
















Look for something positive in each day, even if it means you may have to look a little harder for it. By focusing on the good things in your life, it will bring more of them to you.









Shepherd's VTF Serendipity Ranch Aims to Help Veterans

A new resource in Isabella County offers a unique form of therapy for veterans. The VTF Serendipity Ranch is a free outlet for men and women to overcome trauma they experienced at war. The new Shepherd ranch aims to help veterans throughout Michigan. "It gives them a place to come to retreat, to heal, to rejuvenate and get their life back on track," says director Deborah Praay.

Some of the therapists at Serendipity Ranch are on four legs. They're rescued horses that can relate to our nation's heroes. "It's really rewarding just to watch the interaction between the person and the horse and you can see it. It's a very visible thing when they make that connection," says co-director Marilyn Bowen. That connection is designed to help with PTSD and other demons these veterans face after they return home.

"You get yourself climbed down so far you're contemplating that there's no way out. The suicide rate is way up amongst veterans and I feel that could be part of the reason because they don't have an outlet for their emotions or what's bothering them," says veteran Jerry Khloa. He and his wife own the property the ranch is on and donated it.

Jerry says working with horses saved his life. "I could stand there. I could talk to them. I could tell them what was bothering me. I would put my head on their neck. I would cry and it seemed help me when I walked out of that barn and felt better than a weight shifted off my shoulder," says Khloa.

Eventually the ranch wants to also help emergency responders -- and anyone else who's experienced trauma. "Those nightmares, they can stop and they can be stopped and be replaced with pleasant thoughts and that's our goal to help people get back on track," says Bowen.

Doctors reveal promising research for new PTSD treatment

Doctors are calling a new method an exciting step toward treating Post Traumatic Stress Disorder, a disorder that affects as many as eight million adults during a given year, according to the U.S. Department of Veteran Affairs. An old pill with a new use is being tested in San Antonio.

In nine years, Mark Bratton was deployed five times. His symptoms first surfaced after he served during the surge in 2007. The symptoms kept growing as he was deployed two more times and then volunteered to go to Afghanistan. "All the combat and stress, and all the things that came with that deployment kind of pushed me over the edge," said Bratton.

"In this particular study, we were looking for patients who were either military or first responders," said Dr. Harry Croft. Dr. Croft works for the Clinical Trials of Texas that is a part of a nationwide study using an already approved muscle relaxant.

Doctors cut the dosage and put the medicine under the patient's tongue, so the medicine goes directly into their blood stream. "It blocks one of the receptors that we think sometimes has to do with some of the symptoms," said Croft.

"I noticed change within about a week. I feel better about myself. The anxiety started to subside." said Bratton.

Researchers are hoping it enters the next phase of testing by the end of the year

Grand Rapids Home for Veterans complaints to get independent review

An ombudsman will be appointed to review and investigate complaints at two veterans' facilities in Michigan, including the Grand Rapids Home for Veterans. The bill, signed by Gov. Rick Snyder, was sponsored by state Sen. Peter MacGregor, R-Rockford. It was patterned after a bill proposed by state Rep. Winnie Brinks, D-Grand Rapids.

The creation of the ombudsman's office will allow independent investigation of concerns raised by veterans, their families or legal guardians, or legislators. It follows a stinging audit at Grand Rapids Home for Veterans by the Michigan Auditor General.

The audit documented improper patient care, false claims of checks on patients and failures to investigate allegations of abuse and neglect.

The ombudsman would look at complaints in Grand Rapids as well as the D.J. Jacobetti Home for Veterans in Marquette. The ombudsman will report to the Legislative Council.

"By creating this office, veterans and their families can have their concerns addressed," Snyder said in a statement, after signing the bill into law.

Former Kent County Circuit Judge James Redford has taken over the Michigan Veterans Affairs Agency. Former director Jeff Barnes resigned after the troubling audit. Redford wants complaints addressed within 24 hours. Meanwhile, state Attorney General Bill Schuette is investigating possible physical abuse and crimes at the Grand Rapids home.

