





Michigan to start major revamp of veterans nursing homes

Michigan is starting a major revamp of how nursing care is provided to veterans, with plans to ultimately transition from two homes in the western and far-northern regions to seven new, smaller ones spread across the state.

The initiative — billed as the most substantial change to the system since the first veterans home opened in Grand Rapids 131 years ago — stems from new, bipartisan state laws that officials say will lead to higher-quality care for more veterans. Talks began last year after a state audit uncovered insufficient care, inadequate staffing levels and other problems at the Grand Rapids Home for Veterans.

That home and one in Marquette, which opened in 1981, provide primarily nursing care to more than 500 veterans. They often choose to live there because the government- subsidized care costs them no more than \$4,300 a year.

The homes also are seen as more equipped to treat a population with higher rates of mental health, substance abuse and behavioral problems than at private facilities. But the large, institutional veteran's homes need to be replaced in favor of smaller scale housing and expanded to other parts of the state, state officials say.

"If that were to come to fruition, we would be providing care much closer to where the veterans live now, and their families are going to be closer to them," said James Redford, who Republican Gov. Rick Snyder named to lead the Michigan Veterans Affairs Agency in February 2016 as part of a shakeup after the critical audit was released. He said Snyder told him: "Fix the homes."

In recent weeks, the agency applied for roughly \$66 million in federal funding to help build a new home in the Detroit area and to replace and downsize the one in Grand Rapids. A third of the state's 640,000 veterans live in Wayne, Oakland and Macomb counties.

A \$42 million state match for the two projects was approved by Snyder and the Legislature months ago.

The application also outlines a plan to build five more facilities in phases — first in the Flint/Saginaw/Bay City area, next the Jackson/Battle Creek region, then a replacement of the Marquette home, followed by one in the northern Lower Peninsula and finally another in metro Detroit.

Multi-story, hospital-like buildings would be jettisoned for modern houses that are more like a real "home." Ten to 14 residents in a large house would each have an individual bedroom and bathroom, surrounding a common living and dining area with a kitchen.

Overseeing the facilities' site locations, construction and operations is the new Michigan Veterans' Facility Authority, which was created under a law enacted in January and whose nine-member board met this past week for the first time.

Trump signs new VA executive order

President Donald Trump signed an executive order authorizing the formation of an Office of Accountability and Whistleblower Protection. Trump said that the new office would not only investigate wrongdoing, but also enable Secretary of Veterans Affairs David Shulkin to hold VA employees accountable for misconduct.

"Accountability is an important issue to us at VA and something that we're focusing on to make sure that we have employees who work and are committed to the mission of serving our veterans," Shulkin said in a public statement. "And when we find employees that have deviated from these values, we want to make sure that we can move them outside of VA and not have them working at VA."

The House of Representatives has already passed a bill to enable the VA secretary to fire, reassign or suspend poorly performing employees. The Senate also has similar legislation under consideration.

"Secretary Shulkin has carried out a very thorough review of the VA to uncover all of the problems and challenges that we inherited, of which there were so many," Trump said during a press conference after he signed the executive order. "Based on those findings, we're putting plans in place to fix those problems and give our veterans the health care they need and the health care they deserve. Much work lies ahead, but we will not rest until this job is totally done." Earlier last month, Shulkin relieved the Washington DC VA Medical Center's director following the release of an inspector general report, which stated that veterans receiving care at the facility were exposed to "unnecessary risks" due to unsanitary conditions and inadequate supplies.



The Motorcycle Lawyer on THE LAW

THE DAVID & GOLIATH CASE: MOTORCYCLISTS & SEMI TRUCKS

Not too long ago, I settled a case involving a semi-truck hitting a motorcyclist. At the initial meeting with my client, they told me that they felt overwhelmed and overpowered by the multi-million dollar trucking company.

I'd like to say that those feelings are out of the ordinary, but they're not. Unfortunately, one of the common things I see in cases involving a motorcycle and a semi-truck is intimidation.

After a semi-truck is involved in an accident, the trucking company will send its team of insurance investigators, crash experts, and accident reconstructionists to the scene of the crash. This team looks at the scene, obtains witness statements, gathers evidence, and does its best to determine that the fault doesn't lay with the trucker.

Many companies spend tens of thousands of dollars on these teams, attempting to construct a one-sided story. Not surprisingly, many motorcyclists end up behind the 8 ball when facing a trucking company. When I work with motorcyclists who have been involved in semi-truck accidents, I draw on my own team of accident investigation experts to level the playing field.

In one of my most recent trucking cases, my client was riding his motorcycle to work very early in the morning. He was in the far-right lane driving next to a semi-truck when the truck driver attempted a right turn from the second lane, not the dedicated right lane.

