

Attorney general investigates Grand Rapids veterans home

Michigan's attorney general says his office is investigating allegations of mistreatment at a state-run nursing home for veterans and is encouraging potential victims or witnesses to come forward. Bill Schuette confirmed that his office's Health Care Fraud Division started the investigation in February after an audit uncovered problems at the Grand Rapids Home for Veterans.

The audit said workers falsely claimed they were checking on patients, failed to properly investigate allegations of abuse and neglect, and took too long to fill prescriptions. Auditors also said the 415-resident facility provided insufficient care and had inadequate staffing levels.

Veterans Affairs Agency Director James Redford took over after the audit and promised improvements. He said things are moving in the "right direction" but staffing levels still need to be boosted.

Veterans, homeless move into \$6M Detroit housing

More than two dozen veterans, homeless individuals and people with disabilities have moved into a Detroit apartment building offering low-income rent and support services.

The building was renovated as part of a \$6.1 million project led by a local developer and Detroit Central City Community Mental Health.

Mayor Mike Duggan worked to shut down and seize the old property in 2003 when he was working as Wayne County prosecutor. The Detroit Free Press reports that he will tour the newly renovated apartments and meet with residents. The building opened to its 27 tenants in mid-March.

Veteran receives help with home repairs

A veteran in desperate need of home repairs is getting the help of some very generous volunteers. The Home Depot Foundation is giving the veteran a new ramp, ceiling, landscaping and minor fixes.

"This is the most amazing thing that I've ever had happen in my life," said John Banning, disabled veteran. He served his country for 11 years, but recently he has been down on his luck and hasn't had the money for much needed repairs on his Saginaw home. "Wheelchair ramp has needed repairs for probably 10 years now. My wife lost her job and financials just ain't what they used to be and I didn't have the funds to buy new stuff," Banning said.

The Home Depot and United Way teamed up to fix Banning's home. Volunteers said it's an honor to give him a helping hand. "It's great to be able to come out and help somebody out who is in need and for us to be able to work in this community, and other communities to be able to come out to make that difference is incredible," said Judy Custer, with the Home Depot Foundation.

Banning said he's extremely grateful for their kindness. "These people are fantastic, really really great people and I appreciate it so much," Banning said.

Veteran's World War II uniform discovered in attic, returned to widow

A homeowner in Arizona made a surprising discovery just before he renovated his house -- inside the attic was a bag holding a pristine-looking World War II uniform,

the buttons still shining. The man knew he had to track down the veteran's family. The soldier's name -- Thomas Wilson, Jr. -- was printed on the green bag. It also contained magazines from the era, Dutch wooden shoes, a photo and an old checkbook. Wilson died in 2012. Family members reportedly sold the home in Arcadia the next year, but in the complicated moving process, they left the bag behind.

It took a little time, but the unnamed homeowner and his realtor tracked down Wilson's surviving relatives, including his 96-year-old widow. "Big surprise... I knew what they were, but it had been so long since I had seen anything like that," the soldier's wife. Delma, responded.

Relatives say Wilson managed a team of black soldiers who drove ambulances rushing the wounded to hospitals. They said he wrote a memoir so future generations would know his story.

The veteran's family had owned the home for more than 50 years before selling it. "We were a little astounded to realize we had left something very important in that attic." his daughter. Leah Morse, said.

Couple buys Purple Heart at Goodwill for \$4.99, sends to hero's family

A husband and wife in Arizona spotted a deal when they uncovered a Purple Heart with a \$4.99 price tag at a Goodwill store, and had a duty to find the real hero who received the medal.

Hardy posted a photo on Facebook and the post made its way to a group called Veteran Buddy Finder. Eventually their search led them to the World War II veteran Eual H. Whiteman's former sister-in-law Phyllis Lawson in Missouri.

"She wanted to repay me the \$4.99!" Hardy told a news station describing their phone call. "I said 'no, this is my good deed for the day."





The Motorcycle Lawyer on THE LAW WOMEN'S MOTORCYCLE MONTH: FIVE FACTS ABOUT FEMALE MOTORCYCLISTS

July is Women's Motorcycle Month... or is it May? It depends on who you ask. Several years ago, a coalition of organizations including the Motorcycle Hall of Fame declared July to be Women's Motorcycle Month, but the movement never really caught on. In 2009, Harley Davidson decided that May should be Women's Motorcycle Month, and began planning events around the world to celebrate women riders. The problem is, May is already Motorcycle Awareness Month around the globe, and many advocacy groups and riding clubs believe that women motorcyclists should be acknowledged and celebrated during their own special time. And so here we are today, divided.

