

Army Vet Mistakenly Declared Dead by VA

Critics say a program rolled out to give certain veterans the option of government-funded private care is experiencing serious bumps: according to reports only 27,000 vets have taken advantage of the Choice Card program since it was launched in November.

Technically, to be eliqible to see a non-VA doctor, a veteran must be at least 40 miles away from the nearest VA hospital, or have waited at least 30 days for an appointment.

But veterans groups say confusion about eligibility remains the big problem – not everyone qualifies, but some vets who thought they would be, reported they were turned away. Some say the process isn't clear, and bureaucratic red tape has led to conflicting messages to veterans about whether or not they can access the system. Others have just gotten responses that weren't very helpful.

According to a survey conducted by the VFW in February, 80 percent of the 1,068 respondents who believed they were eligible to see a private doctor in lieu of VA care found out they were not. It's unclear whether this is due mostly to misperceptions about the program by veterans, or missteps by VA officials.

One area of confusion is that according to the rules, a veteran must be 40 miles away from the nearest VA -- "as the crow flies." But this can lead to unequal treatment, since residents in areas with winding roads, or simply crowded roads, could face a longer drive than others.

About 500,000 should be eligible under the distance requirements, but the "as the crow flies" standard is throwing everything off. Groups are behind legislation that would clarify the rule to accommodate a 40-mile driving distance.

On March 24, responding to pressure from Congress and veterans groups, the Department of Veterans Affairs said it is relaxing the rule that makes it hard for some veterans in rural areas to prove they live at least 40 miles from a VA health

The VA said it will now measure the 40-mile trip by driving miles as calculated by Google maps or other sites, rather than as the crow flies, as currently interpreted The rule change is expected to roughly double the number of eligible veterans.

Work Underway on New Beginnings Veteran's **Outreach Center in Flint Township**

Work is underway on a facility that will soon provide Transitional Housing for veterans in Mid-Michigan. The New Beginnings Veteran's Outreach Center in Flint Township is just weeks away from being fully functioning. Right now, repairs and renovations are underway to a 100-year-old house in Flint Township.

"It's a tranquil area for the veterans, so by doing this for them, it's offering them hope," said Arthur Woodson, vice president of New Beginnings Veterans Out-

When the work is done this spring, the facility will be able to house up to 10 veterans at a time. The New Beginnings Veterans Outreach center will provide transitional housing, all federally funded.

The house was a gift from the church next door, but it does need some work. Roof repairs, new bedrooms, and a wheelchair ramp are first on the list. The community has really pulled together to make it happen.








The Motorcycle Lawyer on THE LAW

This May, Be Motorcycle-Aware: **A Message for Vehicle Drivers**

Spring has finally arrived and with it, so has Motorcycle Awareness Month. I do my best to promote Motorcycle Awareness year-round, and over the last 12 months I have tried to use this article to really focus my efforts and help readers (and riders) get involved in Motorcycle Awareness and safety promotion.

In case you missed some of my previous articles, here are a few of the things I recommend you, as a motorcyclist, can do to promote Motorcycle Awareness and safety: get your CY motorcycle endorsement; take a certified rider training course to refresh your memory and learn new riding skills; join a local motorcycle club or group; join an advocacy group like ABATE in your area; get a bumper sticker, lawn sign, or other physical reminder for drivers to Watch for Motorcycles; support changes to the law that improve motorcycle safety (like Nathan's Law, which took effect this year); and finally, talk it up: tell everyone you meet to be Motorcycle-Aware, and use social media to encourage your friends and contacts to Watch for Motorcycles on the roads.

This year, I wanted to do something different. I believe that as motorcyclists, there is only so much we can do to protect ourselves from crashes on the road. After that, it's up to vehicle drivers to ensure they are watching out for us and helping us survive the ride. So, I have created a list of six tips for vehicle drivers remind them to Watch for Motorcyclists. Copy this page and share it. Post it at vour office. Send copies to your friends and family. Give the list to the parents on your kid's soccer team. Share the tips on social media. Contact me (writer@lawyerforlife.com) or connect on Facebook (facebook.com/THEmotorcyclelawyer) to request a copy of the list. Whatever it takes to get this list out to vehicle drivers and, hopefully, improve Motorcycle Awareness.