During the case, the defense lawyers wanted to use the belief that most laypeople hold – that there are blind spots along the side of a tractor-trailer. Because I had assembled a strong and knowledgeable team to work on the investigation, we were able to demonstrate that there was not a blind spot in the area in question. The truck driver's defense crumbled and my client won the case.

I want to advise motorcyclists to take measures to protect themselves when driving near semi-trucks because so many truck drivers drive sleepy, distracted, and negligently. First, assume that the truck driver can't see you. Even if you're in the most obvious place in the road, don't make the assumption that the driver is aware you're there. Assume that if you can't see the driver's eyes, then he probably can't see you.

Second, if you are in the right lane approaching an intersection, be prepared that the tractor-trailer may attempt a right turn from the second lane, as this type of turn is easier for the truck driver. It allows him to minimize the chance that his trailer may go across the corner of land that is off the road.

Third, don't move in front of a tractor-trailer unless you provide more distance than you reasonably think is necessary. Remember that semi-trucks need more time and distance to stop, especially when they're carrying a heavy load.

Finally, be careful when you're driving behind a semi-truck. They often kick up rocks and other potentially fatal road debris. Be sure to leave extra space between your motorcycle and the truck to give yourself time to react.



HISTORIC FEMALE RIDERS



The following is the first in a four-part series showcasing 12 female riders with historic significance.

Bessie Stringfield



Facts: Founder of the Iron Horse Motorcycle Club, she fought through the barriers of being a black, female motorcycle rider and became an Army motorcycle dispatch rider in WWII. She became an AMA Hall of Fame Member in 2002.

As a teenager, Bessie made a name for herself by traveling around the United States on a perpetual quest for adventure. In 1929 she became the first African-American woman to travel across the US alone, on a motorcycle. According to the legend, Bessie started riding as a teen and would flip a coin onto a map of the US and then ride to that point. Truly a free spirit, Bessie even spent time as a stunt rider in regional carnivals and was known for her signature move of standing on the seat of one of the 27 Harley Davidson motorcycles she owned over the years. She is also credited with eight transcontinental rides and is supposed to have ridden through all lower 48 states.

This charismatic gal fought through a lot of obstacles along the way including the fact that she was a black woman and she was a woman riding a motorcycle by herself.

She toured the deep-south, where racism was prevalent and dangerous for anyone of color, but she deserves credit for doing as she darn well pleased on her mission to share her joy of riding with anyone she came in contact with.

Adeline van Buren's effort from 20-years earlier paid off for Bessie when she managed to become a civilian Army motorcycle dispatch rider in WWII. She even won a flat track race while disguised as a man, of course, she was refused her prize money once she took her helmet off and revealed her true gender, but she had proved her point. Women can really ride. In the 1950s she made Miami her home and continued to ride, tour and enjoy life on two wheels. She also became a nurse and founded the Iron Horse MC Club. In the years that followed she became known as the 'Motorcycle Queen of Miami'.

Linda Dugeau



Facts: Founder of the Motor Maids, she was inducted to the AMA Motorcycle Hall of Fame in 2004.

Linda starting riding in 1932 and the tales of her riding adventures graced the pages of many of the leading motorcycle publications at the time. Dugeau had a real knack for riding as she used motorcycles to get to and from college, and later as part of her daily commute through the sketchy city streets of Boston. In yet another example of the old six-degrees of separation, she met a fellow female rider who made her aware of the famous 99 Club made up entirely of female pilots (Remember, Gussie van Buren was both a 99 and a woman rider). In 1938, she initiated a campaign to form a women's motorcycle club. She spent the better part of a decade petitioning females who owned and rode their own motorcycles to join her club until a fortuitous meeting with Dot Robinson helped it all come together.

The pair made it their three year-long mission to recruit 50 female riders who owned and rode their own motorcycles. Eventually, the Motor Maids of America was established in 1940 with Dugeau as founder and Robinson serving as club President. The club was awarded it official AMA Charter in 1941, making it the oldest AMA recognized motorcycle club for women in the USA. The Motor Maids gained popularity rapidly through their regular participation in AMA races and events. The members, dressed in their signature long white gloves, would parade on the race courses much to the delight of men and women alike. Linda Dugeau would be inducted to the AMA Hall of Fame in 2004.

Pearl Hoel



Facts: Known as the First Lady of Sturgis, Pearl and her husband Pappy founded the legendary Sturgis Rally and was inducted into the AMA Hall of Fame in 1991.

Pearl is not on this because of her amazing riding feats, instead she makes the cut because of her contribution to the motorcycle industry. As a recognized pillar of the community and long-time member of the Sturgis municipalities, she was instrumental in getting the townsfolk of Sturgis to accept her husband's wild ideas. It's a good thing they did as their annual motorcycle rally attracts riders from all across the United States to their little piece of heaven in the Black Hills. Her husband gets the official credit for forming the Jackpine Gypsies Motorcycle Club and the Black Hills Motor Classic event, but the story is that Pearl had the influence that made it all happen. Basically, she was the glue that held all the many complicated pieces together and allowed the Sturgis Rally to persevere and grow. Her reputation and influence over the wives of the local businessman was a key ingredient to the recipe for success.