Ultimately, having two different Women's Motorcycle Months is confusing, and has diluted the celebration of women riders. So, as part of our efforts to promote motorcycle awareness year-round, my team and I want to revive July as Women's Motorcycle Month, and acknowledge women riders everywhere. Here are some facts you may not have known about female motorcyclists.

FACT: We sent our Marketing Director, Debbie Parinello, to take part in this year's International Female Ride Day (IFRD) on May 7, 2016, and it was an amazing event! This was the 10th International Female Ride Day, organized by well-known Canadian motorcycle enthusiast Vicki Gray, founder of Motoress.com. Gray established IFRD in order to bring together women riders around the world and encourage them to be role models for women in motorcycling, while at the same time promoting motorcycle awareness and safety. Female Motorcyclists from around the world took part in this great event. You can see our pictures at Facebook.com/TheMotorcycleLawyer, or at MotorcycleLawyerMichigan.com.

FACT: Motorcycle ownership by women continues to climb. According to the latest Motorcycle Industry Council (MIC) owners' survey, about 14% of motorcycle owners are now women. That might not seem like a huge number, but consider this: in 1998, only about 8% of motorcycle owners were women. That means ownership among female motorcyclists has almost doubled in less than twenty years! Younger women are buying motorcycles at an even higher rate than the so-called "baby boom" generation: Among "Gen-Y" owners (18-35), women make up almost 18% of motorcycle owners; in the "Gen-X" group (36-50), women account for about 17% of owners; and among the "Baby boomers" (51+), women make up 9% of motorcycle owners. If those numbers still seem low compared to what you're seeing on the roads, keep in mind that's the number of owners, not riders; in fact, women make up about a quarter (25%) of motorcyclists on the road today.

FACT: Female riders tend to be safety-conscious. The MIC survey data shows that 60% or more of women motorcyclists took a certified motorcycle safety course, compared to only 42% of their male counterparts. In some states, the survey found that women make up 30% or more of the motorcycle safety student population. Women motorcyclists were also killed in crashes significantly less often than male riders, according to a survey by the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety (IIHS), though it depends on which seat they were on at the time of the crash. Sadly, 8% of motorcycle drivers killed in 2014 were women, while the other 92% were men. However, women made up over 93% of motorcycle passengers killed in crashes in 2014. Overall, two-thirds (66%) of women killed in motorcycle crashes that year were passengers. Female riders are also more likely than male riders to wear a helmet: according to a study by Wayne State University, almost 60% of women observed riding motorcycles in Michigan wore helmets, compared to 55% of male riders. There are two important things to keep in mind when looking at these sobering statistics: first, there is no proven link between taking

a motorcycle safety training course and avoiding or surviving a motorcycle crash. Second, male riders are statistically more likely to be injured or killed in a motorcycle crash because there are simply more of them; remember, 75% of motorcyclists are male.

FACT: Women want their bikes big and new. According to the MIC survey, 34% of women prefer cruisers over sport bikes (just 10% of women surveyed rode sport bikes). Women preferred buying new (57%) over used (43%). While the MIC survey doesn't give a reason for this preference, my assumption would be that women are buying new bikes because more and more manufacturers are designing motorcycles specifically for women. Generally speaking, women are shorter and lighter than men, so it would make sense for them to want a motorcycle designed to be more manageable (relatively) for their size.

FACT: Nearly half (49%) of women motorcyclists are married, according to the MIC study, and 50% of women interviewed in a Harley-Davidson commissioned study by Kelton rate themselves "extremely satisfied" with their relationship. This could be because more than half (53%) of women riders surveyed for the Harley-Davidson study say their motorcycle is a "key source" of their happiness, and almost three-quarters (74%) believe their lives have improved since they started riding. What I hear from women riders over and over again is that they ride because it makes them happy; this is reflected in countless research studies and polls about women motorcyclists. This shouldn't be a surprise... Most of the male riders I have spoken to over the years say the same thing: riding a motorcycle makes us happy.

Let's settle the debate once and for all: July is Women's Motorcycle Month, so take a minute to celebrate the women-riders in your life. While you're at it, take another minute to remind your family, friends, and co-workers to be motorcycle-aware, and to watch out for motorcyclists (female and male) when they drive.

This 4th of July, I encourage all my brothers and sisters to remember from


where we have fallen, turn back to God and watch Him bring the healing, liberty and freedom that we ALL want.

