



Veterans Affairs Medical Center Answers to Service Members' Concerns

A town hall meeting was held for Northern Michigan veterans concerned about their medical care. Doctors from the Aleda E. Lutz VA Medical Center met with veterans in Traverse City as a part of a series of meetings taking place across the state. While many issues stood out, one of the main topics was rural access.

While the state of Michigan is ranked low, nation-wide, for veteran benefits and care, the staff of the VA Medical Center are looking to improve it. They opened the floor to veterans today to hear their

Veterans got the chance to have their guestions answered in a town-hall style meeting at the American Legion post in Traverse City. The idea of the get-together is for leaders from the VA Medical Center to hear ways they can better medical care for veterans.

"I think the meeting went really well for us today," said Chris Blasy Chief of Staff at Aleda E. Lutz VA Medical Center in Saginaw. "We were able to get some information from people who have some suggestions on opportunities for us to improve."

Issues ranged from under-staffed clinics to the Affordable Care Act. One issue, though, rose above the others. "In Northern Michigan, there's some challenges as far as transportation," Blasy said. "We do have opportunities to improve our ability to get some of our disabled veterans to their services."

Veterans like Neal Horning said the problem is very real. "We have people from up here who go to Detroit." Horning said, "Now you take a guy that's mid-70's or 80's and he's got to make a trip like that in a DAV van. To me, that's not right."

The Q-and-A session proved to be beneficial for both veterans and the meeting's organizers with both sides viewing it in a positive light. "We're always looking for opportunities and ways to improve and we have to think in terms of different ways to solve the issues, Blasy said. "We got a long way to go, but long as we keep going the right way, the right direction, which I think they are, we'll be doing just fine," Horning said.

The Veterans Medical Clinic plans to hold more meetings like this so they can get to the bottom of problems faster.

'Dogs of War:' A&E makes reality show about veterans struggling with PTSD

When Jim Stanek returned from his deployment with the 1st Infantry Division of the Army with a traumatic brain injury and Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder, he saw first-hand in therapy the impact service dogs can have on veterans. But when he and his wife, Lindsey, tried to get him a service dog, they faced long waiting lists and price tags of up to \$60,000.

"We decided to take it upon ourselves to try and address the issue head on," Lindsey Stanek told FOX411. So they founded Paws and Stripes, an organization that trains rescue dogs and veterans to work together so the shelter animals can be service dogs for their veteran owners. The program is funded by donations and is free for the veterans.

Now, their efforts are being brought into the spotlight as part of a new series on A&E titled "Dogs of War." The show premiered on

The veterans are paired with dogs and the two go through an extensive nine-to-12-month training program so they can learn how to best help each other.

"Every episode we focus on one veteran going through the program," he explained. "I have the honor of mentoring our veterans as they go through the process."

They've had a lot of success since they first launched their organization, Lindsey Stanek added.

"We have graduated over 50 service dogs, we have rescued more than 60 and we've provided mental health [help] to about 85 veterans." she said.

"A&E has really stepped up to the plate and was really willing to tackle the problem our veterans face -- and especially to put it on TV. The show is going to be an emotional roller-coaster," he predicted. "[The show is] just a glimpse of what it's like when you're a veteran living with it."

Lindsey Stanek added that she hopes the series will be appreciated by family members of veterans who may feel like no one fully understands what they go through. She said the show will show viewers what life is like for a veteran struggling with PTSD and other injuries.



The Motorcycle Lawyer on THE LAW

Looking Back at Some of the Highlights of 2014

I recently got a Certificate of Appreciation in the mail from the Detroit-Metro Regional Consortium (the Consortium). Earlier this year, I had a unique opportunity to give back to the biker community by donating one of my personal motorcycles - a Suzuki TU 250X with barely any miles on it - to the Motorcycle Safety Foundation (MSF). The bike is now being used for rider training at Schoolcraft College as part of their Motorcycle Safety Program.

The Consortium offers "hands-on, comprehensive motorcycle training... taught by professional, certified instructors," as per their website. When Debbie Parinello, a member of my staff, mentioned the Consortium's need for training bikes, I didn't hesitate; I'm always looking for concrete ways to give back, and this one was a no-brainer, especially since I did my own motorcycle safety training course at the same location many years ago.

