# IN THE SHOP WITH RON

# A Little NEW For The (Not So) OLD

Hope everyone is having a chance to enjoy this beautiful late fall weather we're having, Michigan eh! I would also like to wish everyone and their families a safe and happy holiday season.

In the shop this month we're going to do a turn signal upgrade on a 1984 Harley FLHT. Some of the early Harley's did not have self-canceling turn signals; meaning if you wanted the turn signals to flash you had to hold the switch in, let go of the switch and the turn signal stops flashing. It's easy to see how this could be considered uncomfortable at the very least and in some circumstances, quite possibly dangerous. Having to operate the front brake or throttle while trying to turn right or downshifting while trying to turn left, or turn signal stops flashing and oncoming traffic mistakenly thinks you're not going to turn. Clearly, self-canceling turn signals are, if nothing else, more convenient and less distractive.

There are several aftermarket modules available to convert non-canceling turn signals to self-canceling. The one we chose for this project is made by Signal Dynamics. It was very affordable, not extremely difficult to install, with basic tools and basic knowledge of electrical circuits, had just what features we were looking for, 3 different self-canceling modes, and 4-way/ hazard flashers. It could probably be accomplished without doing so, but to make it a little easier, I decided to go ahead and remove the fairing. It makes it much easier to remove the instrument cluster, also splicing the wires.



This particular motorcycle had two flasher units (1 for turn signal, 1 for 4-way/hazards), a toggle switch to operate the 4-ways and the usual right and left handle bar switches for the turn signals. The upgraded module will replace all, except we will use the original handle bar turn signal switches. The new module requires a 12 volt DC power and a ground. By removing the old flasher units, and toggle switch for the 4-ways, it made wiring a breeze. To correctly install new module, you will need to locate the wire from the right handle bar turn signal switch, the wire from the left handle bar turn signal switch, also the wire that feeds the right front and rear turn signal lamp and the wire that feeds the left front and rear turn signal lamp. A service manual specific to the motorcycle that you are working on is invaluable here.

The wiring diagram is spot on in the one I used (Clymer) right down to the color coding. The product we used had very easy to follow instructions, a total of only 6 wires to connect. Very briefly, 12 volt DC power to module, I chose a power supply that required the ignition switch to be on. A ground, several good ground locations inside the instrument panel housing. From right and left handle bar switches, to correct wires on module. From correct wires on module to right front and rear turn signal and left front and rear turn signal. Use your service manual, check, double check and re-check to make sure you have identified the correct wires on the motorcycle.

I like to hook everything up temporarily and test for full function before making final connections. Be careful with temporary connections, make sure they don't short out against each other or a ground. For final connections I like to use butt connectors with shrink tube attached these also have a sealing compound to help fight corrosion.



As you can see in this picture (black wire from module) after shrinking the butt connector. I like to use another section of shrink tube (black) over the entire connection just to be safe. The module also comes with a self-adhesive backing and can be easily attached to the inside of the instrument panel housing. Reinstall dash and fairing and you're back on the road. In my opinion, safer and less distracted





color plasma rods to handle the run, stop, and turn functions of the tail lights. We



We started off with a brand new stock '14 Harley Street Glide, and stripped it down to frame and engine. Then we modified the neck and trees with a Misfit Industries rake kit, to accommodate the new 26 inch front wheel. Arlen Ness smooth legs and big brake caliper finished off the clean look up front. Next, we installed a custom Hot Rods and Handlebars stretched tank and dash kit, to keep with the smooth flowing lines, which leads us into the seat. The huge stock seat wasn't



#### Veteran's treatment court to start in Kalamazoo County in 2017

A veteran's treatment will start in Kalamazoo County next year.

The specialized court — meant to handle criminal cases involving military veterans and to help them address issues that may have led them into the justice system — will start in March 2017, Kalamazoo County Circuit Court Judge Pamela Lightvoet said.

Lightvoet said the court will start with five veterans using a \$35,000 grant the county received, and plans to expand the program as more funding becomes available. She said the fully funded program would cost \$80,000 to \$85,000. Officials involved plan to apply for more grants and reach out to the community for more funding once the program starts. "This has been a long process planning this program," Lightvoet said.

It is a means to help veterans who face criminal penalties as they deal with issues related to military service such as Post Traumatic Stress Disorder, drug or alcohol dependence, or brain injuries suffered in the line of duty.

Kalamazoo County Prosecutor Jeff Getting has said the program would offer veterans access to services including mentoring, mental health treatment and substance abuse treatment. "This treatment and support can help veterans avoid incarceration and save taxpayers substantial resources".

Lightvoet said a key factor of the courts is having veterans in the community serve as mentors, Local U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs staff will be involved to make sure veterans are able to get services that are available through the VA, Lightvoet said.

Lightvoet said she knows of two or three cases just in her court that could qualify for the veteran's treatment court in Kalamazoo County. She said participation length in the court is similar to other courts, and would last around 18 months at a minimum.

