

When I saw her for the first time, it was just a running and working frame, tank, and rear-end. The front end was junk, and there wasn't much of a seat. It was in pretty bad

shape. But I just had to have it. You know how that feels—the feeling that it was just meant to be?

So, in 1993, I brought it from a bump-and-paint shop just down the road from me. A few bucks later and A LOT of heart and soul, my late-night project became a reality. Eventually she had her own identity. I call her Bell. She was born in the barn like I was. (But that's a story for another time).

Her transformation started out slow, as there was a lot that needed to be changed. In 1995, money and time were tight, and I needed to put her away for a while, as she wasn't getting the time and attention she deserved. She spent eighteen years

up in the hayloft of my barn before I had time to work on her again



In 2013, I started working on her again, and, thanks to God, I finished this time. I took an old whiskey barrel and turned it into a seat, then lined it with an old buffalo hide I tanned in the early 1980s. I have enough room inside the barrel for my tools, a coat, and even a first-aid kit. The buffalo on the front fender came from my grandkids. I fabricated the rear fender to match the front fender, but made it three inches wider. The suspension was assembled from parts on my scrap pile. The bumpers are leaf springs from an old 1950s truck. The shocks I got from an old bike that I used to ride; I liked them and felt they were a nice fit. I came across my seat completely by accident. It was tooled by a leather man in Flint, MI. I pulled up to his place on my trike, he looked at me and he said, "It looks like you need a seat; I made this one for you." He pulled it off the wall and that was

I choose red oxide primer for the paint because it just seemed like the perfect fit to me. Once everything started coming together, I just went with it. I wanted simple and cool, old-school style. So, what would I choose for the perfect front end? The 45 springer front end...what else?

I love to get feedback from the people as I go by. I love all the local contests and bike shows. They are a blast when I enter, and the trophies are adding up. I was influenced to build Bell by my love of the land, the buffalo and Harleys, of course! Bell was built with heart, soul, and lots of hours of love. There is definitely no other bike out there like her.

New Website Launches, Hoping to Connect More Veterans in Northern Michigan

A Michigan veteran organization is hoping its new website will help connect them to even more people in northern Michigan.

Project Cherry Tree was established last year and is an advocate for veterans' support issues in northern Michigan. They just launched their new website, which has lots of resources available for veterans, and also keeps people up to date with what they're doing. They're hoping the new site will help link people together.

"Working with our legislators and then working with those here locally will help make lasting impacts on those services and changes in those services that will benefit the nearly 68,000 veterans here in northern Michigan," said executive director Steven Chowen. Chowen says the new website was possible with funding from the Grand Traverse Band of Ottawa and Chippewa Indians and help from volunteers.

No More Jail Time in GR Vets Home Abuse Case

A former caregiver who was convicted of abusing a dementia patient at the Grand Rapids Home for Veterans has been sentenced.

Laurie Lyn Botbyl was sentenced to 56 hours on a work crew and ordered to pay fines and costs. She was also sentenced to one day in jail with credit for one day served, which means she will not spend any more time behind bars.

Police said surveillance video from March 27, 2016 showed Botbyl push a veteran—who had dementia and was in a wheelchair—into a desk as others watched and did nothing.

Botbyl lost her job after the incident. She was an employee of J2S, a muchcriticized private firm that used to provide caregivers at the Veterans Home. She was charged in February 2017 and convicted of misdemeanor fourth-degree vulnerable adult abuse in August.

WWII Soldier Buried as Unknown Overseas Comes Home to Michigan on Veterans Day

Family, friends and community members will gather this Veterans Day to honor an American hero who had been lost for more than seventy-five years.

It was Dec. 5, 1942 when Army Technician 4th Grade Peter (Mason) Counter was killed during a lethal firefight with Japanese forces near Soputa in present-day Papua, New Guinea. Following the battle, the 24-year-old man from Northern Michigan was hastily buried in an isolated grave north of the village, near the Sananada Track. His remains went unidentified for decades.

On Saturday, November 11, 2017, Counter's relatives will hold the ceremony he never received at Chagnon Funeral Home in Onaway, the city of less than 1,000 people where he was born on Jan. 25, 1918.

The remains of an unidentified American soldier, tentatively associated with Company C, 126th Infantry Regiment of the 32nd Infantry Division, were interred at the U.S. Temporary Cemetery #2 at Soputa.

In 1943, the remains, designated "Unknown X-10" were reinterred at Temporary Cemetery #1 at Soputa, then interred at U.S. Armed Forces Finschhafen #2, and redesignated "Unknown X-171."

In 1947, the American Graves Registration service exhumed approximately 11,000 graves, including X-171, which was re-designated to X-2693. The remains were shipped to the Central Identification Point at the Manila Mausoleum in the Philippines.

X-2693 could not be identified and those remains were interred at Fort McKinley, now the Manila American Cemetery and Memorial. His identity would remain a mystery for decades.

