in a verbal vote Thursday morning. Shinseki will testify May 15 before the Senate Committee on Veterans' Affairs.

The Motorcycle Lawyer on THE LAW

Giving Back (Literally!) For the Sake of Safety

I've written a few times about my commitment to giving back to the biker community and trying to prevent motorcycle crashes. I do it because it's the right thing to do, and because I ride... so I get it. I know the feeling of freedom that comes from riding, and I also know the devastation that a crash can cause to the motorcyclist and their family. I became a lawyer so I could help people; giving back to the community and trying to prevent crashes is just another way to do that.

Last month, I had a unique opportunity to give back to the biker community by donating one of my own bikes to the Motorcycle Safety Foundation (MSF) via their Schoolcraft College location in Livonia. The MSF is a national not-for-profit organization that promotes motorcycling safety by providing rider training, licensing, and public awareness campaigns. Their mission is "To make motorcycling safer and more enjoyable by ensuring access to lifelong quality education and training for current and prospective riders, and by advocating a safer riding environment." I know this program and especially this location provide quality training to new motorcyclists, because it's where I did my Rider Safety Course many years ago.

Taking and passing a certified rider safety course is an important component of getting a motorcycle endorsement, which you need to ride legally in Michigan. If you take and pass a certified course, you can skip the Secretary of State Riding Skills Test. The Schoolcraft location in Livonia offers four different Rider Safety classes: Basic Rider, 3-Wheel Basic Rider, Returning Rider Basic Rider, and Advanced Rider.

The first three courses are geared towards riders who are unlicensed, including new riders and those who have motorcycling experience but who no longer have a valid CY endorsement and haven't ridden in a while. In all but the Basic Rider course, students must provide their own properly titled, registered, and plated motorcycle or 3-wheel motorcycle. The 3-Wheel Basic Rider course teaches students the basic turning, shifting, and braking skills they need to safely operate a 3-wheeled motorcycle. In Michigan, if you do your certified rider safety course on a 3-wheeled bike, your CY endorsement only allows you to operate 3-wheeled bikes legally.

Unlike the other three, the Advanced Rider course is designed for riders who are experienced and already have a CY endorsement. In the Advanced Rider course, the focus is on enhancing basic skills, crash avoidance, and improving braking and cornering.

I learned about the need for student training motorcycles from Debbie Parinello, our firm's resident paramedic and Accident Scene Management class instructor, who also sits on the Governor's Motorcycle Safety Advisory Team. She told me that the need for bikes kept coming up at their meetings, and right away I knew I had the perfect bike to help out: my Suzuki TU 250X. I'd barely put any miles on it, and I know it's a pretty maneuverable and reliable bike. MSF uses the same make and model in their fleet of training bikes, so it was kind of a no-brainer.

My team and I had hoped to arrange a special event surrounding the bike donation, so we could highlight the great work that MSF and Schoolcraft are doing as one of the busiest motorcycle safety training centers in the State. However, when we got in touch with Vince Consiglio, Rider Coach and coordinator for the Detroit Metro Motorcycle Safety Consortium, and Kristen Schopieray, Motorcycle Safety Program Manager at Schoolcraft, we found out they needed the bike immediately for their next group of students. So without much fanfare, I headed over to Schoolcraft to meet their team and sign over the bike.

I always encourage motorcyclists to "get endorsed, get insured, and spread the word" about motorcycle safety and awareness. I hope that supporting MSF and Schoolcraft College's Motorcycle Safety Program will translate into more motorcycle endorsements, more safety-conscious bikers, and fewer crashes in the future.



A QUICK PILE OF SKULLZ

A friend of mine needed something quick on a wind shear for a customer of his. He already had the skull theme going on his bike so it was the obvious thing to do. Being a quick one, I wanted to keep the artwork simple and not too elaborate. Besides, it can get cheesy if you incorporate too many different elements into the bike. Pick a strong theme and go with it.


