## VETERANS CORNER









### Program gives homeless veterans second chance at life

SPRINGFIELD, Mich. — for many veterans, the impact of battle doesn't end when they return home. Oftentimes, veterans deal With Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD), substance abuse and even homelessness. But one group in West Michigan is working to help get those homeless veterans back on their feet.

Michael Hager, an Army veteran, has been struggling with homelessness on and off for three years. "I never thought this would happen to me," Hager said. "I never imagined myself being like this." Struggling with the aftermath of a failed marriage and PTSD, he said he turned to drugs and alcohol.

"The past three years have been hell, to be honest, but now I'm properly cared for by the VA and I'm grateful to them," Hager said. "I'm in a good place now and I don't feel anything like I did before."

Hager is now staying at the Haven of Rest Men's Shelter in Battle Creek and he's a member of the Veterans in Progress, or V.I.P. program.

"A lot of veterans feel like they've been thrown away," said Todd Artis, manager of the Haven of Rest Shelter and a co-coordinator for the V.I.P. program. They are helping veterans get back on their feet by giving them food and shelter, but also taking them out into their communities.

"They gave a lot for us, we owe it to them," said Ken Nierman, president of the Iron Horse Riders Group Motorcycle Club. The Iron Horse Riders Group has partnered with the Veterans in Progress program by taking the veterans out to baseball games, throwing them Christmas parties and on Sunday, having a cookout while fishing on the lake. "They've given so much for the country that it's such a little thing that we're giving back to them, but at least we are a group that's doing something," Nierman said. "It makes us feel human again," Hager said. "It makes us feel like we're a part of the community and makes us happy. It helps us forget about for a little while some of the things we've been through."

Army veteran Jeffery Whitehead is graduating from the program next month and moving into his own place. "I went through a substance abuse program and other programs that the VA offered because at one time I was doing through things in my life and I didn't want to think about it or deal with it, so I turned to drugs," Whitehead said. "I knew I was making a mistake because I never did that before and all the drugs did was make my situation worse. I've now been clean for four months."

It's a small gesture, but it's one that means the world to the men and women willing to give their lives for their country. "Veterans are an elite group of people and they've been through a lot," Artis said. "Just for them serving our country is a great honor right there."

"It's good to give back," Nierman said. It's the only way I can do it." The Veterans in Progress program is one of several offered through the Haven of Rest men's shelter. For more information, go to http://www.thehavenbc.org

### Vietnam Veteran from Michigan to receive Medal of Honor

Nearly five decades after helping rescue dozens of American soldiers pinned down by enemy fire, a Vietnam War veteran received the nation's highest military honor for valor.

President Barack Obama awarded the Medal of Honor to retired Lt. Col. Charles Kettles of Michigan during a ceremony at the White House.

Kettles led helicopter flights carrying reinforcements to U.S. soldiers and evacuated the wounded after they were ambushed in combat operations near Duc Pho.

Kettles repeatedly returned to a landing zone under heavy fire. He is credited with helping to save 40 soldiers and four members of his unit.

He received the Distinguished Service Cross, but the Pentagon determined his actions also merited the Medal of Honor. Congress passed legislation waiving a time limitation for the award.

### Money stolen from veterans at Clare fair

Police are looking for the person or people who stole money from a veteran's donation jar at the Clare County Fairgrounds in Harrison.

Veterans collecting money for baseball caps that were on display reported to police that roughly \$50 was missing from the donation jar, Clare County Sheriff John Wilson.

The larceny happened sometime in the evening hours the previous night, Wilson said. Sheriff's detectives are investigating the larceny and are asking that anyone with information call the department at 989-539-7166, Ext. 4242.

On a positive note, Wilson said, another veteran, who wants to remain anonymous, donated amount of money that was stolen, Wilson said.



## The Motorcycle Lawyer on THE LAW BACK TO SCHOOL: MICHIGAN MOTORCYCLE LAWS 101

It's "back to school" season this month, the perfect time to provide a bit of education about Michigan's motorcycle laws. As many readers know, I like to try to stay on top of new or changing laws that affect Michigan's motorcyclists, and usually these laws are about what a driver can or cannot do on the road. This month, I've compiled a list of ten motorcycle-related laws you may not have known, many of which are rules about how your bike can, and cannot, be put together.