The couple established their Indian Motorcycle Dealership which was the conduit to the creation of the Jackpine Gypsies, men-only club for the folks who bought Indians from the dealership. In 1937 the Gypsies invited the Rapid City Pioneers Motorcycle Club to Sturgis for the inaugural Black Hills Motor Classic and the rest as they say, is history. The Sturgis business owners were happy to see the people coming into the town from all over, just to participate in the event and together with the Hoel family, they laid the foundation for what is arguably the most recognized motorcycle rally on the planet.

What started as a handful of enthusiasts riding around the old horse flat track for fun and camping in the backyard of the Hoel residence has evolved into an event that brings in a half-million riders to the region. As the years went by, the Sturgis Rally grew beyond anyone's wildest expectations, and Pearl has served as the constant presence through it all. She was also the conduit to the original history of the rally, responsible for telling tales, recounting facts and sharing that information with anyone, journalists in particular, who asked for her help. She was active in the rally until the day she passed away in 2005 at the age of 99 and was inducted into the AMA Motorcycle Hall of Fame in 1991. She will always be known as the "First Lady of Sturgis."

The first six women highlighted were all women who deserve to be recognized for the pioneering effort and riding spirit in the early years of motorcycle history. The transcontinental rides, the breakthrough in women's rights and the formation of clubs and events like Sturgis are all huge accomplishments that deserve to be remembered. The funny thing is, that each of them started out with a simple passion for motorcycles. It's the same burning desire to feel the win on our face and that freedom and independence that exemplifies what it means to ride a motorcycle.

We will continue to ride the way-back machine for a little while longer by taking a peek at the accomplishments of a few ladies that know a thing or two about twisting a more modern throttle. As the decades transitioned from the 50s and 60s to the 70s and 80s the emphasis on riders that have done memorable things seems to have revolved around racing exploits. For that reason, the next batch of battling beauties starts with a few gals who made a name for themselves by riding a motorcycle a few miles per hour beyond its limits.

about. After all, how can you miss the giant Bud Light tree down by the shower trailer?





Bike Week Jack Pine BY Chelsey Clemens

It was September of 1966. The Jack Pine Enduro Race is about to take place. The two day event would start in Lansing, MI near the steps of the Capitol Building. The race route would take riders north into West Branch. MI for the overnight stay before heading back down south to Lansing for the finish. The whole route was 526 miles long, better known as the 500 mile race.

Ron Sape was one of the participants that year, riding a Harley Sprint. A 250cc, 4 cylinder motorcycle with dual sport tires. Fancy riding gear was something unheard of for Ron. So he turned to his trusty blue jeans and lace up boots. Ron would wrap duct tape around the bottoms of his jeans to prevent any sand or mud from getting into his boots. There was no reason to purchase a pair of goggles either when glasses worked just fine. Ron finished 25th out of the 88 riders in his class that year, due to some handlebar difficulties.





The Jack Pine Enduro Race is not like any other race. Riders dealt with numerous obstacles and diverse terrain. They would guide their motorcycles through rivers, deep sand, up and down hills, through mud, and tangled underbrush. This meant that not everyone who started the race finished it. The race used a system of checkpoints, and each rider had a "time card" to keep track of their progress. Points were awarded or deducted based on arriving at the check point on time, late or early. Ron would always agree that if you can't be on time to a checkpoint, it was always better to be a little late. The penalty was less for being late rather than being early. The race winners would traditionally receive a cowbell, but later they would incorporate a trophy as well.

In 1966, the outlaw motorcycle clubs were very thick. They would ride north for the Jack Pine and other stuff, just to rip and tear. As they would come through, Sheriff's deputies would escort them from one county to the next in hopes of preventing any riff raff. Unfortunately, there were some shenanigans happening in West Branch that night involving the clubs, riders, and alcohol. A rider was going down a side street and hit a bridge abutment, which sent him into a telephone pole. The crash was fatal and resulted in no Jack Pine the following year, 1967.



In 1968, the Jack Pine was moved to Reedsburg Dam, west of Houghton Lake, as the starting point. The race was cut down to 400 miles, and was all new trails, which took a toll on the riders. Ron had his 250cc Sprint and was riding with John Penton, riding a 125cc Penton, and Jerry Yoder, riding a 250cc Bultaco. John would ride past Ron and Jerry with no problem, even with a smaller motored bike. When John's bike needed a spark plug replaced. Ron and Jerry thought this was their chance to get ahead of him. Within 5 miles, John had replaced his spark plug and passed Ron and Jerry. The two could not figure out how John was passing them when they had bigger bikes. It never occurred to them that John

The next year, Ron upgraded his bike to a Penton, after trying to do modifications to his Sprint, which resulted in a screwed up timing and twisted crank. The Penton made racing like cheating, it was light and had the best of everything. Before the end of the summer, Ron would become an A Rider and he never switched from Penton motorcycles. Later, the Penton would become KTM.

