

Agent Orange C-123s may hold risk years after Vietnam

Some U.S. Air Force reservists could have been put at risk from the residue left in planes that sprayed Agent Orange during the Vietnam War, the Institute of Medicine reported. Limited testing years later make it plausible that some reservists exceeded guidelines for exposure to the toxins in the defoliant.

At issue are 24 C-123 planes that, after the military stopped spraying Agent Orange, went on to be used by Air Force reserve units for such things as medical and cargo transport. About 1,500 to 2,100 personnel trained and worked on them between 1972 and 1982. Later, some reservists blamed cancer and other illnesses on residues left in the planes, but they were denied disability claims if they did not serve in Vietnam.

Examined were the results of some air and surface tests taken for dioxin and herbicides in the planes between 1979 and 2009. The report stressed that there's little data, and little information about the reservists' activities on the planes.

But because chemical residues were found on interior surfaces, the reservists had some exposure, the committee decided, rejecting assertions that the dried material couldn't have spread.

Pentagon sets up new POW-MIA office

The Pentagon took initial steps to set up a new agency that will direct the troubled effort to search for America's missing war dead, two years after an internal report found the current program was mismanaged and wasteful. Defense officials said that in the coming months they will merge two existing agencies into one POW-MIA office that will be more streamlined and effective. The new organization will be up and running early next year.

The decision comes in Defense Secretary Chuck Hagel's final weeks on the job. Last March, after a long study, Hagel announced he would create a new office to deal with POW-MIA issues that would have more focused authority and innovative approaches.

Hagel's plan combines the functions of the two leading agencies in this field -- the Joint POW-MIA Accounting Command, based in Hawaii, and the Defense POW-MIA Office, based in the Pentagon. Those two organizations will disappear, and the new agency will be based in Washington for now.

Officials had no details on what changes they may make, although they expect there will be a greater effort to reach out to private groups and universities to help with the search for and identification of American war remains that are scattered around the world. Combining the offices and staff will likely bring cost savings and other efficiencies, but it was not clear whether staff would be cut.

The Pentagon also has not yet named the new agency, preferring to let families and veterans groups participate in that decision.

Congress in 2009 set a requirement that the Pentagon identify at least 200 sets of remains a year by 2015 — a number it has not come close to achieving in recent years. Officials have said that the 200 figure is attainable with a budget of about \$100 million a year, which is about the current level. In 2013, there were 60 sets

of remains identified. The head of the Joint POW-MIA Accounting Command, Maj. Gen. Kelly McKeague, told Congress that a realistic goal would be to identify 125 remains per year by 2018.

Opiates handed out like candy to 'doped-up' veterans at Wisconsin VA

Doctors at the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs medical center in Tomah hand out so many narcotic painkillers that some veterans have taken to calling the place "Candy Land." They call the hospital's chief of staff, psychiatrist David Houlihan, the "Candy Man."

Current and former hospital staff members describe patients who show up to appointments stoned on painkillers and muscle relaxants, doze off and drool during therapy sessions, and burn themselves with cigarettes. They told The Center for Investigative Reporting that Houlihan himself "doped up" or "zombified" their patients and that workers who raised questions have been punished.

The problem at this rural medical center underscore the difficulty the VA is having maintaining standards of quality patient care. The exponential growth in the use of narcotics transformed the Tomah VA from a conservative prescriber of pain-killers to one typical of runaway opiate prescription practices throughout the VA health care system.

During the same period, the number of pills handed out skyrocketed. In 2004, the Tomah VA dispensed about 50,000 oxycodone pills to roughly 25,000 veterans. By 2012, that number had grown to 712,000, the data shows.

Independent experts who reviewed CIR's findings said it was disturbing that the top prescriber of painkillers was a psychiatrist, charged with treating mental, rather than physical, ailments.