**ONE:** Do you even ride a motorcycle? Sometimes, there is confusion about the legal difference between a motorcycle and a moped. A motorcycle is defined as "every motor vehicle having a saddle or seat for the use of the rider and designated to travel on not more than three wheels in contact with the ground..." (MCL 257.31). A moped is a 2- or 3-wheeled vehicle that meets the following three criteria: the motor does not exceed 100 cubic centimeters piston displacement; the motor cannot propel the vehicle faster than 30 mph; and, "the power drive system does not require the operator to shift gears (MCL 257.32b).

**TWO:** Believe it or not, there is no minimum age requirement for a motorcycle passenger. Instead, the law mandates that "a passenger shall not ride on a motorcycle unless his or her feet can rest on the foot rests or pegs," [MCL 257.658a(1)]. In other words, as long as a passenger is tall enough that their feet can rest on the foot rests or pegs, they are good to go. The same statute specifies that motorcycles "shall be equipped with adequate seats and securely attached foot rests or pegs for each designated seating position."

**THREE:** You may be able to carry a passenger on your bike, but you cannot carry a package when you ride in Michigan! "A moped or motorcycle operator shall not carry any package, bundle, or article that prevents the driver from keeping both hands upon the handlebars of the vehicle," (MCL 257.661). Rules for cell phone use vary from city to city, so your best bet is to put your phone away until you get to your destination.

**FOUR:** Though helmets are optional as long as certain criteria are met, eye protection is not. A motorcyclist traveling more than 35mph must wear "goggles with transparent lenses, eyeglasses, or a transparent face shield," if the motorcycle doesn't have a windshield. Eye protection must be shatter-resistant and big enough to protect the rider's eyes against "airborne materials and other road debris," (MCL 257.708a).

FIVE: Want to feel the wind in your hair? Motorcyclists can choose not to wear a helmet in Michigan, as long as they meet the following criteria: the rider must have had their CY endorsement for at least two years, or passed a certified rider training program; the rider must be 21 years of age or older; and, the rider must have a minimum of \$20,000 in first-party medical benefits insurance [MCL 257.658(5)]. Passengers who wish to ride without a helmet must meet the last two criteria listed above. Finally, all moped riders 19 years or younger must wear a helmet [MCL 257.658(4)].

SIX: Thinking of going from three wheels to two? According to the law, a motor-cycle endorsement (CY) issued for the operation of a 3-wheeled motorcycle, "is restricted to that operation and does not permit operation of a 2-wheeled motorcycle," [MCL 257.312b(3)]. In other words, if you rode a 3-wheeled motorcycle to pass your CY endorsement road test, or to take and pass a certified rider training program, your endorsement is specific to 3-wheeled bikes only. If, however, you did your road test and/or certified rider training program on a 2-wheeled

motorcycle, and you decide you want to ride a 3-wheeled bike instead, your CY endorsement is fine; you do not need to get a new one. If you're not sure about which endorsement you need, contact your local Secretary of State office.

**SEVEN:** Got ape hangers? Don't stretch too far! Handlebars on motorcycles or mopeds on Michigan's roads must not be higher than 15 inches "from the lowest point of the undepressed saddle to the highest point of the handle grips," (MCL 257.661a).

**EIGHT:** It's no big surprise that motorcycles are required to have two brakes - one front, one rear - that can be operated by hand or foot (MCL 257.705). But, did you know that motorcycles operating on Michigan's highways must be equipped with a working horn? It must be "capable of emitting sound audible under normal conditions from a distance of not less than 200 feet," but it cannot be unreasonably loud or harsh, and it cannot whistle (MCL 257.706).

**NINE:** Can a motorcycle ever be too loud, really? Yes, at least according to Michigan's laws. Since 1978, motor vehicles have been required to meet specific noise limitations, and may not exceed the following limits: If the speed limit is 35mph or higher, the noise limit is 86 DBA\*; if the speed limit is 35mph or lower, the noise limit is 82 DBA; or, "95 DBA under stationary run-up test at 75 inches," (MCL 257.707c).