- #1: See the motorcyclist. That bike isn't riding itself! There is a human being on the back of that bike, someone with a family and people who care about them. Look for them and remember that you have a role in helping to keep them safe.
- #2: Watch for Motorcycles. Look Twice, Save a Life. Motorcycles are Everywhere. Whatever the slogan, the message is clear; look for motorcycles every time you are on the road. Check your mirrors, your blind spots, scan the horizon carefully, and once you've done all that, do it again. Remember, it's been a long, cold winter and you may not be used to seeing motorcycles on the road. That's why it's even more important to make the extra effort to watch for them. Also, listen up! Motorcycles can be loud. In addition to scanning with your eyes, turn down your radio and listen with your ears.
- #3: Approach intersections with caution. Most motorcycle-vehicle crashes happen at intersections, many because the vehicle driver tries to turn right in front of the motorcyclist. When approaching an intersection, slow down and be mindful. It can be difficult for a vehicle driver to judge a motorcycle's speed, so don't try and turn in front of the bike. Wait it out; you'd never forgive yourself if you killed a motorcyclist because you didn't want to wait a few extra seconds at an intersection.

#4: Signal your intentions and be predictable. This is just a good driving rule in general; use your signals so motorcyclists and other drivers know what you're planning to do next. Being predictable can make a huge difference in preventing crashes.

#5: Make space! Unlike a car or truck, there is no such thing as a fender-bender with a motorcycle... even the slightest contact could kill the motorcyclist. Don't risk it. Back off and help keep everyone safe. (This is a good rule to follow with other vehicles too...) Also, don't crowd a motorcyclist! We have the right to use the whole lane, just like a car or truck. Debris in the road that wouldn't affect a car or truck can be a real problem on a motorcycle, so be sure to give them plenty of room to move side-to-side within the lane to avoid obstacles.

#6: PUT YOUR PHONE AWAY. No really, put it away. Put it in the glove box. Leave it in your purse or your pocket. Turn it off in the car. Whatever it takes to make sure your hands stay on the wheel and your eyes stay on the road, watching for motorcyclists. Your distracted driving is extremely dangerous, especially to bikers. Just fading over the line a little bit, or not stopping in time because you're busy "LOLing", could cost a motorcyclist's life. It's not worth it.

Obviously, there's no way to cover everything that vehicle drivers can and should do in order to protect motorcyclists in a single list, and there are no guarantees that following this list will definitely prevent motorcyclist deaths. However, if vehicle drivers make the extra effort to be Motorcycle-Aware, and go out of their way to Watch for Motorcycles and protect bikers on the road, it's a positive change. Please, this Motorcycle Awareness Month, do your best to get the


message out: Watch for Motorcycles... you could save a life!







community for nine decades. It is the largest member-based advocacy group in the world and is dedicated to "Promote the motorcycle lifestyle and protect the future of motorcycling for generations to come." That's a pretty bold statement but one that has a generational track record of success. Without any hesitation, the AMA gives credit to the organizations from which it was born – the Federation of American Motorcyclists (FAM) and the Motorcycle and Allied Trades Association (M&ATA). The really cool historical note is the FAM began with the New York Motorcycle Club, whose members saw the need for a national organization and on September 7th, 1903 had a meeting at their clubhouse where 93 bikers got the ball rolling. Good to know some things never change. Some of the best charity runs and motorcycle events we covered this year got their start around a clubhouse table. One of the premier attendees at that first meeting was George H. Hendee of the Indian Motorcycle Company who brought 109 membership pledges from the New England area. In the original constitution the FAM

Dave Barr's military career was ended by a land mine explosion that took his legs, but that didn't stop him from completing a series of epic motorcycling journeys around the globe.

Barr has ridden around the world, across Siberian Russia in the dead of winter, and to the four farthest points of Australia. In the process, he has written books, produced documentaries, earned two Guinness World Records, and established a charity foundation.

"Wouldn't it be something to share this simple accomplishment of riding a motorcycle as a double amputee with disabled people the world over?"

DID YOU KNOW? Dave Barr was abandoned at birth in the back seat of a car in Los Angeles, Calif.

stated "Its objects shall be to encourage the use of motorcycles and to promote the general interests of motorcycling; to ascertain, defend and protect the rights of motorcyclists; to facilitate touring; to assist in the good roads movement; and to advise and assist in the regulation of motorcycle racing and other competition in which motorcycles engage." Sound familiar?