I am starting with a part that has been painted with base coat and clear coat then wet sanded with 600 grit sandpaper. Before any art can be done I coat the part with a spray on liquid masking material and allow it to dry. This puts a rubbery skin on the part that I can mark and cut. A paper masking will also work depending on the curves of the part being painted.



I draw a cool pile of skullz design and close cut it out of a Xerox copy using my exacto knife. I prefer a #16 blade. You can use good reference for image accuracy



When your paper pattern is cut out, place it on the part and tape it in place and trace it down using a fine sharpie marker.

You can work all 4 skulls at the same time. Start with a paint mix of 70% clear to 30%



white. This will act as a tone and can be built up in intensity with multiple coats. Accent the edges of the tooth and allow for some tones of light and dark using the existing masking to establish your hard

This project took only 4 or 5 hours to complete. Not too bad for a quickie. I have spoken with Chris since this project has been completed. His customer was thrilled with his skullz.

MICHIGAN FEATURE 2014 HONDA JALLES KALLES

fter a ten year absence, Honda presents the allnew 2014 Valkyrie – a modern "muscle" cruiser propelled by an 1832cc, liquid-cooled, horizontally opposed six-cylinder, SOHC engine with PGM-FI. This is the same monster engine that powers the Gold Wing and Gold Wing F6B – stripped down to the bare essentials to give it a curb weight of 750 pounds. That's more than 150 pounds less than the Gold Wing.

To enhance the performance characteristics, Honda mounted the engine low into the Valkyrie's twin-spar aluminum frame. This gives the bike a low center of gravity - the effect of which is amplified by a low seat height of only 28.8 inches. The result is a surprisingly comfortable and well balanced ride for a bike of this size.

Honda also ramped up the stopping power of the Valkyrie with 310mm cross-drilled rotors (14mm larger in diameter) and Nissin four-piston calipers. The rear gets an even larger 316mm disc/caliper combo. Another difference from the Gold Wing is that the Valkyrie gets an independent front and rear braking system as opposed to the linked-brake system found on the Wing. Although not standard, ABS is available as an option.

The modern, sporty fenders, the unique fuel tank design, the fat exhaust pipes and the stylish fairing are all working together to form a very special visual effect. Other modern touches include a LED headlight, taillight, turn signals and its multi-function digital LCD dash. The Valkyrie also features aluminum passenger grabrails and a passenger seat that can be removed to give the bike a more streamlined look.

At the winter shows, the Valkyrie drew a lot of attention and has many reconsidering Honda's position in the power cruiser market.





BACKYARD GRILL TIPS:

During Spring & Summer, we use our grill for almost every supper. Here's some time proven tips that truly make a difference.

SIMPLE, MEAT MARINADE: AT LEAST 5 GENERATIONS STRONG!

Always let your meat be room temperature. Cold meat does not absorb a marinade easily. But light your grill and let it get good & hot. I've used this marinade my entire life for steak and it's literally been used

five used this marinade my entire life for steak and it's literally been used for 5 generations back that my Mom could recall......and it's so incredibly simple:

Take room temp. steaks and squeeze mustard all on one side; rub it in good, making sure to get the sides. Then, drizzle Worcestershire Sauce all over top of the mustard. This is when you add any spices you want; salt & pepper (we add this again slightly when actually grilling too), garlic powder if you like it. Now, just let it sit for only 5 minutes. That's it. That simple. There's something in the ingredients of the mustard (which has been around over 100 years) & the Worcestershire Sauce (which has been around over 100 years) that when combined, make up for a perfect meat tenderizer. You do not taste the mustard one single bit after grilling but the flavor you do get is truly amazing. Make sure that you "let your meat rest" when you take it off the grill or anytime you cook meat. I add a sprinkle of parsley, just for freshness. Just give it a solid 5 minutes and those juices get sucked back into the meat. Don't ever put your meat on a cardboard paper plate as those just absorb all your juices. Use an actual plate or the coated stock paper plates.