Ron has had many memorable years racing in the Jack Pine Enduro Race. His first year was definitely the worst, because he knew so little. Another year, he had gotten a stick stuck up his nose, which caused it to bleed profusely. But, the race that stuck out the most was the year Ron rode with a busted up shoulder from a previous fall. Everything was working fine on his bike, including the headlights, so he decided to ride through the night. Once nightfall hit,



the headlights were no longer working. Ron rode through the dark alongside a powerline until he hit asphalt. That was when a vehicle came up behind him and offered to follow Ron to town. A little ways up the road, the bike ran out of gas. Ron proceeded to hitch a ride with the stranger into town to meet with his team. That was the only year his wife was not with him, and one of the two years Ron did not finish the race. Ron raced 29 Jack Pine events and finished 27 of them.





The 2017 Triumph Bonneville Bobber Is Custom Looks Without The Custom Headache

The long-standing hot rod concept just got re-imagined BY Bradley Adams October 19, 2016 ~ COURTESY OF Cycle World & Triumph



Other noteworthy updates include a shock that's mounted underneath the seat and works on a specially designed linkage, plus updated fork that's shorter than the T120's, "Which we can do because there will only ever be one person on the bike," Triumph says. Less weight means you need less travel for the same level of compliance and bump absorption.

Like the rest of the bikes in the Bonneville lineup, it will come with everything from riding modes (Road and Rain) to switchable traction control, ABS, and a torque-assist clutch.

Color options include Ironstone (with a matte finish), Morello Red, Stunning Competition Green and Frozen Silver, and Jet Black.

riumph's roots may have been laid in the UK, but the British company isn't afraid to look elsewhere for inspiration when designing new models. The 2017 Bonneville Bobber is proof. It's also a really, really cool addition to the current Bonneville line.

Inspired by the American-born bobbers that grew to popularity in the 1930s-on, the 2017 Bobber has a low stance, stripped back, and seat that's actually adjustable between two positions—low and back, and high and forward.

Bobbers have always been about light weight (that's the reason for ditching the fenders and unnecessary body panels) and big power, so Triumph has updated the power delivery on the Bobber, too. Its 1200cc high-torque engine is the same specs-wise, but electronic updates and a new dual airbox/filter design enables it to produce more torque and power down low, when compared to the T120.

To complete the bobber look, Triumph has outfitted this Bonneville with caged swingarm, battery box with stainless steel strap, bar end mirrors, wide/flat handlebar, and rear mudguard loop. The tank is actually reshaped when compared to the T120, too; it's smaller and more compact.



Triumph will offer over 150 accessories for the Bonneville Bobber, including the high 'ape hanger' bars shown on the bike to the right. Cool? We think so, even if our shoulders don't.

Perhaps coolest is that The Bonneville Bobber has been designed with customizing in mind, and that there are over 150 accessories available for more style, comfort, and performance. My favorite? You might judge me, but it's actually the high 'ape hanger' bars, which look awesome and should actually work okay with my longer arms.

For those wanting more performance, there's also a new FOX shock and Vance and Hines exhausts, which come with direction-adjustable aluminum end caps.

I actually had the chance to see and sit on the Bobber ahead of Triumph's official unveil and will say that the bike sounds awesome with the stock exhausts, which are shorter and lighter than the ones on the T120, and have a slash-cut design for better sound and look



The Bobber's seat can be adjusted to a low/back position or high/forward position within minutes. Just loosen the main bolt holding the seat in position and slide it to the desired position.

In person, the Bobber looks well thought-out. Everything from the wire-spoked wheels wrapped in specially developed Avon Cobra tires (narrow front, wide rear) fits the bobber persona.

In a lot of ways, it's everything I liked about the Harley-Davidson® Low Rider S; it has that custom look, but doesn't come with the custom headache. Triumph says, "It's still riding a Triumph, with emphasis on handling, just a special look."

It definitely won't appeal to everyone, but I think the Bobber really will turn some heads. I've got a buddy or two that I think will fall in love with this bike. And I don't think they'll be alone, either.



