Stabby and I would like to wish all the Thunder Roads Michigan Magazine readers a Happy New Year! We hope you all had a very Merry Christmas as well. I apologize for skipping last month's issue. I have been crazy busy lately.

With that being said, allow me to give you some technical information. I'm going to start this one out with a disclaimer: I do not condone violence in any way. My goal in this article is to provide an informative opinion on firearm malfunction, training, and unfortunately criminal use of a firearm.

I'm sure by now most of you have seen the horrendous footage of the assassination of the United Healthcare CEO. If you did, you'll notice that the shooter had to rack the firearm after every shot. Why is that? Well, in my opinion, after watching the video multiple times, he was using a "standard" pistol (think of a Glock or something similar). He also had a suppressor attached to it.

In case you don't know, a suppressor is not a silencer. It does not make the firearm "silent"; it merely suppresses the noise of a gunshot. It is not anything like you would hear in a James Bond movie. The sole purpose of why the suppressor was invented and made, is to protect your hearing. In fact, in the U.K., where it is very difficult to buy a firearm, suppressors are encouraged for that very same reason.

Now, why did this guy's gun malfunction? If you know anything about semi-automatic pistols and suppressors you already know the answer. Obviously, this guy didn't, and his gun failed because he didn't use a booster. For those who don't know, a booster is a component part that goes inside of a suppressor to counteract the weight that the suppressor adds to the front of the gun, allowing the gun to function properly.

Without the booster, the added weight prevents the gun slide from sliding. Which means that the gun can't eject the spent casing or load a new round. Without the booster, it essentially makes your gun a single shot firearm. That may sound very to the point but stick with me here.

From what I can tell from the video, the shooter appeared to have the suppressor threaded directly into the barrel of the gun without a booster. That would explain why after every shot he had to rack the slide. The gun kept jamming due to the spent casing not ejecting because of the weight of the suppressor.

In the video he appeared to be shocked that the malfunction happened. To me and probably most gun owners, that says he wasn't the "type" to regularly test or practice everything out beforehand. That leads me to believe that he really didn't know much about guns and his intent wasn't matched to the numerous other legal gun owners out there. This is important, why? Because we should all know, as law abiding and safe gun owners, to constantly test and clean your weapons properly means you understand the right and responsibility of owning one.

Again, I do not condone what this shooter did. I am merely giving my opinion on why I think the weapon malfunctioned and perhaps to show how gun owners are individually different people – with free will, but a gun is always a gun. A gun can't make any action without the control of the person behind it.

So, hit the range, vote accordingly, and have a Happy New Year!

Me: How have you spent most of your time there and what have you found that are "must do's?"

Dan: I stay at the Ride N Rest in between the Buffalo Chip and Full Throttle. I have checked out some of the entertainment stages in the past, but as far as what I enjoy the most. It's riding.



Me: Can you name your favorite rides or routes that you have come to love while out for Sturgis Rally? Dan: Iron Mountain Road and Needles Highway come to mind, but a hell of a great ride is Beartooth Pass which is


Gas \$484 avg. Food \$194 avg. Night (motel or camp) \$344 avg. Extra (novelties like patches and shirts) \$365 avg.

HAPPY NEW YEAR THUNDER ROADS® MICHIGAN

s we enter the new year, it's essential to consider what lies ahead for all of us. For motorcyclists and their supporters, significant issues are unfolding in Lansing, MI, and ABATE is ready to advocate for our rights. However, we need your involvement—every motorcyclist and their families must reach out to their representatives, visit the ABATE website, and take a stand against government actions that affect us all.

I've addressed some of these matters in previous articles, but it's time to emphasize the urgency. We fought hard for helmet choice, and now there's a push to reinstate mandatory helmet laws. You can choose to wear a helmet, but don't impose that choice on us! Keep an eye on what's happening in Lansing.

Our rights regarding insurance have also been compromised. We want the option to adjust our insurance to cover our bikes and medical needs, but the insurance industry has us constrained. In fact, bicycles and pedestrians seem to have more rights than we do. Some may argue that their insurance is different, but many agents are unaware of the broader issues. I encourage you to visit the ABATE website or attend a meeting. Joining is your decision, but our goal is to raise awareness for you and your loved ones.