IN THE SHOP WITH RON

SO MANY OPTIONS... Part I

Part II continued in next month's issue

Hey everybody, great to have you back in the shop, we have a lot of information to cover this month. So we're going to get right to it.


Last month we did a cam chain tensioner inspection on a 2004 Twin Cam 88 and determined replacement was necessary. Just like any repair or upgrade there are many options to consider, which I will try to briefly

Option 1 would be to replace the mechanical cam chain tensioners with the same O.E. (original equipment) style tensioners. There's no question that this is the least expensive way to go, but depending on your riding style and conditioner you may want to consider other options. I want to be clear the O.E. style mechanical cam chain tensioners work well and if you don't ride hard (not heavy on the throttle, dumping the clutch at every stoplight) and keep your oil changed with good quality oil, you can expect 20,000 to 40,000 miles out of a O.E. style set of tensioners. Something else to consider is a normal air temperature when you ride. The T/C 88 is an air cooled motor, the hotter the air temperature, the hotter the motor temperature, the hotter the motor temperature more wear is incurred. {>air temp=>motor temp=>wear factor} So it's very important to carefully consider your personal riding style and conditions before making any decision on any type of upgrade.

Option 2 would be to upgrade to gear driven cams. This is normally the next in line as far as expense is considered. This option allows you to get rid of the cam chain tensioner, but you have to replace the cams and bearings, etc. If you consider a cam upgrade, this might be the way you want to go. The increase in noise on the cam side of the motor. The noise can be as subtle as a mild whirring or whining sound to a metallic clattering sound. The most important factor to consider with this option is the crank shaft. Another weak spot in the Harley motor (my opinion but shared by many others). Harley crankshafts are 2 pieces pressed together and held in place by a steel pin. Over time the flywheels can move out of sync with each other which will cause runout on the end of the crankshaft.



Excessive runout on the cam side of the crank shaft will cause mayor issues with gear driven cams. Runout is when the crank shaft is rotating in a circular motion; the end of the crank shaft actually has some up and down movement.



Although this movement is not visible to the naked eye, when you have gears that mesh together, any up and down movement of the crank will affect the gears and how they mesh together. Too much runout and something is going to give. To briefly explain runout, think in terms of your going to play a game of pool with a friend. You grab a cue and can roll it across the top of the pool table and the tip of the cue moves up and down off the surface of the down side to this option is; there will be a noticeable table. That's runout loosely defined. The procedure to overcome this issue is quite costly. It requires the motor be removed from the motorcycle, completely disassembled and the lower end sent to a machine shop where they can true the crankshaft and weld the pin so the flywheels can't move out of sync with each other. Than the crankshaft is shaved to remove excess weight and balanced. There is also extensive machining required on the lower cases. Unless you have or are planning on doing extensive lower end upgrades, I wouldn't recommend this option.

Another option is to upgrade to a Hi Flow Oil Pump and Hydraulic chain tensioner. In 2006, Harley started using hydraulic cam chain tensioners in the T/C motor. Although this is probably a bit more expensive than the other options described, this is the option I prefer. What makes this option more expensive is the need to replace cam support plate, oil pump and the tensioners. Since the outer cam bearings are press fit into the cam support place, reusing them would make little to no sense to me. So it's a good idea to replace outer bearings and if you're going to replace outer bearings, you might as well replace inner bearings also. Which brings into question the cam gears and chains. I don't feel it absolutely necessary to replace the gears and chains but if budget will allow, it's probably a good idea.

If that's not enough to consider, one other area that needs to be addressed (no matter which of these 3 options chosen) is the pushrods. The pushrod is basically the link between the cam chest and the rocker box and needs to be removed in order to service the cam assembly. There are two ways to accomplish this. Harley's come from the factory with a one piece non-adjustable pushrod. If you plan on reusing the original pushrods you have to remove the gas tank, remove the rocker boxes and then you can remove the pushrods. Another option is to carefully cut the original one piece pushrod with bolt cutters and replace with aftermarket adjustable pushrods. This is probably the most common option. It allows you to leave the gas tank and rocker box intact. There is the cost of new pushrods to consider.

Having said all of that, for this project, we decided after considering all factors to go with the third option described. Upgrade to hydraulic cam chain tensioners. We're also going to replace inner and outer bearings, inner and outer cam chains and outer cam & crank shaft sprocket.