ABATE

The month of April was so darn hectic with all the visits back and forth to Lansing, expecting to get help from our State Representatives regarding safety and awareness HB 4306. Most of us know how hard it is to get something accomplished in Lansing. It seems like everyone has a better idea than those who sponsor a bill and most of the time they don't really know what the wording or reason for it is. It is very frustrating. According to Vince, this is what happened. We had pizza and pop for all the Representatives and ended up with 24 co-sponsors in the House. We pushed for a hearing in the House Transportation Committee and got it. We ended up with 14 yes and 0 no. The House was getting ready to go on Spring Break and we got the word there would be no vote before the house break. Vince and Jim bumped into the floor leader and he asked why not? The bill was brought up in the House Republican Caucus where there was opposition to the bill. Those against it called it a tax increase. It's not a tax. It's an increase in a user fee to protect the user. No general State funds will go into the motorcycle safety awareness fund. The 2nd component of the bill will raise the motorcycle plate fee from \$23.00 to \$25.00 with the \$2.00 going to the current motorcycle safety fund. On page 3 of the second draft of the bill the State will create a "Look Twice Save A Life" program with \$2.50 per "original" motorcycle endorsement and \$2.00 on a four year motorcycle endorsement "renewal" which is 50 cents per year. ABATE's alternative to a mandatory helmet law is tougher licensing, motorcycle safety and car driver awareness of motorcycles. We need a push from everyone who rides to contact your Representative and let them know it's time to take action. Biker's lives do matter.

ABATE has it's annual Freedom Rally coming on May 31st in Lansing, so please do all that you can to be there. It is very important for the State Reps to see us there in full force. It's been 5 years of riding free, so please don't take it for granted. Be proud and be there. Freedom wasn't free.

May is Motorcycle Awareness Month. If there is anything I could do for you to help spread the word, please call me or get a hold of someone from ABATE. They will know how to help you.

I have been teaching drivers education classes for a couple of years now and the other day at the dinner table I asked my granddaughter and her friend who was in the class with her, if there is one thing you remember about the class what would it be? Their answer was almost identical – You can't judge how fast a motorcycle is traveling towards you. So if you are making a left turn in front of a motorcycle just wait a couple more seconds and let the motorcycle go by and then turn. Who says educating young drivers doesn't work!

For some reason this early in the riding season there have been too many close calls and deer crashes. Please be alert and drive defensively. We as bikers also have a responsibility to drive safely.

If you would like to be a part of ABATE, there are 22 Regions in Michigan. Just go to the ABATE website and look up what's going on. Join our non-profit organization to help all bikers regardless of what club or organization you belong to. We help preserve and protect your rights as much as we can.

IN THE SHOP WITH RON

VIBRATIONS

Hope everyone has been able to enjoy some of this beautiful early-season riding weather that we've had. With the unseasonable warm weather and late frosts it has helped to keep the bug populations to a minimum (so far). This month in the shop we will be replacing the motor mounts on a 2000 H-D Dyna Wide-Glide. This motor mount set-up is referred to as rubber mounted; meaning one bracket mounts to the motor, another bracket is mounted to the frame, and the two brackets are joined together by a very dense heavy duty rubber material. The purpose of this is to help absorb the vibrations of the motor. Over time this rubber can deteriorate and/or tear. often causing some very bad vibrations.



The front mount is especially prone to fail due to road debris thrown from the front tire; also it is almost impossible to change the oil filter without getting a little residual oil on the mount. When the front mount gets bad, it puts increased stress on the rear mount, which is why when the front goes bad, I prefer to change the front and rear motor mounts at the same time. In order to replace the motor mounts we need to support the motorcycle by the frame, while still being able to raise the motor slightly in order to allow removal of the old mounts. I use a support stand on the frame and a screw jack with a small block of wood on the motor.



The front mount is relatively easy, there are two 9/16 hex head bolts going through the motor mount and the front of the engine case and two 5/16 allen head bolts through the front cross brace of the frame.



Loosen all 4 bolts just about halfway then using screw jack raise the motor just enough to allow the old mount to slide out from the bottom, and then remove all four bolts, slide the new mount in place and start, but don't tighten bolts at this time. Be very careful when raising the motor with the screw jack too far, because the motor could hit the bottom of the tank, causing damage to the tank or to the wiring or worse, take the weight off the stand supporting the frame, thus causing a very tippy and extremely DANGEROUS situation. When replacing just the front mount, remove the screw jack supporting the motor and using red Loctite (my preference) tighten all four motor mount bolts to the MFG. specs. If replacing both mounts, leave the front mount loose until rear mount is replaced. The rear

mount is a bit more difficult, mostly because of its extremely tight access. Unfortunately, the confined space does not allow any decent photos. The rear mount is located at the rear of the transmission in front of the rear wheel. Remove the lower belt guard to access the bolts that go through the transmission case (9/16 hex) the other two bolts (5/16 allen) are directly in front of the rear

For the front, have the screw jack as close to the front as possible and to the rear for the rear mount. Loosen all four bolts part way and raise the motor slightly to allow removal of the old mount. Install the new mount and start all four bolts part-way, remove the screw jack, then tighten all the bolts on the front and rear mounts and use red Loctite and tighten to the MFG. specs.