Getting the certificate and letter of thanks in the mail got me thinking about some of the other positives from 2014, and I thought I would use this opportunity to summarize some of the highlights we've seen for motorcyclists in Michigan as well as for our firm.

Overall, 2014 was a good year for my team and I in terms of giving back to the biker community. In February, we launched our new Biker Card, which helps motorcyclists in two ways: First, it allows bikers to easily carry first aid information that could potentially save a life in the event of a crash. We've handed out hundreds of these cards this year, and we are glad that so many Michigan motorcyclists will have this potentially life-saving information with them if they need it. Second, our Biker Card gets the cardholder discounts and freebies at over 100 Michigan vendors, which we hope will encourage riders to try new products, services, and restaurants while they're out enjoying the open road. We also had many, many requests for our "Watch for Motorcycles" bumper stickers, especially during Motorcycle Awareness Month in May. Our goal is to get as many bumper stickers as possible onto cars across America in order to remind drivers that motorcycles are everywhere.

Also in May, House Bill No. 4781 was passed. This Bill amends the section of Michigan's vehicle code (MCL 257.306) that deals with the Temporary Instruction Permits (TIPs) for motorcyclists. TIPs were designed to give new motorcyclists the chance to practice riding before taking their rider skills test, but some people were applying for a new TIP every year instead of getting their full CY endorsement, which is a requirement to ride legally on Michigan's roads. Starting January 1, 2015, the new law limits the number of TIPs granted to riders to just two in every ten-year period. That's more than enough time to practice for a Skills Test if the rider doesn't want to take a certified Rider Safety Course (Note: I always recommend that new riders take a certified Rider Training Course). Ultimately, limiting TIPs is a good way to encourage more motorcyclists to get their CY endorsement.

This fall, "Nathan's Law" (House Bill No. 5438) was passed into law. The new law is named for Nathan Bower, a young rider who was killed in a motorcycle-vehicle crash back in 2009. It mandates that driver education programs must "include information concern-

ing the laws pertaining to bicycles and motorcycles and shall emphasize awareness of their operation on the streets, roads, and highways of this state." In other words, motorcycle awareness is finally a mandatory part of driver education programs, a win for motorcycle safety advocates. Obviously there is still much to do in terms of promoting motorcycle awareness and safety among motor vehicle drivers, but teaching young drivers to "Watch for Motorcycles" from the beginning is certainly a step in the right direction.



BRIOCHE ENCRUSTED CHRISTMAS HAM

(French meaning for "rich bread covering")

*inspired by Mario Batali on abc's The Chew, but modified by MaMa Thunder: for simplicity.

Make sure ham has set out a full hour at room temp. & on a big platter.

- 1 7 to 10 Pound Boneless, Smoked Ham
- 1 Tube of Pre-done Pastry Dough
- 1 Bottle of powdered Clove Seasoning
- 1 Can of your fave juice that you feel pairs best w/ Ham; Pear juice, Apple Cider, Mango, Pineapple....,whatevva'
- 1 Tbls. of powdered Cinnamon
- 1 Smaller Bottle of Apricot Preserves (quality brand)
- 1/2 Level teaspoon of Red Pepper Flakes
- 2 Beaten Eggs
- 1/2 Stick of Real Butter: melted by microwave
- 1 Heavy Aluminum, Square shaped, throw away, "turkey or big-ass ham" pan. Buy cheap @ WallyWorld.

Mix up your clove powder and cinnamon powder together.

Score the ham. This means you make shallow cuts in a criss-cross pattern, all over entire top and sides of ham. Preheat oven to 425 degrees.

After you've scored your ham, pour your juice preference all over ham and make sure it's down in all the little checkerboard crevices you've scored. Now take your clove & cinnamon mix and put some in your hands and sprinkle all over ham, making sure you get some down in every single crevice. If you need more, make up another batch of it; only takes a sec. Now, just let it set while you prepare the dough.

Now, you can go to The Chew and make your own authentic Brioche dough if you're skilled in "scratch" pie crusts, etc., but throw some flour down on your counter, pop open tube of dough and lay it out, throw some flour on your rolling pin and just start rolling out until it's big enough to cover the entire ham (just eyeball it), but don't get dough so thin it will split open the sec you start to cover ham with it.