The FAM lasted 16 years and peaked at 8,247 members before WWI decimated the potential membership. While the FAM was struggling, the M&ATA was founded. Although controlled by the motorcycle industry, the M&ATA began registering clubs and supporting motorcycle activities including the Gypsy Tours. A competition Committee was founded to fill the void left when the FAM was no longer able to oversee the responsibilities. After a steady growth over the next five years the M&ATA Riders Division was named the American Motorcycle Association. Over the next several decades the M&ATA eventually merged with the West Coast Motorcycle Safety Council and in 1969 became the Motorcycle Industry Council we know today.

Upon it's founding in 1924 the slogan of the now stand alone AMA was – "An Organized Minority Can Always Defeat an Unorganized Majority." Sounds like echoes from that 1903 clubhouse table....

Ratification of the AMA was August 1, 1924 and within the month they had operated the first nationally sanctioned AMA event which was most likely the national Six Days Trial held from August 25 through 30 in Ohio, Pennsylvania and adjacent states. The 1,400-mile endurance run started and ended in Cleveland, Ohio. In 1928, the AMA moved headquarters away from the M&ATA location in Chicago to Columbus. The AMA moved around Columbus a few times and eventually settled in Pickerington, about 10 miles from the original location. Today the Headquarters building sits on a site with the incredible Hall of Fame Museum. If you have never taken a moment to head on out to Pickerington to visit the AMA Hall of Fame Museum - rework your schedule and ride on out. Whenever we are anywhere near, we make time for a quick run through. The tours change regularly and the motorcycles, gear and historical paraphernalia on display will remind you of the great history that has been bestowed upon us by the greats that carved out motorcycling as we know it today.

By 1993, AMA membership had topped 200,000. With an estimated 25 million on-and off-road motorcyclists in America, the advocacy needs of the diverse membership base was needed more than ever. Over the decades the AMA has consistently championed the rights of motorcyclists. Fighting government restrictions and access and outright bans such as the ones attempted St. Louis and Brockton, Massachusetts, no other organization has so consistently represented the interests of motorcyclists. Along with the advocacy, the sanctioning of the events has allowed American motorcycling to climb to world-class status in all types of events. From GNCC, Road Racing,



Hillclimbs and many other AMA events, riders across the country benefit from the decades of work from the dedicated folks at the AMA. At the final race of the AMA sanctioned 2014 GNCC series held in Crawfordsville, Indiana the crowds and racers each set records for attendance. Our sport and lifestyle continues to grow and with that growth the AMA's role is more vital than ever before. To get an idea of the scope – the AMA sanctions more motorsports and motorcycle recreational events than any other organization in the world. Membership benefits are huge including everything from discounts on gear, hotels, motorcycle transport, tickets to events and insurance. Members also get a monthly magazine dedicated to all national current events and news updates. Their website is also a great resource and the site header sums it up perfectly - AMA Rights. Riding. Racing.



MAMA'S SPICY BUFFALO FRIED OYSTERS

- 1 Dozen Oysters Fresh or the kind in tub at the grocery. But you MUST smell them and they should smell like the ocean and nothing else. If cooking for a party or even another couple, you'll need more than a dozen Double or triple recipe, accordingly.
- 1/2 Cup of Buttermilk
- 1/2 Cup of Cornmeal
- 1/2 Cup of All-Purpose Flour

Pinch of Cayenne

Canola or Peanut Oil for frying

- 1/4 Cup of your fave Hot Sauce (more if you want)
- 1/4 Stick of Real Butter; salted preferably
- 1/2 Cup of Crumbled Bleu' Cheese (in a tub in most larger grocery stores; in refrigerated cheese section
- 2 Tbls. of Chopped Chives

In a bowl big enough to accommodate the amount of oysters you're make ing, submerge oysters totally and let soak for one hour, stirring gently a few times.