In 2012, through genealogy research, the Army contacted Counter's niece, Lavina Kollias, and asked her to submit a DNA sample.

DPAA received authorization to reexamine the remains in November, 2016. Unknown X-2693 was disinterred Nov. 4, 2016 and sent to the laboratory at Offutt Air Force Base in Nebraska for analysis.

Through forensic analysis using DNA, dental records, and circumstantial evidence, Counter's identity was confirmed on Aug. 2, nearly six years after initial contact with the family was made.

Counter returned home on November 8, his casket shrouded in an American flag, as military personnel removed his remains from an airplane.

John and Vivian Counter, the parents who sent their son to war, won't be at the service. Counter's two brothers, Glenn W. and John "Lee," and two sisters, Dorothy Counter and Lavina Dzieglawski, won't be present, either; they're all gone now. But a slew of his nieces and nephews will be.

Counter will be given full military honors on the Veterans Day occasion, which will begin at 11 a.m. with visitation and continue with the full ceremony at 1 p.m. He will also be honored during a ceremony at Onaway High School on Thursday.

He will then finally be laid to rest at Elmwood Cemetery, 21475 M-68 Highway, in Onaway, alongside his parents; brother, Glenn; sister, Dorothy; his grandparents, Sarah and Levi Rivers; and his uncle, Oakley Rivers.

WHAT HAPPENS TO MY PERSONAL EFFECTS AFTER A WRECK?

One of the most common questions I get after a wreck is "What about my damaged jeans, sunglasses, and helmet? Who pays for them?"

In Michigan, it depends. If the at-fault driver has insurance, then you can't sue him for these damages. You have to look at your own insurance coverage to determine whether or not you'll be compensated for your personal items.

Many insurance policies don't cover damage to personal effects, while some cover only safety gear, such as helmets. To really understand what your insurance policy covers, you need to read the contract in its entirety.

When you read your policy, look for indications that your personal effects are covered in the case of damage. If you can't find anything about insuring your personal items, call your insurer and find out where your policy stands.

Some insurance coverages that may apply to situations like this

Accessories Coverage

The term "accessory" may vary in definition between insurance companies, but a good rule of thumb is that a motorcycle accessory is anything that was not on the bike when it left the factory. Motorcycle accessories can include things like:

- · Saddlebags (the bags themselves, not the contents)
- Fairings
- Windshields
- · Light bars
- Helmets
- Riding apparel

Safety Gear Coverage

Safety apparel often includes your helmet, leather clothes, boots, and gloves. If you have safety gear coverage, then your insurance policy may cover these items in the case of an ac-

Personal Property Coverage

This type of coverage includes just about all of your personal belongings that you carry on your bike. Personal property coverage would come into play if these items are damaged, stolen, or lost. Items that fall under the personal property category can include phones, camping gear, or hunting gear.

What Does Personal Items Insurance Look Like?

There are a limited number of coverage types specifically for personal effects on motorcycles. Here are two different policies to give you an idea of what may be available to you:

The American Modern Insurance Company policy states: "Accessories: When you purchase full coverage, equipment you add to the bike that did not come from the manufacturer (as identified by the VIN) is covered separately, up to \$3,000. You can buy up to \$15,000 in coverage."

"Safety apparel: Our full-coverage policies provide \$1,000 coverage on approved clothing and helmets if damaged in an accident (\$400 limit per helmet). There is no deductible for the

Progressive offers a Carried Contents insurance coverage, and states, "Carried Contents coverage will pay for insured's owned personal property (such as hunting gear or camping gear) that is damaged, destroyed or stolen while using the insured vehicle. Coverage is subject to a \$250 deductible.'

Ask Before a Wreck

Ideally, you need to know what your insurance policy covers before loss or damage occurs. However, if you don't know what your policy covers and you've experienced the loss or damage of personal items, make a claim to your insurance company and ask them to cover the damage.

While the Carried Contents coverage seems superfluous—especially with a deductible of \$250—I do recommend buying accessories coverage if you customized your bike. In most cases, insurance policies won't cover those customizations.


If you're not clear on what your insurance policy covers, ask. It's always better to know your coverage than to get a nasty surprise after you've incurred loss or damage.