The Motorcycle Lawyer on THE LAW SKIMPING ON MOTORCYCLE INSURANCE CAN COST YOU

As most loyal readers already know, these monthly articles are just one method my team and I use to pass along motorcycle-relevant information about the law, insurance, riding techniques, and maintenance; often, I am passing along information my team and I come across while fighting for injured motorcyclists and their families. And, while I have discussed insurance in previous articles, I wanted to talk about a specific aspect of insurance this month and explain a few of the ways that buying only the bare minimum in motorcycle insurance may save you money on the outset, but could cost you in the long run.

First, a little background: My client was injured by a negligent motorist who was driving without insurance on the vehicle ("the uninsured driver"). As I have explained in previous articles focusing on motorcycle insurance, you only need to carry the basic 20/40 bodily injury coverage in order to be legal here in Michigan. That coverage provides up to \$20,000 per person, or up to \$40,000 for any number of people the motorcyclist may injure by riding negligently... which is not what happened in this case, and not what this article is about. I mention it only because in previous insurance articles, I also recommend having at least \$100,000 in bodily injury coverage to protect yourself. (Keep in mind, this does not include the additional \$20,000 per person in medical coverage motorcyclists who wish to ride without a helmet are required to carry.)

Having the basic 20/40 bodily injury coverage also entitles motorcyclists to no-fault benefits, but only if a motor vehicle is sufficiently "involved" in the crash. Michigan's no-fault system allows motorcyclists injured in a crash with a motor vehicle to get lifelong medical bill coverage for injuries related to the crash, as well as wage loss, household chores, and medical mileage reimbursement; again, this only applies if a motor vehicle is involved in the crash.

My client did not have uninsured or underinsured motorist coverage. This type of policy kicks in when the motorcyclist is hit by a negligent driver who has no insurance, or not enough, to cover the rider's injuries. Apparently, my client "heard from someone" (presumably not an insurance agent or an attorney) that he didn't need to purchase uninsured/underinsured coverage because the insurance policy on his car would cover him in that type of scenario. He was hoping to save a little money on his motorcycle insurance by avoiding what he thought would be redundant coverage.

In fact, my client's uninsured/underinsured policy for his car has a specific exclusion disallowing him from using his auto insurance policy to cover the injuries he received in his motorcycle crash. It is referred to as the "other owned vehicle exclusion", and it works like this: if you own two (or more) vehicles, you must insure each vehicle as fully as you would want to be covered in the event of a crash when driving that particular vehicle. In other words, you must purchase as much coverage as you want on a pervehicle basis

Now, I'm not usually one to side with insurance companies, but I actually believe this rule makes sense. After all, the insurance company wants to be sure that they have quoted and received payment for a premium consistent with the amount of risk they have assessed. Risk is assessed differently for each vehicle; if you have a Honda and a Ferrari, you can bet the insurance company will assess higher risk, and thus higher premiums, to the Ferrari. To put it another way, why would any insurance company allow someone to purchase uninsured/underinsured coverage for their minivan, at a premium of \$50, then have it cover their motorcycle, convertible, and teenage son's pickup truck? If each of his vehicles were assessed the same way, the policy holder should have paid at least \$200 for four policies for four vehicles, not \$50 for one policy for four vehicles. Insurance companies are not in the business of losing money, so it shouldn't come as a surprise to learn that they specifically exclude the policy holder (and often their family members) from coverage if the policy holder is operating or riding in another vehicle owned by the policy holder. Your Honda's policy does not

cover you in your Ferrari, and your motor vehicle insurance does not cover you on your motorcycle.