Pour your Apricot Preserve into a small bowl and mix in your Red Pepper Flakes. Gently smear this all over top & sides of ham. Remove from platter and dry the bottom of ham good so not leaking. Place ham in middle of rolled-out dough. Very Gently bring all 4 sides up to the top and just take the dough and twist into a little knot on top and pat down. Take Egg Wash (combined melted butter & beaten eggs) and brush All Over entire dough, even underneath. Place on rack that is placed in aluminum pan. As soon as you put it in the oven, turn oven down to 350 degrees. Bake for 2 hours. If it looks like it's getting too brown towards the end, then make an aluminum foil V-tent and tent the ham so that it comes out golden brown and not Remove from oven, brush all over with melted butter & must cool for full 15 minutes. If possible when cutting, use a serrated electric knife. If not electric, use a very sharp serrated knife. Make up another batch of Apricot Preserves w/ Red Pepper flakes only melt down on stove top and use as a gravy. Perfection!

SUPER E-Z "Gourmet" GARLIC MASHED TATERS

- 1 Tub of Bob Evans Creamy Mashed Potatoes
- 1 Tub of Bob Evans Sour Cream n' Chive Potatoes
- 1 Small Tub of Premium brand Sour Cream
- 1 Small Tub of Premium brand Whipped Philly Cream Cheese (room temp)
- 1 Medium Garlic Bulb; cut off ends, place in alum. foil, seal tight, cook in 425 oven for 40 minutes and then mush it down blend into potato mixture.

- 1 Jar of Your Favorite Preserves; add nutmeg or cinnamon or even a little spice; spice & sweet is good.





Tech Tips By Steve

ARE YOUSLIPPING?

The last couple of months we have been talking about making some horsepower and torque with a supercharger,

well with that kind of power upgrade you will be transferring higher pressures to other parts of your bike, like your drivetrain. Depending on how abusive you are with the new found power you have will depend on how much you will need to beef up your drivetrain. If you are nice to things most of it can survive 100 ft. lbs. of torque and maybe a bit more, personally I would be saving for a clutch for starters after you start modifying that ride of yours. Whether it is a supercharger or a big bore kit with nice cam and tuning, Metric or Harley, they both need some beefing up when you start putting out some major horsepower and torque.

So you have done a bit of modifying and now when you give it some fuel you feel like your bike is slipping a bit, just does not feel like it is grabbing like it had before. Most likely you are getting some clutch slippage. Before I get into a clutch replacement, let me go over what clutches are made of and how they work.

What does that contraption do and how?

The clutches responsibility is to disengage and engage the transmission from and to the engine, basically putting the bike in neutral. It does this on a motorcycle when the rider pulls in the clutch lever; this motion is transferred down to the clutch pack by a cable or hydraulic power which in turn opens a gap in the clutch pack disengaging the transmission. When you let the lever go it allows the spring pressure to close the gap engaging the clutch and off you go! Whoa a little info is missing huh ... OK let's look at a typical basket style clutch used on Metrics and Harleys alike. A simple explanation is the clutch fiber plates are connected to the outer basket via tabs, which is connected to the engine and the steel plates are connected to the inner hub via tabs or splines and this is connected to the transmission. If you have the clutch lever pulled there is a gap between the fiber and steel plates so the inner and outer parts can spin freely of each other and will do so until you release the lever, which in turn lets the springs apply pressure to the pressure plate, which applies pressure to the fiber and steel plates locking it all together and zoom off we go!

What are the parts of a motor-cycle clutch?




Fig 1 Harley Clutch (early coil spring style)

Motorcycles clutches come in a variety of configurations; the most common are the wet multi-plate, dry multi-plate and an automotive style dry plate used primarily on BMW and Moto Guzzi. The basic

components of a wet and dry multi-plate clutch are; fiber plates, steel plates, an inner hub (clutch center) and clutch shell (outer basket), diaphragm spring or multiple coil springs, and a pressure plate. (Fig 1-2)




Fig 2 BMW Clutch

The wet clutch is exactly as it sounds; it is immersed in a light bath of oil which makes for smooth quiet operation. Dry clutches are made up of the same primary components as the wet but there is no oil present, these dry clutches work well but are prone to noise when the clutch is disengaged and can be a bit grabby too.