**TEN:** There are several mentions of lights and reflectors in Michigan's laws. For example, motorcycles and mopeds are "required to have one rear stop lamp," (MCL 257.697b). And, motorcycles and mopeds must have at least one, and not more than two, head lamps, which must be between 24 and 54 inches above the ground on which the bike is standing, and meet several other criteria (for more information, see MCL 257.685). Reflectors on the front or front sides of a motorcycle must be amber colored; those on the rear or rear sides must be red; and the light lighting up your license plate must be white (MCL 257.689).

Remember, a single article could never cover every Michigan law that applies to motorcycles or motorcyclists; this article provides a snapshot of some of the laws currently on the books. The circus owner's jaw is on the floor. "I've never seen a display like that in my life." - He turns to the biker and asks, "Can you top that?"


The biker says, "Hell yeah; just get that lion outta' there."







THE 2016 Ray C's RODEO







But, you can bet your bottom dollar I will never vote for the two piles of differing mammal





## IN THE SHOP WITH RON

## **SO MANY OPTIONS** Part III

The Final Chapter ~ **New Direction** 

I would like to start this month by offering a sincere apology, with the limited amount of space available each month; it's very difficult to do justice to a project that is this in depth and technical. When the opportunity to write this article presented itself, this was the project I was working on at that time. With this being the last chapter for this project, it's also going to lead us in a New Direction. Future articles will be geared more towards DIY projects. One project, one article, service and maintenance things, that most with average skills and tools can do yourself in your own garage. As we approach winter then we will touch on custom body work, painting and accessorizing both custom and aftermarket bolt on. So once again, I apologize for the long windedness/ incompletions of these first articles and hopefully you will keep reading. Having said all of that, let's get to it!



When we left off last month we were basically ready to reassemble the cam compartment and install aftermarket 2 into 1 exhaust. After removing and replacing inner cam bearings (requires specialty tool), we replaced the outer cam bearings, pressed the inner race, spacer, and 'O' ring on rear camshaft. Press the outer cam bearings into the support plate first (specialty tool), put the inner cam chain around the camshafts and make sure the timing marks are lined up. Check, double check and check a couple of more times to be absolutely sure the marks are lined up correctly. If timing marks are not lined up correctly and you put it together, the motorcycle probably won't start. And if it does, you will more than likely wish it wouldn't have! Being too far out of time can cause a valve to hit the piston. So once again, be absolutely sure timing marks are lined up. With inner chain on cams and timing marks

aligned, press front camshaft into front bearing (specialty tool) that is already pressed in cam support plate. An extra set of hands is very helpful at this point. Now we can install the inner bearing retainer and inner cam chain tensioner. A quick note here; for this project we are using hydraulic cam chain tensioners. If you are going to reuse or replace with the original O.E.M. style mechanical type it must be installed before installing the cam shafts and chain. Now we can install oil pump and cam support plate. Pay close attention to manufactures installation instructions, some require you to mount oil pump on crankshaft first making sure to replace all "O" rings. Some require the use of alignment screws, (specialty tool) this application instructed us to mount the oil pump to cam support plate finger tight and install cams, inner chain, oil pump as an assembly, start cam support plate bolts finger tight and roll the engine over by hand a few times to allow everything to mesh together. Then final torque the cam support plate to engine case bolts first, and then oil pump to cam support plate bolts.

Next, install crankshaft drive gear and cam shaft drive gear to outer chain making sure timing marks are aligned. (Outer gears have timing marks also). Install chain and gear assembly on cam and crank using new bolts.

Service manual recommends using new bolts for outer cam and crankshaft gears. They're not very expensive and you don't want them coming loose. (TRUST ME!!!) At this point I prefer to re-install cam compartment cover. Some like to finish installing lifters and pushrods first, but I like to close up the cam chest now to keep from getting any debris or contaminants in cam compartment. Next, we can install lifters, lifter block covers, pushrod covers (with new "O" rings) and pushrods. We are using adjustable pushrods so once again, follow manufactures installation instructions for installation and adjustment. When using adjustable pushrods, the lifters must be pumped up full of oil before adjusting. Do one cylinder at a time, both pushrods and let it rest for 15 minutes or so then do the other cylinder. Slide pushrod covers in place, make sure "O" rings stay in place, and install retainers.