Preheat your oil in a large pot until you put the end of a wooden spoon in and little bubbles pop up and surround the handle. It's ready for frying! In a shallow pan, combine cornmeal, flour, cayenne and salt & pepper to taste. Remove oysters from buttermilk, dredge each oyster through the cornmeal mixture and keep flipping it to cover thoroughly. Coat them all at one time and place on a separate platter. With tongs or a slotted spoon, gently lower an oyster, one at a time into hot oil. Do not overload the pan. Fry until golden brown all the way around. Remove to paper towel lined platter. If you have more than one batch to fry, place in an oven set on 200 degrees to keep hot until done frying all oysters. In a medium glass or ceramic bowl, combine hot sauce and melted butter. Toss fried oysters in hot sauce mix & again, coat thoroughly. Remove back to rinsed off platter, top with crumbled Bleu' cheese and chopped chives. Serve immediately while piping hot. always make up extra hot sauce & melted butter as an extra dipping sauce. These babies rock the house! Whether you're making a dozen or 3 dozen

* Tip Of The Month: When frying bacon, always cut your bacon in half; width wise, right in the middle. Easier to work with. And, lay out your back on a stone cold skillet and then place on the stove. This stops ends from curling and cooks more evenly.

MOTHER'S PROPER FRESH PEA SALAD

- 1 Bag of Fresh, Flash Frozen Peas; quality brand
- 1 Tub of Philadelphia Whipped Cream Cheese (not the old-fashioned block style. The new whipped kind is fabulous for cooking!)
- 1 Half a Pound of Bacon (sliced in half as in the * Tip of the Month), fry crisp and then chop up into chunky, medium pieces.
- 1 Medium sized sweet Vidalia onion; chop up into small chunks

Pour your bag of fresh, frozen peas into a medium sized glass bowl. Fry up bacon crisp, let drain on paper towel. Pour off half the fat and the rest. saute'up the onions. Use a slotted spoon and just add those directly into bowl with peas, along with bacon and Whipped Philly. Salt & Pepper to taste and I always add Parsley to everything. This is such a totally fresh side dish!

I make up a batch all the time and then just snack on it or spread it on buttery crackers. Fab!

MOMMA HOW YA' ROLL THEM FRIED ICE CREAM **BALLS?**

I worked at Chi-Chi's Mexican Restaurant in my early 20's for several years and the 1st week there learned the secret to this famous recipe.

- 1 Gallon of Premium Vanilla Ice Cream
- 3 Cups of Crushed Frosted Flakes
- 1 Tbl. of Cinnamon
- 1/4 Cup of Sugar or Splenda
- 2 Egg Whites

Canola Oil for Frying

Whipped Cream, Chocolate Sauce &/or Honey

On a parchment lined cookie sheet, scoop out big, full, rounded ice cream scoops. Place in the freezer to get good and hard for an hour. In a baking dish combine the cornflakes, sugar & cinnamon. In a separate dish, beat up egg whites until frothy. Roll each ice cream ball in egg white mix and then in cornflake mix; coating extremely thoroughly. Place back on cookie sheet and freeze for additional 2 hours.

Get a medium-sized skillet and fill 3/4 inches full of Canola oil; apprx. 375 degrees. Place one ice cream ball at a time on slotted spoon or spider until golden brown. They fry up fast! Blot on paper towel and serve up with melted chocolate sauce & whipped cream, or drizzled honey & whip cream too! Oh, baby, these are SO addictive and totally hit the spot!


















DAYTONA BIKE WEEK 2015 Ride'n the Storm Out!!







Valerie Thompson Seeks to Become Fastest Female Motorcyclist at El Mirage Dry Lake.

The "Queen of Speed", seeks to break previous motorcycle record and enter the 200 MPH Club at El Mirage.



(Scottsdale, AZ) - April 10, 2015

- Seven-time land speed record holder, Valerie Thompson, will return to El Mirage Dry Lake Bed May 16 - 17 for Southern California Timing Association's (SCTA) land speed racing event, with hopes of breaking the land speed

record in the APS-G class, and becoming the first female motorcyclist to earn a spot in the famed, "200 MPH Club".

The club is a list of racers who have to achieve two things: 1) reach or exceed 200 MPH on a run, and 2) break the existing record at the same run.

Thompson reached a personal best of 199.903 MPH at EI Mirage on a BMW S 1000 RR motorcycle. The record is 214.360 set by Ralph Hudson in 2011. Considering Thompson has achieved 200 MPH clubs in other racing events, she's poised to break the record at EI Mirage and become the first female motorcyclist in the famous land speed record list.

