LUCK OF THE IRISH HEARTY STEW

1-1/2 to 2 lbs. of Boneless Sirloin Steak Meat; cut into bite-size pieces 2 Tbls. of All Purpose Flour

- 2 -3 Tbls. butter or margarine
- 1 Large Yellow Onion; chopped in big chunks
- 1 Can of Beef Stock and 1 Carton or Box of Beef Stock
- 1 Can of Stewed Tomatoes; un-drained
- 1 Envelope of Good Seasons Garlic & Herb Dressing Mix
- 1 lb. of red potatoes, jackets left on, cut into 3/4 inch chunks
- 2 Handfuls of pre-packaged baby carrots
- 1 Cup of Frozen Peas
- 1 Cup of either Frozen Corn or Frozen Broccoli, or both
- 2 Tbls. Worcestershire Sauce
- 1/2 Palm-full of Thyme
- 2 Tbls. Pearl Barley (in spice aisle any grocery)
- 1 Heaping Tbls. of Parsley
- 1 Bay Leaf
- 4 Beef Boullion Cubes: dissolved in 1 cup hot water

Melt 1/4 stick of butter or 2 tablespoons of margarine over medium heat. Dredge your meat chunks thoroughly through flour and then dredge again. Place into melted butter in a Dutch Oven and let brown up good on all sides. Remove to side plate. Now, on medium-high heat, sprinkle apprx. 3 heaping tablespoons of all-purpose flour into same pot. Keep working it around and around for about a minute or so to cook off the flour taste. Next, add your dissolved beef boullion cubes hot water mixture and again, let it all get mixed in well. Keep that wooden spoon moving! Next, add the (1) can of beef stock and keep an eye on it as it will thicken up quickly. Turn heat down to medium-low. Add the box of beef stock now. Add back in the beef chunks, potatoes, tomatoes, dressing mix, onion chunks. Worcestershire, thyme, barley, parsley and bay leaf, Cook covered for 45 minutes. The last 15 minutes, remove bay leaf and if needed, if stock too thick, add 1 cup of hot water. This will dilute the beef flavor so only add it if truly necessary. Now add in all your frozen veggies and a large pat of butter or 1 Tbl. of margarine, whichever. Take cover off and let go until frozen carrots are tender throughout. Serve in big soup bowls along with a cold apple/walnut & pear salad mixed in creamed mayonnaise and chopped Romaine lettuce. Serve hot crusty bread and take some room temp, margarine or butter and throw in a palm-full of basil and spread on thick slices of hot bread. Aye! Now this Irish Stew truly is magically delicious!

ONION PIE......VIDALIA STYLE

- 3 Cups of thinly sliced Vidalia Onions 1/2 Stick of Melted Butter
- 1 Pre-made Pie Shell
- 2 Eggs; beaten
- 3 Tbls. All-Purpose Flour
- 1/2 Cup Half & Half
- 1 Small Tub (8 oz.) of Sour Cream
- 1 Tub (8 oz.) Philly Cream Cheese (room temp.)
- 10 Slices of Hickory Smoked Bacon cooked crisp
- 1 Pkg. of pre-sliced mushrooms
- 1-1/2 cups of Grier cheese (get from Deli counter)
 Salt & Pepper to Taste

Preheat oven to 325 degrees F.

Melt butter down in a skillet and add onions and mushrooms and saute' until lightly browned. Place your pie pan on a sheet pan in case any drips over. Line bottom of pie crust with sauteed onions and mushrooms. In a small bowl beat up the two eggs and the flour together until smooth. Gradually add the half & half, cream cheese, sour cream and salt & pepper to taste. Mix well and pour all over the onions in the pie shell. Crumble bacon all over the top of pie and distribute evenly. Bake for 25 minutes and the last five, slide oven rack out and top generously with Grier cheese and let bake for 5 more minutes. Let cool 5 mins. before cutting.

OH SO LUCKY! IRISH GREEN CUPCAKES with GREEN BUTTERCREAM FROSTING

Pkg. of White Cake Mix

Follow package directions, only add GREEN food coloring to the mix as dark as you prefer. Bake as directed. If baking directly in cupcake tins be sure and spray bottom & sides generously. If baking in cupcake papers, only fill 3/4 full. Cool thoroughly.

Buy 2 cans of Betty Crocker Buttercream frosting and again add food coloring to the desired green that you want. Frost cupcakes generously. Take a butter knife and dab at the frosting to make stiff peaks after you're done frosting. Looks very pro.