Now, on to the exhaust; when installing a custom exhaust, it's best to lay out all the parts and read the instructions before beginning with the actual installation process. Our old exhaust is already removed. So remove old exhaust gasket from cylinder ports and replace with new. For this system we will reuse our original flanges and circlips

The rest of installation is pretty straight forward. Step by step follow manufactures instructions. On this particular application, install front heat shield on front head pipe and gently rock exhaust head pipe assembly into place. Install flanges and flange nuts finger tight. Attach to any support brackets and install muffler. Install everything finger tight first. Then from front to back, gradually snug everything up a little at a time until everything is firmed up. In the process of snugging everything up, make sure to watch for clearance issues between the pipes and anything they get close to. Then torque to manufactures specification. With a new exhaust system, I like to heat cycle it a few times to allow the coating; whatever it may be, chrome, black, ceramic, etc. to get up to full operating temperature gradually. After a few heat cycles, (3 maybe 4) let everything cool down and then re-check tightness of all hardware.



That's all for this month, but stay tuned in the future we plan to do an article discussing EFI fuel management systems specifically.

# THE TIME IS NOW

Many years ago I had a friend who, as it turns out, may have been truly wise beyond his years. In Bob's world, Michigan only had two seasons; deer season, and the rest of the year. He started hunting with his father and uncles at the family deer camp in the western U.P. in the days when hunters waited hours going both directions for the ferry at the straits of Mackinac. The camp had a cabin constructed of rough sawn cedar vertical over horizontal ship lap siding, ship lapped interior walls, and plank flooring. The windows and doors were re-purposed from other structures, light was provided by Coleman lanterns and flashlights, heat was a small parlor wood stove, and running water meant grabbing a bucket and running to the hand pump just outside the back door. And yes, there was indoor plumbing, it was just in a separate building about 30 yards from the cabin and the heat of a lantern made it reasonably comfortable to use when the cold set in. To Bob and the men in his family, deer camp was Valhalla and it wasn't unreasonable to spend the other fifty two weeks of the year doing all the little things that ensure a successful hunt.


As I write this in the first week of August, I realize that deer season is still weeks away, but at the same time I also know that this is probably the best time to start getting ready for November 15th. A couple of years ago, we had a customer come in the store the afternoon before opening day looking for a new bolt for his Remington 700 to replace the one he didn't realize he had lost until that morning when he opened his gun case (for the first time since the previous season). He was already in a bit of a panic, because his buddies were waiting for him in the parking lot so they could drive north to their camp, but he nearly came unclued when we told him that you don't just slap a new bolt into a rifle, especially a high power deer rifle, and expect it to work properly. If he had taken time in August or September to start getting ready for his hunt he would have had time to get his rifle to a gunsmith for repair. Now, while this may seem like an extreme example the truth, fact is that most shops are overrun with hunters ten days to two weeks before deer season who suddenly realize their firearm needs repair (many knew there was a problem when they put the gun away) and are seeking an overnight miracle. Unfortunately, there are always some hunters who end up disappointed because even the best prepared shops have limits on how much work they can handle and end up turning work away rather than doing slip-shod work or making promises they know can't be kept.

Let me give you some more practical advice on preparing early for you. First, it is much easier to sight in a scope when it is warm and sunny rather than working the dials with numb fingers while it is spitting sleet and snow. Now is the time to find out that you need to replace your optic, and if you find yourself in that po-

sition remember that it is possible to put too much scope on your gun. There are not a lot of rifles capable of shooting sub MOA groups right off the shelf, so unless you have money to burn. don't spend more on your optic than what the rest of your gun is worth. Once your new sight is mounted and bore sighted, you still have to take it to the range to finish dialing it in. Bore sighting is only intended to get you on paper at twenty five yards and a variation of inches at that range will be feet at a hundred yards and beyond. Always sight in off a rest or a lead sled to minimize movement, if you don't have one try wrapping a five pound bag of rice or dry beans in a towel to give you a steady (and edible) base. Zero first at twenty five yards, remember that it takes 16 guarter minute clicks to move your bullet strike one inch at this range, and use a ruler to measure center of bulls eye to center of bullet strike horizontally and vertically then count the clicks as you move the cross hairs before you fire again. I don't worry about shooting a 3 round group until I am hitting in the bulls eye and it's time to fine tune shot placement. If your first shot is five inches left and three inches high why waste another bullet to confirm you need to make some adjustments because in the long run you are just burnin' bullets, and that can get expensive!