Lock-up clutches are not new but with new engineering they are getting popular with the everyday rider. You can do this two ways, you can just replace the pressure plate with a lock up style or replace the entire clutch with stronger springs, more plates and the lockup pressure plate which most high torque and horsepower riders are doing now AND some will fit under your stock cover without a spacer! The lock up clutch is a very simple device, you have four to six pivoting arms, as engine speed increases the arms 'swing out' under centrifugal force and push against the pressure plate – gripping the clutch pack tighter as the RPM's increase locking the clutch plates tight. They do not affect every day riding or clutch lever pull (as long as you do not opt for the stronger springs).

That brings us to the Install of a new Barnett lock-up style clutch on a 2008 Road King. (Fig 3)




Fig 4 Clutch adjustment rubber cover removal

After securing the bike to the lift we drain the primary oil, as the oil is draining you can loosen the clutch cable adjuster on the front frame down tube. (Note: to make the rubber cover come off and go back over the adjuster easily spray a little WD-40 or penetrating oil inside the rubber cover Fig 4) then remove the derby and primary covers. Now, slowly and evenly, in a star sequence, remove the six bolts holding the diaphragm spring. Remove the retainer, diaphragm spring and pressure plate from the clutch hub. Note: old clutch adjusting bolt and plate will not be reused. Then remove the friction and steel plates from the hub. This bike has 9 friction plates and 8 steel plates AND there is a single small friction plate in the back with 2 damper springs, so far sooooo easy!

Soak New fiber plates for about 2-3 minutes in primary oil, then start with the flat steel seat ring, then the dished steel spring then the small fiber plate, steel plate, fiber plate, steel plate, fiber plate and so on until you get to the last steel plate. The kit comes with three spring kits, 1-42 lbs. 1-58 lbs. 1-82 lbs. pick the one you want depending on how much initial clutch grabbing pressure you want ... remember the stronger the spring the harder the clutch lever is to pull back ... we picked the 58lbs. springs and slipped them into the pressure plate and then put the lock up head on with the 6 bolts, tightened to bottom and then 5 ft. lbs. ... Clutch Installed!!! (Fig 5)

Last steps are to put the primary cover back on with a new gasket, add oil, adjust clutch at the clutch hub not at the slack adjuster on the frame down tube which should be loose still. To adjust this style clutch properly use your allen wrench and tighten adjuster bolt just so you feel a slight resistance then loosen it _ turn and secure it with the lock nut. After that you can take out your cable play with the adjuster on the left down-tube, remember you do not want this too tight because it will prematurely wear out your throw-out bearing and cause other problems too. 1/16 to 1/8" free play at lever is recommended by Harley. Move the clutch lever in and out a few times and recheck your cable free play ... good? If so then slap that derby cover on and BAM you are done my friend ... Go ride! OH

YEAH ... give it a bit of a nice break in period, the dang clutch was expensive ya know.
























ABATE OF MICHIGAN MICHIGAN HELMET LAW REVIEW 2014

I am fortunate to have access to the OHSP collection of motorcycle crash data as it comes in over the course of each year. The Office of Highway Safety Planning, a division of the Michigan State Police, collects the statistics regarding motorcycle crashes from all police departments across the state. I have been collecting the statistics over the last several years since the helmet law was modified to return choice to bikers who don't want to wear a skid lid when they ride.

Here are the results over the last 5 years with the last 3 being since choice was returned. Keep in mind these are the annual statistics within the time frame stated. The final results for each year are not officially released until February or March of the following year. However the final statistics have never shown any meaningful difference in the ratio of fatalities and incapacitating injuries for either helmeted or

un-helmeted crash victims. A couple of things of note are first, from year to year the total number of crashes has not changed from one year to the next significantly from mandatory helmet years and choice years. Weather plays the biggest factor in any fluctuation of total crashes. Early riding weather and late summers put more folks out on the road for longer periods resulting in more crashes. Second is that helmeted rider fatalities and incapacitating injuries mirror un-helmeted crashes. Nowhere is there any indication that wearing a helmet decreases the number of total fatalities and incapacitating injuries since the law changed.

Essentially, NOTHING HAS CHANGED.

Below are the raw numbers, no spin, no motives, and no agenda. Make of them what they are.