You can now purchase pre-marinated baby-back ribs at your local big chain grocery (yes; Wally World) and they have the perfect seasoning blend, marinated (lots of slurping sauce) and then vacuum packed. Hello! You cook in oven for 2 hours and then throw them on the grill. Totally qualifies for a K.I.S.S. endorsement. And the best part....they come in Kansas City style, Cajun style, North Carolina style, Texas style. We've had these like (4) times now and turn out perfect every single time. Ya' gotta' try them!

E-Z MUFFIN TIN EGGS BENEDICT W/ E-Z-EST HOLLANDAISE SAUCE

(Patricia Heaton's recipe from The Chew; slightly revised)

1 Tube of Buttermilk Grands

6 Slices of Applewood Maple Bacon; rough chop

12 Cage Free Eggs; room temperature

Nonstick cooking spray

Salt & Pepper to Taste

HOLLANDAISE SAUCE:

3 Large Egg Yolks

3 tsps. White Vinegar

1-1/2 Pinch of Cayenne Pepper

2 Sticks of Unsalted Real Butter; melted

Salt & Pepper to taste

1 Rounded tsp. of Chives

Get oven preheated to 350 degrees.

Spray a 12 cup nonstick muffin tin very generously w/nonstick spray. Cut each Grand biscuit in half horizontally, and then press it out thin (use rolling pin or if don't have one use a glass) until it's an apprx. a 5-6 inch circle. Press each circle firmly in the bottom and going up the sides of each muffin cup. Divide the bacon evenly among all the muffin cups.

Top each w/ an egg and sprinkle w/ salt & pepper. Bake until the eggs are just set; apprx. 15-20 mins. For the Hollandaise Sauce; In a blender, add the yolks, vinegar & cayenne. Pulse a few times to

blend. With the blender running, gradually add the melted butter to make a smooth, creamy sauce. If the sauce seems too thick, add a tsp. of warm water to loosen. Be sure and season w/ your salt & pepper. Run a thin knife around the edge of each muffin cup & gently pop out of muffin tin to plate up. Serve piping hot, topped w/ Hollandaise sauce & sprinkled chives. These are so simple and taste amazing.

* BACON TIP: Take your pound of bacon and cut it straight down the middle in half. It makes it so much easier to work with and you actually end up being able to fit more into a skillet.

COOL, CREAMY CUCUMBER SALAD

* Perfect side-dish for any grilled meat.

4 Ozs. Sour Cream

1 Tbl. White Whine Vinegar or Apple Cider Vinegar

3 Tbls. Dill (dry spice is fine)

1 Cucumber sliced apprx. 1/8 thick, apprx. 2 cups

1/3 Cup of Purple (it's not red; it's purple!) onion, sliced very thin and soaked in ice water)

Salt & Pepper to taste & refrigerate at least 1 hour.

Mix everything together; drain your purple onion and add either in rings or cut straight across to add as halves. I just put mine right on top of my grilled meat and it is so creamy and cold and great contrast to hot meat right off the grill (remember to rest meat or the only juicy bite will be the first one).

JULY 4TH WATERMELON SUNRISE

2 Cups Seedless Watermelon cut into big chunks

4 ozs. of Rum or Vodka, 2 ounces simple syrup (simple syrup is just 1/2 cup sugar & 1/2 cup water mixed well). Add watermelon cubes to blender; puree & strain. In a large glass pitcher add puree, rum or vodka, simple syrup and juice of 1 lime. Stir to combine well. Pour over crushed ice and baby, you're in Summer Heaven. Slurp!




















INDEPENDENCE DAY

HISTORY OF MOTORCYCLES:

Part 11

The 1980's brought many changes to American pop culture. The birth of Pac-Man and Microsoft Windows paved the way for technology to supersede human interaction, and the assassination of John Lennon ushered in the downfall of music as we knew it. By the end of the decade we saw the Berlin Wall fall and inflation rise to record levels. What impact did this have on the motorcycle world? Well let's just say that Japan was doing far more than selling the first compact disc players the world had ever seen. Japanese bikes were quickly becoming hotter than an 80's teen girl wearing Love's Baby Soft.


Though motorcycling had been popular for years, it became more accessible to some riders due in part to the many low-priced and easy to ride Japanese models on the market. To capitalize on the growing market the Japanese began to leave behind the designs that had originally helped them explode onto the motorcycle scene in America. Some developments that emerged earlier in motorcycle history quickly became standards in the 80's...water cooling, shaft drives as opposed to chains, and virtually any modification that could boost performance and speed. An interesting aspect of many 80's bikes was the plethora of modern high-technology additions including electronic instruments with basic computers and LCD displays, 6 speed transmissions, and triple disk brakes.

