





Man finds Korean War military ID in storage

A man combing through a storage unit in suburban Detroit says he discovered military ID tags that might have belonged to a Korean War soldier. TV station WXYZ says the dog tags bear the name William C. Fowler.

Adam Heaphy says he searched the internet and learned that Fowler, a South Carolina native, was born in 1927 and killed in action in 1951.

Heaphy says he found the tags after successfully bidding on an abandoned storage locker at A-1 Affordable Storage in White Lake Township. He wants to return them to the owner, perhaps a member of Fowler's family.

Soldier's remains coming home after 66 years

A soldier's remains have been found after he was killed in North Korea during the Korean War. Curtis Wells, of Ubly, enlisted in the U.S. Army around 1950. He was sent to North Korea. Shortly after he arrived, his battalion was taken over by enemy forces.

Wells was nowhere to be found. He was listed as Missing In Action. As years passed, he was not accounted for as a Prisoner Of War and was declared dead in 1953, but his remains were never located. That's until a few months ago when his family got the call they had always been waiting for. Through DNA and dental records, they matched remains excavated from a site in North Korea to those of Wells.

His oldest sister, Elizabeth Liedke, says it brings their family some much-needed closure. "It's going to be a relief, a big relief because we never thought after being so long that it could be true. We never figured we would hear or see anything about it," said Liedke.

His remains are currently in Hawaii and will be flown back home. Wells will finally be laid to rest in Harbor Beach later this month.

96-year-old veteran's home getting a facelift from East Jackson football team

Maynard Bunce, 96, doesn't get around as well as he'd like to these days. But that's OK, because his 81-year-old friend Jim Bayne is there to help. Bunce's vision and hearing have digressed, and he now uses a walker to get his legs going. But Bayne, a volunteer with Catholic Charities of Jackson, helps the World War II veteran by driving him to and from the next adventure.

"Jim is great," Bunce said. "I'm telling you, I am the most fortunate person in the world to get acquainted with him. I feel so ashamed that I did everything myself, but I can't now."

Bunce, a born and raised Jacksonian, lives on the south side in a little, one-story house. He's been there for 67 years and had his house built after purchasing the lot. The exterior paint is in rough

shape, though, which caught the eye of Bayne. He reached out to Greater Jackson Habitat for Humanity to see what it could do, and the organization found a suitable solution.

The East Jackson High School football team is coming to paint Bunce's house. Bayne is buying the paint and Billy White Roofing and Habitat are providing the supplies. A skilled painter is coming to lead the football players. "I got the legs of a football player," Bunce said. "I love football. If they paint my house and make it look halfway decent that will be a fine job," Bunce said.

The generosity of Bayne, East Jackson's football team and community groups comes at a time in Bunce's life when it really matters. Not only is he living on public assistance, but two recent burglaries left his pockets \$2,300 cheaper, literally. "One guy pushed me down and stole money right out of my pockets," Bunce said. That happened about three weeks ago, he said, when his TV and radio also went missing. It was the second burglary.

The first happened a month ago, when envelopes with his emergency funds were stolen. Bayne said he filed police reports, but he really just doesn't understand how somebody could do that. "People are coming in here, knocking him down, taking his money, how can you justify that?" Bayne said. Bunce doesn't know if the person stealing from him is a relative, stranger or acquaintance. But he said he's learned the most important thing in life is to be honest.

"Very few people live up to 96 years old," Bunce said. "Most of my friends are gone. But the most important things are to be honest and to have good friends. Of course, none of us have more than one or two honest to goodness true friends.





IN THE SHOP WITH RON

Fuel Tank Service ~ **Not A SCARY Project**


In the shop this month we're going to do a fuel filter and supply line replacement on a 2004 Dyna. This is a maintenance issue that I believe is often overlooked, due to the fact that these components are located inside the fuel tank. Out of sight, out of mind so to speak. The fuel filter should be part of your regular maintenance/ service schedule, but it's not based on time or mileage alone, riding conditions and style must be considered and also, quality of fuel available. The supply line, we're replacing, because it's beginning to leak. The fuel injected bikes have a quick disconnect fuel line and they will develop a leak sometimes. You may disconnect and reconnect the coupler several times with no problems and then for no apparent reason, it will start to leak. That's why we're getting into this, because of the leak and since we're already there, it's time to replace the fuel filter also.

Before we get started, I can't stress SAFETY enough. We will be working around gasoline. Gasoline is extremely flammable, be very careful and work in a well ventilated area, no open flames and no smoking. If you're doing this in a heated shop, be aware of outside sources of ignition, such as the pilot light of a furnace coming on. If you're just servicing the filter and it's possible, try to plan the service when there is less than half a tank of fuel in the motorcycle. In this case, the coupler is leaking (and of course the tank if full), so we'll have to drain the tank. I'm not going to go into detail here, but be very careful!