GET CREATIVE WITH GRILL BUNDLES!

Anything you can cook on top of your stove, you can put in a grill bundle; Just use the high-quality heavy aluminum foil. Place on low heat on grill and let go long and slow. Gives you time for a few beers.

Brown Rice, Shrimp & Snap Peas and a pat of butter

Sear your **Kielbasa** off quick, slice in 1 inch pieces then place in a bundle of sliced thin **onions & peppers**, **thin sliced potatoes** & a pat of butter.

Take Frozen X-Large Shrimp from any major grocery store and the quartered size of frozen corn on cob pieces, double up alum. foil,

making a bowl shape with high siders, add ingredients and sprinkle McCormick's **Caribbean Seasoning**, roll up your bundle nice and tight and let it go for about 15 minutes over medium heat. **Phenomenal!**

Grill off **Pork Chops** really quick on high heat, turn heat down to low. Add your fave veggie; **frozen peas or frozen squash**. We like to add a can of **sliced apples**, a couple pinches of cinnamon and a pat of butter. Wrap tight, let it go for 15 mins. over med. heat. Delish! Then we do our veggie off to the side; (be sure and spray your grill with non-stick butter or olive oil before laying veggies down) **big slices of squash**; cut lengthwise, big thick **slices of onion**, **long slices of eggplant**, **whole carrots** cut in half and placed flat down, **whole ears of corn on the cob still in the husk**. Just pull down your husks gently, slather butter all over the ear of corn; salt & pepper and gently push the husks back up in place and grill over low heat. After about 10 minutes, pull down the husks again and let the corn get some good grill marks. Serve with husks back up. Crazy Good!

The thing is to just think outside of your kitchen. If you can cook it inside, you can cook it on your grill.

Even pasta bundles on the grill.

I am a BIG lover of grilling fruit and then drizzling a sauce, honey or ice cream over top. Grilled fruit is amazing because when it's caramelized on the grill, it enhances all its' pure flavors:

GRILLED BANANNAS: Cut bananas length-wise and on a low grill that's been sprayed with butter, lay them down, sprinkle with a mixture of brown sugar & cinnamon, flip, remove and drizzle with either melted Hershey's chocolate sauce or hot melted caramel sauce (both in the ice-cream aisle at any grocery).

GRILLED PEACHES: I use whole, fresh peaches, cut down the middle, remove pit, leave on just enough to get grill marks, sprinkle with cinnamon & sugar mix, remove, drizzle with heated marshmallow sauce.

GRILLED PINEAPPLE: Cut the pre-cut ones' from your Deli in the tall plastic container. These are big, thick-cut pieces. Sprinkle w/ cinnamon & sugar mix; get good grill marks, remove and add a couple small scoops of quality Vanilla Bean ice-cream.

TECH TIPS TIRE BASICS



How to Choose the Best Tires for Your Motorcycle

Whether replacing a set of worn motorcycle tires or upgrading to better tires, motorcycle owners must realize the importance of buying the best tires for the type of vehicle and riding experience desired. Whether driving off-road or on the street, buy-

ing the right tire improves the ride quality for riders and their passengers.

When shopping for the right tires, learn about the types of motorcycle tires available, including track, sport, off-road, cruising, and touring tires from leading brands such as Bridgestone, Dunlop, Michelin, and Pirelli. Also find out which size tire your motorcycle needs and become familiar with the different motorcycle tire size numbering systems. Knowing what to look for when shopping for motorcycle tires can lead to both financial and time savings, not to mention protection for you and your passengers.

Types of Motorcycle Tires

When choosing the best tires for a motorcycle, owners must first determine the type of tire that fits the driving situation. The table below details the different types of motorcycle tires available.