"Breaking the record at El Mirage is goal I've longed wanted to achieve", says Thompson, who was inspired by her aunt to set high goals and perform in a competitive society. "The fact that you have to break an existing record to get into the club makes it even tougher to get!"

Thompson set a personal best speed of 217.7 MPH at Texas Mile in 2014.

Inspiring young women to achieve their potential has become a personal effort of the "Queen of Speed". Thompson regularly donates time supporting children to overcome personal challenges with charitable organizations. She earned the "American Women Riders Community Hero Award in 2011.

"It's seeing kids achieving goals and raising the bar that inspires me to do the same at speed competitions", Valerie says about the young women she's talked to. "I always tell them that courage is the best protection they can have".



Having recently added Quicksilver Powersports Lubricants as a sponsor, and with her performance team behind her, Valerie has a full support system in place to become the first female motorcyclist in the El Mirage 200 MPH Club.

This will be her third time racing at El Mirage.

Valerie Thompson Background

Valerie is a seven-time land speed record holder and owner/driver of the Valerie Thompson Land Speed Racing Motorcycle Team who has also competed in the All Harley Drag Racing Association and National Hot Rod Association drag racing series. She set a personal best top speed of 217 mph on her BMW S 1000 RR during the October 2014 Texas Mile competition. Thompson is an official member of the BUB Speed Trials 201 MPH Club, Mojave Magnum 200 MPH Club, ECTA 200 MPH Club, Texas Mile 200 MPH Club and lifetime member of the famed Bonneville 200 MPH Club.














Tech Tips By Steve

CONFESSION AND COMPRESSION

Release will do you good!

I had a humbling experience to start the spring! Dumping a bike on dry asphalt was a first for me a few weeks ago... I have literally been run over by a car before, but this felt worse, at least to my ego! I just got a friends bike out for a ride after tuning it. I started out of my back parking lot toward the front and just as I was dodging a pot hole here comes a zooming truck in my parking lot, ok no biggie dodged a thousand vehicles however this time as I put my front binders on and got ready for the forks to dive then BAM a strange and horrifying thing happened, the front tires slapped over the left and dumped my butt over the bars and onto the ground ... GRAVEL from the pot hole was my demise. Bike did well thank God for the crash bars and I only scratched up my helmet, well until I slammed it onto the ground in a childish fit of rage, now it's ruined, but I tell you my head would have been a mess without that cranium cover! Now to get that pothole fixed and the parking lot swept, and maybe a real big speed bump too!

Ok enough of my confessions and proof I am human and make mistakes just like everyone else out there brothers and sisters! Now for some compression "release" discussion, what the heck are compression releases and why do we need them? Motorcycles have been using these since the kick start years for the on road and off road crew too and now with the big inch bikes with higher compression engines they are a must, especially if you are running a Softail or Dyna due to the battery compartment only allows for a smaller battery compared to an FLH. Now, almost all of the new Harley's are running compression releases now due to bigger engines and starter issue's. If you plan on doing a big bore kit and/or upping your compression don't forget to get your engine builder to put a set of these in. If you are riding a Harley and you want mechanical compression releases some shops have the special tool (Figure 1) to machine the hole into an assembled engine with little pain, still it's going to cost ya a few hours labor though, but it's an easy day.

How they work

When activated the compression release lets a small amount of pressure from the cylinder escape, which allows the starter to turn the engine over easier to get a good "spin" so the motor can start easier. This also puts less strain on the starter and battery, less strain equals to more life from the starter and battery. They can be activated three basic ways, manually, electronically or mechanically.

Manual Compression Release

If you take a look at Figure 2 you can see a typical push in style manual compression release, these are inexpensive and easy to use, the only downfall is sometimes the rider forgets to push them in before starting, which the bike usually reminds you of. S&S also has a manual style for their heads, but because of where they put their compression release hole on the middle of the head you have to use a pull cable system as seen in Figure 3. One more good thing about this style is, they are easy to replace when they wear out. They are easy to work, push both of the releases down, this will allow a little air out while you turn the engine over, which lessens the compression and allows the starter to turn the engine over faster, which intern makes for less strain on the starter and battery. As soon as the bike fires, the compression releases slam shut and no more compression is lost so the bike runs normal, Oh yeah, I don't recommend the aluminum top push in ones, they will burn your fingertips bad when you have a hot engine.

