## THE MOTORCYCLE LAWYER ON THE LAW

#### Two Separate Accidents; Two Motorcyclists Killed. **Tesla Autopilot Responsible?**

Two motorcyclists were killed in two separate accidents, within a span of three weeks when they were struck from behind by Tesla automobiles, both allegedly operating on "Autopilot."

The first accident, on the night of July 7, 2022, in Riverside California, a motorcyclist – on a Yamaha V Star, riding in the High Occupancy Vehicle lane, was struck from behind by a Tesla Model Y traveling in the same lane. The fatal accident is still being investigated but suspected by some, that some version of the car's Autopilot was being used.

The second accident was on July 24, 2022 - also at night, near Draper Utah. In this crash, a Harley-Davidson, also traveling in the HOV lane of Interstate 15. A vehicle identified as a Tesla Model 3, was in the same lane and struck the motorcycle from behind. At the scene of the accident, the driver of the Tesla informed police that he had been using Autopilot at the

A self-driving car, also known as an autonomous car, driverless car, or robotic car, is a car incorporating vehicular automation, that is, a ground vehicle that is capable of sensing its environment and moving safely with little or no human input (e.g. Teslas equipped with autopilot).

The U.S. National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) is currently investigating these two fatal motorcycle wrecks. The NHTSA had been investigating 39 crashes since 2016 involving autonomous vehicles - 30 of which involved Tesla's, 19 of which lead to deaths.

Last year in this magazine, I reported that on March 17, 2021, at 1:12 AM, a Tesla - proved to have been using autopilot, collided with a Michigan state trooper's patrol car in Eaton County. Per the Michigan State Twitter account (@MSPFirstDist: Mar 17, 2021), the patrol car had its emergency lights activated when it was struck by the Tesla.

#### Michigan Law on Autonomous Vehicles (AV)

Michigan's statute MCL 257.665 - titled: Research or testing of automated motor vehicle, technology allowing motor vehicle to operate without a human operator. This state law requires that, for a manufacturer to test this technology on the roads, the car must be insured, and a human must monitor the car's performance and be able to take control (if needed).




The Michigan law further plainly states, "an automated motor vehicle may be operated on a street or highway in this state."

#### **HOW TO COMPLAIN**

With these accidents and deaths, it's clear that driverless vehicle technologies still have flaws! Moreover, it seems that Tesla's CEO, Elon Musk, and the U.S. government believe that the public roadways - where you and your family drives - are appropriate testing grounds for autonomous vehicles. If you wish to act on this issue on behalf of motorcyclists, writing your state representative(s) would be a good start visit https://www.congress.gov/members to search with your address! You might also consider donating to the American Motorcyclist Association (AMA) for its lobbying efforts. # Biker Preacher's

ast month I started writing about The Sermon on the Mount that the Lord Jesus preached and the Apostle Matthew preserved for us today. I'm going to continue with the 2<sup>nd</sup> of the Beatitudes Matthew 5:4

Matthew 5:4 <sup>4</sup>Those who mourn are blessed, for they will be comforted.

Now, if you remember, last month we found out that the original word for beatitude is the Latin word Beatitudo, which literally means blessed and happy.

So, we could substitute the word happy for the word blessed - this verse would read: "Those who mourn are happy, for they will be comforted" Yet, this doesn't sound quite right does it? How can anyone be happy when they are in mourning? How can anybody be happy when they are crying? How can there be happiness when there is sadness? My brothers and sisters, here is the key:

- · Happiness depends on why you are CRYING.
- · And Happiness depends on what you are crying about.

Let me put it this way... If I am crying about the sin in my life – I should be happy. Why? Because that means I am taking the sin in my life seriously - that I am concerned about it. If I crack jokes and laugh about the sin in my life then that would mean I am not taking it serious enough. If I ignore the sin in my life - that means I don't want to deal with it. But, if I cry about it that means I have looked at it – and I see the seriousness of the situation. If I cry about it that means that I realize how much it affects me, my relationship with God, my relationship with others and I need to do something about it. I need to repent.

Listen!! Repentance is the second step to true happiness. Ephesians 2:8-9 says "For by grace you are saved through faith, and this is not from yourselves; it is God's gift - not from works, so that no one can boast."

You see repentance involves a U-Turn. Repentance involves confession. Repentance involves depending on the goodness of God. That's why this verse says "those that mourn are blessed" because they are comforted when they repent of their sins. Maybe you're reading this today and you're at a place of sorrow for your personal sins... today is your day for forgiveness, freedom and

But, if there is sin in your life and you're hiding it, covering it up or thrown your hands in the air like you just don't care... you're going to do it anyway. Please listen to the Holy Spirit calling you to repentance and forgiveness. Numbers 32:23 says "...be sure your sin will catch up with you."