Writing about other owned vehicle exclusions got me thinking about other insurance questions we receive regularly; here is a list of four common questions we hear from clients:

- 1 "Should I cancel my motorcycle insurance during the off-season?" I always recommend against this. Your homeowner's policy will not cover your motorcycle. If something happens fire, flood, theft, rodent damage, you can't use your homeowner's policy to cover it. I've written about this a few times before; to read more, visit www. MotorcycleLawyerMichigan.com/80.html to learn more.
- 2 "How do I get my motorcycle repaired after a crash?" To get your motorcycle fixed, you need collision coverage, which will cover the cost of repairs or pay a fair market value for a motorcycle that is totaled. However, this may only apply to stock parts; see 3 for information about custom work and accessories.
- 3 "Will my insurance pay for custom work or accessories?" As usual, the answer here is "it depends". Collision Coverage normally only covers stock parts of the motorcycle; custom parts, paint, or accessories may be excluded. Check with your insurance agent; be very specific about what you want covered, and be sure to ask specifically if your policy or rider covers custom work.
- 4 "Do I need special insurance to ride without a helmet?" If you are over 21 AND have had a motorcycle (CY) endorsement for at least two years OR passed a certified rider training program to get your endorsement, you can choose to ride without a helmet as long as you have at least \$20,000 of first-party medical benefits coverage; The same goes for any passengers on your motorcycle. In other words, to ride without a helmet, you need \$20,000 in first-party medical benefits for each person on the motorcycle; that coverage has to be separate from VA, Medicare, or other healthcare insurance you already have.

Insurance is complicated and full of exceptions and exclusions; that is why I always tell people that the answer to any question about a motorcycle wreck, liability, insurance coverage, the law, and so on is always "it depends": The facts of the crash, who owns the vehicle(s), where the crash occurred, what address is listed on the insurance policy, and a whole multitude of other factors come into play when assessing how the law applies to the crash and what insurance coverage is available to help the injured victim(s).

Nobody can explain every aspect or answer every question about insurance in a single article; if you have questions about motorcycle insurance, contact your insurance agent. HISTORY OF MOTORCYCLES:

Part 12

By the time America reached the decade of the World Wide Web we had seen the rise of Hip-Hop and the thawing of the Cold War. We would also have the misfortune of witnessing firsthand an increase in terroristic acts in our nation, with the World Trade Center and Oklahoma City bombings...Anyway, all that aside, the motorcycle continued to forge ahead. As I mentioned

before, during the 1990's we saw the motorcycle industry turn its focus towards improving upon the two-wheeled beauties that we had grown to love so much. And these improvements helped to further entrench the motorcycle and the lifestyle surrounding it into mainstream America.


The Japanese manufacturers were able to grow by leaps and bounds during the 90's due in part to the growing interest in the racing scene. Honda continued to enchant riders both in search of technologically advanced bikes, as well as riders who just HAD to go fast.

In 1990 Honda released the VFR750R (aka RC30) in America. This was a genuine race bike for the street, and sold at a staggering price that was twice the cost of a stock Interceptor. In 1992, 200 units of the legendary NR were produced for sale in the U.S. This was a totally street legal version of the ill-fated NR500 Grand

Prix Racer, which sold for a whopping \$60,000. No, that's not a typo....it was seriously 60 grand...at that's 90's bread, not today's low-carb version of the dollar. The NR was loaded, and way beyond its time. It featured carbon fiber body work, a digital dash, under seat exhaust, and fuel injection. In spite of its sumptuous use of carbon and light alloy, it weighed in at nearly 500 pounds. 1993 was another lucrative year for Honda with the









release of the CBR900RR (Fireblade).

This model combined the power of an open class motorcycle with the weight and handling of a 600, and proceeded to stun the sport bike world. Finally, Honda introduced the radical EXP-2 in 1995. This bike was a two-stroke 400 cc model that became "proof-of-concept" for company that a cleaner burning and more powerful two-stroke engine was attainable.