As The Politician Turns

Welcome to another episode of "As the Politician Turns". Last issue I talked about how as part of the budget "deal" politicians voted to reduce the cost of living allowance for military retirees under age 62. As expected, they've taken a lot of flak and are now trying to back pedal. One bill introduced would restore full COLA to those with 100% VA disability. The latest bill I read would restore the COLA to all military retirees. Just goes to show that if you don't agree with the decisions your elected fools in D.C. make, you need to make your dissent loud and clear with them. Once in a while they actually do listen to their constituents. What a concept, huh? Who knows what will eventually be decided. Politicians introduce amendments faster than superman can change in a phone booth.

Part of the first bill also has some VA changes:

Extend the access for service members who deployed to Iraq and Afghanistan to get health care at VA from five years to 10

Improve care and benefits for veterans who were victims of sexual assault while they served in the military, to include easing the claims process for affected vet-

Expand alternative medical programs and chiropractic care and fund complementary medicine research at the Veterans Health Administration

Seek to eliminate the Veterans Affairs claims backlog by 2015 by requiring VA to provide quarterly reports on its progress to Congress (I personally don't see how filing reports will eliminate a backlog, it just takes employees away from working on veteran cases)

Backdate eligibility for veterans who need medical care for exposure to contaminated water at Camp Lejeune, N.C. to Aug. 1, 1953, complying with a recommendation by the Agency for Toxic Substances and Disease Registry

Expand dental programs and services.

The bill also presses for widening of reproductive services and fertility treatments and providing adoption assistance for spouses or surrogates of severely wounded or ill troops whose infertility problems are related to activity in the line of duty.

\$9 million veterans' housing development proposed for former site of World War II bomber plant village

At the peak of the Willow Run Bomber Plant's production during World War II, the Willow Run Village temporarily housed a large portion of the 22,000 workers that assembled B-24 Liberators in the "Arsenal of Democracy."

An estimated \$9 million building that will also provide apartments for homeless vets is being proposed for several vacant lots where developers say they believe a dining hall and recreation center for bomber plant's workers once stood.

Township officials and the team proposing the idea are still in talks, but township planning coordinator Joe Lawson expressed optimism over the project and said preliminary site plans could be before the planning commission sometime in the

The developers include husband and wife Mary and Mike Levine, along with another partner, who owns a parcel on Ware Court near the intersection of Midway Street and East Clark Road.

The Levine's said current plans call for a new three-story, 47,000-square-foot building offering on-site Veterans Affair Hospital staff and services. It will provide 48 one-bedroom apartments and be partially dedicated to homeless vets.

"There's a need for veteran housing – a big need," said Mike Levine. "There are a fair number of people who have needs for different services and this will help because they will live in close proximity to the hospital.'

Mary Levine said the vision includes fully furnished apartments; an entirely handicap accessible first floor; a common kitchen area; offices; an exercise room; and a computer room/library.

A VA case manager and social worker assigned to the residents would work on site 40 hours per week, and transportation to and from the VA Hospital would be

Mary Levine said they plan to raise equity from low-income tax credits, a construction loan and some long-term financing.

The vouchers for homeless veterans will be provided through the Michigan State Housing and Development Authority.

Lawson said he is confident about the project's success because of the developers' experience and connections. The Levine's run a law practice and Mary Levine specializes in affordable housing. Prior to that she served as a staff attorney and general counsel for the Michigan State Housing Development Authority.

The location was selected partly because one of the partners owns property, though they are working to purchase adjacent township-owned land, but also because of the proximity to the VA Hospital and historical significance.

Use Your Local Veterans Groups

Remember, if a veteran is struggling and has a problem, whether financially or emotionally, your local veterans organizations are there to help them. They can't help fellow veterans if they are unaware of someone's need.





The Motorcycle Lawyer on THE LAW

Our new Biker Card puts potentially life-saving information in your wallet

I'm a lucky guy: I love motorcycles and I love riding, and my job allows me not only to ride, but to meet a lot of great people, see a lot of cool bikes, and work with a lot of motorcycle and biker-friendly companies all over Michigan. A big part of my practice is helping the biker community. I take pride in the fact that I have organized several motorcycle-awareness campaigns, that I actively participate in motorcycle groups, and that my team and I have such a great track record for helping injured bikers.