Electronic Compression Release

The second style of compression release is electronic. This style is hooked up to your ignition so when you turn your key on they are actuated automatically and close once the bike is started. The plus is you won't forget them. Harley is now starting to use them on many of their bikes. This style can be retrofitted on older twin cams but the heads must be removed and the wonderful tool to make this happen, is close to \$900 bills so there are fewer shops that offer this service. Harley offers the parts for 2007 and newer twin cam models, each release is about \$40 and the wiring harness is another \$60, so after the machining is done it is a simple plug and play. S&S has an electronic one for their heads too, which their 1999 and up heads come predrilled for. These are standard on the Big Dog and other bikes that come with the S&S motor, turn the key and fire that big inch bike up, but don't forget to let that beast warm up or its going to cost you money down the road. Figure 4 shows the S&S setup on a Big Dog.

Mechanical Compression Release

The last kind is the mechanical style: these have been around for a long time too. today they are used on some Ducati's and the Harley V-Rod and a few metric bikes also. They use a lobe on the camshaft to keep the exhaust valve open slightly unlit start up to release compression and ease starting; hey Harley peeps how come the V-Rod gets all the cool stuff.

ONF

Each of the two exhaust cam lobes are equipped with a spring loaded compression release lobe on the "heal" of the cam at the point where the valve would normally be fully closed.

The lobe holds the exhaust valve open slightly at cranking speed. This releases some of the compression, making the engine much easier to crank.

Once the engine starts, and rpm increases, the compression release lobe is centrifugally retracted and the engine runs normally, with full compression, and without any loss in performance. This allows a stock starter and battery to start nearly any engine.

These S&S easy start cams are cool because you can get your cam upgrade and you compression release done in one slam dunk without machining, and you don't have to wonder if your compression releases are working or not... they are each and every time you start, how cool is that!!

Out off time again, I sure pray you all are out there getting a lot of miles on your bikes. For me... not so much right now, I guess it's my job to keep some of them





MICHIGAN GUN LAW **EVOLVES**

A lot of discussion is happening around the bills that passed recently into law regarding firearms here in Michigan. The changes enacted through these bills will take effect on December 1, 2015, and are focused on the Concealed Pistol License (CPL) and the application process for obtaining one. With nearly 600,000 total CPL applications (including pending, approved, denied, revoked, etc.) across the state of Michigan, it's no surprise that some restructuring has occurred. The truth is, the bills did a wonderful job in streamlining the application process, and stating in clear language all the details necessary for CPL holders to know.

The largest change to the structure is that the bills eliminate the county gun boards. Instead, the applications will be processed strictly by the county clerks, with the state police doing all the background investigations. Some people, such as Wayne County residents, will see almost no change in how the application process works, as the Wayne County clerk has been processing those applications for years already.

The other change that will be readily apparent is in the pricing structure. The current \$105 fee will be dropped to a flat \$100 fee for new applicants, and the renewal applicant fee will see a price raise to \$115. All counties will be required to provide a laminated CPL card at no cost to the applicant, but may charge up to \$10 for a hard plastic license, only if they also offer the free option.

A change that most renewal applicants will appreciate is that, since your application is signed under oath, you will not be required to submit proof that you have trained, but your signature on the affidavit stating you have done so will be sufficient. Most CPL instructors will likely still offer the review option for students who want to stay updated on the most current legal changes, even though it will not be a re-




quirement anymore. The county clerks will still be providing the compiled firearms laws to applicants when they apply, but always be sure you stay informed on any legal changes.

A few minor changes include some additions to the information required on the certificate issued by instructors, as well as some clearly stated consequences for violating any of the provisions contained within the amended laws. While the laws regarding what is required of CPL applicants and CPL holders has not changed, it is clearly stated, and more easily understood by most people.

When one applies for their CPL, they give implied consent to submit to analysis of breath, blood, or urine, and the new phrasing gives clear direction on this. There are specific consequences for refusal to submit to such analysis, and they are outlined clearly in the new document. This is a section of the law that many people have missed over the years, and having a clearly devoted section on it is, in my opinion, a very positive improvement.

If you would like to read the document in full, simply search online for, "Public act 3 of 2015," or, "Senate Bill 34." Michigan law can also be found online by searching the Michigan Compiled Law (MCL).
