May was Motorcycle Awareness month...

hat doesn't sound right, or make any sense, right? Well, you probably already know what I'm going to say next and probably already said it yourself. Every month is Motorcycle Awareness Month! Or every day should be. Same gist.

While I am still delving into the disbelief of losing someone very close to us in the past few weeks on a bike, I have been pondering how I was going to write this letter this month. It is terrible that as motorcycle riders we are forced to accept the risks that are out there every single day. I'm not talking about the gravel, the

grass clippings, and all the critters on the side of the road. I'm talking about other people on the roads watching for us. I find myself deleting and deleting repeatedly because I sounded too angry when I read it over. So, instead of jumping on my soapbox with two feet and sounding angry at the world, I'll just share a little home life and a few facts instead.

11 teens die a day because of texting and driving. My son is 15 years young and has been on me for almost a full month on helping him get a moped. "It would help him get around town and to get where he feels he needs to be this summer." I'll say, he pleaded his case well and hasn't really been badgering me like he would in the past. Is my boy growing up?? I'm in, but we had to discuss this a bit more before making any decisions. I asked him if he had spoken to his mother about it yet and mentioned that we would also have to speak with Aly about it too. After all it would be convenient for us to not have to run him all over town all the time, he could be responsible for himself a little more, and he does have a chunk saved up to help with the cost. Plus, it was fun thinking back to being his age and how much fun it was to hit the road on two wheels! It feels empowering even if it's on a moped. I'm in!

Currently 1 out 4 accidents are caused by texting while driving So, then I start slinging the questions at him to see how much planning

he had actually put into this idea. I knew he had some cash saved up because he was already saving for an electric mountain bike, but he's also been on this shoe collecting kick. All I can say is "squirrel" when it comes to his savings attempts. So, I ask how much money do you have left to pitch in on a moped son? Me, with surprise - Okay! Who do you know that has one already? He didn't realize I was asking him that question out of both humor and out of curiosity because I know from experience that it's usually where it all starts - lol. The questioning continued. Okay, how long have they owned it and have you been with them when they have been riding it? Okay, do you think they are good at rider? Are they riding legally, and do you think they are being cautious and safe out there? Have they got in any trouble with it since they got it? Are they aware of the rules of the road? Oh?... I pause and then... hmmm, okay. So, do you think you would be a better rider than them and more importantly, a safer rider? Well, he had some good answers until the last few questions. Thankfully, he was honest with me, and he admitted that he had rode his buddies moped (duh) and that he had seen him blow stop signs and drop it coming to stops. Sound familiar? He then proceeded to tell me about all his buds' bad habits without realizing I was imagining him riding alongside him the whole time he was talking. Okay, I'm thinking that I'm glad he sees his buds' faults, but this is his close buddy and I know what one does, typically the other will follow. So, all the fears I had in the back of my mind started to come out. I was in, but now I'm back out again!

I admitted that I wasn't ready to say yes. My fears as a parent got me. I

needed to walk away from the conversation for a bit to question my fears and if I was being fair or not. I needed to think about it more. So, I'm back in again, but not without a good sit down together with him. We had the talk again. The one about all the dangers people that ride two wheels face on the road each day and always being aware of our surroundings. This isn't a new conversation between us since I have owned motorcycles his whole life. I've never really been without one since he was born. He's been on most of them over the years with me. That's beside the point. I needed to make sure I brought up how things are different these days compared to when I was his age. Not only while riding two wheels, but when we are driving our cars too! Oof, he doesn't even have his drivers permit yet and I'll save my early year stories for a much later date! - lol. While shaking my head at myself, it was hard for him to imagine that cellphones didn't exist "back in the day." Texting while driving didn't exist. It wasn't even a thing for us, and it's gotten to be crazy out of control. I'll say it... I'm 100% okay with the state stepping in and governing when it comes to this worsening issue. Regulations need to be made. I DO believe that cell phones need to be harnessed while driving and that certain apps do not need to work while a vehicle is moving. Let's be honest, we are all guilty of picking up our phones from time to time while on the road. It's a sad fact and please let this comparison sink in...

Texting while driving is 6 times more likely to cause an accident than drunk driving.

I guess my point is this, it's a shit show out on the roads these days and I'm tired of losing friends and loved ones out there. I'll keep cutting the grass around my "Look Twice" sign in my front yard for all those passing by to see, we'll keep sharing and posting through the month of May about Motorcycle Awareness, and we'll renew our ABATE membership when it comes due to support the cause, but we all need to do more! We need to do more for each other! We need to do more for all the future riders like my son. Have conversations regularly with your families and children that are just learning to drive. Have conversations regularly with those you meet that don't ride. Make it a point to talk about the risks we face as motorcyclists and what we all can do together to make it safer and broaden the chance that we get to come home safely. Yeah, it's June and May was Motorcycle Awareness month, but I really do want to be able to ride with my son for as long as I can when he's old enough to join me. I hope we'll be able to do so until I just can't ride anymore. That



includes both Aly and I. Not because it was cut short by unfortunate or unnecessary reasons that could have been avoided.