This year, we are proud to be launching a new Biker Card that contains potentially life-saving information from our Accident Scene Management Class, which has three main goals: First, to reduce injuries and fatalities at the scene of a motorcycle crash. Second, to reduce rescuer injury at the scene of a crash. Third, to enhance EMS effectiveness by having trained bystanders tend to the injured until they arrive.

The card gives the basics of "PACT", an easy acronym to help you remember what to do if you crash or find yourself at the scene of a crash. PACT stands for: Prevent further injury; Assess the situation; Contact EMS; Treat the injured with life-sustaining care. Also included on the card are the basic first-aid priorities, which can easily be remembered as the ABCs: Airway, rescue Breathing, and Control bleeding. The Biker Card provides helpful illustrations and further instructions for the ABCs, and allows the cardholder to put their name and emergency contact information right on the card.

My team and I felt that this information is so simple and so vitally important that we needed to get it out to as many people as possible. By creating this new Biker Card with PACT and the ABCs right on it, you can easily carry this life-saving information with you every time you ride.

We're the only law firm in Michigan approved by Accident Scene Management, Inc. (ASMI) to offer this class. Our own Debbie Parinello, motorcyclist for over 20 years and certified EMT, teaches the practical aspects of the class, and I teach the legal portion. By training bikers and others on how to handle a crash scene until EMS arrives, we hope that we can help to reduce injuries and save lives

Why else are we excited about the new card? Because my team and I have gone above and beyond the call of duty to secure perks for cardholders, including discounts and freebies, with over 100 vendors across Michigan. 



The Way it Works

Each month *Thunder Roads Michigan* will announce a list of Thunder Run Stops each month. These stops are selected based upon the recommendations of our readers and confirmed by our editors. Riders can then hit these locations and present their Rider Cards in order to register at each stop.

Once a Rider has registered at the stop their Card number is then entered into the drawing for that stop. *Thunder Roads Michigan* will then select rider checks-ins randomly each month from across the state for special prizes and incentives.

Prizes are developed by both *Thunder Roads Michigan* and our sponsors - allowing for some exciting options. They may include stays at exciting stops, riding gear or accessories, gift certificates, cash, and even the opportunity to win a motorcycle!




The beauty and simplicity of this program is that anyone can win with any check-in, but your chances of winning are increased by the amount you ride! The dedicated rider trekking across the state has a greater chance of accumulating prizes but the couple that can only get out a few days a month to ride can also win! Every check-in counts as an entry in the "drawing" - so if you hit 40 stops in a month, you have twice as many chances of winning as someone that only hits 20. The more you ride - the more opportunities you will have to win! That's the whole idea - to encourage everyone to get out and ride!

State and Stop Prizes

Every month the *TRMI* staff will randomly select winners from the check-ins. Some prizes will be specific to the particular stop - and usually sponsored by that stop. For instance, a leather shop may award a custom leather vest to someone visiting their store during the month of June. That would be a prize specific to that stop and only riders checking in at that location would be eligible for that prize. The Winners

If your check-in is drawn, *Thunder Roads Michigan* will post your card number both online and in the magazine. Riders will then have at least 45 days to "claim" their prizes. But there is room to work within the system. Within those two parties there are those amongst us voters who





It is also firmly established that people who have carry permits are statistically more law-abiding then people who do not. And : CHICAGO'S FIREARM the number of RTC states and carry permit holders reached all-time highs as the nation's murder rate fell to nearly an all-time low.



That brings us to Detroit, which has seen its share of crime over the years and which in 2012 had the highest murder rate of any major U.S. city. The Detroit News reports that the city's police chief, James Craig, offered a solution to reduce crime; allowing law-abiding citizens to obtain concealed carry permits That's not a position typically espoused by big-city police chiefs. And Chief fire training as a condition of owning a gun in the city) was unconstitutional. Craig didn't always think that way either.

According to the article, Craig had worked for nearly 30 years in the Los Angeles Police Department, before moving east to become the police chief in Portland, Maine. It was there, in Maine, that he started believing that lawabiding oun owners could deter crime.

"Coming from California where it takes an act of Congress to get a concealed weapon permit, I got to Maine, where they give out lots of CCWs (carrying concealed weapon permits), and I had a stack of CCW permits I was denying;

"I changed my orientation real quick. Maine is one of the safest places in America. Clearly, suspects knew that good Americans were armed."

Chief Craig's statements echo those he made last month, when he said that good citizens with concealed pistol licenses, "translates into crime reduction." And the numbers bear that out. The article notes that Detroit police have reported 73 "justifiable homicides" in the city since 2011, 15 of them occurring in 2013. Most of these cases involved citizens like 77-vear-old Willie White. who in 2012, fatally shot a man who'd broken into his home. White's home had been broken into several times before, but after he defended himself, the break-ins stopped.