Yamaha didn't slow down during the 90's either. 1991 brought about the release of the FJ1200A, it came standard with antilock brakes, and it set the standard for sports-touring bikes during the decade. In 1993, Yamaha introduced us to the striking GTS100...this machine featured electronic

fuel injection and hub centered steering, but consumers scoffed about the price and failed to bite on the bikes innovation. 1996 was a stellar year for the company when they released the original Star model, sporting a 1300 cc engine it was named the V-4 Royal Star. In the final 2 years of the decade Yamaha graced the American public with the YZ400F (It became the first mass produced 4 stroke motocross bike, and was to become the eventual downfall of the two-stroke 250's.), the YZF-R1, and the YZF-R6. Motocross style bikes were becoming more main-stream by the minute at this point in history.

Suzuki was not to be outdone by its Japanese competitors, and also produced progenies faster than Octomom. 1990 brought us the 779 cc DR-BIG which amounted to the largest single cylinder

engine in living memory. Followed by the GSX-R750 in '91 which switched from oil cooling to water cooling and packed on a few pounds. 1995 was a better year for the company, when the beloved Bandit 1200...a 16 valve 1156 cc oil/water cooled model appeared on the motorcycle scene. But Suzuki didn't stop there, in 1996 they released the all new GSX-R750 which was coined the "turning point model" thanks to its twin – spar frame instead of the older double cradle frame. The engine was also redesigned and featured 3 piece crank cases, chrome plated cylinders, and a side-mount cam chain, as well as the Suzuki Ram Air Direct (SRAD) system. The company's first sport bike with a V-twin engine came in the form of the TL1000S in 1997, followed by the legendary SV650 "Hayabusa" in 1999. The Hayabusa sported an aluminum frame and a liquid cooled 90 degree V-twin DOHC 4 valve engine. Suzuki called this bike the "ultimate aerodynamic sport bike"...and they were right, as it soon became the favorite of land speed racers.

So it's pretty clear that the Japanese were hard at work during the 90's, but what were our local boys up to at the time? While I have to admit, there was plenty to focus on at the time....Y2K was creeping in on us, and the Spice Girls were incessantly asking everyone to tell them "what you really really want", but despite the staggering amount of diversions, Harley-Davidson managed to focus on the tasks at hand and had themselves one hell of a decade as well.



To kick off the '90's Harley introduced us to the FLSTF Fat Boy.... as we all know; this bike almost instantly became a modern legend of motorcycle design. 1991 brought us the "Dyna" line of bikes, starting with the FXDB Dyna Glide Sturgis. It wasn't until 1994 that Harley-Davidson would enter the world of Super bike racing, but it did so elegantly with the release of the VR1000 and its powerful dual overhead cam and liquid cooled engine. The same year brought us the classically styled FLHR Road King to the growing family of touring bikes Harley



already had to offer. 1995 was yet another year for firsts in the H-D family, with the addition of the Ultra Classic Electra Glide. This bike would become the first in Harley history to be a production bike with sequential port electronic fuel injection. The next three years Harley-Davidson would spend expanding its ever evolving corporation by opening new factories in Milwaukee, Menomonee Falls, Kansas City, and even Mahaus, Brazil...which just happened to be the first operations to ever take place outside of the U.S. for the Harley-Davidson Motor Company. Harley rounded out the decade by sprucing up the "Dyna" and "Touring" motorcycle families by upgrading them to include the new twin cam 88 engines.

Seems pretty cut and dry...except for a long lost friend in the industry...or maybe that's long lost foe, seems to be attempting a bit of a comeback towards the close of the era. 1998 brings about the revival of brand exclusive production for a former competitor in the American motorcycle market. A merger of 9 companies ultimately formed the Indian Motorcycle Company of America (IMCA), and they opened a production facility in Gilroy, California starting with production of Scout, Chief, and Spirit models powered by engines acquired from S & S Cycle Inc.

So where does this leave us now? Well to be honest it leaves me pretty exhausted. Between crossing my fingers that my student loans were going to disappear in a world-wide computer crash and wondering why anyone would voluntarily put a cigar...never mind, I digress. The '90's brought us a lot of bigger, faster, and more loved two-

wheeled beauties than one could have imagined possible. Next time we will conclude the series on motorcycle history by looking at today, tomorrow, and just how far we have come since Roper's crazy bicycle.