After all, what is stepping on a "soapbox" worth and what good does it do if nobody stops to listen? It's great to share our awareness posts on biker pages and groups and in biker magazines, but it's everyone around us that needs to see and hear it too! Not just us riders! I pray that my son listened to what I've said and



that the Lord blesses him and you with safe journeys,

Sam Villegas, you are gone, but never forgotten.

We hope to see you out on the Thunder Roads® of Michigan!
















WYLD STALLIONS MOTORCYCLE BUILD

DEREK LONG UPDATE

ince *my* last build update our time has been spent with birthdays, easter and some shit weather that has been more of a hindrance then anything (and as I type this, we're in the 80's!) funny how that works.

Also, since my last update I endured the last days of my grandmother's life and pondered what is a life well lived? She was the sweetest soul. My thoughts have filled



my time searching for the answer, but it's still not clear. I guess for some it might be materialistic possessions, or accomplishments that are referred to as milestones. Then again, I believe that there are people out there just getting through the day to day with the hope that it'll work itself out one day. Even though I have not produced a clear answer to this, I do know working on motorcycles has given me the time to reflect, think, and learn new things about being more self-sufficient. Even though life has been slowing me down and I feel like my build is moving kinda slow, it's still pushing me to learn some new stuff along the way.

In April, I had no real design in mind when I threw the frame in the jig except that it was getting cut! So, it was a no turning back moment as I proceeded to chop off the rear. With the cold coming to an end and people knowing riding is right around the corner swap meet season was in full swing. I found myself searching for parts at the Detroit area swap and picked up some stuff that is yet to be determined if any of it will go into this build. While at the swap I got to hang out with the Thunder Roads Michigan team and some other rad peeps that I bumped into. So, no matter what I took home for parts... it was worth the cost of admission.











Getting back into the shop, I decided it was time to do and not think any longer. After all, thinking only gets me in trouble! I started by bending and marking some welding rod to kinda get an idea of what I wanted to do. I did this until I found the angles to produce my idea into a hardtail section. Then I went to work with the most used tool that I have, my grinder. The cutting discs and flap discs provided by Empire Abrasives have continuously exceeded my expectations. As quickly as I pulled the trigger it sliced through and removed any excess metal with no problem. I had a roughed-in hardtail section! Afterwards, I worked on finishing the welds on the frame that I have so far, put the rear tire on the rim, cut down my cam cover to give it a slimmer look, written a plan in my head moving forward, and hoping that my plans will come to fruition. I do have a tore apart motor still, but I've got all the necessary pieces. Ha! I even traded an old-timer and an old bolt on hardtail section for the necessary parts to turn my motor into kickstart! I've found it fun since it confuses the creature comfort people who ask "So you're taking a push button start and making it so you have to jump on a pedal to be able to ride away?? Yes! If I gotta explain it, you wouldn't understand-lol.

So, with all that stated, all I want to do is garage rat shit, with my garage rat friends. Especially without having to heat up the workshop before getting going! Also, having most of my parts or with them arriving shortly is making me feel a little more at ease. Again, thank you for following our Wyld adventure and remember "All We Are Is Dust In The Wind, Dude." - (Theodore "Ted" Logan)!






JON WYSONG UPDATE

fter clearing out the no longer necessary subframe I laid out where I wanted my cuts to be for my hardtail section. But before I actually cut anything, I made a strut that would take the place of the mono shock and set my ride height. Once the ride height was where I wanted it, I started cutting away at the frame and the swing arm leaving enough material to weld to. With the frame and swing arm sections out of the way I stuck my new frame rails inside the old frame rails and got them situated to tack them in place. I then plug welded the rails in place to lock it in so I would be able to remove the shock mount and get my new seat mounts in place. After I got everything in place and where I wanted, I fully welded it out. Now I have a hard tailed Honda shadow!

Unfortunately, since doing that there's not much else to update because I've been dealing with some family issues and BMD that's been taking up a lot of my free time. I'm also currently trying to finish up another bike build that has taken time and attention away from this one. If I can get it off my lift, then I can move my hard-tail Shadow onto it soon. The first thing on the list once the bike is in the lift is to start fabricating the exhaust so I can get it sent out to get chromed. Then I'll work on getting the motor pulled and cleaned up so that I can get the frame cleaned and prepped for paint. Stay tuned!

■ell, we took some time off and didn't really get to the project bike until lately. With the weather warming, we all needed to get the daily riders ready. Had to take care of the crew! Especially since we are planning on getting some miles in the saddles this summer.