Second, there is still an ammunition shortage and you may have difficulty finding your favorites rounds if you put it off too long. Some cartridges you have used for years may no longer be available forcing you to find another round your gun likes. Remember, a gun is like a significant other (I used to say "wife" but that could be deemed sexist and insensitive), find what it likes and stick with it and everybody will be happy. By the same token, if you are using a new gun try a couple of different loads to determine what is going to shoot best in that particular gun and don't be too surprised to find the manufacturer's recommended cartridge isn't always the best shooter for your firearm.

And finally, deer season opens a week after the November election and if the wicked witch of the rich gets her anti-gun ass elected to the White House I guarantee that we will see a bigger run on guns and ammo than the one that followed the Newtown, CT massacre in 2012. And if you didn't catch it in the news, it was revealed this week that the BATFE has been compiling a list of gun owners from the data in the 4473 background check, which is outside their constitutional authority. Sounds to me like now is the time to make sure you are registered to vote, and it also might be a good time to put away a couple hundred extra rounds, just in case.









# Picking Out Your Pattoo

In the zeitgeist of high speed media and plastic people there are thousands of tattoo shops popping up all over the country. How do you know where to go for ink? Safety should be your first priority, closely followed by quality. Here are some step-by-step pointers to help you know what to ask and, more importantly, what to look for.

- 1.) Ask to see the shop license and the individual tattooist's blood-borne pathogen card. Now neither of these really means a whole lot without follow through, but this is what I am supposed to start with since they are better than nothing.
- 2.) Is the shop clean? Check out the restroom, this is generally a good indicator of how the shop views cleanliness. Are the workers clean? How is their attitude? If they are bossy and rude they are more likely to be about quantity over quality. If they don't want to talk to you about your design or are unwilling to draw at all they are probably not artists and also not worth
- 3.) Find people who have current work from them. Portfolios can be photo shopped, or stolen. If you can, find people that the artist has actually tattooed you can see what their tattoos look like in the real world. Worst case scenario; you can usually fix a bad tattoo, you can't fix dying.
- 4.) All items should be single use or properly sterilized. Needles, ink, stencils, markers, caps, etc. are not re-usable at all. There are a myriad of bacteria and viruses that can be passed this way. Many people believe that if they are sexually active with someone that they can share a needle. This is not so, there are some diseases that can only be passed through the blood. Needles should never be stored on site or in your purse, cupboard, etc. for later reuse (i.e. "Your own needle"). Speed stick is not the answer for applying stencils. Inks should never be returned to the bottle after being dispersed. Single use is the only way to go.
- 5.) An ultrasonic cleaner should NEVER be used in a work station. If you see this leave immediately. Ultrasonic units put minute particles of contaminated water into the air if left uncovered. Contaminating items outside of the work area such as phones, radios, iPods, etc. Grabbing anything with bloody/ink stained gloves is a sign that they don't know what in the hell they are doing and you should leave.

I see many scratchers carrying "tattoo kits" with used equipment right in the same compartment as supposedly clean tools. Storing used items in the same container as "new" items defeats the whole purpose of having new items. There are many factors to take into consideration when it comes to getting a tattoo. Factors that are commonly unknown due to the private nature of the tattoo industry. That is why it is best to leave it to true professionals. It is illegal in the state of Michigan to operate as a tattooist or piercer outside of a health department licensed location.

I am not so slow as to believe this will stop anyone from doing it at a party or a clubhouse, nor do I truly believe that these laws will weed out anything but the worst shops. No matter where you choose to get a tattoo, please be safe about it.