SWORN ENEMIES

I think it's time for a serious discussion about the biggest enemies of your firearms. Calm down, I'm not going political so this is not about Barak Obama, Hillary Clinton, or any of the other liberal anti-gun ideologues who delight in finding creative way to blame legally owned firearms for all of our societal ills. Rather I want to hit on a more practical concern for serious firearm owners, dealing with moisture and crud.

Mark Twain once observed that nobody is completely useless, even the worst of us can always be used as an example. Case in point was the guy who came into the store a few months back complaining that he could not open the slide on his pistol. He then produced a small stainless steel semi-auto from his pocket that was so badly fouled with pocket lint I thought we were going to have to break out a razor and shave it before tearing it down for repair. As it turned out, the only real problem with the gun was an accumulation of pocket crud, coupled with perspiration and over lubrication that had worked in between the frame and slide (yes it was a turd rack gun) causing a functional impingement that only took a few minutes to clear once identified. I doubt that this problem would have made the firearm unsafe to shoot, but poorly functioning guns are always accidents waiting to happen!

Problems such as this are easy to avoid. First, don't carry a firearm in your pocket unless you are using some type of pocket holster. Pocket holsters protect your gun from both moisture and dirt, keep it in an upright position, protect the trigger/trigger guard, and reduce the obvious print of a firearm through your clothing. Second, every evening when you take the firearm out of your pocket take the time to work the slide, do a quick inspection and wipe it down with a silicone cleaning rag. Third, at least monthly take the gun to the range and fire it to ensure functionality, and then break it down for a proper cleaning.

On the subject of cleaning, remember that the use of too much lubricant on your gun can be as bad as not cleaning it in the first place. Over lubrication is a crud magnet, especially around the bolt face and breach. If you are getting powder residue hard baked on in these areas, then it's a result of too much lube, or poor quality ammo, or a combination of the two; and left unchecked it may lead to failure to go to battery and a non-functioning firearm! A fairly new product that will help maintain your firearms are "RAMRODZ", caliber specific tightly wound cotton swabs on wooden stems.






Dip the swab into the solvent and run the bore before using the brush, then use a clean swab to remove residue after brushing, it's so much quicker and simpler than running patch after patch. Then, before you throw them away, fashion the blunt end to a scraper with a knife and use the wooden edge to scrape away the gunk in the tight areas on the bolt and around the breach without scratching your finish. How do you keep from over lubricating in the first place? Try using a moly based grease instead of liquid or spray lubricants and apply only the amount you can put on the end of a toothpick to your slide rails and around your barrel bushing. If this is done properly, there will be a noticeable reduction in residue buildup.

As far as moisture goes; this is Michigan and we reside in the state of humidity, we contend with often sudden precipitation (got my 6 soaked to the bone on my way home from work tonight), and moisture levels of many of our homes and workplaces are way too high and metal surfaces pay the price for it! Everybody knows that moisture causes oxidation (rust) quickest on blued finishes and given enough time, it will also discolor stainless. Fingerprints are moisture on steroids, because of the salt content of perspiration and can cause the onset of rust almost overnight. The best defense against all oxidation is not exposing your guns to moisture in the first place, but that is not practical if you are going to carry a firearm. The next best choice is to wipe your firearm (s) down daily with a silicone impregnated gun rag like those sold by Remington, Hoppes and Outers; or make your own by spraying a fine silicone lubricant lightly on an a clean rag made from an old t-shirt (old t-shirts are the best gun cleaning rags in the world and very cost effective). Then wipe your gun with the rag, rather than spraying the firearm directly and then trying to wipe off the excess, which takes us back to over lubrication. And if your gun does get drenched, the way my Glock 43 did tonight, dry it off the best you can with dry rags and blow it out with compressed air (if available) then wrap it in the silicone rag or silicone gun sock overnight, because one of the properties of silicone is that it draws moisture away from metal surfaces.