The Motorcycle Lawyer on THE LAW Making the Most of the Off-Season

Welcome to the deep freeze, the worst time of year for Michigan motorcycle enthusiasts. Most of our bikes are safely tucked away for the winter, and we're left dreaming of the first day back on the road.

I recently asked our social media followers to tell me what they do to beat the winter blahs. Of course, a few people suggested leaving Michigan for a warmer climate over the winter months; not a viable option for most of us. Some people had some interesting suggestions for how to make the most of the off-season, and I thought I would share them with you.

Some readers suggested taking a safety course. Many of the practical courses, like those offered by the Motorcycle Safety Foundation, won't start up again until spring, but registering early should guarantee you a spot once they get rolling. There are also some indoor options: for example, you could take the Bystander Assistance Course offered by Accident Scene Management, Inc. (ASM). This course teaches motorcyclists what to do if someone goes down in a crash, including basic First Aid, how to properly lift a motorcycle off an injured biker, how to manage a crash scene, and other potentially life-saving skills. While our office does not have any affiliation or partnership with Accident Scene Management, Inc., I do provide space for the Bystander Assistance Course in our Southfield headquarters several times a year. I also assisted our very own Marketing Specialist, Debbie Parinello, to become a certified EMT so that she can teach the ASM courses. If you are interested in taking the Bystander Assistance Course offered by Accident Scene Management, Inc., contact Debbie by calling our office.

Other readers use the off-season to tune-up or even upgrade their rides. Many of our readers like to do their own tinkering, and winter gives them all the time they need to get their bikes into tip-top shape for spring. Of course, not everyone is handy, and many rely on licensed professionals to get their bikes tuned, upgraded, and customized to their liking. One follower talked about getting a custom paint job done during the off-season; another, about adding "everything chrome". One reader suggested taking some time to learn how to work on her own bike. What a great idea! Even just learning the basics would be a valuable investment for any motorcyclist. If you're not ready to do the work, you can certainly do some research. Anything you can think of doing to a bike, you can find a forum and discussion about it online. YouTube and Pinterest are chock full of ideas, inspiration, tutorials, and how-to's. There are also planning tools and apps you can download to plan, save for, and get started on just about any motorcycle project or purchase for

Speaking of purchases, the off-season is a great time to take a look at your motorcycle insurance policy. Do you have the right coverage for your bike? Do you have enough coverage? What about special riders for custom work? In case you missed back in the fall, I always advise people to keep their motorcycles fully covered with comprehensive, and collision, and bodily injury coverage year-round. Why?

First, because your homeowner's policy doesn't cover your bike! If something happens, like a flood, a fire, a tree falling on your garage, or even a break-in, and you've cancelled your comprehensive coverage, your damage or loss will not be covered. Second, if you cancel your collision coverage but end up taking your bike out for a "quick ride" and something happens, you're going to be stuck paying the full cost of the damage. Finally, you're legally required to have bodily injury coverage to ride on the road. If you cancel it and take your bike out, you could end up in a mess of trouble; doesn't seem worth it to me. Take some time this off-season to research your insurance requirements and make sure your policy is the best one for you; if you have questions, talk to an insurance professional.

Finally, one of our readers suggested getting involved in a local motorcycle club during the off season. Certain motorcycle clubs have a bad reputation, but for the most part, clubs are made up of likeminded people who share a passion for the open road. Most clubs hold events year-round, and many of these are geared towards fundraising for local charities. Joining a club is a great way to meet fellow bikers and really "give back" to the community. Motorcycle clubs also do a lot to promote motorcycle awareness and safety campaigns, which are extremely important for all riders; I encourage everyone to get involved and spread the word that "motorcycles are everywhere", whether they're part of a motorcycle club or not.

Even though this is a tough time of year for motorcyclists in Michigan, the good news is the cold won't last forever, and the riding season will be here before we know it. Take advantage of the off-season to brush up on your skills, upgrade your ride, overhaul your

insurance policy, or get involved in a motorcycle awareness campaign in your area.