On the night of October 1, 2017, a gun- : for building a precision product with tight country music festival in an open-air venue. This might sound sick, but I admire Paddock's taste in guns. The AR-15s I saw in the pictures run about \$2K with the triple-stack hundred-round magazines, and the AR-10s are easily pushing \$3K. The manufacturer of these firearms has an outstanding reputation in the industry

man opened fire from the thirty-second tolerances and quality fit and finish-but floor of the Mandalay Bay Hotel in Las: this is where my gun envy ends. From Vegas, strafing the crowd attending a there, Paddock drives over the cliff. Adding bump stocks to these guns may have been self-defeating for the carnage he had envisioned, because the heat buildup from simulated full auto-fire was the probable reason police found more than one of them jammed and cast aside. Even ARs built for full auto-fire will "malf" due to the heat generated by sustained cyclic fire. I would bet dollars to donuts that Paddock ruined the guns he used. In that regard, he joins other : homicidal crazies, James Holmes (Aurora, Colorado shooter who killed twelve and wounded seventy in a crowded theater), and Jared Loughner (Tucson, Arizona shopping-center shooter who murdered six, including a federal judge, and wounded eleven, one of whom was Rep. Gabby Giffords), whose killing sprees were cut short because they didn't understand the limitations of either their firearms or the accessories they used.

once again, an unfortunate incident was: In every instance of a mass shooting, the anti-gun crowd can be found on broadcast media pontificating the righteousness of their demands for more restrictive gun legislation, up to and including repealing the Second Amendment, After Las Vegas, Hillary Clinton was one of the quickest to the microphone and declared war on high-powered assault rifles, machine guns, silenc-


ers, high-capacity magazines and the NRA. Her sentiments were echoed by wanna-be gun-grabbers across the nation.

In truth, all the noise they make proves the common denominator in the anti-gun movement; the adherents only have two moving parts-their mouths and their asses-and those are interchangeable. Typical "out-oftheir-ass talk" would be banning assault weapons, which nobody seems to be able to define. They don't know the difference between a machine gun and a full-autocapable firearm; firearm report can be suppressed, but not silenced; and extended magazines tend to reduce body counts. The NRA and other such organizations are all that stand between us and an overreaching government, ever since Bill Clinton and Janet Reno declared war on common people, with actions like Ruby Ridge and the Branch Davidian in Waco.

All the carnage in Las Vegas was over in twenty minutes, but the way I see it, the violence in South Chicago and many other large cities is a Mandalay Bay massacre in slow motion, and no gun control measure is ever going to stop it.

IN THE SHOP WITH RON

RACK YOU PACK

This month in the shop, we will be installing a luggage rack on the tour pack of a 2007 H-D Ultra Classic. It's an easy upgrade and it gives you a little more room to carry gear.

The procedure is pretty straightforward, but there are a couple of things to consider:

1. If your trunk has an under-the-lid organizer, you will have to remove it to install the luggage rack, and then reinstall the organizer.

2. If you have a spoiler on your trunk lid (or plan on installing one later) the rack will have to be mounted in a way so as to not interfere with the spoiler. The luggage rack kit we're using has a template included, so if you don't have a spoiler and plan on adding one later, you can mount the rack in its proper position and easily mount the spoiler at a later time.

On this bike, the owner has no intention of adding a spoiler, so we're just going to mount the rack on the lid in a centered front-to-rear and side-to-side position. This luggage rack kit comes with all necessary mounting hardware, including four black rubber grommets—one for each leg of the rack—to go between the rack and the painted surface of the lid. With the grommets on the legs of the rack, position the rack on the lid and make sure it is centered from front to rear and also from side to side. We have a little more freedom on this project because we are not going to be adding a spoiler.

Look at the luggage rack from all angles, to be sure it's where you want it. Using a china marker or wax pencil, mark one of the legs (we used the right rear) to use as a reference point.



Now we can set the rack aside for a minute. Next, using the reference mark on the lid, put down masking tape on either side of recessed area of lid at equal distances the length of the lid. Place the luggage rack on the tape (with grommets in place) and make sure it is centered front to rear and side to side. Make sure it's exactly where you want it.



Once the rack is positioned, if you have someone to help, have one person hold the rack firmly in position while the other person carefully draws the outline of each leg with a pencil on the masking tape.



Now find the center of each circle you drew on the masking tape. Be very careful—there is no room for error here; if the holes aren't centered, the mounting screws won't line up with the rack. The rack we're using has the option of adding a high-mount brake light/taillight, and the left rear (clutch side) mounting bolt is larger than the other three and is hollow in the center to allow routing of the wiring.

Drill a 1/8-inch pilot hole in the center of each circle you drew. The left rear hole needs to be 5/16-inch diameter and the other three holes need to be 1/4-inch diameter. Before drilling any holes, I like to open the trunk and lay a towel down inside to catch any shavings that may fall inside. Drill gently, or when the drill breaks through the surface of the lid it will be dragged down quickly and if you're not careful, you

will scratch the painted surface of the lid. Remove the masking tape.

Now, with the grommets on the legs, carefully set the rack on the lid. I like to use a little silicone sealant between the grommets and the legs, and between the grommets and the painted surface of the lid. Use sealant sparingly; too much will cause the sealant to squeeze out and make a mess.

Start the bolts from the underside of the lid and tighten in a cross pattern—each bolt a little at a time—until tight.



The bolts in this kit are new and have a lock patch on them; if you're installing a used rack or reusing bolts, use a dab of Loctite on each one. Remember, the left rear bolt is larger and hollow to accommodate wiring for lights.