We've started the ratchet top 4 speed tranny rebuild, and now currently waiting on the gasket kit to put it back together. Old E and I finished all the final welding and grinding on the hardtail frame. Pretty happy with how it came out. I then cut the rear wheel spacers and got the rear tire and transmission alignment right on. Then, welded together a TC Bros. oil bag with a few alterations, so it wouldn't be like everyone else's. Got it mounted and it's looking good! We've also tried a few different styles of handlebars but still not sure what we will go with. Once we mount the rear fender and get the mid controls figured out the frame should be ready for powder coat.











Veterans Crisis Line

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) Veterans Health Administration (VHA) has established a national Veterans Crisis Line to ensure that Veterans in emotional crisis have free, 24/7 access to trained counselors. To operate the hotline, the VA partnered with the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) and the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline. Veterans, family members, and friends can call the lifeline number, 800-273-TALK (8255) and press "1" to be routed to the hotline and speak to a counselor about any issue that is creating a crisis situation in his or her life.

State Hunting and Fishing

Eligibility: Michigan provides for eligible resident disabled Veterans and former prisoners of war to receive a fishing license, hunting license, fur taker permit, deer permit, wild turkey permit, wetlands habitat stamp or any combination of these licenses free of charge.

County Veterans Service Offices

In Michigan, each county has a Veterans Service Office which is staffed with professionals that are certified and dedicated to helping Veterans, their spouses, and children, as well as surviving family members of deceased Veterans. They can assist veterans in applying for benefits earned by active military service. These include:

Federal - Disability Compensation, Pension, Healthcare, Education, Home Loans, Burial and Survivor Benefits

State - Veterans Bonus, Education, Employment, Healthcare, Home Loans, Michigan Veterans Homes, and Military Injury Relief Fund.

Local – Claim Preparation and Assistance. Financial Assistance, Transportation to VA Medical Appointments, and Indigent Burials.

Many County Veterans Service and County Recorders also make Veterans ID Cards.


DISTRICT 14 ATV RACING


Our great state houses so many different disciplines of off-road racing, I could give you a new one each





DIY SHOP TIPS A SHOT IN THE DARK

come time ago, I learned that being able to see while riding at night was a good thing. In spite of that good sensible learning, I've been running the same 53/4" truck headlight that I picked up from a gas station in the middle of BFE, somewhere in Michigan's Upper Peninsula about eight years ago. I had every intention of putting a good, quality sickle headlight in as soon as I got back from that ride, but you know how that goes. Since then, what used to be a fair to medium source of light, for making those long hauls, has devolved into something more resembling a Bic lighter in a mineshaft. I decided that needed some adjusting.

If you've been paying attention to the words that I've been slinging for the past few months here, you'll note that I have a fondness for old iron. You'll also remember that I have a bit of an affinity for the ironic in that I like to throw (more of an underhand toss) a bit of tech

into the mix as well. In the case of the Bic lighter mounted under the eyebrow of my old shovel, I thought it might be high time to look into a headlight that would be stupid bright while at the same time using as little current as possible. Like I mentioned before, being able to see what's trying to kill you can be considered a positive thing. Also, those of you who have ever had a kick only scoot know that those pesky Watts can be a valuable commodity.

The old truck headlamp I had was a tungsten halogen sealed beam that hadn't really changed since Led Zeppelin was new on the scene, so I had a lot of room for improvement. The first I investigated was High Intensity Discharge or (HID) lights. They're those bluish ones that blind you coming over the hills on the highway at night. They definitely throw a lot of light out a long way, and are more efficient than halogens, but still use too much power for me. Second, I looked at LED lights. They use almost no power and can definitely be bright, but they have some issues throwing the light out where you want it to be when you






want it to be there. With a little persistence, I found the solution to what ailed me.

I found what I was looking for at Speed Kings Cycle Supply (www.speed-kings-cycle. myshopify.com). Their "Sunlight Creator" projector LED headlight puts a whole lot of bright and shiny from energy efficient LEDs into a projector style housing like an HID. It really looked like I had found the best of both worlds. For around one and a half hundred simoleons, their 5.75" torch sports over 4100 lumens while eating only 40 watts of power. It's plug and play, has a high & low beam, is vibration resistant, and IP67 waterproof to boot. I got it in just a few days, and it most definitely delivered as advertised. The quality of fit and finish was obvious when I first laid hands on it pulling it from its fitted box. All the electronics were onboard, housed in a highquality aluminum housing and the polycarbonate lens was flawless. It was almost a shame to put it in a housing.

Then, it was just a matter of removing the trim ring and unplugging the old truck lamp. I plugged in the Sunlight Creator, got that trim ring back on, and I was back in business. In all of about twenty minutes, I had traded my tired only Bic lighter for a true enough boolye! If y'all go in this direction, it really is 'bout that simple, give or take. I would advise takin' a gander in your service manual before you start though...Just sayin'. I for one am looking forward to taking my bike out for a moonlight stroll.

Until next time, keep it between the lines and shiny side up. Shovel on – Nate T.