I have chosen this name for our monthly recipe page, as that was what my mother, rest her soul, always used to say when I would assist her in the kitchen.

Mom was an avid supporter of the K.I.S.S. (KEEP IT SIMPLE SWEETIE) method of cooking. I now, more than ever, truly appreciate her philosophy of always taking shortcuts where you can, as long as your ultimate outcome is that of down home, labor of love cooking.

BACKYARD GRILL TIPS

During Spring & Summer, we use our grill for almost every supper. Here's some time proven tips that truly make a difference.

SIMPLE, MEAT MARINADE: AT LEAST 5 GENERATIONS STRONG!

Always let your meat be room temperature. Cold meat does not absorb a marinade easily. But light your grill and let it get good & hot. I've used this marinade my entire life for steak and it's literally been used for 5 generations back that my Mom could recall......and it's so incredibly simple:

Take room temp. steaks and squeeze mustard all on one side; rub it in good, making sure to get the sides.

Then, drizzle Worcestershire Sauce all over top of the mustard. This is when you add any spices you want; salt & pepper (we add this again slightly when actually grilling too), garlic powder if you like it. Now, just let it sit for only 5 minutes. That's it. That simple. There's something in the ingredients of the mustard (which has been around over 100 years) & the Worcestershire Sauce (which has been around over 100 years) that when combined, make up for a perfect meat tenderizer. You do not taste the mustard one single bit after grilling but the flavor you do get is truly amazing. Make sure that you "let your meat rest" when you take it off the grill or anytime you cook meat. I add a sprinkle of parsley, just for freshness. Just give it a solid 5 minutes and those juices get sucked back into the meat. Don't ever put your meat on a cardboard paper plate as those just absorb all your juices. Use an actual plate or the coated stock paper plates.

GET CREATIVE WITH GRILL BUNDLES!

Anything you can cook on top of your stove, you can put in a grill bundle; Just use the high-quality heavy aluminum foil. Place on low heat on grill and let go long and slow. Gives you time for a few beers.

Brown Rice, Shrimp & Snap Peas and a pat of butter.

Sear your **Kielbasa** off quick, slice in 1 inch pieces then place in a bundle of sliced thin **onions & peppers, thin sliced potatoes** & a pat of butter.

Take **Frozen X-Large Shrimp** from any major grocery store and the quartered size of frozen corn on cob pieces, double up alum. foil, making a bowl shape with high siders, add ingredients and sprinkle McCormick's **Caribbean Seasoning**, roll up your bundle nice and tight and let it go for about 15 minutes over medium heat.

Phenomenal!

Grill off **Pork Chops** really quick on high heat, turn heat down to low. Add your fave veggie; frozen peas or frozen squash. We like to add a can of **sliced apples**, a couple pinches of cinnamon and a pat of butter. Wrap tight, let it go for 15 mins. over med. heat. Delish! Then we do our veggie off to the side; (be sure and spray your grill with non-stick butter or olive oil before laying veggies down) **big slices of squash**; cut lengthwise, big thick **slices of onion**, **long slices of eggplant**, whole carrots cut in half and placed flat down, **whole ears of corn on the cob still in the husk**. Just pull down your husks gently, slather butter all over the ear of corn; salt & pepper and gently push the husks back up in place and grill over low heat. After about 10 minutes, pull down the husks again and let the corn get some good grill marks. Serve with husks back up. Crazy Good!

The thing is to just think outside of your kitchen. If you can cook it inside, you can cook it on your grill. Even pasta bundles on the grill.

I am a BIG lover of grilling fruit and then drizzling a sauce, honey or ice cream over top. Grilled fruit is amazing because when it's caramelized on the grill, it enhances all its' pure flavors:


GRILLED BANANNAS: Cut bananas length-wise and on a low grill that's been sprayed with butter, lay them down, sprinkle with a mixture of brown sugar & cinnamon, flip, remove and drizzle with either melted Hershey's chocolate sauce or hot melted caramel sauce (both in the ice-cream aisle at any grocery).


GRILLED PEACHES: I use whole, fresh peaches, cut down the middle, remove pit, leave on just enough to get grill marks, sprinkle with cinnamon & sugar mix, remove, drizzle with heated marshmallow

GRILLED PINEAPPLE: Cut the pre-cut ones' from your Deli in the tall plastic container. These are big, thick-cut pieces. Sprinkle w/ cinnamon & sugar mix; get good grill marks, remove and add a couple small scoops of quality Vanilla Bean ice-cream.



hunters are much better at creating legend than fishermen ever dreamed of being! Maybe it's time for some of us (you) to work on the skills needed to remedy one of the chief causes of "the one that got away syndrome" - poor marksmanship and bring that big buck home for a change!