Tire Type	Description
Race Tires	Allow for cornering at tight angles; extreme acceleration from a standing position; speed when coming out of turns; durable on the track use
Sport Tires	Made for fast action on the road; radial pattern gives better road grip; offer better handling in dry and wet conditions; more durable than race tires
Off-Road Tires	Best for off-road use; tires typically sport a knobby design; these tire types are secured with rim locks to prevent the tire from spinning on the rim in rough terrain
Cruising Tires	Offer superior grip on a variety of different road surfaces; improved grip for wet weather use; improved stability control
Touring Tires	These type of tires offer long distance use in all weather conditions; stable tire offering excellent driver control

Make sure they are the correct type of tires for the motorcycle model before making a purchase. Also inspect them thoroughly to make sure they meet proper tire standards. Finally, make sure that any tires purchased match up. For instance, do not mix and match a belted tire with a radial tire.

Motorcycle Tire Sizes

When determining motorcycle tire size, owners should pay attention to the five-part size number. This number is comprised of the width, aspect ratio, speed rating, tire construction, and the rim diameter, in that order. The sections below give more information on each of these areas.

Motorcycle Tire Width

The first number in a motorcycle tire size represents the width of the tire. The width of a motorcycle tire is the measurement, in a straight line, from the outside of one sidewall to the outside of the other sidewall.

Motorcycle Tire Aspect Ratio

The tire aspect ratio represents the motorcycle tire's cross section profile in relation to its height. The number on the tire represents the percentage of the height to the tire's width. This ratio is represented as the second number, after the tire width, on the tire size number.

Motorcycle Tire Speed Rating

The motorcycle speed rating represents the maximum speed at which riders can drive the motorcycle with a maximum load and the tires at the maximum listed inflation pressure. The maximum load and inflation pressures are also found on the sidewalls listed separately. The third entry on the tire size number is a letter that represents the speed rating. The following table contains the various speed ratings and their corresponding speeds in miles per hour, or MPH.

Z-rated tires have no recognized upper speed. They are listed

as 149+ MPH to represent this lack of a threshold.

Motorcycle Tire Construction

The fourth number/letter in the tire size represents the tire construction. The letter B stands for belted tires,, and the letter R stands for radial tires. Belted tires contain a fiberglass, Kevlar, or aramid fiber belt that gives the tire added strength and increased load capacity. Shoppers should pay attention though since not all belted tires have the B designation. If unsure about what type of tire is being bought, ask the seller for more information.

Radial tires have a longer life than belted tires, as well as better steering control, but they make for poor off-road tires and have reduced grip at slow speeds. Radial tires do have belts, but only to add stiffness to the tire. Commonly constructed of steel, polyester, or aramid fibers, the belts in a radial tire reinforce the tread region.

Motorcycle Tire Rim Diameter

The tire rim diameter is the measurement of the rim or wheel upon which the tire sits. Measured in inches, the tire diameter can be found by measuring from the inside of the rim lip on one side of the rim to the inside of the rim lip on the other side of the rim.

The Different Motorcycle Tire Size Numbering Systems

Four systems comprise the available motorcycle tire size measuring systems which are largely dependent on bike type and manufacturer. The table below lists the four different tire size numbering systems.

Tire Size Num- bering System	Description
Metric	The most common tire measuring system; considered the most descriptive; found on almost every motorcycle type
Alpha	Most often used for touring motorcycle tires; the B designation, which indicates a belted tire, can appear after the speed rating
Standard Inch	Found in older motorcycles; these types of tires do not include an aspect ratio; these are bias-ply and not belted
Low Profile Inch	Also referred to as the 82 Percent Series Size System, due to the aspect ratio being 82 percent when not specified; manufacturers no longer using this tire size system

vs. Tubeless Motorcycle Tires

Tubeless tires have become a safety feature on motorcycles. They retain less heat, there is no chance that they will pop when punctured, possibly causing a wreck, and tubeless tires tend to stay connected to the rim.