Some noteworthy Japanese bikes of the 80's include the Honda V45 and V65 Magna. Introduced in 1982, it was one of the original 80's cruisers with a 750. In 1983 the V65 was released as an 1100. Many saw this as Honda challenging Harley-Davidson by indicating engine size in cubic inches (Harley's standard measurement) versus cc's. The Magna would evolve through the decade into the Super Mag-



na, but would never gain as much respect on the American market as the Honda Shadow. American buyers preferred the more "Harley-esque" appearance and performance provided by the Shadow.

Prior to the split between performance bikes and cruisers became as prominent as we see today, Kawasaki decided to take the engine from their legendary "Ninja" and equip a low slung cruiser frame with it. What they produced was the Eliminator...a 900 cc (later a 1000 cc) water cooled inline-four with a 6 speed transmission that produced over 100 HP in a sleeker and lighter model than Honda's Magna.



Yamaha made its own contributions to the technological advancement of motorcycles in the 80's. The FZR 400RR SP burst on to the scene as one of the first aluminum beam frames and housed a 399 cc inline-four. The SP enhanced that simple rightness with a tapered aluminum swingarm, a single seat, and a faired-in headlight. But perhaps Yamaha's greatest accomplishment of the 80's was the V-Max. The V-Max is the







only "80's bike" that remains in production today. And interestingly, they hold their resale value better than any other Japanese model... similar to the value retention of a Harley.

Speaking of Harley-Davidson....what were they up to during the decade of Space Invaders and now iconic "Brat Pack" movies? In 1980 Harley is still owned by AMF, but they released a historical bike anyway...the FXB Sturgis model in honor of the iconic Sturgis Motorcycle Rally. The Sturgis model was equipped with a belt drive, black chrome appointments, and an 80 cubic inch engine. 1981 rolled around and a letter of intent was signed by thirteen H-D executives to buy back Harley-Davidson Motor Company from AMF. The year

carried on, and then June 15th happened....it wasn't just the day my baby brother entered the world and removed me from my youngest child throne...Harley-Davidson was officially no longer owned by AMF. Harley was back, and with a new commitment to quality, they would cruise through the remainder of the decade releasing the FXR/ FXRS Super Glide II with its rubberisolated, five speed powertrain and the welded and stamped frame for the new Sportster models. In 1983 Harley responds to the stockpiling of Japanese motorcycle inventory in the United States by petitioning the International Trade Commission for tariff relief...and it is granted. Per-

haps the greatest achievement of the 80's for Harley was the release of the 1340 cc Evolution engine on five models, including the all-new Softail in 1985. The Evolution motor was the result of seven years of development, and designed to produce more power at every speed, run cooler and cleaner, and was oil tight. The end of the decade showed

that Harley-Davidson was again on top of its game when the company requested the International Trade Commission terminate their earlier granted tariff. A monumental move in American business history that demonstrated confidence in Harley's ability to compete in the marketplace. They then released the Heritage Softail model, began using the Evolution motor in Sportster models, and bought the Holiday Rambler Corporation. The 80's was rounded out with the return of the springer front end on the FXSTS Springer Softail and the introduction of the Sportster 1200 to mark the 85th Anniversary of the Harley-Davidson Motor Company.

The 80's was a turbulent decade for many, but the motorcycle industry continued to forge ahead as always. The 1990's was no exception. After perfecting the basics in the two-wheel industry there is only one thing left to do...and that's improve. Next time we will look at what advancements the industry made, and motorcycling became mainstream

Young men with everything to live for ferreted out an entrenched enemy on the islands across the Pacific, wading ashore through the bodies of fallen GI's, they charged headlong into artillery and machine gun fire that cut them down by the hundreds and at times thousands; then loaded back onto troop transports to be taken to the next island for another headlong suicide charge. And the ship board lull between battles was spent on high alert because of enemy submarine activity and the ever present threat of kamikaze attack. And as bad as the warfare was, it was further punctuated by the deprayity found in the enemies POW and concentration camps. Damn straight those generations had a profound respect for the flag and all that it stands for, they

I have met people who have literally lost everything to an over controlling and uncaring government, but still express undving love for a nation in which they still have unshakable faith. And where does such faith come from? From people who know the price of freedom because generations of their ancestors have been willing to pay it. I don't know about the rest of you, but when my flag passes by during the 4th of July parade I will be on my feet with my hand over my heart because I am proud to be a believer!