Now, let's talk about the noise ordinance—this is outrageous. Police will have the authority to measure your bike's noise levels. It's astonishing that lawn mowers and trucks can be louder without consequence! The first offense will result in a fine, the second will incur a higher fine, and the third could lead to felony charges. We must stand together against this. They are targeting us specifically, and we cannot let that happen. I mean REALLY??!!

Now going after our second amendment rights. Read and know.

IMMEDIATE ACTION IS REQUESTED!

NRA members and, Second Amendment supporters, anti-gun legislators are aggressively pushing several bills that threaten our Second Amendment rights here in Michigan. Now is the time to add your voice to this battle, as these bills can be scheduled with little notice in the final days of the session. Click the multiple "Take Action" buttons below to urge the committees to OPPOSE these unconstitutional bills.

Senate Committee on Civil Rights, Judiciary, and Public Safety

Bills are eligible for hearings but have not been scheduled at the time of this posting.

Senate Bill 1086: Creates a "Do Not Sell" list for firearms that temporarily and indefinitely suspends an individual's Second Amendment rights. Although joining the list is voluntary, removal from it is exceedingly difficult.

Senate Bills 1149& 1150: Propose severe restrictions on "home-built" firearms and the raw materials used to make them.

Senate Bill 942: Seeks to ban bump stocks, making them illegal to own, sell, or possess in Michigan imposing stricter regulations than those governing machine guns. This comes despite the U.S. Supreme Court overturning the federal ban on bump stocks earlier this year.

Senate Bill 1134: Introduces regulations on firearm color and bans so-called "deceptively colored" firearms targeting firearms with a camouflage pattern.

Senate Bill 1135: Prohibits the sale of imitation firearms in Michigan, with limited exceptions.

These are just some of the many things we as a whole should be paying attention to.

Get on the Michigan government site look up who you need to talk to. Or go on the ABATE site to get more info. Or get ahold of me I'll send you to someone that has the answers. We have the names and phone numbers of those that support motorcycles



New Faces In New Places

It has been four and a half weeks since election day and the last race for Congress has been called. The final breakdown of the U.S. Senate will be 53 Republicans and 47 Democrats. The U.S. House of Representatives will also have a slim margin, with 220 Republicans and 215 Democrats. Complicating these margins, in 2025 two (2) Republican Senators and three (3) House Republicans will be leaving to assume positions in the Trump Administration. Those five seats will be filled with appointments by Governors in the case of the Senate and special elections for the House seats. In total, starting January 3, 2025, there will be 10 new members of the Senate and 63 new members of the House of Representatives. That means a lot of new faces in and around Capitol Hill. We have a lot of work to do introducing the Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF) and our legislative priorities to these new lawmakers!

You can help us meet these new legislators by joining us in Washington, D.C. for Bikers Inside the Beltway on May 19 and 20, 2025. In January the MRF website will have updates on registration and travel details. We need bikers to show up, be seen and be heard!

A Christmas Hope To: North Carolina Veterans From: Michigan

s we know Hurricane Helene did auite a number on North Carolina along with a few other states (Georgia & Tennessee), I have been actively arranging and delivering supplies to a wonderful veterans



group named Combat Female Veterans Families United, which is based out of Greensboro, NC. Michigan has answered the call a few times already. The Strength in Numbers organization has helped so much in organizing it from their end and I have been at the receiving end here in NC. I can't give enough praise to Strength in Numbers; they do incredible work for veterans. Even with all their efforts for Michigan veterans around Davison and nearby areas, they took the initiative to collect donations for North Carolina veterans this Christmas. They spread the word, and the folks in Michigan really came through. I'm proud to be connected with both of these fantastic groups. The first batch of donations was delivered in October 2024, marking the start of a great partnership between two veterans' organizations focused on supporting our veterans. The second round of donations came from Georgia and the American Legion in South Carolina in November, which I personally delivered to the hardest-hit areas in North Carolina. Let me tell you, the photos don't even come close to showing the true extent of the damage. If it weren't for the kindness of Americans donating their time, items, and effort, the toll from Hurricane Helene would have been even worse. I witnessed the destruction firsthand. and the impact will be felt for years. Asheville, NC, and its surrounding areas will be under a water advisory for guite a while. 