Tires with tubes have one main advantage: they are easier to repair on the fly. If a tire with a tube is punctured during a trail ride, it is relatively easy to pull off the tire and patch the tube, then put the tire back on the rim. Tubeless tires, on the other hand, usually require garage equipment to repair. This is why so many off road tires use tubes.

Riders who use tires with tubes need to be sure that the tire pressure is correct. This is one of the most important safety measures to take with this kind of tire.



Motorcycle Tires Need Replacement?

Motorcycle tires show some of the same signs of wear as automobile tires, particularly when the tread is becoming sufficiently worn to merit replacement. Signs to watch for include:

- Exposed steel belts, cords, or fabric layers
- Wear bars even with tread height
- Tread worn enough that Lincoln's head isn't concealed at all when a penny is stood in a tread groove
- Cut or punctured sidewall
- Sidewall severely cracked from age or dry rot

Uneven tire wear may indicate that a tire is defective, the rim is bent, the bike's frame is damaged, or the wheel is out of alignment or out of balance. Any of these require a trip to the mechanic. They will not only interfere with steering today; they will accelerate wear and tear on the bike over the coming months.

Are the Current Tires Doing What Is Desired?

If the current tires have performed well in terms of tread life, road grip, and weather, a rider might choose to replace them with exactly the same make and model.

At the same time, given the constant innovation in motorcycle tires, there may be upgrades that would improve performance in some way important to a specific rider at the time tires are due to be replaced. One or another manufacturer is likely to have come up with tires that are just a bit better for high mileage touring, multi-season driving, high-speed racing, sharp cornering, driving in all weather conditions, or driving off road. So it may be worth checking out the newest tires to see if any of the improvement will benefit the way a particular bike will be used.

d Rear Tires Are Not Interchangeable

The rear tire is designed for acceleration and carries most of the weight of the bike, rider, and any saddlebags on a touring bike. The front tire is designed to handle up to 80 percent of the braking and the actual turning motion during turns. The rear tire only takes a leaning motion in turns. Because of their different tasks, the two tires are engineered differently. Motorcycle tires should not be rotated as one would automobile tires.







ABATE OF MICHIGAN

OBSERVATIONS, CONCLUSIONS AND ADVICE

By virtue of my job I have had the unique experience of being somewhat of a silent observer in Michigan's State Capitol for 19 years. I have seen governors come and go; numerous legislators come and go, lobbyists, news reporters, and office staff. I have been at so many political rallies for so many causes I am sure I cannot remember them all. Most in an official capacity and several as an annual participant.

I would like to share some observations, conclusions and advice for what it may be worth.

In the years prior to term limits there were a tremendous number of senior elected members of the house and senate. These guys had "weight". They had the power to effect the operations of government in a substantive manner. I think they individually had more gravitas in influencing legislation than most do now. Good or bad.

Since term limits and so many frequent changes of legislators it's clear that these elected people are not "special", "exceptional", or different than any of us for the most part. They come from all backgrounds, have little or a lot of education, and come in like high school freshmen. They have enthusiasm. That hit's the political machine, and their schooling begins.

The political machine as I see it is just the meat grinder that is turned by the constant presence of the same groups of attendees every day. What comes out of the grinder depends on what goes in, who gets to decide what goes in, and who has the best grip on the handle. Predominantly that consists of the Governor, The Speaker of the house, the Senate leader, and Lobbyists.

Having influence amongst that particular group of power mongers first requires understanding the process, and second building the coalition's amongst your peers to become valuable to them in completing their agenda's. This means tradeoffs. A group of likeminded reps use their votes to pass the power mongers bills to have their issues accepted as grinder content and hopefully eventually passed.

Lobbyists have perhaps the most influence in the grinder's content. They do not have term limits, and many are former legislators with complete training on how the process works. They are backed by either big money, or a lot of members, and often were very involved in assisting the elections of those who will support their interests. And they are always there.