You want to be blessed and happy right? Then you need to mourn, repent and get free from sin because sin is a blessing blocker.

Pray with me - Heavenly Father, I come before you in the name of Christ Jesus your son. Lord I'm a sinner, I have sinned. God, I repent of my sins and am so sorry for breaking your law. # BULLET POINT

## GOOD NEWS!

here are not many things lately that truly excite this old warhorse, but when I find a description of a pistol that begins with NOT LEAGAL IN CALIFRONIA the heart does a bit of a pitter-patter and wants to see more. Then eyeballing the picture, which seems kind of familiar, and reading the specs, I found myself falling head over heels in lust with what I view as one hottttt bullet launching machine. There are tons of doppelgangers in the gun world, knocking off other company's successful designs, but there's always a definite difference in the quality of materials and workmanship. You can feel, see and hear the differences between the real thing and their clone without ever firing it and, if you are gun savvy, you know that you will never pass it off as anything other than a cheap imitation. Its like expecting a wild weekend with what you thought were going to be twins only to find out that you were duped into an afternoon and stuck with a homely second cousin. Folks, I promise you that in this case, you will not be dissatisfied with either one of the following!

I have a friend who shoots a lot of 3-qun competition and the pistol he shoots is the Staccato - P, Staccato 2011 built solely for performance. Staccato is the old STI and is known for their high-end firearms and matching prices. What you have is a single action double stack 1911 style pistol that is so well balanced and assembled and freakishly accurate even in novice hands and is engineered for speed. The stock night sights are more than adequate, but add an optic and you will amaze even yourself when you start shooting ten round single hole groups with good mechanics and meaningful practice. It's truly a firearm worth considering for a next qun or future qun, but it's not inexpensive.

Enter a worthy consolation prize that, with a little planning, might be within the average person's budget. I was reading some literature on the new Springfield Prodigy and right up front it said NOT LEGAL IN CALIFORNIA which usually means that it will not be available with California 10 round sissy magazines. To me that's a turn on because

it means that the company is not going to bow before the rosy red asses of west coast politics. I don't know if there will be aftermarket mags available in the future, but the idea of buying a handgun that comes with both 17 round and 20 round magazines gives me a gun chubby. Then finding a picture and the doppelganger effect kicked in because I was looking at an affordable version of the Staccato-P, and the specs sheet is just as impressive. But as I said before, most clones leave a lot to be desired once you get your hands on one; we got one in the store, and I must admit that I was not disappointed if what I was holding. It looked, felt and sounded like a quality firearm (lust, lust, lust) and I will be getting one in the near future.

There are differences between the Staccato-P and the Prodigy such as the Staccato is available with either an aluminum or steel frame and the aluminum will save you about 5 ounces of carry weight. The prodigy only comes in steel, but is available in either a 4.25" or 5" barrel and the larger Prodigy is the same weight as the Staccato. Both have bull barrels and while the trigger pull on the Staccato is outstanding the Prodigy is able to hold its own withoutshame. The Prodigy comes in two different barrel lengths both available with or without an optic, where the Staccato is available in several different models and sizes, all of which are optics ready. As far as available optics, the Prodigy is built to accept the Hex Dragonfly and if used there are no odd gaps, or overlaps of mounting plates to detract from the appearance, but quite frankly the Staccato-P looks good no matter what optic system you put on it.

Now, I am not going to blow smoke up your skirts and try to convince you that the Springfield has the same feel as the Staccato; I know that none of you are that simple. The biggest difference between the platforms boils down to the Staccato is fully hand fitted and is a runner right out of the box where the Springfield is mostly hand assembled and will require some shooting to get as smooth as the gun it was cloned from. But, when the roughly \$1400 Prodigy is about half the price of the Staccato you can afford to practice!

## MOTORCYCLE Roll Your Chaps for The Ride

Here is a great way to secure your chaps and keep them from unfolding or unrolling in your trunk or saddle bag.

1. Lay your chaps on a flat surface, unzipped so that the legs lay open flat against each other.



2. Fold the belt and buckles in, as shown.



3. From the top, fold in the right side to form more of a straight line.



Fold the chaps in thirds.



Fold the left and right sides in towards the center (where the snaps are located). and snap together.



You're Done! Your chaps are now in a secured bundle.