### Gov. Snyder signs bill requiring frequent reports on veteran's

The conditions at Michigan's two veterans' homes will be evaluated more frequently thanks to new legislation signed by Gov. Rick Snyder. On Wednesday, Oct. 26, Snyder signed a bill requiring guarterly reports that highlight staffing levels, patient complaints. and average response time to complaints, timeliness of medication distribution, and the number of recent resident deaths at the Grand Rapids Home for Veterans and the D.J. Jacobetti Home for Veterans in Marguette. "Our state's veterans deserve the highest standards of care available, and this bill helps ensure that the conditions of veterans' homes are evaluated and reported on more consistently and effectively." Snyder said in a press release.

Reports were previously submitted separately and with varying deadlines. This legislation, which comes after a stinging report of the Grand Rapids Home for Veterans earlier this year, makes those reports uniform.

The February audit of the Grand Rapids home by the Michigan Auditor General chronicled improper patient care, false claims by staff on checks of patients, and failures to investigate allegations of abuse and neglect. Inadequate staffing levels and patient complaints not being forwarded to the director of nursing were also documented in the report.

Reports evaluating the state's veterans housing will be due Jan. 1, April 1, July 1 and Oct. 1 of each year. The bill requires reports be sent from the Michigan Veterans Affairs Agency, its successor agency, or the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs, to Snyder, the Senate and House Committees on Veterans Affairs, and the Senate and House Appropriations subcommittees.

## Korean War veteran laid to rest more than 60 years after he went

After Private First Class Milton Bullis went missing in action in North Korea more than 50 years ago, it was a part of his brother that helped bring him home. A memorial service was held October at Great Lakes National Cemetery for the Detroit native that was taken as a prisoner of war amid the Korea War while serving as a medic during the conflict.

It wasn't until Donald L. Bullis Sr.'s DNA was used by a recovery team in the mid-2000s that his brother's remains were found

Milton Bullis was a member of the Medical Company, 9th Infantry Regiment, and 2nd Infantry Division when he was sent to Korea in November 1950, after North Korea invaded South Korea in June

Chuck Erickson, Milton's nephew, had a chance to meet a few soldiers at the service that told him his uncle saved three Native American soldiers on the battlefield. "He was already a hero," Erickson said. Now, he's a superhero."

The company lost nearly half of its men days into a delaying action headed south to Kunu-ri and when ordered to withdraw. Milton Bullis was not found. He was declared missing in action on Dec. 1. 1950.






# The Motorcycle Lawyer on THE LAW FINDING NEW ROADS: HIGHLIGHTS FROM 2016 AND A LOOK AT THE ROAD AHEAD

This is it... the last article of 2016. One last chance to talk about motorcycling in Michigan before a new year is upon us. This time of year always brings mixed emotions with it; it's a time of celebration, of taking stock, of setting goals, and reminiscing about the year that is winding down right before our eyes. With that in mind, here are three of 2016's highlights for my team and I, and a final reminder about how important it is to get involved in promoting motorcycle awareness.

**Highlight #1:** Winning the "unwinnable" case. Back in May, I wrote about our trial victory on a case many attorneys said was "unwinnable". My client was riding his motorcycle when a minivan driver, who seemed to be stopped in the lane ahead of him, suddenly attempted to turn around without looking. The motorcyclist was badly injured when the minivan slammed into him, yet the negligent driver hired a four-attorney defense team and tried to argue that my client was more than 50% at fault for the crash. If they had won, the defense would not have been required to pay non-economic damages; these cover long-term effects of the crash, like scarring and disfigurement, loss of enjoyment of life, and pain and suffering.

Their argument was that my client was negligent, mostly because he was not wearing a helmet. I filed a motion to block this argument, but it was denied. So, I explained to the judge and jury that my client met all the legal requirements for riding without a helmet: he was over 21 years old, had his CY endorsement, was riding a registered and insured motorcycle, and was carrying the required \$20K in additional medical coverage. Then I asked them a question: how could the defense claim that my client was negligent when he went to such great efforts to ensure he was riding legally? Then I pointed out that, even if my client had been wearing a helmet, it wouldn't have prevented the crash or most of his injuries; however, if the driver had been Motorcycle-Aware and done a shoulder, mirror, and blind spot check, the crash may not have happened at all. While this was a major win for my client and my team, it highlighted how much work still needs to be done, both to get drivers to be more Motorcycle Aware, and to get people to recognize that riding without a helmet is not negligent in and of itself.

Highlight #2: Making the list(s). My team and I are proud of the work we do, because it means we get to help injured motorcyclists and their families. Earlier this fall, I learned that I had once again been nominated to the Super Lawyers list. Briefly, Super Lawyers rates attorneys across the nation in over 70 areas of practice. Attorneys must have attained a high level of professional achievement and be widely recognized by their peers to be nominated; only about five percent of lawyers in each state get nominated. Then, I found out I had also been named to the Best Lawyers® list. As per their website, Best Lawyers® has become the "definitive guide to legal excellence." It is a tremendous honor to be named to both of these lists, and I am humbled and grateful to have the opportunity to do what I do.