I am just skimming the surface here; someday I may have to write a book. But the conclusion I want to impress upon folks

is how important each of us participation in this circus is. These people we elect control our lives, money, taxes, and future in a major way. It may seem like we have little individual influence. Not necessarily so. We all have to go meet the potential candidates for office before the election. Run them through our own personal meat grinder and get to really know them.

Abate is an excellent example. We seriously vet all potential candidates. We have them come speak at our meetings, and take questions. We are a citizen lobbyist group and we have a long history of being very involved. We make sure we have access to the power mongers and we influence what goes or does not go into the grinder. What we have done as a political lobbying group would never have been accomplished by an individual.


I am going to tell you there are legislators in Lansing I wouldn't give a pack of matches too. They defy comprehension as to how they got elected. There are some very conscientious legislators too, that are well vetted and truly are there to work for the constituents of their districts.

Don't vote based on campaign ads. Ever. Don't vote based on party affiliation. Ever. If you can afford to belong to a lobbying group that represents your rights or beliefs, join. Lobbying is not going away, and the best defense is a good offense.

And finally, if you're a motorcyclist please Join Abate. ~ Rusty


Mission Peninsula

Last month we showed you the vineyard ride around Leelanau Peninsula, leaving from Central Lake, heading south down through Traverse City, and up and around M-22 back down to Empire. This beautiful route has many vineyards. Multiple wineries are open during the summer months, offering tours and winetasting.

While this ride is short there are many interesting side roads that will take you to places like Old Mission Village. This is a nice run to the east and is really worth seeing. Another great stop is at the north end of M-37 in Old Mission State Park. The road ends at the Mission Point lighthouse. You can tour the lighthouse and checkout all the history behind it, which in itself is worth the run, especially if you are into that kind of thing.

Heading back south, turn right on to Bowers Harbor Rd, this will take you to Peninsula Rd, where you will turn left to go back down the west side of the peninsula. This road hugs the shore all the way back to Traverse City, with a couple restaurants on the way, and beautiful scenery, including some pretty nice views of Powers & Fox Island, and The Leelanau

If you do the peninsula route the way we show you here, you're not going to go much more than 50 miles, so it may be considered a side trip on a longer tour, such as The Leelanau Vineyard Route. Whichever way you decide, it's a definite must do while riding in this beautiful area.

MSF Group Riding

Quick Tips from the Motorcycle Safety Foundation


otorcycling is primarily a solo activity, but for many, riding as a group - whether with friends on a Sunday morning ride or with an organized motorcycle rally - is the epitome of the motorcycling experience. Here are some tips to help ensure a fun and safe group ride:

Arrive prepared. Arrive on time with a full gas tank.

Hold a riders' meeting. Discuss things like the route, rest and fuel stops, and hand signals (see diagrams on next page). Assign a lead and sweep (tail) rider. Both should be experienced riders who are well-versed in group riding procedures. The leader should assess everyone's riding skills and the group's riding style.

Keep the group to a manageable size, ideally five to seven riders. If necessary, break the group into smaller subgroups, each with a lead and sweep rider.

Ride prepared. At least one rider in each group should pack a cell phone, first-aid kit, and full tool kit, so the group is prepared for any problem that they might encounter



Ride in formation. The staggered riding formation (see diagram below) allows a proper space cushion between motorcycles so that each rider has enough time and space to maneuver and to react to hazards. The leader rides in the left third of the lane, while the next rider stays at least one second behind in the right third of the lane; the rest of the group follows the same pattern. A single-file formation is preferred on a curvy road, under conditions of poor visibility or poor road surfaces, entering/leaving highways, or other situations where an increased space cushion or maneuvering room is needed.





Avoid side-by-side formations, as they reduce the space cushion. If you suddenly needed to swerve to avoid a hazard, you would not have room to do so. You don't want handle-

bars to get entangled.