TRANSFER BAN FALLS TO SECOND AMENDMENT RULING

Things are looking up for gun owners in Illinois. On Monday (1/13/14), as some 4.500 concealed carry applications flooded the state's online portal on its first full day of operation, Obama-appointed U.S. District Judge Edmond E. Chang of the Northern District of Illinois issued a significant opinion that invalidated Chicago's ban on firearm sales and transfers within the city. The suit was brought by the Illinois Association of Firearms Retailers and three individuals, with the backing of NRA.

The Chicago transfer ban was part of a series of ordinances the city hastily enacted after its total ban on handoun possession was invalidated by the Seventh Circuit Court of Appeals' 2010 opinion in McDonald v. Chicago, Chicago's crusade to be the nation's most oppressive jurisdiction for gun owners has vielded other important victories for the Second Amendment. These included the Seventh Circuit's holding in 2011's Ezell v. Chicago that Chicago's ban on discharge (notwithstanding its requirement that residents obtain live-Other aspects of the city's wide-ranging gun control regime have been whittled down in response to litigation and the broad preemption provisions of Illinois' recently-enacted Firearm Concealed Carry Act (the result of vet another successful Second Amendment case in the Seventh Circuit, 2011's Shepard v. Madigan). The transfer ban remained, however, a symbol of the same political denial and impudence that have ironically helped move the Second Amendment needle in the right direction through litigation time and again.

The ordinance at issue flatly stated: "no firearm may be sold, acquired or otherwise transferred within the city, except through inheritance of the firearm." Chicago attempted to justify the ordinance by, among other things, pointing out that residents could obtain firearms outside the city's borders. The city also insisted that the ordinance increased the "transaction costs" of the firearms trade, making the acquisition of firearms by criminals more expensive, time-consuming, and dangerous (because they would have to travel through high-crime areas infested by rival gangs to buy guns). Chicago additionally claimed gun stores "are dangerous in and of themselves and cannot be safely



The court called Chicago's argument that it could ban firearm sales, as long as guns were available elsewhere, "profoundly mistaken." "Second Amendment rights," Judge Chang wrote, "must be guaranteed within a specified geographic unit--be it city or state."

The court also determined that the restriction had to pass a high level of scrutiny (although not quite "strict scrutiny"), because the type of regulation at issue was unknown to the framers of the Second Amendment and because it broadly prohibited even law-abiding Chicagoans from exercising an essential component of the rights protected by the Second Amendment--the acquisition of firearms. Regarding Chicago's purported justification of increasing transaction costs, the court noted that the evidence showed few criminals actually purchase firearms directly from legitimate dealers. Thus, "residents who seek to legally buy a gun bear more of the share of the added transaction costs in time, effort, and danger than gang members or would-be criminals The city, the court wrote, "cannot justify its ban on legitimate gun sales and transfers with overinclusive means that impact more law-abiding citizens than

Examining another Chicago claim that the ban helped maintain the city's "low household gun-ownership rate." the court opined: "It is ... doubtful that minimizing household gun ownership is, after Heller and McDonald, even a valid basis for gun regulation: possession of a gun for self-defense in the home is the core right protected by the Second Amendment, so trying to minimize the exercise of that right cannot be a valid basis for the sales-and-transfer ban."

Demonstrating the importance of proper scrutiny, the case was distinguishable from other recent opinions applying only "intermediate scrutiny" (for example, the recent opinion largely upholding New York's SAFE Act) by its insistence that the city do more than just produce "expert" opinions claiming the restrictions could inhibit crime. Rather, the court refused to ignore the effects the restrictions also had on law-abiding residents and legitimate activity. According to Judge Chang: "If the City is concerned about reducing criminal access to firearms, either through legitimate retail transactions or via thefts from gun stores, it may enact more appropriately tailored measures."

Because Chicago does not otherwise regulate firearm sales, the court, on its own initiative, stayed the effect of its judgment so the city could decide whether to appeal the case or pursue legislative remedies through more narrowly-tailored regulation. The city was given until January 13 to request an additional stay.

Besides paving the way for lawful firearms commerce in Chicago, Judge Chang's decision also shows the possibilities of a court taking the Second Amendment seriously. We will closely follow this case and continue to keep you informed of significant developments.