Recently, I was pleased to learn of yet another accolade: my team and I have been included once again on the Best Law Firms list! To be included on the Best Law firms list, a firm must be "recognized for professional excellence" and receive "persistently impressive ratings from clients and peers". My team consistently goes above and beyond in order to ensure that our clients and their families are well-informed and cared for at every step of the legal process. **Highlight #3:** Finding new roads. If you visit my website (MotorcycleLawyerMichigan.com), I also have blog posts and other pages dedicated to "great rides" across the USA, all submitted by readers and fans over the years.

What's great about my job and the motorcycle community I serve is I get to meet a lot of like-minded people who love to ride. I get to learn from their experiences, and I get to share these experiences with others. "Finding new roads" isn't just about finding the best rides in America, it's also about finding the best information, tips, strategies, and more to share and help make the community stronger.

It's always a little bittersweet to look back on the year that has passed. On the one hand, my team and I have much to celebrate this year; we worked so hard and helped so many injured motorcyclists and their families, and we are very proud of what we have accomplished. But on the other hand, our phones keep ringing, because motorcyclists are still being injured every single day by negligent vehicle drivers. So, while we do want to celebrate the victories, they make up only part of the story. The other part is that there is so much more work to do in promoting motorcycle awareness and safety, and that responsibility belongs to all of Michigan's motorcyclists.

For the last time in 2016, I am asking all readers to get involved in spreading the word that "Motorcycles are Everywhere." As I suggested in my June article, get engaged: join up with a local motorcycle club or advocacy group, and post often about motorcycle awareness on social media. If you LIKE our Facebook page (Facebook.com/TheMotorcycleLawyer), you'll have access to shareable motorcycle awareness posters and information, as well as all kinds of other motorcycle content. Become a part of the growing community on social media whose goal is to minimize or eliminate motorcycle crashes, injuries, and deaths. At the very least, send an email to reception@lawyerforlife.com to get a free bumper sticker, so you can remind other drivers year-round to Watch for Motorcycles.

Ouestions come into our minds As we go through our lives; How best to gain peace within And avoid the world's strife?


The purpose of the Universe Occurs to me sometimes; What should I strive for now? How best to spend my time?

And the budget thing, I never liked big name motels and some of the best travel meals were cold cuts for sandwiches and sodas from a cooler in the trunk. Yeah, it wasn't fancy, but it sure made for some fun and interesting times! Here is something you need to think about; a few years ago I lost my son long before his time and have since lived with a lion's share of regrets, but offsetting those regrets are fond memories especially of some of the places we went and things we did.

We have done Disney and the plastic fantastic make believe vacation destinations that eventually start to feel as hollow as they leave your wallet on the way out the gate. We live in a nation that God has blessed with natural wonders beyond compare. Words and pictures are fine, but they will never be the same as witnessing with all of our senses actual places and events paragraphs and photographs can never adequately describe. Have you ever seen sunrise at Monument Valley, I have and to be honest I don't have the vocabulary to express its majesty.



Countless breathtaking wonders, both natural and man-made, and truly American events are there for us that none of the fantasy themed venues will ever be able to hold a candle to in comparison. Man-made, try Washington DC with its monuments and museums, but don't leave without witnessing the solemn dedication to honor and duty of the guards at the Tomb of the Unknowns, of the pomp and ceremony of a dress parade at the Marine Barracks. This destination is an easy 4-5 day getaway with plenty of time left to make a slight detour to see Gettysburg, the site of the most decisive battle of the Civil War. Other east of the Mississippi destinations can be as close as northern Kentucky and the birthplace of Abraham Lincoln, the Steven Foster mansion, and Mammoth Cave National Park. Move your travel range out as far as New Orleans and in between you find places

like Nashville (home of country music), Memphis (home of the blues) Chattanooga (Rock City's seven state vista and civil war battlefield), Charleston (colonial slave market and museum), Gatlinburg and the Great Smokey Mountain National Park and Cherokee Reservation, and the notorious Andersonville civil war prisoner camp. With a little planning and the help of Map Quest any of these destinations and hundreds more can be seen in a week or less.



Headed west? Sturgis is a two day drive and the gateway to the Black Hills, Deadwood, and Mount Rushmore; add one more day west and you find yourself in Cody Wyoming. Cody, the home of the Buffalo Bill Museum, the Cody stampede (nightly rodeo in June and July) is a place where it is not uncommon to find elk and mule deer wandering around town or a buffalo wandering beside the highway. A couple of hours north of Cody is the Little Bighorn, and just an hour west is the first jewel of national park system, Yellowstone. For those of you who have never been there, she is an alluring temptress who will seduce you with her wiles, captivate you with her beauty, and break your heart when you have to leave and then call to you in the wind.

Within a full day's drive south of Yellowstone are four more enchanting national parks with Monument Valley, spiritual center of the Navajo people, sitting on the Utah/Arizona border and Grand Canyon a half day further west. These destinations are may require more time and money, but the rewards are certainly worth it. Speaking of costs; a Disney ticket is about \$100 per day per person while national park passes are a fraction of that, but when was the last time anybody ever had to stop and in the Magic Kingdom to let the wild horses cross the road?