Periodically check the riders following in your rear view mirror. If you see a rider falling behind, slow down so they may catch up. If all the riders in the group use this technique, the group should be able to maintain a fairly steady speed without pressure to ride too fast to catch up.

If you're separated from the group, don't panic. Your group should have a pre-planned procedure in place to regroup. Don't break the law or ride beyond your skills to catch up. For mechanical or medical problems, use a cell phone to call for assistance as the situation warrants.

You asked for it, and we have answers! We field many guesof these questions come up in every class.

If I have my Concealed Pistol License (CPL), that means I have to carry concealed. right?

With your CPL, you may carry openly or concealed. There is no requirement that you maintain concealment with your CPL.

What is open carry? Is it allowed in Michigan?

Open carry is not defined in Michigan law. There are no laws for or against open carry, therefore it is legal in Michigan. Open carry means carrying the gun so that it is seen. Without a CPL you have to be careful that it never becomes concealed. With a CPL, you may switch between the two methods at will.

If I print (showing outline of gun under clothing), isn't that considered brandishing? What it my gun accidentally becomes visible?

Several years ago, an opinion by the Attorney General for the State of Michigan was published. This opinion defined "brandishing." Now, between that opinion, and the fact that open carry is becoming more widespread, there is no need to worry about printing or your gun becoming visible. In order for you to be considered brandishing your firearm, you must be threatening someone with it.

Why do people open carry? Isn't that dangerous?

open carry groups in Michigan, the laws and the enforcement of : be carrying, may someday save your life.

tions about carrying pistols, whether openly or concealed. Most : the laws are becoming streamlined. The opinion on brandishing was likely one effect of open carry. The Michigan State Police Legal Update 86 answers a lot of the questions for police about carry, particularly open carry, that weren't always answered consistently in the past. The MSP Legal Updates are an awesome resource for non-officers, though they were designed to be guides for officers in the completion of their duties.

> Open carry also serves to bring notice to the fact that people carry firearms, and to help show other people that it's normal to see someone with a gun on their hip, and that the person carrying poses no threat to others. Obviously, there are certain risks that go along with open carry, and it's possible that you may end up having a chat with police, as they respond to a call by someone who is afraid of you with your gun.


> Open carry makes your gun more visible to everyone, and this includes criminals. This may mean that the criminal chooses another target, or it could inadvertently escalate the situation before it even begins. Your gun is more readily accessible, should you need to defend your life with it, but you have also lost the element of surprise.

> Whether you decide to carry openly, or concealed, be sure you think about the advantages and disadvantages of both. If you'd like to get involved with open carry, Michigan Open Carry is an excellent group, and they've been around for years. They will often have open carry gatherings, like at parks and some restaurants, which are open to any who wish to attend.

If you do choose to carry openly, I strongly recommend the use of a retention holster. This will help prevent anyone from taking your own gun from you. Be sure to train with any holster you use, as you need to be familiar with how your holster works. When you need it, you need to be able to access your gun with-Open carry is often politically motivated. Thanks to the many : out fumbling. Tech Tips By Steve

Looks like we have warm

weather YES YES! Spring was a bit late and so was the usual mad rush of bikes but sure enough they came ... YES! One fairly common maintenance issue popped its nasty head this spring and we found it on two bikes so far ... compensator sprocket problems! Since it seems to be a bit of a trend in the industry with Harley right now I thought we would talk about these buggers. The first bike in the shop with the problem was a 2005 Dyna with a well-built engine ... and I mean nice! If you run into this bike on the road watch out, it is fast and it has an abundance of torque. The other problem child was a 2008 Road King that had noise in the primary and some wild starter kickback (a problem with the newer Harleys) and it had trouble starting once and a while when hot also.