A few months back. I wrote about how "good hunters" prepare for the season well ahead of opening day, but "great hunters" literally plan for their hunt year round. With good weather upon us, it's time to start heading to the range on a regular basis to hone those skills to become a "one shot, one kill" hunter. I hear your collective groan over the cost of "Bambi bustin' rounds," a buck round (pun intended) and up, but there are ways to manage your shooting budget and increase your proficiency at the same time. All practice is good practice as long as you focus on the fundamentals of sight picture, breath control, hold control trigger control and follow through with every round. On the range the Marine Corp drilled "B-R-A-S-S" into our young green skulls full of mush to the point where each shot was walked through a mental check list of Breath, Relax, Aim, Stop. Squeeze, and by God it works!

Sighting is nothing more than having your focus in the right place. Iron sights require you to focus on the front sight blade as you acquire your sight picture. where with an optic your focus is on the cross hair or the red dot and not on the target. Too many deer are wounded or completely missed every year, because hunters focus on the animal and not the sights, often leading to a panicked trigger slap and less than poor accuracy. Get into the habit of taking a full breath in and slowly letting about half of it out as you raise your firearm, or lay into the stock if you are using a rest, and look specifically for your sights, rather than picking up on the target, then finding them. Taking in the breath and letting part of it go slows you pulse, settles your nerves and helps reduce the movement you see in your sights. Breath control has to be part of your practice regiment.

Hold control means doing everything necessary to minimize the movement of the sights as you line up your shot. One of the biggest mistakes shooters make in their "hold" is how and where they establish their cheek weld on the stock. Good shooters have their cheek pressed tightly to the stock and as close as :

A good firm well positioned cheek, weld forward on the stock, allows your head to ride the recoil, keeping the scope away from your eye as long as the stock is tight to your shoulder. Do it any other way and you

the numbers based on a Maybe the hardest fundamental to learn is proper trigger control, which is also the single most critical element in consistent shot placement. Even when using a rest, poor trigger technique is going to show up down range and that is not the fault of the gun or sights. If we treated our children the same way, that too many shooters pull the trigger, we would be jailed for child abuse in the first degree, and end up social outcasts living on the fringe of society. If you fear you may be a serial trigger abuser, take heart because doctor shoot good is in the house.

> Proper trigger technique is an awful lot like making love; it ain't gonna happen if you can't get past first base. The trick is to snuggle up tight to the stock, like you were going to kiss her on the ear, look lovingly into the sights, and then softly place your finger on the trigger and caress it ever so softly (slowly increasing the pressure) just like that special spot in the small of her back until she sighs and surrenders to your will. By learning how to properly seduce the trigger, you become the master and the firearm is your faithful servant.


Here is a drill to improve your trigger control. Because of the cost of ammo, I suggest you set up a .22 cal rifle with sights similar to your deer gun and make this the primary tool for trigger practice. Post a plain sheet of dull finish paper as a target at a range, about 10 feet from your shooting position. Shooting from a bench and off a sandbag (or similar rest), fire one shot into the center of the paper, this bullet hole becomes your target for the drill. Now, using the rest with proper hold and cheek weld on the stock, aim at that first bullet hole. Then, fire several shots in a row, taking in a full breath and letting it out part way with each shot. Chances are you will not be hitting that first hole as you shoot, especially with an optic, but what you are looking for is a nice tight single hole made by all of the succeeding shots. If you are not getting that single hole, post a new piece of paper and start again, and stav focused on the sights and slow down your trigger pull until you are getting that tight single hole grouping. Once you become consistent in your trigger pull, move on to more traditional targets, the smaller the better. Anybody can hit a 6 in bull's eve at twenty five vards, but it takes some skill to hit an inch and a half dot at the same range; and when you think you are Billy or Betty bad ass stand up and try it off hand. Don't rush to take the deer rifle to the range, have fun with this for a while, but when the big gun comes out, start with the same drill and seduce that trigger!

GROUP RIDING

Riding a motorcycle is a great deal of fun, but it is a lot more fun when you have a few friends to ride with. Riding in a group does however have its own set of challenges. The first is communication. Anyone who has ridden in a group knows that it is difficult to talk to other riders while you are riding, unless everyone has an Intercom system. Although an intercom system is probably the best form of on bike communication, not every rider has one. Therefore it is important that the riders in a group have a set of basic hand signals so that they can communicate effectively while they are on the road. Each group should have at least a basic set of signals that can easily convey issues ranging from the need to stop (gas, restroom/ rest break, and bike problems) to warnings (police, debris/ road hazards, and direction changes).