Taking reasonable care of your firearms will insure they are ready to protect and serve you more faithfully than any politician ever dreamed of. ---- Til next month...keep your powder dry!









IN THE SHOP WITH RON

SO MANY **OPTIONS** Part I I

Hope everyone is getting an opportunity to enjoy this beautiful riding weather we've been having. I just want to give a quick recap of the last couple of articles in case anyone just tuned in, so to speak. We took a 2004 Dyna Twin Cam 88 and tore it down to do an inspection of the mechanical cam chain tensioners. The inspection revealed the tensioners needed to be replaced and after considering all the options, we decided to upgrade to hydraulic cam chain tensioners and Hi Flow oil pump.

With the bike on the lift and prepped for this service, (battery, exhaust, air cleaner and spark plugs removed, right foot peg/brake pedal disconnected and set out of the way) The first step is to remove the stock one piece push rod. We choose to replace the stock pushrods with aftermarket adjustable pushrods so we are going to cut the originals with bolt cutters. Work on one cylinder at a time.


Slide down slightly the center of the pushrod cover and remove the upper retainer (the short piece with a raised tab)



Slide the bottom part of the cover up towards the rocker box. This will expose about 1 1/2 inches of the pushrod just above the lifter block covers. This is where we will make our cut.



Before we cut the pushrod, we need to get it to a point where it has the least amount of pressure. With the rear tire raised slightly off the lift and the motorcycle in fifth gear (spark plugs removed) rotate the rear wheel in the normal direction while watching the pushrods. One will go up than come down, then the other one will do the same. When there both at the lowest point is how we want them when we cut. It's important to be extremely careful not to damage any other part of the motor while making the cut. Once this cut is made, remove the bottom part of the pushrod and remove the top part and the cover and set aside.



Once all the pushrods and covers are removed, loosen the four bolts on each of the two lifter block covers and remove the covers. When disassembling, it's a good idea to mark position and location/orientation of all parts even if you're not going to reuse them. You may need to reference them during reassembly. Remove the lifter retaining dowel and the lifters. Now we can remove the cam cover, take out the bolt that holds outer cam gear to cam and do the same thing with outer gear on crank shaft and remove both gears and outer chain as an assembly and set aside.

Now we can access the four bolts that hold the oil pump to cam support plate and the six bolts that hold cam support plate to crank case. With both removed, get a good hold on the support plate and wiggle/rock back and forth to free from case. Support plate, cams, and inner chain will come out as an assembly

When you pull the support plate away from engine case, usually part of oil pump will stay with cam support plate. Pay close attention to how things come apart. Make sure nothing ends up in cam compartment that isn't supposed to be there. Now we can remove the rest of the oil pump assembly. At this point with the option we chose, tear down is complete and we can start reassembly.

For reassembly, the first step is to remove and replace inner cam bearings and press new outer bearings and cams into new support plate. Both of these operations require a fair level of mechanical experience and a couple of different specialty tools. If you're not sure, don't hesitate to ask for help or advice. If you don't have the correct tools, sometimes you can rent them from a local repair shop. As I mentioned at the beginning of this series of articles, this service requires a bit more than average skill level. But it's not rocket science either. If you have decent mechanical ability, fair amount of tools and you're not too proud to ask for help, it's not impossible. Unfortunately, space doesn't allow me to get into great detail. But if anyone has any questions, feel free to contact me. I will be happy to help anyway I can.

Another good source of information is a shop service manual specific to the year and model of motorcycle you're working on. The service manual will have detailed disassembly and reassembly instructions, plus all necessary torque specifications.

Reassembly is basically the reverse of disassembly. Any gaskets or 'O' rings that have been disturbed must be replaced. The cam shafts must be timed to each other before being pressed into cam support

All bolts should be thoroughly cleaned and a small amount of Loctite used. I prefer to replace the bolts that hold the outer cam chain gears to the crankshaft

Next month we'll wrap this project up by installing the new 2 into 1 exhaust and onboard fuel management