What is a compensator sprocket anyway? Basically it was designed to take up some of the power inconsistencies in the V-Twin engine to make your life a little smoother. It is located under the primary cover and attached to the main shaft of the engine in front of the rotor/stator assembly (FIG 1). It is the front sprocket in the primary chain assembly and the back sprocket is attached to the clutch hub in the rear. This whole primary chain/sprocket assembly's job is to take the engine power and transfers it to the transmission which in turn shoves that power to the rear tire via a chain or belt. They have not been too much of a problem in the older bikes as long as you're not a drag racer, then most of those guys went to a compensator eliminating sprocket. With that being said you riders are putting some serious miles on your bikes in no time with little maintenance. Compared to the older bikes too so my guess is if you rode those older bikes like you are riding today's bike's we would probably see some issues.

So how do you know if your compensator is bad or going bad? Symptoms may be: 1. Getting a kickback in your starter when trying to start 2. May make it hard to start when warm 3. Clunky shifting, hard shifting or trouble finding neutral 4. And lastly, noise and or vibration from the primary case, sometimes a whining sometimes a ticking or growling.

Compensator problems are well known in the newer bikes; the stock compensators just are not taking the bigger engine torque being put out today, Harley came up with a Screaming Eagle Compensator patch a while ago for \$250.00. However, they never admitted there was a problem, and then they had a problem with that kit so they did some re-engineering and now a new kit is available. This kit will cost vou \$299.00 (FIG 2), then \$50.00 for some adhesive to glue in an oil deflector supplied in kit that attaches to your primary cover, oh and another \$105.00 for a new rotor because Harley says the new fix will not work with your stock rotor... Oh yeah you will also need a 70 Torx bit for the new compensator bolt too, but hey! You get to keep your stator and stock primary cover so that's some good news! Sorry but there is no real data on the new Screaming Eagle Compensator Sprocket kit vet, just because the old kit didn't work as expected I am not going to be a negative ned ... Let's be positive and say they have it worked out now. A little fun fact ... Harley has made three changes to the compensator since 2000 with the newest change made in 2014(FIG 3). **Tech Tip** ... do you see that automatic primary adjuster in FIG 1? It is the nylon shoe thingy in between the compensator and the clutch assembly. This was Harleys answer to make the bike a little more maintenance free and take out some of the primary chain noise. The problem is that it can over tighten and it does not have the ability to back off its tension, which makes a recipe for bearing failure, vibration and noise, well crap that was everything it was supposed to take care of. Haydon Enterprises has a fix for the FLH's and actually it makes their style tensioner for most all big twins and sportsters, look em up they have been around for a long time (FIG 4)




FIG 6 Vulcan Engineering Compensator Eliminator Sprocket

OK, back on point! There are others options to fix the compensator problem, one comes from BDL (FIG 5) and one from Vulcan Engineering Company (FIG 6) and they are around \$200.00. Neither of these compensators needs the rotor replaced and no further modifications needed. The Vulcan is a straight forward compensator eliminator solid two gear sprocket; no moving parts no buffering capabilities. The BDL has no springs but does have compensating abilities; they are limited compared to stock. The BDL and Vulcan versions boast a lot less weight hanging out there off the main shaft, long life and no wear out problems compared to the stock and screaming eagle versions, but it's not a perfect world. Both the Vulcan and the BDL may add some vibration, most likely if your compensator is on the outs and making all kinds of primary case noise, if you choose this route you should get a quite bike with less vibration than what you had.

The compensator problem is for stock and non-stock bikes alike, it simply is not able to take the newer 88"-96"-103" motor output, there are several choices for you to correct the issue though and that is always nice! **Another tidbit** ... all you throttle hounds keep in mind as you build your bike and gain all that wonderful HP and Torque there are things inside your bike that were not meant to take all that and those parts will tend to break or wear out quicker and remember as you fix one thing the next weaker link will break or wear out, the harder you ride the more you have to build that machine to take that habit Brothers and Sisters! Here is another little **tech tip**, when you take the primary all apart take a very good look at your clutch assembly and all it components, **including the clutch hub splines!**