Another problem while riding in a relatively large group (approximately 6 or more riders) is keeping the group together. Things such stop lights/ stop signs and other vehicles on the road tend to create chaos for the cohesive nature of a group. There will be instances when a group may be broken up into smaller groups:

- Only a portion of the group makes it through a light before it changes
- Turning at an intersection allows other vehicles to divide the group
- · Not all riders can pass a vehicle(s) safely
- Mechanical problem/ rider falls at the middle or near the back of the group

What can the Leader(s) of the group do to keep this from happening? There are a few things that the riders can do to keep their group together as well as make their ride safer. As the lead rider approaches a light that is about to change, he/she has a few options:


- If there is enough space & time and it is safe to do so, slowdown and let the light change before the group arrives
- Pull over after passing the light or slow down so that the rest of the group can catch up without having to do excessive speeds

When passing slower traffic:

- Do not pass until there is enough room for all riders to pass (if the group is relatively small)
- After passing a vehicle, make enough room for the riders behind you. You don't want to stand another rider in "no man's land" (the wrong side of the yellow line) with oncoming traffic

The most important thing that a group can do to make their ride more enjoyable and safer is to be organized. The entire group should know the destination of the ride, as well as the route being taken. Also there should be designated rest stop as well as meeting spots in case the group does get separated. What this does is take pressure of riders who are separated from the rest of the group. Riders will be less inclined to ride over their heads in an effort to try and catch up/ keep up with the group, if they know that everyone will be waiting for them at a certain gas station, restaurant etc. up the road. This is particularly true of newer riders, who might be uncomfortable with the pace set by more experienced riders in the group. Cell phones are also a good idea in case of an emergency (fall, mechanical failure, etc.); the rest of the group can be contacted and kept apprised of the situation.

Group Riding 101



When riding in a group the riders should ride in what is called "Staggered Formation", diagram 5.1 depicts this staggered formation in action. As we can see the leader is in the left portion of the lane (blocking position). The next rider is 1 second behind the leader, in the right portion of the lane. The third rider is in the left portion of the lane, 2 seconds behind the leader and 1 second behind the second rider. And the forth rider is 2 seconds behind the second rider.

The easiest way to judge following distance is by using time. While following a vehicle, choose a stationary object up ahead (a tree, sign, light standard, etc.) As the vehicle in front of you passes the object, start

etc.). As the vehicle in front of you passes the object, start counting until you pass the same object. Ideally you want a minimum of two seconds between you and the rider directly in front of you.

Note: The lead rider should always assume the blocking position for the lane that the group is riding in, when the group changes lanes then the leader should again assume the blocking position and the other riders stagger themselves accordingly.

This "Staggered Formation" provides safety for a group in two ways:

• **Size** – the group is more compact, you can imagine how long this group of 4 riders would be if they were riding

single file. The last rider would be off the diagram. Also the more spread out a group is the more it invites car drivers to attempt to merge between riders

 Space – every rider in the group has a safety cushion around him/ her, 2 seconds in front and behind as well as room to maneuver from side to side to avoid debris, potholes etc.

Note: There will be situations when it will be safer for the group to use the single file formation. These would include:

- Turns
- On/Off Ramps
- Streetcar tracks
- · Passing slower vehicles
- · Construction Zones
- Narrow Bridges
- · Roads with parked cars



When passing slower vehicles (diagram 5.2), each rider should spend as little time as possible in "no man's land". The group should not try to pass together. If something were to happen some riders could be caught on the wrong side of the yellow line, with on-coming traffic rapidly approaching.

The Leader

In every group there is a leader, but what makes a good leader? Does the rider with the most experience

make the best leader? Not necessarily! Just because a rider has a high level of skill doesn't mean that he/ she will make a good leader. "Good skills are irrelevant in the absence of good judgment!" To be a leader a rider must be able to set a pace that everyone in the group can follow safely. He or she must also be able to plan ahead and communicate to the other members of the group. Making last minute turns, stops, lane changes, etc. will catch other riders off guard and can lead to disaster.

If you are a leader who constantly loses slower riders in the group, you are not doing a good job of leading. A good leader also has to be able to follow others as well. "If you cannot follow others, how do you expect others to follow you?"

Chase Rider

As well as having a leader, a group should also have a chase rider, the last rider in the group. This rider's duty is to keep an eye on the riders in front of him/ her. This should also be


a rider with a fair amount of experience. If something were to happen (a fall, mechanical failure, etc.) to a rider near the back of the group, the chase rider will be there to deal with the situation.


One of the biggest problems with riding in a group is that speeds can get out of hand quickly. Normally the ride starts off at legal speeds, then one rider ups the pace a little, and then the next rider will up the ante. Before you know it the group is doing speeds well above the legal limit. How do you keep this from happening? The best way to that I can suggest to keep this from happening is to ride with people that you know and trust. Personally if I ride with someone for the first time and they do something that put others at risk I will not ride with that person again period! I have better things to do than scrape someone off the road.

"Riding in a group is not about competing with each other; it's about working together as a unit. If you want to compete go to the track!"