The first thing we need to do is locate the fuel pump fuse and remove it. With the fuse removed, start the motorcycle and let it stall (run out of fuel). This will release any pressure in the fuel pump, next either remove the main fuse or disconnect the battery. Safety once again. There are wires to unplug near and inside the gas tank. Make sure there is no chance of a spark. With the motorcycle prepped: fuel pressure relieved, battery disconnected, seat removed, our next step is to remove the dash. On this model there is a bolt at the base, one on either side about in the middle of the dash and around the fuel cap



Carefully lift the dash away from tank and unplug wire harness. Now, remove the bolts around the fuel filler/fuel gauge assembly and remove it. There is a seal on the gauge assembly, it can be reused if it's in good condition. If there is any question, replace it, it's not terribly expensive. Unplug the wires to the fuel gauge and set the assembly aside.



Looking inside tank; this is the fuel pump/filter assembly. Gently lift black the tab on the rear of the housing and slide the assembly forward and free of the bracket. At this point, it requires a little careful maneuvering/wiggling to be able to disconnect the fuel line and wiring. Remember, this is a fragile unit, patience and finesse, not force. With the line and wiring disconnected; it takes a lifting and slight twist to remove unit from tank. Be careful of painted surfaces. It's a good practice to tape paper towels around the opening to protect the paint.

With the fuel pump/filter assembly on the bench, we can disconnect the line from the fuel pump to the filter. Slide the silver horseshoe clip out and remove the black cover from the white filter housing and then remove the fuel filter and sealing O-ring.

Note the color of the filter. The new one is white; this one is overdue for replacement. If you're only servicing the fuel filter, reassembly is the opposite of disassembly. A couple of things to be aware of when reassembling; it doesn't show up well in the picture, but there is an allocation in the center of the fuel filter housing that fits in a hole in filter. It's a tight fit. I like to use a little lube here and on the sealing O-ring also. This helps ease reassembly. Make sure the O-ring stays in place when reinstalling the filter housing cover. On this project, we also replaced the fuel supply line from the filter to the guick coupler on the outside of the tank. It's a fairly straight forward procedure; 5/8" socket, unscrew the fitting from the tank (already drained) and install a new one



It takes a little maneuvering, because you have to twist the entire line. Do not over tighten the fitting on the fuel tank. Pay close attention to the O-ring when disconnecting and reconnecting the lines. If they appear damaged at all, replace. Make sure they stay in place during reassembly. Once reassembly is complete, start the motorcycle and check for leaks



ran broadside into a pick-up truck driven by a 59 year old woman who turned left right in front of him.

If you have read the news, you will surely be aware that he was wearing a helmet, and also that he was a sponsor and champion of our helmet modification bill, which allows us to decide for ourselves about wearing a helmet.

But, there was so much more than just being a sponsor to the helmet law change that Rep. Pettalia was intricately involved in that pertains to our lives as bikers.

You can thank him for not seeing an additional \$100 dollars added on to your motorcycle registrations every year. As chair of the transportation committee, he ensured we were not taken advantage of. He also was the sponsor of the TIP bill, which ABATE pushed for in order to limit temporary rider's permits with the intention of getting people trained and endorsed. Also, the Nathans Law/Nathan Bower Act was sponsored by Rep. Pettalia. This is the law that made motorcycle awareness training mandatory in all Drivers Training classes.

Any and all legislation involving motorcycle licensing and education was a closely held interest to Rep. Pettalia.

ABATE President Vince Consiglio, as well as, Legislative Officer Jim Rhoades, had a regular and close relationship with the Representative. He was always very welcoming to bikers in Lansing and he was a regular speaker at our yearly Freedom Rally. He often enjoyed riding his motorcycle to the Capitol to work.

It is with tremendous sympathy to his family and friends that we offer our condolences. We have lost a great ally and a champion of freedom and liberty. We will not let his support, friendship, and advocacy go unforgotten! It is our hope to see issues that might have played a part in helping to prevent his untimely passing gain relevance in new legislation that addresses the sheer negligence that takes place far too often. "I did not see him" is not going to cut it, when "I did not look" is the truth!

HISTORY OF MOTORCYCLES:

Part 13

At the close of the 90's we had reached a point in our journey where Harley Davidson was still coming on strong, Japanese bikes were twisting the throttle and climbing the ranks, and Indian was creeping back onto the scene with some solid bikes. The 2000's wouldn't slow manufacturers down either.

Harley Davidson brings the fuel injected V-Rod to the table in 2002. The V-Rod also combined overhead cams and liquid cooling and delivered an ass kick-

ing 115 horsepower. The Sportster line of bikes received updates to its seating positions, frames, and engine mountings, as well as the addition of the XL Forty-Eight in 2010. The touring editions at Harley also had some work done; improving transmissions and creating a new frame that provided a longer wheelbase to improve seating position and maneuverability. 2006 brought us the all-new

FLHX/I Street Glide to the touring family as well. The biggest change for Harley this decade was quite possibly the addition of the 2009 FLHTCUTG Tri Glide Ultra Classic. Harley's first three-wheeler for public purchase.

Harley Davidson wasn't the only company hard at it during this time. After purchasing Indian Motorcycle Company from a London based private equity firm (Stellican), Polaris Industries Inc. took over production

and relocated from Kings Mountain, N.C. to our very own Spirit Lake, Iowa. While a modest number of Indian Chiefs had been produced in North Carolina, the resources of Polaris and the move to Iowa proved to be stellar for Indian. Indian not only began production again, but they



introduced the powerful new Thunder Stroke 111 V –Twin in 2013 at Daytona Bike Week. In 2014 Indian unveiled the Indian Chief Classic, Indian Chief Vintage, and Indian Chieftain all equipped with the powerful Thunder Stroke engine as well. The Indian Roadmaster would soon follow, and then the Indian Scout, and the Chief Dark Horse. Indian came back with a vengeance...and with the mind-blowing power behind these new

bikes that has even the most expeditious riders shaking their heads.

So the industry just keeps chugging along, perfecting the objects of our affection at every turn... and we all thank you for that, but what do these guys have up their sleeves for us in the future? Over the years concept bikes have emerged that look to the consumer to be straight out of the mind of H.G. Wells. But what ever happened to these bikes? Well, just

as in the early years, development stages didn't always progress past the prototype stage. Many of these concepts proved to be nothing more than cool ideas... ideas that appear feasible on paper, but lack the ability to actually function on the road. Despite this fact, some of them are still worth a look.

The Nuclear Fusion Motorbike 2050 is a concept designed by Romain Herment. This concept bike uses nuclear energy as a power source. Herment calls it the Mo-

torbike 2050 Version 2.....makes me wonder what kind of explosion Version 1 ended in. This futuristic bike uses two inexhaustible natural elements (deuterium and tritium) to allow for a sustainable ride should dark days come to the fuel industries.







The Lamborbiker is a tribute to Nicolas Tesla and Ferrucio Lamborghini. This bike takes its name from invention and design...and with good reason. The Lamborbiker has hubless wheels and smooth clean lines, but is far from the prototype stage, as all design has been done via computer, and even the engine design has only gone as far as 3-D imaging thanks to specialized software.

The Fallout is a concept bike that was conceived as a tribute to the classic chopper. The Fallout, sports a single sided swing arm that meshes with the Bimota sourced frame in order to create a completely unique "Hub-Centered" steering motorcycle. It has short bobber style handle bars, chopped exhaust, and a long tank to bring out chopper aesthetics that bikers know and love. Combined with a bit of futuristic body styling, this becomes old school biker meets hover craft.

With all of these potential avenues for the motorcycle industry to take, how do we even know what is feasible, and what is imagination running rampant onto paper? Well we know this for sure...times are definitely changing, and those changes affect us all in one way or another. The most likely adaptation the motorcycle community will see in the near future is hybrid bikes. The concept of an electric bike may not be your cup of tea (or bottle of beer as it may be), but it is none the less, part of our future. As we look at hybrids today, many of the electric cars actually get better gas mileage than your two-wheeler. Pretty crazy to imagine, but true. There are positives and negatives to the idea of hybridization of motorcycles. The internal combustion engine has been around for more than 100 years, and we have done pretty much everything to perfect its original design. Bringing up the old adage, "If it ain't broke..." Also, oil companies really don't want everyone plug-


ging in versus filling up...big oil doesn't know how to be poor, nor do they want to be! Also, your bike makes noise...good noise...noise that makes the cage drivers pay attention when you're out on the road. Hybrids are clean, therefore good for our planet that we are slowly destroying. Electric engines have total linear power availability...electric bikes can go from 0-100 mph in one gear if you want to. The choice will soon be yours to make.

From the infancy of the motorcycle to the possibilities of what the future may hold for our two-wheeled friends; the motorcycle has come a long way. Motorcycles vary considerably depending on the task for which they were designed, such as long distance travel, navigating urban traffic, cruising, sport and racing, or off road conditions. No longer must riders endure back breaking rides that can heat the nether regions upwards of 300 degrees. Not to mention, we can travel hundreds of miles before succumbing to the magnetism of a gas station. Today motorcycles are the most common type of motor vehicle in the world...200 million motorcycles (33 bikes per 1,000 people) to be exact. Not bad for the idea that stemmed from Roper's twisted imagination and a shitty bicycle so many years ago. Bikes today are affordable, trustworthy, comfortable, and above all still the coolest thing since sliced bread.
